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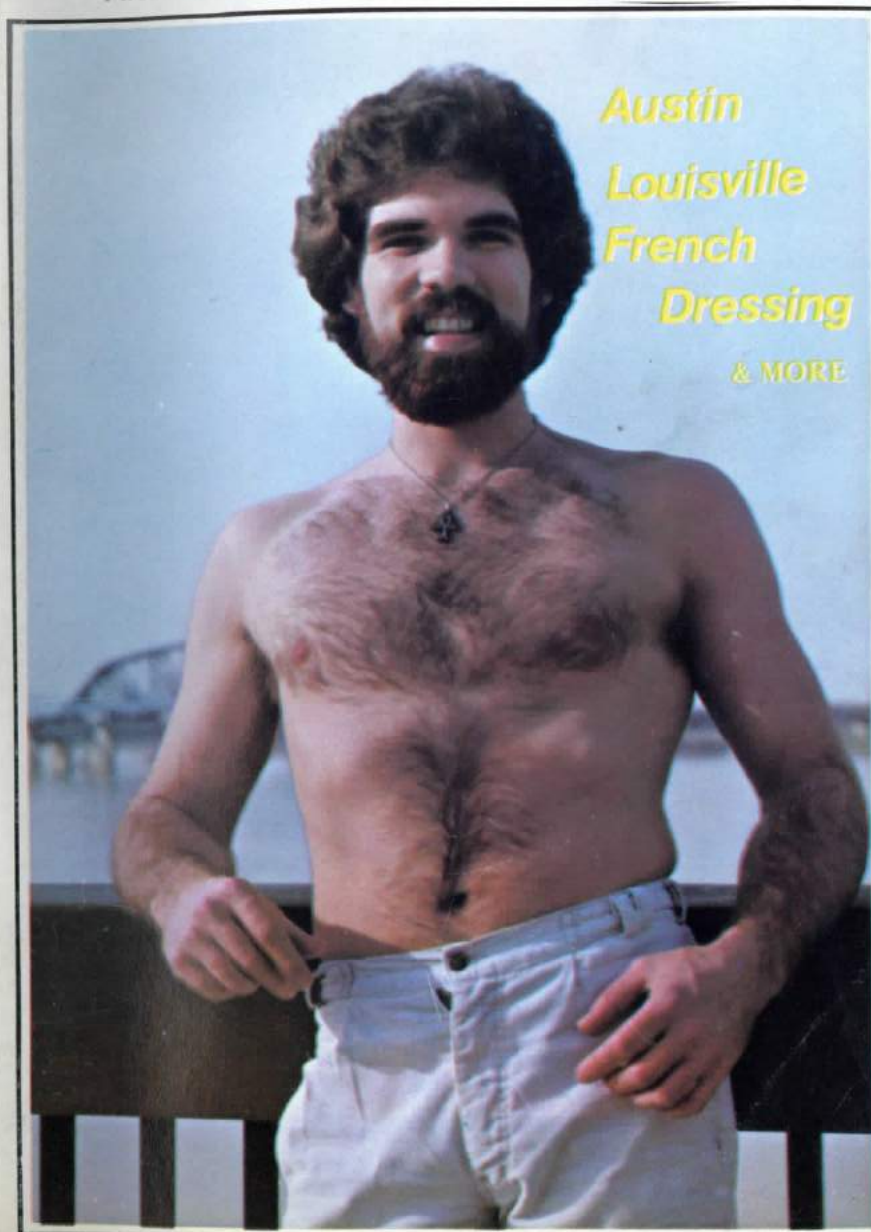
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MAN OF THE MONTH

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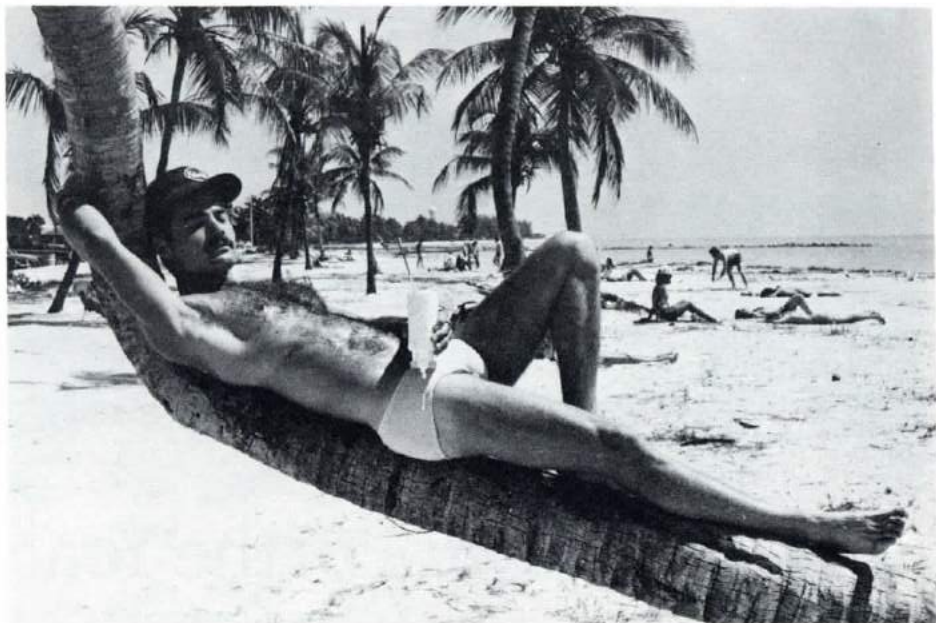
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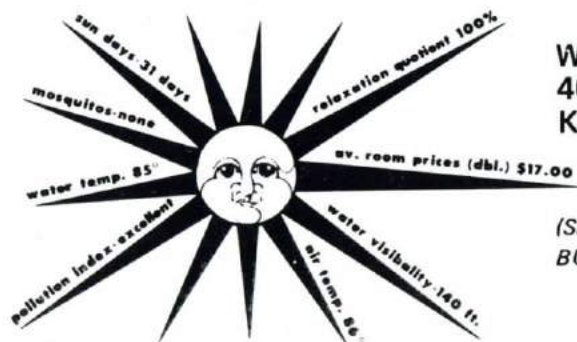
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The Versatile KEITH LANDON CRUISE Personality of the Month

Keith Landon stands as one of the most active contributing members of the Southern gay community. His participation in gay activities and innovative concepts have established him as an important businessman and promoter of social unity and distinction. Currently the publisher/president of the periodical FLORIDA KNIGHT LIFE, Keith has a variety of colorful experiences in his background. He was

a short order cook, insurance salesman, and manager of two nightclubs before his present position in the publication business.

FLORIDA KNIGHT LIFE is a small complimentary magazine circulated throughout the state of Florida at a rate of about 10,000 copies a week. Keith's intentions with the magazine are to make it an informative guide

offering not only club advertising but articles on bars, parties, and disco events in Florida.

Before founding FLORIDA KNIGHT LIFE approximately 3 months ago, Keith had been operating Keith's Cruise Room for nearly 9 years. He points out the various "firsts" for which his Cruise Room became reknown, including the fact that the club was the first to use dancing go-go boys. The bar was also the first to play "The Dating Game," a gay version of the television show where men asked men questions in order to select a "date."

Keith sold his club on September 30, 1977, and now divides his time between the magazine and serving as producer of the annual Miss Florida Pageant for Female Impersonators. The contest is now reputed as the best of its kind in the country, presenting production numbers and fashions which each year reflect unmatched professionalism. It was all inspired by Keith's desire to show straight society what gay performers could do given the appropriate opportunity, and to demonstrate to the public "just what talent was all about." The event was presented to sell-out crowds in various hotels during its first few years before securing its present annual home at the Fontainebleau in North Miami Beach. The average audience numbers about 2,000, with tickets this year at \$10 and \$12.50 a piece.

The number of contestants permitted to enter the pageant is usually limited to around 25, with an average of 15 to 20 hopefuls who want to enter the competition turned down each year. The city of Atlanta is the only area outside of Florida which is allowed to send contenders to Miss Florida. Keith explains that this is because Atlanta was supportive of Miss Florida when it first began, and that because of its continued loyalty Atlanta may be allowed entrants in the contest. There indeed have been two Miss Florida winners from Atlanta: Tricia Marie, the very first Miss Florida in 1972, and Hot Chocolate, who won the title in 1976. Keith promises this year as the hottest year yet.

The contest is unique in that it is the only one of its kind that does not incorporate the word "gay" in its title. "Gay" indicates a sexual preference," Keith remarks. "It really has no relationship to the art of female impersonation. There is a difference between a drag queen and a female impersonator. A drag queen makes up for the fun of it - to go out into the street and carry on. A female impersonator, however, dresses like a man and looks like a man; he dresses like a woman to make a living."

Originally from Massachusetts, Keith has resided in Florida for 22 years and loves it. He is extremely happy with FLORIDA KNIGHT LIFE and is excited about Miss Florida. "I've been extremely lucky," Keith claims in regards to his endeavors. That statement meets with reciprocity, Keith: the Southern gay community is lucky to have you.

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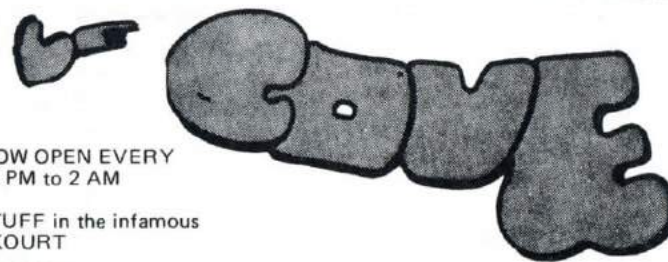
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Da Arla's DISCO

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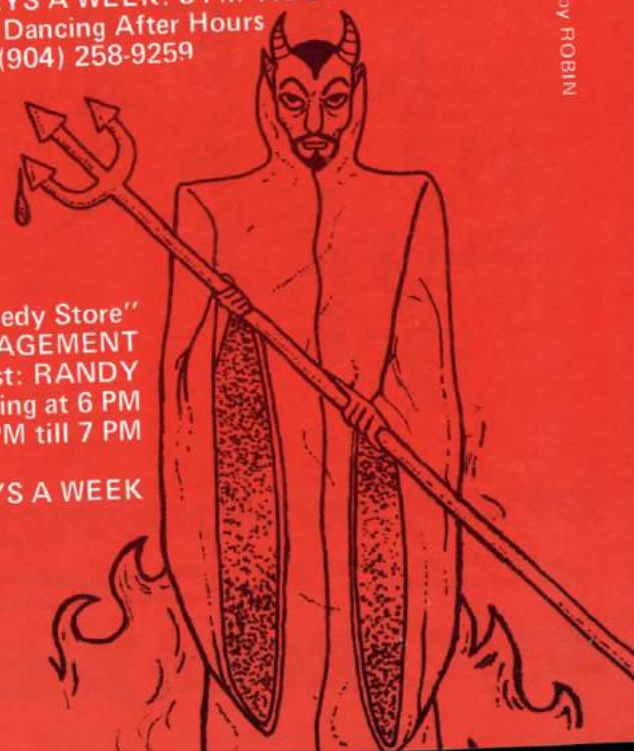

HABITAT

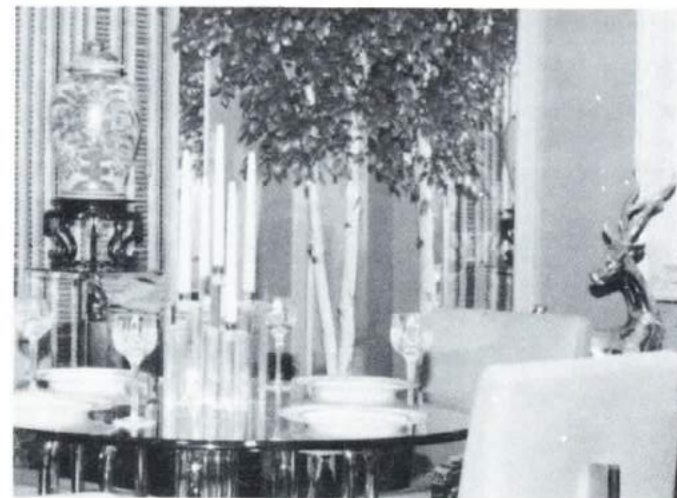
You have heard of the old adage - "Show me your friends and I will tell you what you are." Equally true, show me how you live and I will tell you what you are. Truly, if your dwelling is not your castle, you are a

dwelling — happy home, happy person. So, why not surround yourself with as much beauty and comfort as possible? That is, go out and get it — if you do, it is certainly worth coming home to. Whether your eyes are opening in the morning or closing at night, it is such consolation to have a well furnished place to experience either. Not to love and appreciate environmental beauty must be the height of emptiness, so fill yourself with the good things of life. Mainly, start at home.

First of all, everyone of you have taste and appreciation for one form of beauty or another. Put them to use. Reward yourself with atmosphere in your own private world — your home. It is really very easy, if you “want” you “do” — which reminds me of what Elmo Ellis of WSB once said, “I am an American and I live by the four last letters of the word: ‘I Can.’”

As to the photographs on these pages, I wish to show the range of beauty the individual can create for oneself. The double page picture represents a desirable arrangement for relaxation and entertainment. Do not go by any style or trend. Your judgement should be based on what you like. Part of the pleasure is acquiring things one at a time and, as your collection grows, start making compositions and arrangements with these collectables (i.e. visualize your room as a prize photograph or painting, the same as you would with a landscape or seascape or still life). The beauty lies in the composition and arrangements. If necessary, seek professional advice in helping you accomplish this.

As you will note in the color double-page photo just preceding, vertical bands of mirrors were used on one wall to start the composition. These are mounted on plywood columns 10" out from the wall. Between the columns are places ½" glass shelves. Back wall and side of the columns are lined in brown corduroy. Now, you are in a position to create what is known as “shelf scapes” (i.e. do your still life arrangements with collectables on each shelf).



It is amazing how many beautiful arrangements you can accomplish with even inexpensive items, such as sea shells, glass and even paper ornaments.

Note the drape table between the wicker chairs and sofa is nothing more than ¾" round plywood top mounted to an inexpensive bar stool. Five yards of any fabric will make your round cloth. ¼" plate glass placed on top gives you a beautiful and serviceable item for your room. The cost is amazingly low. The lamp base is nothing more than bamboo sticks tied together with a flared pleated shade, to give you the new look. Walls, draperies and lambrequin over the window is the same brown corduroy as used between the mirrored columns. This can be done with comparatively low-cost fabric to create an illusion of plush and beauty. The greatest accomplishment is when you make things for yourself. A self-reward is one of your best compliments.

In the small dining area, an illusion of space and grandeur is again created by the use of mirrors. Once again a 6" wide strip of mirror is mounted to a ¾" plywood panel with a wood molding framing the mirror. Any type of blind or drapery placed behind the mirrored columns will give you a decorative illusion of more space. Two pedestals in front of the window treatment in the dining room are made from ¾" plywood faced in 1/8" mirror. Perfect items for holding plants or any massive ornaments. Back of the pedestals can be left open — which would be a good place to stash your stereo speakers. For glamorous dining, it merely takes a little mirror, a few candles and soft music. This type of small dining area makes a good card and game area where you are limited on space.

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These things all belong to you, so enjoy them. It's a beautiful way to bring a little more LIGHT into your LIFE.



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Derby Week '78

"...AND THEY'RE OFF!," shouts the announcer from the grandstand at Churchill Downs as the highlight of Derby Week concludes on Saturday, May 6th, 1978 with the "crown jewel of horse racing": The 104th running of the Kentucky Derby, the Run for the Roses! The entire world will have its eyes on this greatest-of-all horse race of three-year-old thoroughbreds.

There is fun and festivities for everyone for ten full days and nights of excitement building up to this two-minute grande finale. Commencing with a prestigious "kick off" luncheon April 28th honoring the "Silver Horseshoe" recipient each year held at the infamous Galt House Hotel, now in its modern building adjacent to cruisey Belvedere Plaza, seven beautiful acres with pools and fountains spewing along the riverfront in the summer and outdoor ice-skating in the winter. The original Galt House was built in 1869 on E. Main Street.

Relive history with a visit to the last home of George Rogers Clark, the founder of this river city that banks on the Ohio, is 1778. Take a stroll down historic Main Street where turn-of-the-century commer-

cial buildings have been restored to new uses. One of particular interest was the original stable of the original Galt House. Not only is the carriage house still standing, it now houses one of Louisville's most popular cruise bars: The Badlands. This bar has cleverly maintained the rustic atmosphere with a more modernized western decor. The main floor is a cruise bar which opens onto a small dance floor, then into a room with a pool table and then through the swinging saloon doors into a quieter, more dimly-lit room just before the pinball room. The upstairs, which housed the police department's shooting range, has been converted into a super-disco with mirrored walls, balls and the original bullet holes in the concrete walls. The disco section is open on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.

Another building of interest also on Main Street now houses another large Gay bar: The New Down-towner. This club has 3 completely different levels. As you enter, you'll find a long bar with stools and at the far end is a good-sized multicolor-lighted dance floor. There is also a whole section devoted to pinball and pool. Proceed through a doorway to find a complete cabaret room showbar. On Thursday, Friday, or Saturday nights you may want to make an immediate left and up the stairs to The Tropics, a tropical style (obviously) disco bar with a U-shaped bar at one end, the D.J. at the other end, and the dance floor in the middle, outlined overhead with chaser lights and various other lighting and special visual effects. One thing that makes this upper level unique is the cat-walk encircling the dance floor so you can discredibly observe your favorite dancers from above by peeking through the hanging ferns. During Derby Week, some of their activities include "The Miss Pegasus Contest" with a cash prize of \$150.00 for best talent. On Thursday, May 4th, is the annual "Mr. Buns" contest with a \$50.00 prize.



Beginning Friday, May 5th, all bars will be open continuously for 48 hours from 6am Friday through Sunday at 6am.

The Odyssey Club is a private club with memberships available to guests upon request. The newly remodeled bar has a very friendly atmosphere as you enter the cruise bar and then proceed into their large show bar to meet and greet their all-star cast of female impersonators who perform on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Shows begin at 10pm, with disco dancing between shows. You won't want to miss their Derby Brunch on Saturday, May 6th, beginning at 6p. (their regular brunch schedule is each Sunday at 6pm). During this week of madness, they will have continuous shows on Friday — which is Derby eve.

Right in the heart of downtown is the River City Mall which, at present, is a very cruisey daytime location — soon to be as exciting a night now that Louisville's two newest clubs are opening in the well-lighted, secured area of downtown which enjoys plenty of parking. The first to open in this location is the City Discotheque, directly across from the Julep Lounge. City Discotheque is an ultra-modern ultra disco with three bar areas and a game room. Two sides of the dance floor are mirrored walls and another wall serves as a projection

screen which is a focal point of interest that really sets this bar off by the clever way they have correlated the slide show in theme context with the music and mix in fascinating lighting patterns. And how grand to have a Grand Opening Party to kick off Derby Week!

Morris McCrocklin, former manager of The Badlands, has just opened the MGM Club in a two-story colonial building just down the way from City Discotheque. Entering the first room, there is a rectangular bar which will probably be a formidable cruise area. In the second room, you'll find a large 40' X 12' dance floor with a computerized lighting system enabling plenty

of space for your attack of "dancing feet." A third room is a game area with two pool tables, foosball, and pinball machines. The entrance hall has an eye-catching winding staircase (just perfect for your Scarlett O'Hara impersonations) to the second floor which is a large ballroom presently available for private functions, but which may become a dining room at a later date.

On Saturday, April 29, thirty hot-air balloons compete in the 6th Annual Great Balloon Race. Thousands of spectators view the balloons floating over the city — which go higher even than many of those watching from the ground... This is a free event which begins from the Kentucky Fair & Exposition Center. This is also the official opening day of Churchill Downs.

Louisville's cruiseiest park, Cherokee, is even more cruisey on that Sunday when the Kentucky Derby of Cycling draws over 200 top amateurs from North America for this hill-&-dale road race on what is considered one of the best cycling courses. In the evening, there ain't nothin' like the Belle of

Louisville Dance Cruise aboard this famous paddle-powered, triple-decked, stern-wheeled, whistle-blowing steamboat. On Wednesday, May 3rd, you won't want to miss the excitement and entertainment on the 4th and River Wharf, the embarking location of the Great Steamboat Race between this great boat and the Delta Queen from Cincinnati, when they compete for the championship of the riverboat world and the "Golden Antlers."



The Great Steamboat Race is Wednesday at 5:00 PM. After the race, enjoy your favorite drinks at special prices until 11:00 PM, then disco dance until 4:00 AM.

Pegasus Parade is Thursday at 5:00 PM. The bar will be open right after the parade with special drink prices.

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Friday, May 5th, the bar will open at 7 PM and remain open until 7 AM. Disco dancing until 4:00 AM.

DERBY DAY, May 6, the bar will open at 3:00 PM. There will be a color TV on which to watch the 104th Kentucky Derby. The bar will remain open until 6:00 AM.

The 1½ mile Pegasus Parade on May 4th is ranked as one of the finest in the U.S. Floats, speciality units, beautiful horses, and excellent bands per-

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We have merely highlighted the more prominent events to give you an idea of the many "happenings" of Derby Week. Of course, it's not the same every year as new activities are added each year, and Louisville is not the same all year long. Naturally, the Derby helped put Louisville on the map, but when it comes to horses, this one race is only a beginning. At Churchill Downs, there's the Derby Museum and spring and fall thoroughbred racing. And, at Louisville Downs, the pacers go through their paces.

And when it comes to cruising, other than the previously mentioned places, Central Park, a hustler hangout, is still very active. The Savoy Theatre features a unique "opera" room..., Library Park offers interesting possibilities and then Greentree Mall is just across the river in Clarksville. On parade day, during Derby Week, a festive place to be is on the corner of 4th and Broadway.

Louisville has certainly gained awareness of Gay life in the past year — due to the progress of the Gay Rights Alliance of Kentucky, an organization devoted to "instill in homosexuals a sense of pride and selfworth." Their meetings, which are open to any interested person, are held the third Friday of each month at either the Library or the Unitarian Church (where the MCC also meets for Sunday services at 7pm). You may phone for further information on the Gay Hot Line and MCC: 583-5241. This group is always seeking ways not only for fund raising drives for their non-profit organization, but for entertaining and fun activities for a change of pace. Thus far, their most successful was a dance & cruise on the Belle of Louisville, but the plans for a "Tropical Thirties" party to be held at the YMCA on May 4th, sound just a festive and exciting. Tickets are available at the better Gay bars for only \$3.00.

As you see, fast horses, beautiful people, great restaurants, Gay awareness and bars aplenty, typify life in Louisville, the northern border of Southern Hospitality.

"Commercial chic" was the evening's assignment, and I was approaching the occasion with the anxiety of a starry-eyed fan. I strutted into the Atlanta Hilton lobby and immediately sensed the dictation of my environment to hide all nervousness underneath a guise of "professional cool" -- whatever THAT means. The party was located in a downstairs ballroom, and a quick panoramic survey upon entering the room certified that all of the "beautiful people" were there.

I paid a visit of necessity to the open bar and then escorted my Vodka Collins around the room to visit with recognizable crowd members. A local disc jockey and I tested the expansive buffet, noticing a large display at the center of the table with the giant initials "D. S." carved out of ice and illuminated with blue lights. The feast had been laid in honor of the Casablanca love goddess Donna Summer. And all of the disciples who could sneak through the doorway were present.

Casablanca music throbbed over the portable dance floor in the center of the room (PORTABLE dance floor?). Standing in a corner clique was Angelo Solar of Atlanta's Back Street disco with the gold record he received for being the first disc jockey to play "I Feel Love" in a local disco. "Angelo! Please go show this 'portable' DJ how to mix a record!" It was time for another drink. Especially as the speakers began perspiring to the strains of "I Feel Love."

"This party's from six to eight," I thought to myself, munching on undefined hors d'oeuvres. "It's seven now. Where is she?" Not ANOTHER drink -- at least not for a while yet. "Will there be trumpets or something?" Not at all: the lady who made a record label simply slipped in with a small cluster of people -- just like "one of the gang." It took everyone a matter of seconds, however, to take action against the fact that she was not. A

half a dozen flash bulbs and as many poses later, I managed to shake her hand.

"Miss Summer, I'm a terrific fan of yours and have followed your career from the beginning."

"Thank you," she answered with a sweetness that my triteness hardly merited.

"I'm excited about your new movie. What type of part do you play in it?"

"I play a sort of introductory role in the film. Lots of other musicians are in the movie with me."

"Is it funny?"

"Yes, it's basically a comedy."

"What do you sing in it?"

"I sing one principle disco song and then two or three others of a different style."

"But there's lots of disco in the movie, right?"

"Oh, you KNOW there is!"

She suddenly beamed lost to the local "celebrities" clutching at her to join them in photographs. A local artist presented her with a large chrome-framed portrait taken from the cover of her "Love to Love You, Baby" album. She offered him as many gracious moments as the situation could provide. "Let me get your address so I can stay in touch with you," she told him with her back turned momentarily to the gathering. The young man could be proud, even though HIS art was not on the Casablanca payroll.

I turned to spot the huge cake being rolled into the ballroom. Across the top was written "Rumour Has It Summer is Here." Miss Summer then proceeded to show cameras a dozen ways

to hold a knife before slo-o-owly sinking the blade into the confection. Her expression was not unlike the one shown on the "Love to Love You, Baby" album. All beneficial to photographs, of course.

I don't believe that Donna Summer ever had a chance to indulge in a piece of cake. Told by someone important hovering at her side that she "had to circulate," she once again renewed her slow travel around the room. "Please get out of her way so she can see what she's doing," I was told as the star was signing an autograph. "Please make it out to Anthony," her fan requested. But the pen could not finish its impression as the name "Summer" hit a smudge on the young man's photograph. "Anthony, you've had your hands all over this thing," she as he half-smiled. "That's okay," he approved the partial autograph.

In the crowd was local female impersonator Tissy Malone, who is well



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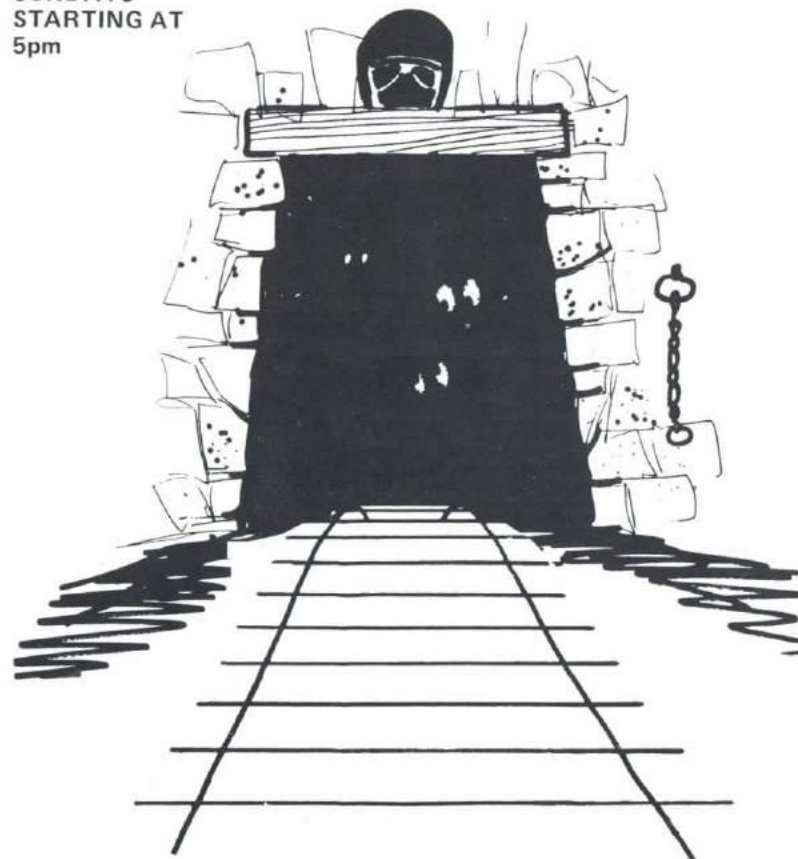

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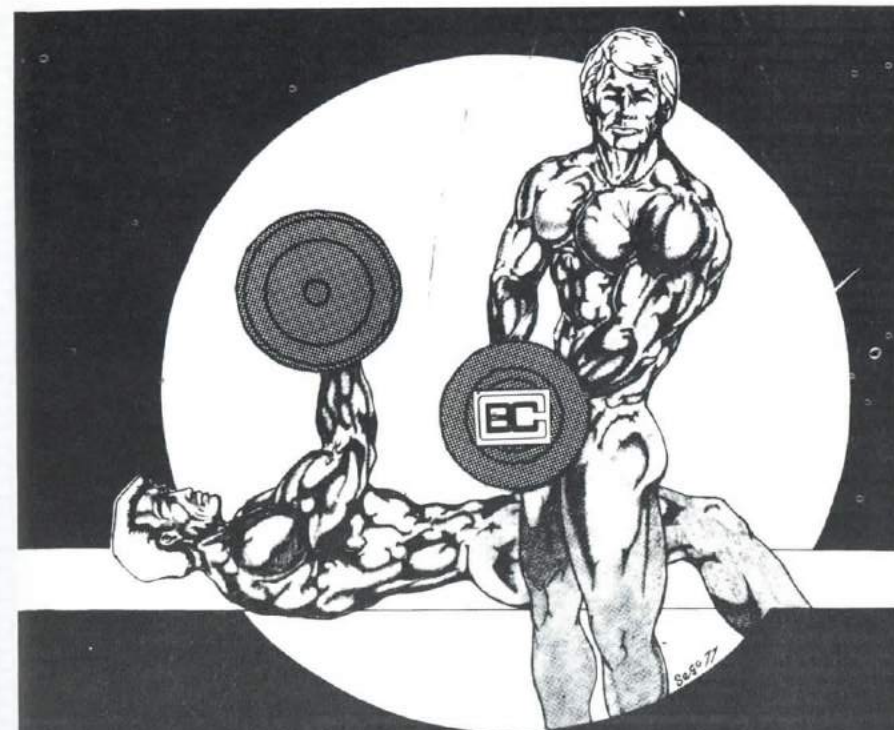

Phoenix is one hell of a hot town, and I don't mean just the climate, which is, however, superb. When most of the country is frozen over, here the skies are blue and even the winter temperatures are in the seventies.

Nor is the word "town" right, even though some may remember when it was little more than a cow town. Today, Arizona's capitol city and surrounding metropolitan area has a population of over one million. The large Gay community, both male and female, is friendly, attractive, and not the least bit shy!

Arizona bars are open seven days a week, but close at 1am, earlier than most states, so get to it. Unless you are an avid hitch-hiker, you will also need a car or bike, as Phoenix is spread

out nearly as much as Los Angeles. Taxies are not that readily available...

Top discotheques are His Company Disco, 3839 N. 16th St.; The Forum, 4132 E. McDowell; and Talk of the Town, 3701 N. 16th St. His Company Disco gets a somewhat unisex crowd, has a large game room with pool tables and is packed for after-hours on weekends from 1am till 3am. Many humpy numbers at the Forum, which features a popular Sunday afternoon buffet. Talk of the Town is almost strictly for the ladies, both foxy and otherwise. Another, Miss Matty's Attic is too new and mixed to hazard a guess as to which way it will go.

The "top" cruise bars are Connection, 4211 N. 7th St., which gets a Levi and



western crowd and the Nu-Town Saloon, 5002 E. Van Buren, which is somewhat more collegiate as it's not too far from Arizona State University in Tempe. The Nu-Town features a patio buffet on Sundays, and Monday night "Beer Bust." The Connection has the "hottest" rest rooms in Arizona, but you won't get any rest...! "Bikers" hang out at the Ramrod, 394 N. Black Canyon Road while the 307 Lounge gets it on with a more matured, but very available clientele.

Popular show bars are Diamond Lil's, 3025 N. 24th St., and The Casa de Roma, 4331 N. 16th St. Also, for the women out there, are The Black And White (formerly The Habit) at 7100 N. 7th St. and the Unlimited, a restaurant

at 2320 N. 32nd St. More of a mixed bar can be found at The Sportsmen Lounge, which has pool tables and a small disco. It's at 4622 N. 7th St. The new Mr. Fatfingers, 5749 N. 7th, is unique in that it actually offers slow dancing. (Romance may come back yet!)

The first of the great Club Baths Chain to open west of Missouri and Texas is the very busy Club Phoenix Baths at 1517 S. Black Canyon Road.

Also high on the list of fun and games places is Swim & Sea Athletic Club for Men. This can make a hot afternoon even hotter. It is private, and located at the Desert Pool Motel, 2922 E. Van Buren. Inquire there as to admission. Another place to stay is The Erotic

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Motel & Bookstore, right next to The Nu-Town Saloon. (Editor's note: No, we did not make this up. Apparently there really is a place in Phoenix called, *The Erotic Motel & Bookstore*.)

There are numerous book stores and various cruisy areas. Some are quite active and some are dangerous. See your copy of "The Bob Damron Address Book" for more complete details, or pick up a copy of *Arizona Gay News*, Arizona's popular weekly newspaper. Unfortunately, there are virtually no

all-Gay dinner houses, but Denny's (as so often happens) at 5000 N. 7th St. "picks up" a lot of the action after-hours. (It's even more unfortunate when you consider how truly dreadful the service and food can be in a Denny's!) Among the better 'straight' restaurants in the area are Asia House, Beef Eaters, Chez Louis, Camelback Inn, El Chorro, Etienne (a name shared by a famous Gay artist), Saddleback Inn, Lulu Belles, Maximilian's, Stockyards and Vito's Scampi.

While in Arizona, try and see such natural wonders as the Grand Canyon, Petrified Forrest, and the Painted Desert, but don't miss your share of the readily obliging man-made market, too!

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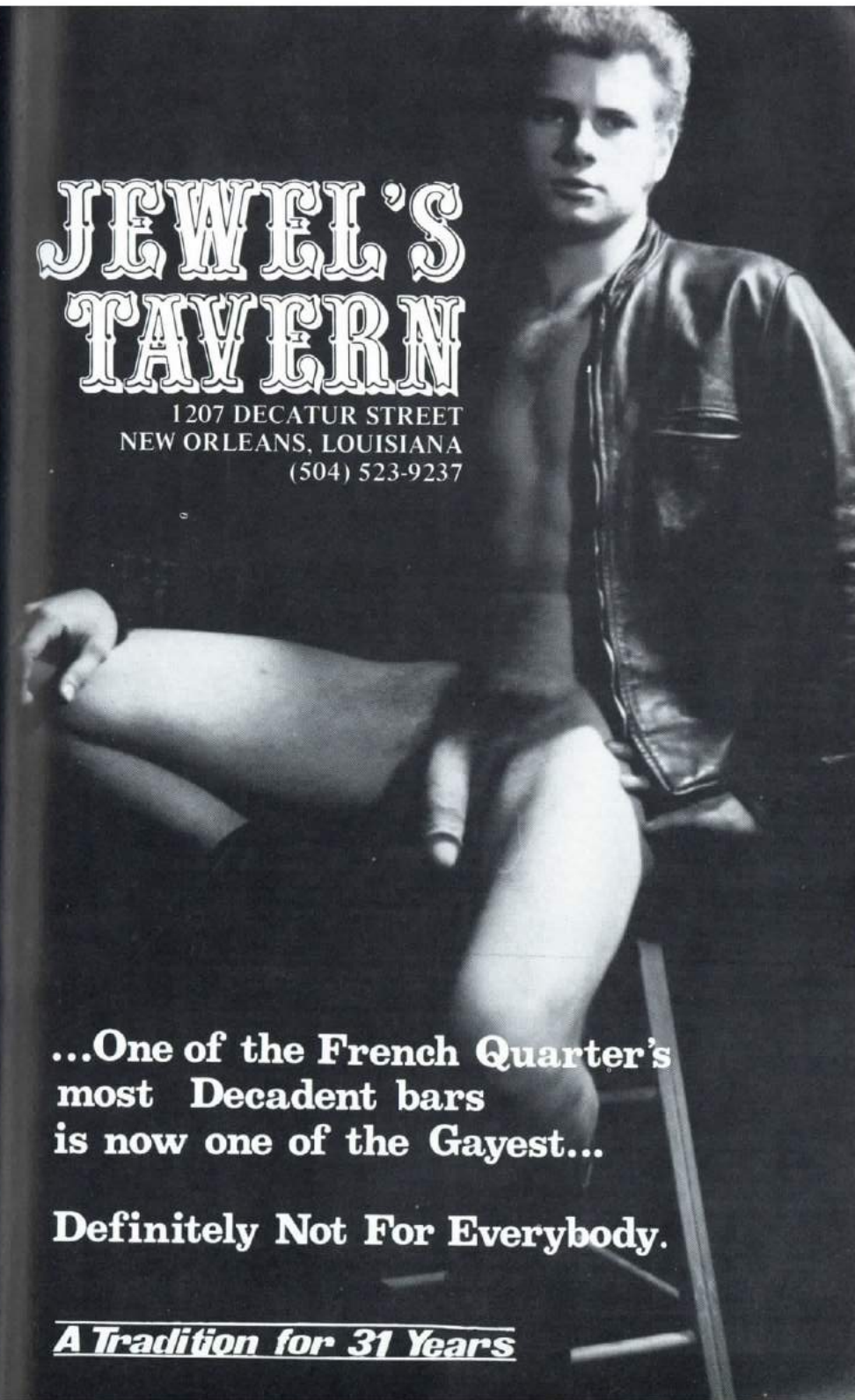
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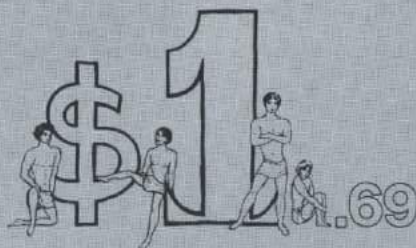
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CRUISIN' AROUND

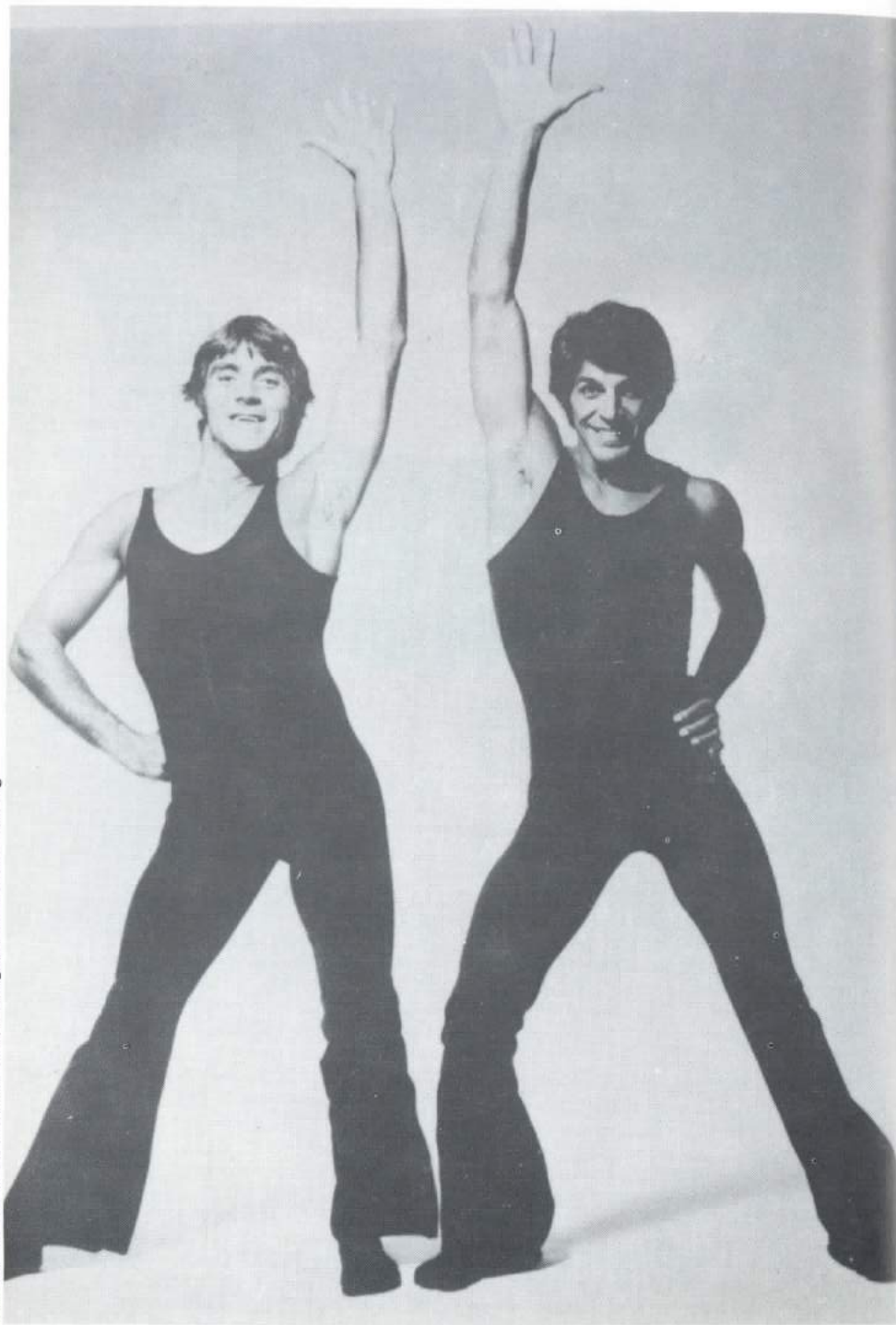


It was about two years ago that Heather Fontaine (David Hetherington) became one of **CRUISE** magazine's first 'Entertainer of the Month.' Since then, he has gone on to become a major character illusionist with America's most successful and famous group of female impersonators, French Dressing. Their travels have taken him all over the country, even up to Canada. Because they have occasionally appeared in the South, and several members of their cast are from the South, we sent **CRUISE** special reporter Tom Oosterhoudt to learn more about them and their show. Here is his report:

French Dressing was born at New York City's "Top of the Village Gate" in 1973. For this engagement, a French songstress gathered some of New York's best known impersonators, along with Canada's top female impersonator, Jean Guilda, to join her act. From this gathering, the title French Dressing was created. After the impersonators received rave reviews in comparison to those of the French songstress, the group left for California,

and the songstress departed. From San Francisco, they went on to Los Angeles and played at some of Hollywood's top night spots, continuing to get recognition with fabulous reviews. Members of the group later appeared on television on shows like the David Suskind Show, To Tell The Truth, and Claude Sacha caused quite a stir when he attended the Hollywood premiere of the rock musical movie "Tommy" and was introduced on the ABC network's national coverage of the event as the *real* Barbra Streisand. Over the past few years, French Dressing has continued to amaze audiences all over the American continent. At one point they landed a 154-week run on America's largest dinner-theatre circuit, the Chateau DeVille chain.

When the show began in New York, the cast consisted of Claude Sacha, a native New Yorker; J.C. Gaynor, originally from the Phillipines; Caleb Stonn, a Puerto Rican; and of course, John Guilda from Canada. Sammy De Marco and Lewis Love started with the group in New York as their male lead dancers and later became the group's

managers while in California. Kelly Lawrence, originally from Chattanooga, Tennessee, joined the group also while they were appearing in Los Angeles. Greg Moore started off as the group's hair dresser and later replaced Caleb from time to time. David Hetherington (Atlanta's own Heather Fontaine), originally from Huntsville, Alabama; became a regular cast member in February of last year.

Interestingly enough, the show is owned and produced by several members of the group, including Claude, Kelly, J.C., Sammy, and Lewis. Because of this, French Dressing's cast is the highest paid group of performers in the country. They conduct themselves in a completely professional manner. Danny Villa is their full-time choreographer, and reworks some numbers for each different theatre at which they play. When they arrive at a new location, they often have a technical rehearsal that lasts up to twelve hours. This rehearsal perfects their lighting and special effects. Costumes and props are also provided by the group.

Julie Andrews and Helen Reddy are the characters portrayed by Kelly Lawrence. Caleb Stonn is stunningly effective as Judy Garland and Liza Minnelli. When David Hetherington started with the group, he was a flawless Marilyn Mon-

roe impressionist. He went on to add other characters and has received rave reviews for his impressions of Dolly Parton and Marlene Dietrich. John Guilda was with the group for a short time during its early days and later returned to Canada as a traveling solo artist. While with French Dressing, Guilda did impressions of Edith Piaf and Marlene Dietrich. He is currently enjoying a solid three-month booking in Puerto Rico.

This past year the group performed at the Beef 'N' Boards Dinner Theatre in Cincinnati, Ohio; at the Country Dinner Theatre in Austin, Texas; at the Lincoln Plaza Playhouse in Oklahoma City; the Club Bene' in Newark, New Jersey ("only 45 minutes from the

Great White Way"), and appeared for the entire fall season at La Nuit En Rose up in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. French Dressing has also appeared at the Dallas, Texas, Playboy Club recently and will be on the boards at the Chicago Playboy Club soon. In the works is a very special series of performances at Don Ho's Honolulu Club in Honolulu, Hawaii.

French Dressing has proved conclusively that what has long been a standard of entertainment for Gay audiences is just as entertaining for straight audiences when female impersonation is presented in its most professional form. If they come your way, don't miss them!

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Cruise Guide

To Restaurants, Lounges, Discos, Show Bars, Baths, Bookstores and other Businesses who welcome the patronage of gays. The area covered by this guide includes all of the Deep South; Washington, DC; Baltimore, St. Louis, Indianapolis St. Louis, Virginia, and Kentucky. While these listings do not include every gay establishment in every city within this area, all of those listed have been visited personally by our staff, have indicated that they do wish to be listed as welcoming gays (even though some have straight clientele also), and are recommended. They are listed alphabetically by State, City and Name.

ALABAMA

NOTE: Liquor laws in Alabama are almost as strange as their politics. Most bars stop selling liquor at 2am on Saturday night, but some bars (mostly private clubs) remain open longer. All bars offer beer, wine and liquor, but the mixed drinks are offered only by the "mini-bottle" (1/10th of a pint) and, because of heavy taxes on drinking, the prices are steep. Most bars open in the late afternoon or early evening and, because of "local option," close at varied times after 2am weekdays. "Local option" also predates who opens on Sundays. Check these listings carefully.

BIRMINGHAM

The Cruisable Capital of Texas

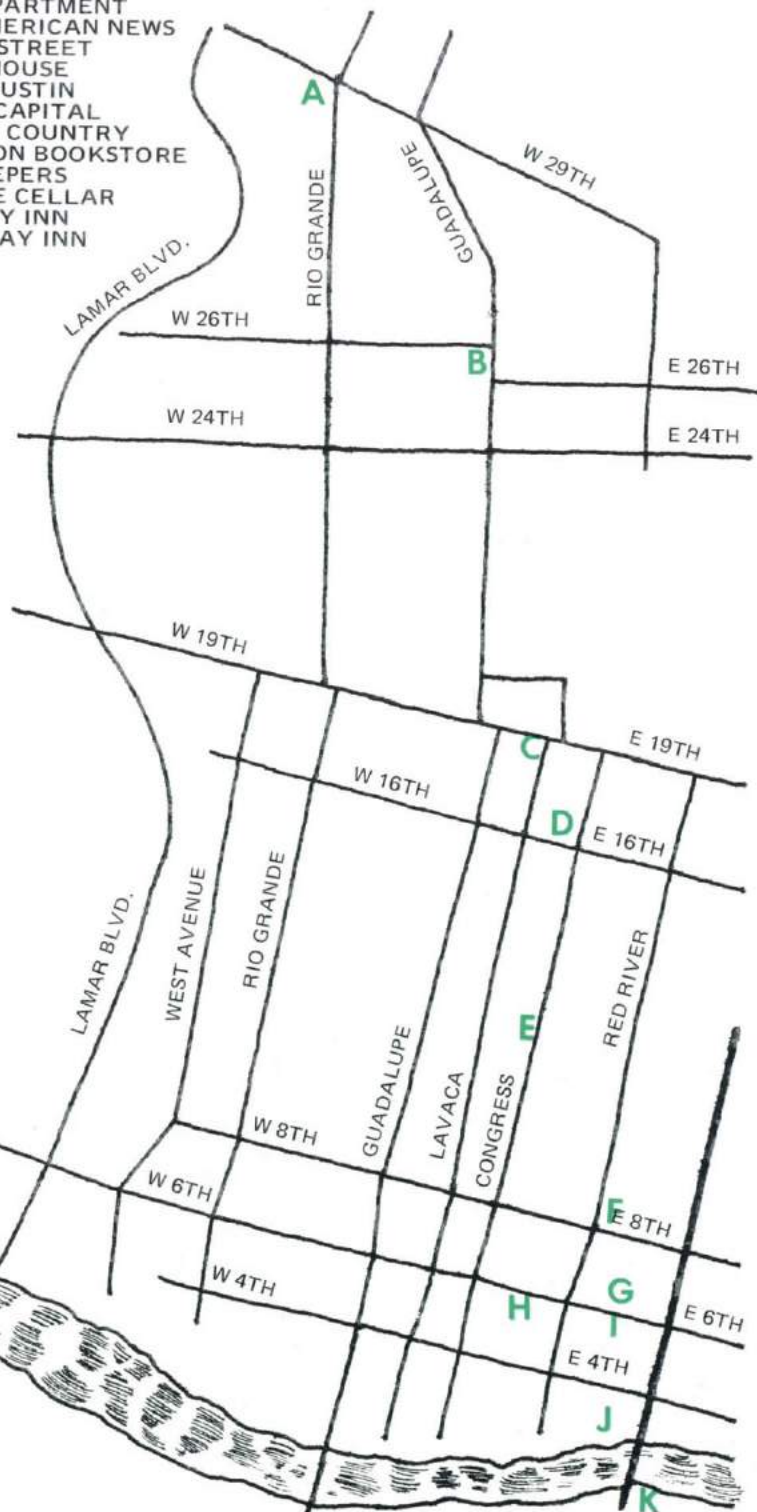
A city of contrasts, different from its big sisters, Houston, Dallas and San Antonio; Austin, the capital of Texas and home of the University of Texas, still retains a western flavor while displaying a personality all its own.

As in other Texas cities, you'll find the natives friendly, but because of the large proportion of college students Austin has a more youthful, fun-loving, attractive crowd than almost anywhere else in the Lone Star State with less cowboys and more beautiful people types. Unlike Houston or Dallas, you won't find most gays all living in one section of the city. Austin has diverse lifestyles and communities and gays can be found in affluent West Austin, low-rent East Austin, quiet suburban North Austin or in South Austin where the many apartments attract students and young marrieds. As in other Texas cities, gays swarm to the nearby recreational areas. But Austin, being a geographic blend, a meeting ground of the coastal gulf plains and the rolling hills of the Texas Hill Country, offers a wide variety of these spots. Skinny dipping is popular at the Lower Colorado River Authority Park on Lake Travis. At Lake Austin they gather at Queen's Cove to swim and bask in the sun. And at Barton Springs in Zilker Park, one can bathe in the just-above-freezing waters of the creek or take the sun and cruise.

In addition to these recreational attractions, Austin offers much for the tourist. The LBJ Library located on the University of Texas campus is a mecca for scholars and a treat for visitors. The State Capital, the University and many other government buildings house interesting exhibits while just west of the city you'll find the hill country with ranches, resorts, and many interesting sights. The federal government now conducts tours of the LBJ Ranch and the visitor can see Lyndon Johnson's birthplace, home and gravesite all on the same tour.

No, that is definitely not Ethel out streaking again. It's just your everyday scene from Hippie Hollow, the popular nude beach on Lake Travis. Our first suggestion to find the place is to get somebody to show you where it is. Our second is to attempt to follow these directions. Take the Mopac Expressway to the Ranch Road exit (RR 22). Follow this west till it deadends, about 16 miles. Turn left and go about 1/2 mile. Turn right at the first major road. Follow this about 5 miles till you see a county constructed parking lot on your left. Park, take your clothes off, and hit the beach. The gay portion is off to the left at the very end of the beach. Needless to say the bushes can be rather fun and we are assured the whole area is safe from vice, sheriffs, and other such vermin. The lake is safe to swim in, or if you want, just lay out on the rocks and enjoy the sun. (in case you were thinking of it, there is no overnight camping).

Compared to most college towns, the Gays in Austin tend to be more open with their lifestyle. The fact that the college students are heavily encouraged to take part in city government and to vote helps keep the political climate warm and receptive. The city's police do not waste their time and the taxpayers money by bothering the bars or their patrons. The nude beaches are also looked on with a blind eye by the local gendarmes.

Austin's largest bar and most popular discotheque is Austin Country. With its downtown location and plenty of parking, it can't be beat for convenience. The club features disco with "sensurround" sound and disco fog seven nights a week. There is a game room in the rear and plenty of hot spots for cruising. The crowd here is young, collegiate, and hot to trot. There are very few games played here—if somebody wants to meet you, they are going to speak (which is a pleasant relief for someone from out of town who knows no one).

Twice a week, Austin Country throws special parties. On Thursday they

have shows featuring Kitty Litter and Roger along with frequent guest appearances by Ernestine and Tiffany Jones. On Sunday, during the spring and summer, it's cookout time on the outdoor patio. The Country furnishes the fixin's and the mixin's. All you do is bring whatever you want to grill.

Located just around the corner from Austin Country is the Private Cellar (bet you'd never guess there is alot of traffic between the two). The time worn brick of the building that houses the bar helps to lend a cozy and elegant atmosphere to this popular cruise bar. The clientele tends to be mostly collegiate, however you can find all ages and types. They come to dance, drink, cruise, play pool, cruise, and generally enjoy themselves. The club has a beautiful outdoor, tree lined courtyard. On nice nights, the courtyard tends to be the hottest (and we don't mean Fahrenheit) part of the club. And if that "mid-summer night's yearning" is too much to resist—well...

The Private Cellar will soon be opening an excellent restaurant upstairs. The menu will include such things as Chateau Briogne for two, and a weekly special. Gentlemen can dine in style surrounded by period antiques and greenery. Service will also be available on the balcony that overlooks the courtyard below.

For the man's man, The New Apartment is the place to see and be seen. All types can be found there, however they tend to attract the more masculine, 25-35 crowd. Things you can look like you're doing while you're actually cruising that hunk across the bar include pool, pinball, and keeping an eye on aforementioned hunk. There is also a TV room that we were informed is not always used just for watching TV.

reviews other Gay magazines..!

As promised last month, we're going to review Gay publications. For some reason, this subject caused some consternation here at the **CRUISE** offices. Fears were voiced that we should not set ourselves up to criticize other publications because we are part of the "Gay press" and as open to 'review' as any of those that might be mentioned. So, in an effort to be as fair as possible, we are going to review **CRUISE**, too! Keep in mind that these reviews are the personal opinion of this reviewer and do not necessarily reflect the views of **CRUISE** or of any other staff member.

The Gay press has mushroomed in the past few years to the point that every major—and some minor—population areas have a Gay newspaper, magazine, give-away guide and/or newsletter to keep the Gay community informed, entertained and, in some instances, scandalized. This review section will explore local, regional and national publications. We'll be giving you addresses and prices of the publications we review and we urge you, if you are unfamiliar with the publications mentioned, to write to them and order a sample copy so you can make up your own mind.

THE ADVOCATE — 1730 S. Amphlett, San Mateo, California 94402. 1-year subscription: \$12. Issued bi- Single issue

price: 75 cents. Available *everywhere* (any newsstand worthy of the name now carries this publication—usually right next to the New York Times Sunday Edition... And it is also available in all adult bookstores and in many Gay bars). The Advocate used to be a little Gay newspaper that featured lots and lots of coverage of Gay events in California (yawn) and had 'stringers' all over the country who fed regional news to them in an effort to widen their scope. It fell like manna every two weeks on a national Gay audience that was **STARVED** for Gay news of any kind and who considered the Advocate as a bush-league New York Times for Gays. Well, things change. The Advocate was sold awhile back and the new owner has decided to make the Advocate more of a newspaper/magazine, kind of a combination Wall Street Journal/Christian Science Monitor/Time/After Dark and Variety. It's an interesting combination, but it's not the old trustworthy Advocate. I miss the "old" Advocate—but I wouldn't consider NOT reading the "new" Advocate. It is "must" reading for all Gay people.

BLUEBOY — 185 N.E. 166th St., Miami, Florida 33162. 1-year subscription: \$24.00. Issue monthly. Single-issue price: \$2.25. After a faltering start with their first issue (which was not only the ugliest Gay magazine ever issued, it was owned by other than the current owners and was then based in Washington, DC), Blueboy has gone on to become the most arty and soulless Gay publication on the market. It is incredibly "cool" in its presentation and goes so far to be "sophisticated" and "hip" that it's become an industry joke. Blueboy is **THE** magazine for those Gays (and straights) who insist on believing that old stereotype that Gays are, by nature, more "tasteful" than ANYBODY. The layouts are stunning, the artwork superb, the color overwhelming and the printing first-rate. But after "reading"

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one (through observation I have ascertained that almost no one actually READS Blueboy), you are left with the discomforting sensation of "...Gee, that's a pretty magazine, but it seems ...very overdone." Blueboy is the magazine you "display" on your coffee table along with the current After Dark and Christopher Street.

AFTER DARK — Box 950, Farmingdale, N.Y. 11737. 1-year subscription: \$14. Issued monthly. Single copy price: \$1.50. After Dark is, perhaps, the ultimate closeted Gay magazine. For years they even refused to print the word "Gay" — even though they were aware that 99% of their readers ARE. If you are interested in show business at all, this is the magazine for you. Beautiful photography, clean layouts, in-depth information and, now that they're obviously running scared from the competition evident in Blueboy, In Touch, Mandate et al, a little more "gaiety." After Dark is the foundation upon which almost all other glossy Gay magazines are built. It is important.

IN TOUCH — 1316 N. Western Ave. Los Angeles, Calif. 90027. 1-year subscription: \$12.00. Issued bi-monthly. Single copy price: \$2.00. This is a strange magazine to pin down. It features lots of truly interesting reading material, good-looking models and "inside info" on gossip show biz, but they need a more imaginative art director

(maybe they should hire Blueboy's and rein him in a bit). The magazine could be SO much better looking! Since In Touch has been around longer than most any other glossy Gay entertainment magazine, it seems obvious that Blueboy took the In Touch concept and ran the field with it. It's too bad In Touch didn't do the same. Overall, In Touch is a better, more informative and more fun-to-read magazine than Blueboy, but you'll never impress your friends with it... Frankly, I like the fact that In Touch's models look more like "real" guys than Blueboy's "posed & plastic" men.

MANDATE — 155 Avenue of the Americas, New York, NY 10013. 10-issue subscription goes for \$14.90. Issued monthly. Single issue price: \$1.50. Mandate's first incarnation was as "Dilettante" magazine which seemed to have a fetish on Rudolf Nureyev. (?), but, after a few issues, they changed the name, redirected the focus and are now just a rather tepid New York version of In Touch — with pinches of After Dark. Good photos, some interesting and eye-catching layouts, but, overall, too "New York."

CRUISE — Box 11987, Atlanta, GA 30355. 1-year subscription: \$15. Issued monthly. Single copy price on the newsstands: \$1.50 (but \$2.50 by mail to cover postage, etc.).

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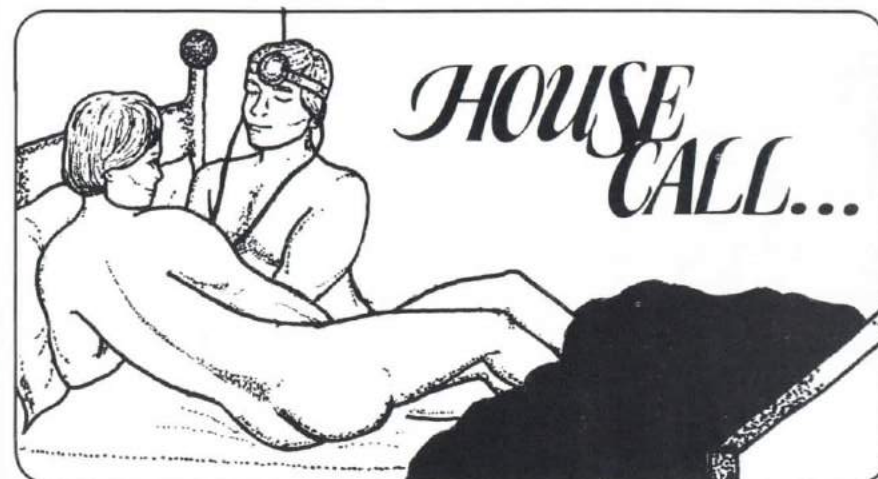
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it from a toilet seat or from any other source. Sex with someone else is the *only* way to get it. In men, symptoms of this disease are; burning sensation upon urination, a yellowish discharge from the penis and pain in the scrotum and surrounding area. Treatment is relatively simple and effective, but can *only* be undertaken by a physician.

In women, after an incubation period of 3 to 5 days, symptoms appear. These include painful and frequent urination plus a pronounced vaginal discharge. Again, under the treatment of a physician, this condition can be completely arrested.

Syphilis is a much more serious condition. After exposure to an infected person, the first sign of this condition is a hard, raised chancre (*pronounced 'shanker'*) which appears after about one month. The chancre is a hard, painless ulcer about 1cm. in diameter and has a thin watery discharge. In the male, the chancre usually appears on the penis, in women on the labia or cervix (which can and often is overlooked by the woman). But the chan-

cre can also appear on the lip, tongue, tonsil, or nipple. After a period of time, the chancre will disappear on its own. **THIS DOES NOT MEAN THE DISEASE IS GONE, BUT MEANS INSTEAD THAT THE CONDITION IS GETTING WORSE!**

Next we see a general rash followed by ulceration and then nervous system involvement. Treatment at the chancre stage consists of injection with a large dose of penicillin and is normally 100% effective. This disease is particularly important to have treated at the earliest stage possible! Medical textbooks are full of illustrations of those who chose to ignore it after their chancre(s) went away... They are truly grim. It's what killed Al Capone.

Although both conditions are serious, they are both easy to detect. A simple blood test every year (or every 6 months minimum if you are quite active sexually with a variety of partners) along with a routine physical once a year goes a long way in protecting you (and your friends) against these diseases.

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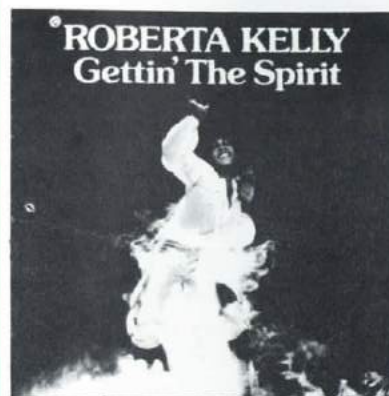
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
