"Stay Off Median." Does that mean you're not supposed to screw the fortune-teller? Oh, sorry, it's not "medium." Never mind.

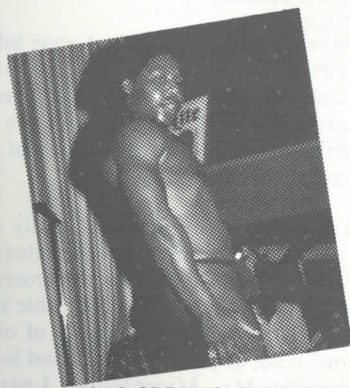

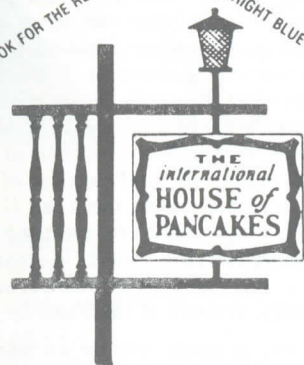

INFRARED LISTENING SYSTEM IS A HIT!

At the demonstration of the Alliance Theatre's new Infrared Listening System, in late October, praise for the new system was universal. The system's benefits for the hearing impaired and both the comfort and quality of sound of the headsets were lauded. In remarks after the demonstration, the following statements were made:

Michael Lomax, Chairman of the Fulton County Commissioners, said, "We first tried the Infrared Listening System when we brought 'Children of a Lesser God' to Atlanta a few years ago. I wasn't sure there would be enough interest for a

permanent system, but I'm a skeptic turned true believer. We look forward to making these events even more accessible. Bob Lower, Chairman of the Fulton County Arts Council, said, "I'm really pleased and proud that the Alliance Theatre has taken our suggestion and implemented it."

Andrew Witt, Managing Director of the Alliance Theatre Company, said, "It's a terrific piece of equipment and makes the theatre fully accessible to the 200,000 hearing impaired people who live in the greater Atlanta area."

Deborah Holten, Executive Director and President of Special Audiences, Inc., said, "I would strongly like to commend the Alliance Theatre for installing the Infrared Listening System. Special Audiences has been trying for years to encourage arts organizations to make their programs more accessible for disabled individuals."

The Infrared Listening System which was purchased with a grant from the Fulton County Arts Council adds a new dimension

already existing services for the handicapped at the Alliance. The theatre boasts easy wheelchair access, taped programs for the blind, a TTY unit in the box office so that the hearing impaired can place reservations for themselves, and regularly scheduled performances interpreted by Stage Hands, Inc.

The system presently has 20 headsets; more are expected to be added in the future. The headsets are available to patrons on a first come, first served basis. A fee of \$1 is charged for each use to offset maintenance costs. In addition, each user must leave a driver's license or credit card with the house manager as a deposit during the show, which will be returned upon return of the headset. Patrons wishing to use a headset, which works equally well anywhere in the theatre, should ask the house manager.
