YOUR RIGHTS: MONDALE VS. REAGAN



The November 6 election offers a **clear choice** for 17 million Gay and Lesbian voters. After more than three decades of civil rights battles, we have in **Walter Mondale** and **Geraldine Ferraro** candidates who are committed to our dignity as human beings and supportive of our civil rights.

Over a distinguished career as an attorney general, senator, and vice-president, **Walter Mondale** has fought for the civil rights of all Americans. Two years ago Mondale faced network television cameras to commit himself to Gay civil rights at the New York banquet of the Human Rights Campaign Fund.

Under **Mondale's leadership**, the Democratic Party has affirmed the rights of Gay people, both in its platform and its rules. Mondale supports S 430, the Senate Gay-rights bill. He is committed to increased support for the fight against AIDS. The Mondale platform calls for an end to discrimination against Gays both in immigration and in the military.

In contrast, under **Ronald Reagan's leadership**, the Republican Party has become the party of **Jerry Falwell** and the **Moral Majority**. Indeed, the 1984 Republican Party platform is the most **radical** of any major party in this century; it promises to impose on America the social views of the **most backward** fundamentalist preachers and Catholic hierarchy.

Ronald Reagan's administration is undermining **your** civil rights and liberties:

Item: Reagan's Justice Department has directed the Assistant Secretary for Health to resume classifying foreign Gay people as **psychopaths**.

Item: Reagan's Defense Department increased discharges of Gay people from the military by 35%.

Item: A Reagan-appointed federal judge has just upheld the Defense Department's discharge of Gays, a decision that attacks the **right to privacy of Gay people**. This same judge is being prominently mentioned as Reagan's next appointee to the Supreme Court.

If Reagan is re-elected, he will probably appoint a majority of the justices to the Supreme Court. The justices will sit not for a few years, but for life. Such a Reagan Court could well return us to the closeted Fifties when Gay people were purged from government-related jobs by the hundreds on mere suspicion.

Despite the polls, it is still early in the campaign. We owe it to ourselves as Lesbians and Gay men, as Americans, to help shape the outcome of this campaign.

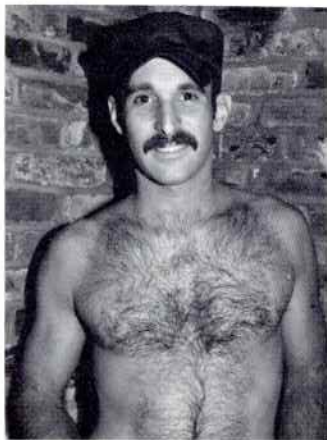

**DEAR

Now, children, on these festive days, if we have a word to be heard, why not float a note to Dear Diamond Lil, c/o Cruise Weekly, 729 Piedmont Ave. NE, Atlanta, GA 30308. Remember, your airing is caring!!

Dear Diamond,

I am an attractive, 19-year-old, gay male. My problem may seem very ridiculous to you but is very serious to me. I read your column every month and respect your opinions. My story starts about 2½ years ago when I was sixteen and very inexperienced. I had one or two schoolmates who were gay, but that was it. One of my friends who was gay found out about a man in our town (Redlands, CA) that was gay. This was a big deal to us then, so I convinced him to give me the telephone number. I called, and a man answered. He sounded very mature and very nice. After talking a short while, he offered to come to pick me up so we could see each other.

I said yes right away. When we went in his house, we sat and talked for about half an hour before he decided he wanted to put on a gay video. When my eyes saw the screen, I flipped. I was horny; we seemed to attack each other. Once I got home I completely put him out of my mind for some reason and never called him back.

About a month later, I called him as a last hope for a place to stay because my father kicked me out. He had found out I was gay. K___ (the man's name) said I could live with him at least until I finished school.

We had a weird kind of relationship for about six months, with me moving in and out and him kicking me out, then asking me back. He was starting to get mad at me for even thinking about other guys, like he was jealous, yet he was seeing guys himself. I had found out about the "gay scene" and was living it up. He would bring home boys who were younger than me and I was sixteen. I started to find out things about him like; he was very chintzy about spending money on even himself; he was 36; and he like young boys. He seemed to want no strings, and I really didn't either. I figured, "I'm young enough for this guy to want me around," so I took full advantage of it.

After the first six months, he started taking me places like Disneyland, Mexico, and to small things like dinner. I seemed to always find a guy to flirt with or pick up on and that really started to piss K___ off. During this last 6 months I also found out K___ had two lovers before he met me; (1) G___ for four years, and (2) T___ for five. He met them both at sixteen and spit on their requests to stay when they both reached about 20 or 21.

K___ had to move out of state about one year after I met him. I said, "Goodbye." Well, he was offended and hurt that I could just say goodbye; but I wasn't moving from where I had live my whole life. Besides, my father came around after my mother talked to him.

About two to three months later, I got kicked out of my father's house again. I had nowhere to go, so I called K___ at his new number and said, "I need help." So, he sent me enough money to take a bus to Montgomery, Alabama, where he was. I was kind of stuck once I got there, because I know nobody. K___ was sweet, he really tried everything to make me happy. I began to feel needed for him (note - need). He took me to Atlanta, New Orleans, and even New York. I, again, flirted and even went off with a guy in one city.

I could go on for pages of all the things K___ has done for me like; clothes, flowers, cars, diamonds, even Europe; but I feel so insecure. It's like I know it will be over around 20 or 21, when I get too old for him. I love him more than I've ever loved anyone. He is my first true love. I cook, clean, practically live for him. He makes me feel so mature. But, I get confused on why he wants me to be mature if he likes young guys. He doesn't deny the fact he thinks they're cute but he says he'll love me forever. We'll be together 2½ years on December '88, and I'm buying him a diamond wedding band to match the one he bought me. Can I put that ring on his finger and say forever, or is it when I've lost K___ I know I'll have lost my youth?

Dear "Unsure,"

I find your problem not in the least bit ridiculous; and believe me, there are many others out there who will relate.

Of course, you're feeling insecure with this relationship; and I'll bet ol' K___ is feeling the same way. You see, it is a relationship of dependency. 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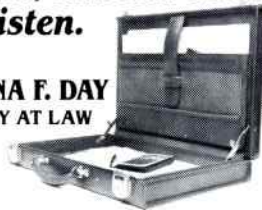

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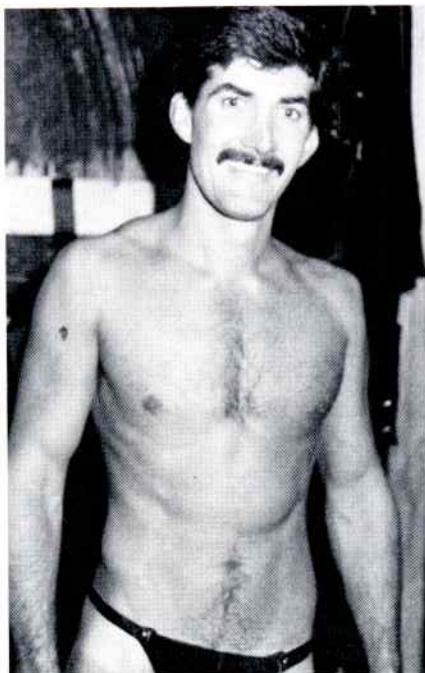
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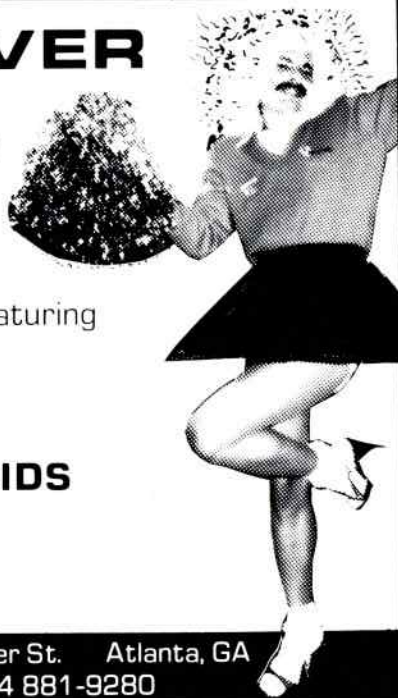

As a necessary consequence of that timely addition to the national legal structure, the auction of persons on the block ceased to be a force in the American marketplace. Admittedly not fully in the spirit of that amendment, Brother, Help Thyself on September 30th sold manflesh for public consumption at the Exile. Six men offered the sale of their bodies on the block for the purely charitable motivations of the BHT movement.

The body auction was one of a series of BHT events occurring on Round Robin Sunday, the final day of the month-long series of charitable fund raisers to provide revenues for various gay non-profit organizations.

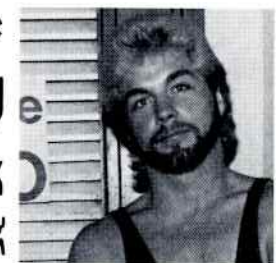

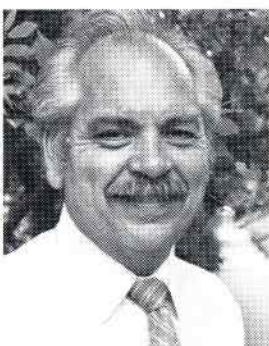

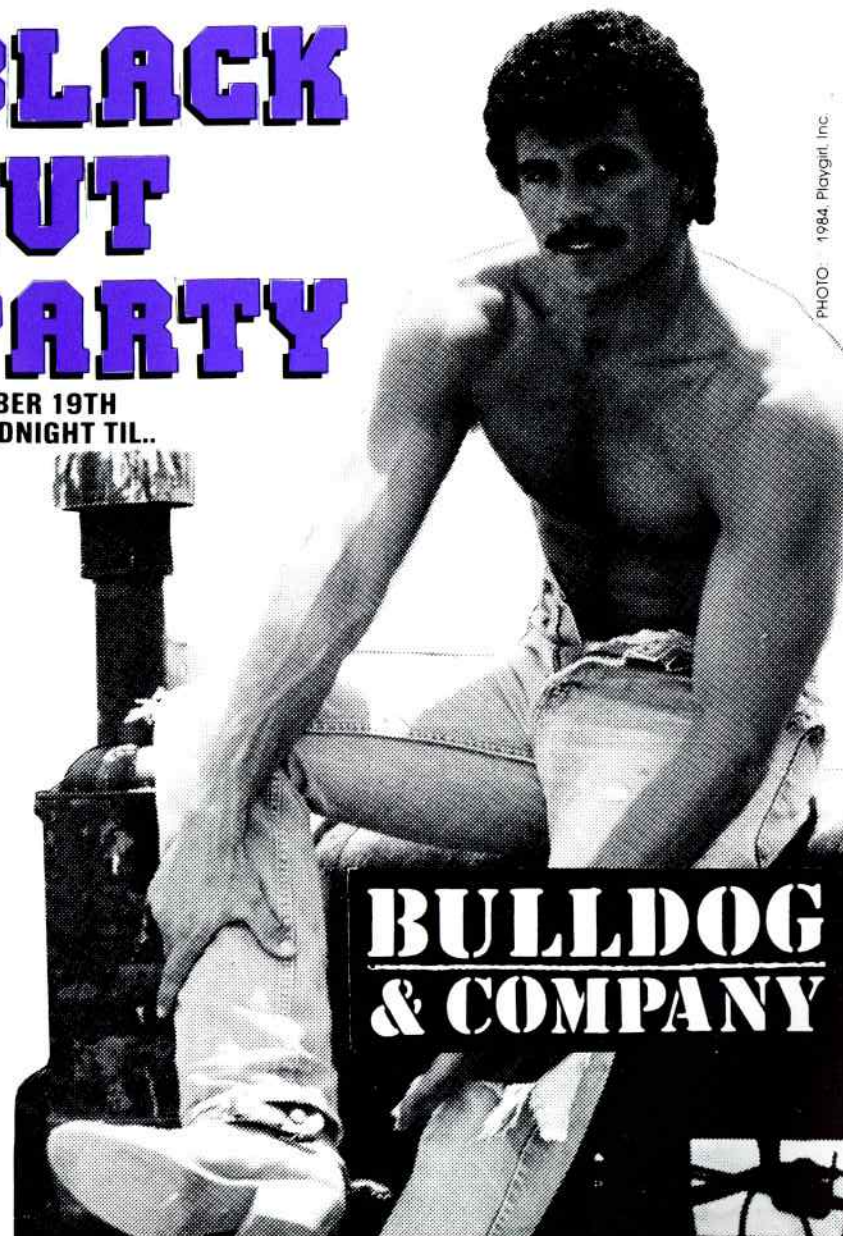
