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NARROW DEFEAT OF ABA RESOLUTION SEEN AS VICTORY

Lesbian and gay civil rights activists Dan Bradley, Robert Bauman, Abby Rubenfeld, Steve Endean and Frank Scheuren were not surprised when delegates at the 1983 American Bar Association convention defeated a resolution to oppose discrimination against homosexuals at the Atlanta Hilton Tuesday. What did surprise them was the margin of defeat — the resolution failed by 24 votes; 158-134. "We thought it was going to be two to one," said Frank Scheuren. "It's phenomenally close," said Bauman. "Wait till next year."

Bradley, a Miami attorney and member of the ABA, had worked hard for the resolution that would "have substantial impact on lesbian/gay civil rights legislation" if it had passed. His strategy included obtaining endorsements from several fellow attorneys and activists, as well as writing the resolution in the "blandest terms possible."

"We are not asking for an endorsement of a lifestyle," Bradley reminded the delegates before the voting took place. "We are asking for equal civil rights for all citizens."

Speaking for the opposing viewpoint, an attorney from Oklahoma inveighed the wrath of God and the crumbling of the American Republic. "Next thing you know they'll be nominating Gerry Studds for President," he warned in all seriousness.

"That was one of the best anti-gay speeches I've heard in the last ten years," Endean admitted. "The man was quite simian (ape-like) in his thinking," Bauman observed. Speakers of both viewpoints were given sparse but polite applause from the predominantly conservative male

crowd. Perhaps one-quarter of the delegates were women.

The resolution failed on the third round of voting. A voice vote and hand vote were too close to call so delegates were asked to stand and be counted. Bradley, who is a member of the Board of Directors of the Gay Rights National Lobby, left shortly afterwards for a commitment in California. He is expected to introduce a similar resolution to the ABA next year.

Earlier, Rubenfeld joined Bauman in support of the resolution in the Crystal Ballroom of the

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FIRST TUESDAY HOSTS ENDEAN AND BAUMAN

Former U.S. Representative Robert Bauman and Steven Endean, director of the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL), were guests at the August meeting of the First Tuesday Association at the Atlanta Gay Center this week. About fifty people attended the meeting.

Both Endean and Bauman answered questions about past and present controversies. Endean claimed that recent criticism that he has received from the Advocate publisher David Goodstein and free-lance writer Larry Bush stem from his decision not to retain activist Jim Foster on the GRNL staff.

"Goodstein said that I would pay for that decision," Endean allowed. The Board of Directors of GRNL have rallied to Endean's defense, while Endean says he is discouraged but not defeated by the infighting among leaders and potential leaders of the lesbian and gay civil rights movement. "The last eight months have been hard," he admitted. Apparently Goodstein would like to see GRNL and the National Gay Task Force unite into one organization with himself in a position to be "the power behind the throne." A reporter for the *Philadelphia Gay News* made that analysis recently. Endean said it has been "enormously frustrating" to have to choose between "doing the job or raising money. Contrary to some media reports, our choice was to do the job."

However the fundraising arm of GRNL, a political action committee (PAC) known as the Human Rights Campaign Fund, raised over \$600,000 and became the 17th largest PAC in its first year. Those funds primarily went to help elect supporters of lesbian and gay civil rights legislation.

GRNL has adapted to the need for increased lobbying caused by the AIDS epidemic, according to Endean. "The AIDS issue has expanded on us," he said. GRNL has garnered over 70 sponsors for the House Lesbian/Gay Civil Rights Bill and has over 50 sponsors for an immigration bill that would allow lesbians and gays entrance into this country.

Bauman said that lesbian/gay civil rights is "something that will eventually triumph because it is the right thing to do." He warned that if "rights are parceled out on the basis of whether a group is moral or immoral, then we are in trouble." Bauman also predicted that a resolution which supports legislation banning discrimination against homosexuals will "certainly" pass at next year's meeting of the American Bar Association.

Bauman also admitted to being a recovered alcoholic. "I haven't had a drink in over three years," he said. "Through counseling I've learned that drinking was a reaction to not dealing with the fact that I was gay." His personal odyssey will remain private, however.

Although he was commissioned by a publisher to write a book on his experience, he discontinued the project after one chapter because "it was too painful."

"I'm not going back to 1980 to relive that part of my life," Bauman said. He also said he has no plans to ever run for office again. He is happy enough being a "Reagan

Republican" and an openly gay activist. "I'm happier than I've ever been in my life."

ACTIVIST SEEKS FBI RECORDS ON GAY GROUPS

Dan Siminoski, a political science professor and civil rights activist, is tentatively scheduled to visit Atlanta August 7th through 14th in part of a nationwide search for information of the FBI's surveillance of gay and minority organizations.

In addition to working with Atlanta's gay community, he plans to work with the Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Non-Violent Change on "questions relating to FBI surveillance of Dr. King and the civil rights movement."

Siminoski has filed a Freedom of Information request seeking FBI files on homosexual organizations covering 32 years. "The disclosures will indicate a positive public scandal, and that scandal is a civil rights scandal" he said.

He hopes to "rebuild" the history of the gay movement in the United States from the "Dark Ages" of the 1950's to the present and to give contemporary homosexuals a sense of community and self-esteem. His quest is being supported by the American Civil Liberties Union and other national and state organizations.

MCC OFFERS "SNOOPY"

Last week Metropolitan Community Church (MCC) of Atlanta kicked off a building fundraising drive for the renovation of the church property at 800 N. Highland. The focus at this stage is the presentation of two benefit performances of the musical "Snoopy!!!" a sequel to the show "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown." Like "Charlie Brown," this show is a series of vignettes suggested by the comic strip, "Peanuts."

Reprising their roles from "Charlie Brown" will be Valerie Anthony as the "super crab," Lucy; Bob McJunkin as everyone's favorite, Charlie Brown; and Randall Willis as Snoopy. The show is directed by Tom Harmon with Jeff McIntyre, the director of the Atlanta Gay Men's Chorus serving as musical director.

According to Leonard Wirkus, advertising chairman, "The warm and hospitable response which we have received nearly everywhere, took us somewhat by surprise. ARSONIST DESTROYS LADIES ROOM AT THE STUD

An arsonist set fire to the ladies room at the Stud last Thursday, sending customers out to the streets as smoke filled the new bar at 567 Ponce de Leon Ave. A rain-soaked roof and a quick-thinking manager kept damages to a minimum, said Stud owner Bill Sanders. A

suspect has been identified by several eyewitnesses and the Atlanta Fire Department is investigating. The Atlanta Police Department filled out a report on the incident.

The Stud, formerly Frank's Conference Room, was launching a membership drive last week when a customer, described as "not all there," was seen running from the premises. The doorman recalled that the man had become agitated when asked to produce identification to gain admission to the bar. According to manager Roger Jett, the night-soot quickly filled with smoke. "It would have been a lot worse if we hadn't acted accordingly," said Jett. The fire was started in a ceiling above the ladies restroom. It was quickly doused by a fire extinguisher. "It was definitely arson," said Sanders. Fortunately for the customers inside the Stud, water had saturated the roof that week while it was being renovated. "It just made a lot of smoke," added Jett. The fire caused a minimal amount of damage but much of the bathroom had to be replaced, Sanders said. He has no idea why anyone would want to start a fire in the ladies room of his club. His employees will remain on their toes, however. "I'm sure we'll be pressing charges when the suspect is arrested," said Jett. "We can't have someone setting fires."

THE UNPUBLICIZED EPIDEMIC—GAY ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE TO BE FEATURED

Next week in *Cruise* Newsmagazine the Atlanta Gay Center Mental Health Advisory Committee will launch a weekly series on alcohol and drug abuse in the gay community. The series will run through September and will be aided by a series of posters which will be distributed in the community room. The coordinators of the project will culminate their work with a workshop at the Atlanta Gay Center October 8.

"One in four" gay people have a serious alcohol or drug abuse problem," according to Harly Strickland, a social worker who will edit the upcoming series. Strickland is in private practice at the Grandview Therapy Clinic in Buckhead and is a member of the AGC's Mental Health Advisory Committee. He hopes to deal with drug and alcohol abuse problems in the gay community with educating people about preventive measures. As one of his posters says, "We can't stagger to freedom!"

RICH'S EXECS SQUASH ANTI-GAY REPORTS

An anti-gay remark said to have been made in a meeting of department heads of Rich's Lenox Square has apparently been squashed. "We checked it out," said Ann Berd, Rich's Corporate Public Relations Director. "It's very difficult to combat an anonymous source," Berd said, "it's like an anonymous letter." According to Jeff Nuzum, *Cruise* staff member, a "reliable source" told him that Chuck Frew, Rich's Lenox Square General Manager recently told his department heads to stop hiring gays. "He never said any such thing," Berd told *Cruise*. Berd said that Frew's response was, "It's a false rumor or a lie." According to Berd, Rich's official policy is to hire people based on their qualifications, without regard to race or sex, so long as they "conduct themselves in an orderly manner." "We hire all kinds of people," she added, "and welcome our customers without restrictions."

MANATT ADDRESSES LESBIAN AND GAY CAUCUS

Democrat party chairman Charles Manatt addressed the 13-member Lesbian and Gay Caucus of the Democratic National Committee at its first formal meeting on July 14 in Detroit.

Manatt's pledge of continued cooperation and support was also echoed by other senior DNC staff who visited the caucus, including Executive Director Mike Steed, political director Ann Lewis and 1984 Convention Chair Ros Wymann.

The caucus membership, which is open to any DNC member who actively supports the party's commitment to gay rights, expressed its appreciation to the chairman and his staff for the positive and cooperative spirit which the DNC has increasingly demonstrated since the inclusion of gay rights in the 1980 democratic platform.

The Lesbian and Gay Caucus was established by a unanimous vote of the DNC Executive Committee in early February of this year. Over twenty percent of the members of the Democratic National Committee - including 21 state chairs and vice chairs - signed a petition urging its formation. The DNC signatures were collected by local lesbian and gay political groups in 23 states.

Dick Hinson, a gay farmer from northern Minnesota and a member of the DNC, serves as caucus chair. Since February, two Democratic chairs have also joined.

Leaders of the National Association of Gay and Lesbian Democratic Clubs, a national network of gay political organizations in 46

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states which coordinated formation of the caucus, also participated in the caucus meeting. Others in attendance included Chris Riddiough, director of the Lesbian Rights office of the National Organization for Women, and Richard Anthony, Executive Director of the Michigan Organization for Human Rights.

Peter Vogel, co-chair of the National Association of Gay and Lesbian Democratic Clubs, pledged to work closely with the members of the caucus and the DNC in strengthening the lesbian and gay community's role in electing supportive Democratic candidates in 1984.

Jack Campbell, Southern Regional Vice Chair of the National Association announced that the next meeting of the Executive Committee will be held in Miami in December 1983.

hotel. The Executive Director of the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund (LLDEF), Rubinfeld gave an overview of the ten-year-old effort of her organization to support lesbian/gay civil rights. Housing, employment, immigration and First Amendment protection were listed among current legal cases handled by the LLDEF. The group is also fighting sodomy laws in Georgia and Texas; and supporting the efforts of attorneys involved in those fights. Rubinfeld said, "Other current legal battles being waged by the LLDEF include military (U.S. v. Joanne Newak, U.S. Air Force), relationships, and student groups. Rubinfeld also directs a recently developed information program for "the bar, the judiciary and the general public."

Bauman for the first time publicly admitted his sexual orientation before the gathering of local and national news media. An admitted conservative who served in the House of Representatives from 1973 to 1981 and founder of both the American Conservative Union and the Young Americans for Freedom, Bauman also stated his unqualified support for lesbian and gay civil rights legislation. "I am still a political conservative; and yes, I am gay," Bauman also admitted he had let his ABA Membership expire because "it was becoming too liberal. If they pass this resolution, I'll reconsider," he added. That statement was met with confused laughter.

Bauman cited his own experience of gay discrimination. "Your average attorney, like myself, with a degree in economics and international relations, a doctorate in law, three years in the Senate and nearly eight years in the Congress would ordinarily have few problems in finding employment upon leaving public office. A parliamentary wizard who could silence Bella Abzug and hot-tie Tip O'Neill must have some utility, wouldn't you think?" he asked. "The answer is no, if you are gay, or thought to be gay, or if there is even a hint that you might be gay. I am an optimist yet I am not unaware of the arrogance of old ideas." Bauman said that lesbians and gays do not ask for approval, condescension or even sympathy. "We simply and plainly demand that we, as citizens of the United States, be accorded our full legal and constitutional rights, and we will gain that inevitable triumph."

Bauman was repeatedly grilled about his leadership in the "Conservative Right" in a press conference following his remarks. He accused the *New York Times* of inaccuracy

in labeling him as "an outspoken critic" of gay rights while serving as a Republican representative of Maryland in the Congress. "I never spoke out against gay civil rights," Bauman said. "I did vote for the Family Protection Act and for two McDonal amendments," he added. "I was wrong; we all make mistakes; forgive me."

Bauman does not plan to move to San Francisco as the *New York Times* reported; neither is he separated from his family — two children still live with him in Maryland. Bauman claimed that the Roman Catholic Church "forced the self-

realization process" which he has worked through for the last three years. Bauman is also a recovered alcoholic. "I hope to encourage others to face themselves and to live their lives as God made them."

Bauman spoke with Frank Scheuren, President of Dignity (an organization for lesbian and gay Catholics), about joining that organization. Endean, who is Executive Director of the Gay Rights National Lobby (GRNL), announced that Bauman will begin serving GRNL on a pro bono (no cost) basis. Bauman will serve as a lobbyist on Capitol Hill, Endean said.

I'd like to thank Stuart for this opportunity to share my opinions with Cruise readers. About a month ago, I heard someone talking about the skills of a Disc Jockey. I would like to straighten out some popular misconceptions.

Fazing: This is an effect which simulates a tunnel sound in the music. It is done using two copies of the same record going at exactly the same speed. Some of the sounds cancel and produce a faze. There is no magic button on the mixer to produce this effect. The work is done by the D.J.

Echoing: This effect is recognized a lot more often than fazing, but is equally difficult. This involves taking two copies of the same record and running them exactly a certain number of beats apart. The result is the artist repeating himself on beat.

An **Overlay** is the mixing of two songs with both songs having equal volume and being on the beat.

A **Slam** is having one song suddenly disappear while a new song takes its place on beat. The emphasis of a slam is the sudden transfer.

I've gone over these with the hope that you will listen a little more carefully to your favorite D.J.s and will learn to appreciate their work more than before. If you have any questions feel free to get in touch with me. Next week, I'll be discussing some of the interactions between the customer and the D.J.

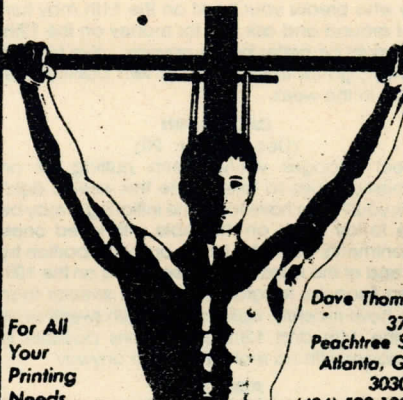
