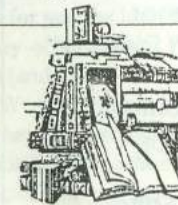

From the Editor

In February I was on a sales trip to Houston. There were three other people with me on the way down and we were discussing politics. One of these women and I have always sat on opposite sides of the political camp, but we were discussing politics anyway. Out of the clear blue sky, her girl friend said, "I've never voted, but I will, if you will tell me who to vote for". It has always been against my principles to tell anyone how to vote, what to do, how to live, etc..

I won't tell you how to vote, but I will try to direct your thinking on some issues that are important to our future and let you decide who can best serve your purpose.

The first thing we must do is keep in mind that a Republican administration has been in office for eight years. Now, the primary force behind the Republicans is a strong defense and a sound economy, both of which the Democrats always remain vague on and it gives lots of voters cold feet. Let's face it, we all want a strong economy. And the other negative side of the Democrats is that wild domestic social spending. They give hand-outs to everybody - right?

Well, just think about what the Republican have done for you the last eight years. We do have a strong defense. Of course it is riddled with bribes and pay-offs at the top. We have a space program that has been grounded for the last two years and may (and I do mean may) get off the ground in October. We have the biggest trade deficit in history. We are living on borrowed foreign money. We slid through the October stock market crash, but they slid through it in '29 too. It is after the new President takes office that we will discover what kind of shape the economy is really in. That is when the market always turns down. Some questions to consider: Do you want another Republican appointed Supreme Court Justice? I think not! I realize that the Supreme Court doesn't mean much to most people, but it does make the laws in this country. Women's rights are in trouble, gay rights are in trouble, abortion is in trouble, affirmative action is in trouble, and the outlook for AIDS patients isn't good if there is another Republican appointed Supreme Court Justice. How do you feel about the environment? Is your job secure? Are you really any better off financially than you were before 1980?

I don't want anybody to tell me how to live. Unfortunately, one of our political parties seems to think that if you aren't white, upper middle class, married with 2.5 children and the mother at home, you're voice does not count.

No, Randi, I still won't tell you who to vote for, but I hope you will vote because in any given election between 40% and 60% of the voters stay home. Our community is between 10% and 20% of the population. Hell yes, we can make a difference. It is simple arithmetic.

National Coming Out Day Oct. 11

SAN FRANCISCO - The National Gay Rights Advocates and The Experience Weekend are coordinating efforts to make "National Coming Out Day" (NCOD) a success. The event will be a reminder to all lesbians and gay men that the time has come to go forward in the campaign for civil rights, the time has come for them to "take their next step."

To excite gay and lesbian organizations in local communities, the organizing body of NCOD has begun a large scale campaign of its own. The national media has been put on alert and "Coming Out Kits" have been mailed to organizations nationwide.

NCOD encourages every gay man and lesbian to "Take their next step" this October 11th, a step that for each individual is intensely personal.

Marine Corporal Jailed

PARRIS ISLAND, SC - Marine Corporal Barbara Baum, 23, was convicted on charges of having sex with another woman and sentenced to a one year prison sentence. Corporal Baum was

sentenced on June 10, 1988 at the Parris Island Marine Corps Recruit Training Depot for committing indecent acts with women, sodomy, and obstruction of justice.

Corporal Baum is the first woman to be court-martialed on sex charges. Of the four women investigated, one has been discharged in lieu of court-martial and three others have been discharged.

Corporal Baum's conviction is part of an ongoing investigation of lesbianism at Parris Island that is a result of a report published last fall which mentioned lesbianism among Marine Corp women. The Defense Advisory Committee on Women in the Service issued the report.

Major General Joseph Hoar, the Parris Island Base Commander, will review Corporal Baum's case. The sentence can either be reduced or "let stand", but not increased. After Major General Hoar reviews the case, it automatically goes to the Navy and Marine Court of Military Review in Washington for review.

The National Gay and Lesbian Task Force is urging lesbians and gay men to protest this discrimination by the military.

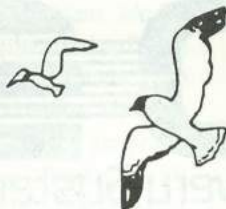

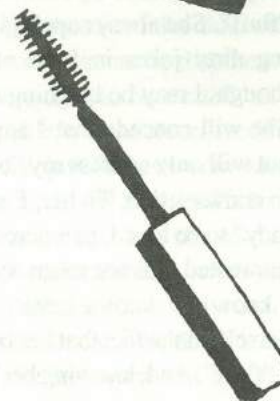

She will concede that I am intelligent but will only address my "butch" lover in conversation. To her, I am a "pretty lady" to be loved, pampered, and complimented, but not taken seriously. I know she knows better. She prides herself on the fact that her best friend is a "fluff". And, knowing her best friend,

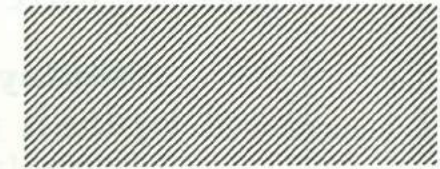
it is unlikely that she gets away with her chauvinistic attitudes without at least some comment.

Yes, I have many labels. So do we all. Just keep in mind that they come as a package deal, you can't have one without all the others. And you can't decide to forget the one about me that you don't like.

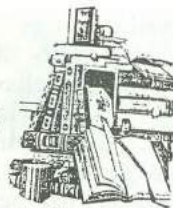

A Discussion of Lesbian Literature Both New and Old

This month T. Sumner Reviews:

Cherished Love

by Evelyn Kennedy

Last September

by Helen R. Hull

This month I am going to review two very different books. The first is pure romance - no murder or mayhem or intrigue, just romance. The second is a truly wonderful collection of short stories from the early part of this century. We'll start with Cherished Love by Evelyn Kennedy (Naiad Press, Inc., \$8.95). The story revolves around Dr. Megan McKenzie who has recently lost her lover, Ellen, to a car accident. Into the midst of her shock and grief comes attorney Randall Grayson who is trying to settle the affairs of Ellen's estate. Randall is married but intensely interested in her new client.

As the relationship between Megan and Randall grows deeper, Megan's best friend Lynn looks on with dismay. Megan scoffs at her warnings about

being involved with a married woman - until they both find out what Randall's husband has planned.

Cherished Love is not only a very idealistic romantic adventure, it's main character is a woman of unbelievable perfection. Megan is not only rich, she's beautiful, intelligent to the point of genius and so emotionally correct that she comes across as cold. This changes towards the end of the book as we get a glimpse of her humanity and the loving woman she was meant to be. Although I was sometimes annoyed at the unswerving perfection of Megan, overall I enjoyed this book. Like a prime-time soap opera, I couldn't wait to find out if Randall would leave her husband, if Megan would pay any attention if she did and how it would all

turn out at the end.

Next, we switch to Last September, seven short stories written by Helen R. Hull and edited by Patricia McClelland Miller (Naiad Press, Inc., \$8.95). Ms. Hull was born in 1888. She participated in women's suffrage parades, lived with another woman and never married. Her stories reflect not only the era in which they were written but the confusion that comes from being a strong woman in a world controlled by mothers and men.

Two of the stories focus on a young girl's attraction to the older women in her community and the trouble it brought. Rumors and accusations, hurt feelings and remorse. The final story, Last September, revolves around two women at the end of their lives who find

each other again and for the last time. These are not stories about lesbianism although it is implied at times. These are stories about women in a different time. The struggles and the joys. Mainly they are about decisions and relationships.

I found them superbly written and very interesting as well as entertaining. Ms. Hull published 17 novels, four books on writing and 65 short stories. She also worked full-time at Columbia University where she taught creative writing. Last September and Cherished Love are both available for \$8.95 from Naiad Press, Inc., P.O.
