Great Justifications

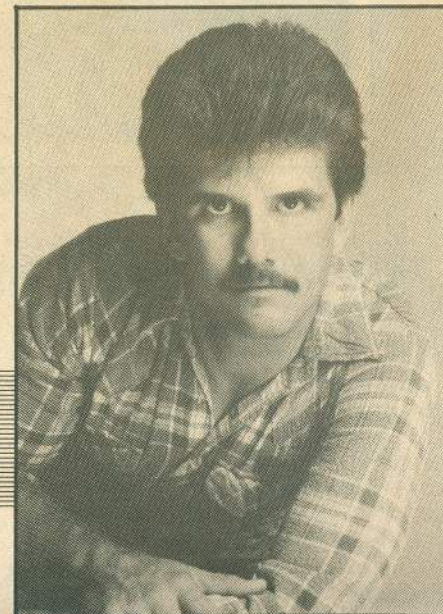
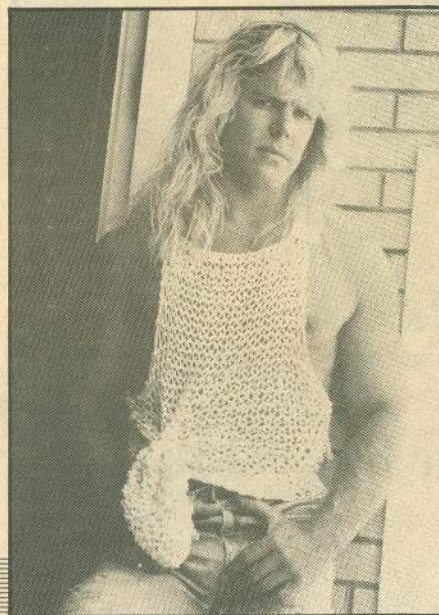

Anonymous Group Attacks Whitmire

A group calling itself Concerned Houstonians for AIDS Action, sent 830 "birthday cards" to Mayor Kathy Whitmire of Houston, which read, "Happy Birthday Mayor! 830 people in Houston will not be celebrating another Birthday. They have died of AIDS. Hundreds more will die before your next birthday. While you are celebrating, thousands of people in Houston are fighting for their lives and you continue to turn your back on them."

"Mayors in other cities have given money and time. They have been leaders... They Care. Why Don't You."

Stamped on the card in red was, "YOUR SILENCE IS DEADLY."

Whoever sent the cards also sent out a press release with no address or phone number that slammed the mayor for her lack of response to the crisis and praised the mayors of New York, San Francisco and Los Angeles for using "their positions of leadership to see that their general constituency is educated and the needs of people with AIDS in their city are addressed..." Gays contacted in those other cities did not completely agree with the secret writer's assessment.

Said Larry Kramer (author of *The Normal Heart*) in New York, "I don't think any mayor anywhere has been on top of this. I blame Mayor Koch personally here in New York for the extent of the epidemic."

Eric Rofes, executive director of Gay/Lesbian Services in Los Angeles said that their mayor "has been very strong and very good, but our city government is arranged very differently from Houston's."

In conjunction with the story about the cards sent to the mayor and the anonymous

press release, *The Forum* asked the Mayor's Office, "What response has the mayor had to the AIDS crisis in Houston?" Paul Mabry of the office said that he would give us a run-down of all the things that Whitmire had done, but later called back to say that the mayor had decided instead to call a general press conference to give a statement in the matter. He said that no date had been set for the press conference.

FORUM OPINION: It is pretty low to send out anonymous attacks on people, even if there might be a basis of justification for the attacks. It is also our opinion that the mayor is accountable to the people who elected her, and those people have the right to have concerns addressed. We think it's time to take her on another bar tour. Perhaps she'd detect a difference in attitude this time.

Dallas and Houston Clinics Closed

State District Judge Saroly Wood granted a temporary injunction this week to close down clinics in Houston and Dallas run by William Hitt that treated allergy and AIDS patients with injections of their own purified urine.

Rose Anne Reeser of the state attorney general's office said that Hitt was in violation of the Texas food and drug act. "The judge ruled it (the purified urine) was a new drug and was being sold," said Reeser. She added, "He was making false claims as to the benefits the drugs could offer. And he was making false claims as to the professional qualifications of the staff. He had people in there giving injections that were called 'nurses' who were not nurses."

However, patients who had been taking the treatments were upset with the ruling. Joe Porro, of Aid for AIDS in Houston, said hours after the ruling, "I've gotten five calls already from people who said, 'Great, they've just signed my death warrant'" One PWA was with Porro but was too upset to talk.

Hitt was infuriated by the ruling and said that he was losing money by treating AIDS patients in the clinic, because most of them lost insurance and jobs after it was discovered that they had AIDS. Said Hitt, "If you're losing money doing something, what logical reason do you have for doing it unless you're helping someone?"

He also slammed the attorney general's office and the judge for claiming that the injections of urine were to be thought of as a drug. He said that anything that was a substance from the body could not be considered a drug. Hitt also stated that purified urine injections have been used to treat allergy patients for over 15 years. He



pointed out, "We have given over one million injections, and we have never had a reaction that was adverse."

He said that there was nothing wrong with calling the trained medical assistants on his staff nurses, and that most allergy shots were, in fact, given by people at home on a regular basis all over the world.

In the meantime, no trial date has been set, and the clinics will remain closed until such time as Hitt can be cleared of charges.

Because of the treatments being stopped, many of those who testified on Hitt's behalf have become quite despondant. "That's a very difficult thing in health fraud cases," said Reeser, "because there are always people who are taken in by the claims."

Said Hitt, "I don't have any trouble looking at myself in the mirror. I hope the rest of them can say the same."

Fake Letter Shakes Dallas Organization

DALLAS—A letter sent to several gay newspapers around Texas that purported to be a confession from a former Emperor and Empress of the Sovereign Court of the People, a social and charitable club, that they had benefitted personally and financially from charity drives has been labled a fraud.

Three different members of the current United Sovereign Council of Texas explained the breakdown of expenses for their benefits and said that no more than 30% of any

benefit was used for running expenses and that no person was given money from the funds raised.

Dennis Dale Darcy, who was one of the two people named in the letter as defrauding the community, said, "Whoever did this is very vicious." He has reported the letter to both the police department and the district attorney's office and said that he will personally persue the matter to find out who was behind it.



Clinical Trials to Begin for AIDS Vaccine

Beginning in October, the first human trials for an AIDS vaccine approved for experimental use will begin in Washington.

Micro-Genesis, Inc., the company that is testing the vaccine, said that they will need 81 healthy volunteers for the study, and that they are looking for mostly gay men. Anyone wishing to volunteer should call (301) 496-7196.

The first phase of testing will take six months and will determine if there are any side effects to the vaccine, which is made

from the outer coating of the AIDS virus itself. Phase II of the trials will take from one to one-and-a-half years, while the last phase, which will determine if the vaccine is effective in protecting those vaccinated, will last for several years.

Even though the new vaccine looks promising, it will be up to 10 years before it would be available for general use.

In the meantime, other companies are still investigating other vaccines and possible cures.

Authorities Panic about False Positive

MARLIN—Falls County District Attorney Thomas Sehon admitted on Tuesday that his office had based their headline-grabbing search for children who could have possible come in contact with the AIDS virus through sexual acts with Glenn Ethridge on a false-positive HIV test done in the initial autopsy.

Ethridge was killed in an altercation with a teenage boy who had been living with him. When police investigated, they found considerable evidence that Ethridge was a child molester.

When the initial report came back from the autopsy, they immediately began a much-publicized search for anyone who had come in contact with the deceased despite the fact that the Dallas County medical examiner told them that further tests were being done to determine whether Etheridge did indeed have AIDS or even carry the virus.

On Monday, they released a report that stated that the further tests showed negative results. Said the report, "It is our opinion, in view of the forgoing tests, that the deceased showed no evidence of having AIDS. In addition, there is no demonstrable evidence of his having been exposed to the virus causing AIDS."

Sehon told *The Forum* that the youth was not being charged in Ethridge's death and said, "I've left the whole think up to the Texas Department of Health."

Smokers Beware

The risk of developing lung cancer is 10 times greater for smokers than for non-smokers, says the American Cancer Society. Those who smoke two or more packs of cigarettes daily are 15 to 25 times more likely to develop lung cancer than non-smokers.

Bartender's Killer Convicted

* HOUSTON—Samual Joe Piraino, 47, was convicted of voluntary manslaughter in the shooting death of Brett Jeffery Grossman, who had been a bartender at Kindred Spirits on Richmond.

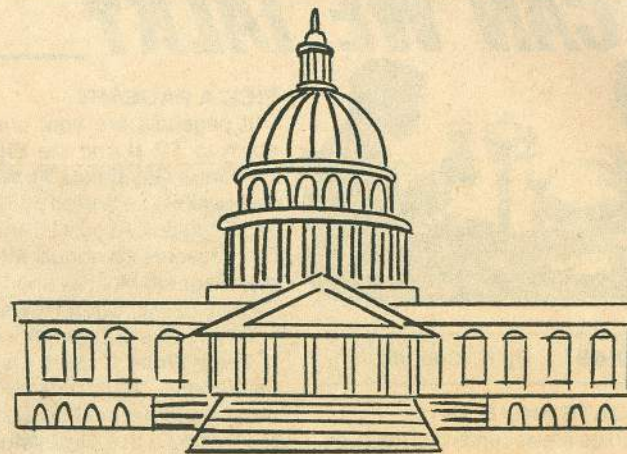
Kindred Spirits owner Marion Coleman said of the verdict, "It's a gross injustice. My stomach is just turning. If I had done something like that, I'd never have gotten involuntary manslaughter. I just can't believe it."

He was very calm as he talked about this issue, and said he didn't say anything to them at the time because he was shocked, and he was also in a public restaurant.

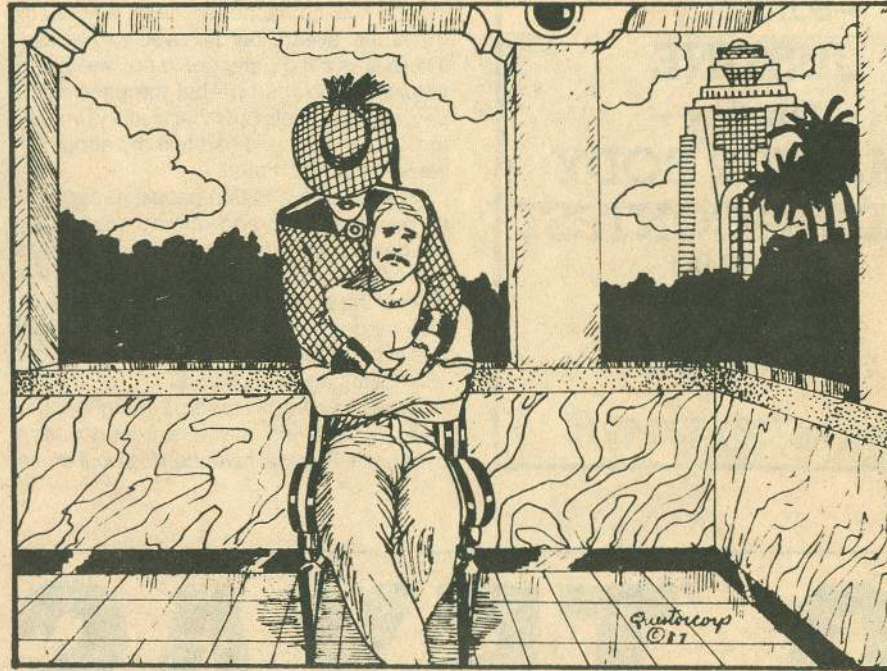
WELL!

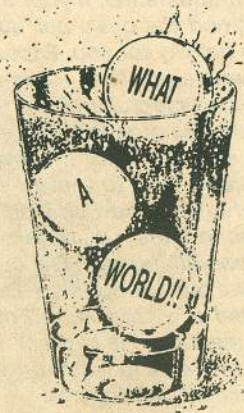
Decisions, decisions, decisions.
