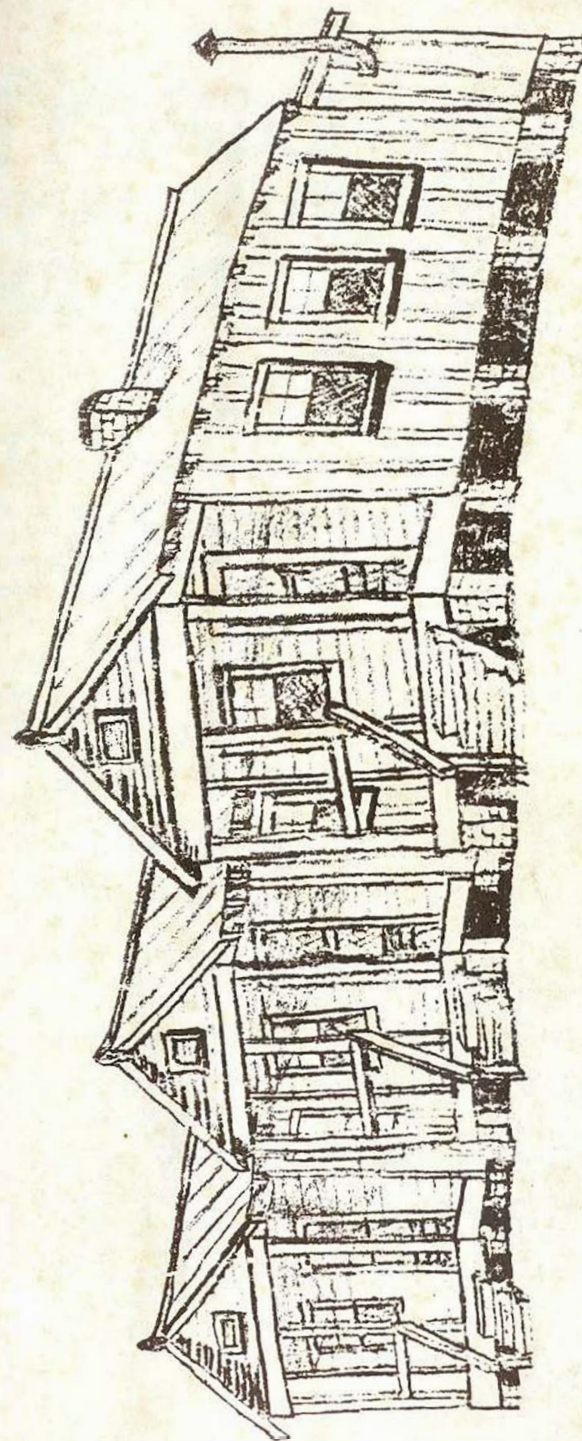

Miss Bryant is still under contract to the Commission as an advertising spokesperson for orange products; however, the current contract does expire August 31 of this year.

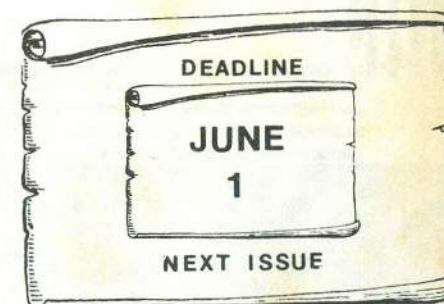
Regardless of what you may have heard or read in the media, no decision has been made concerning Miss Bryant. Adecision is expected prior to August 31.

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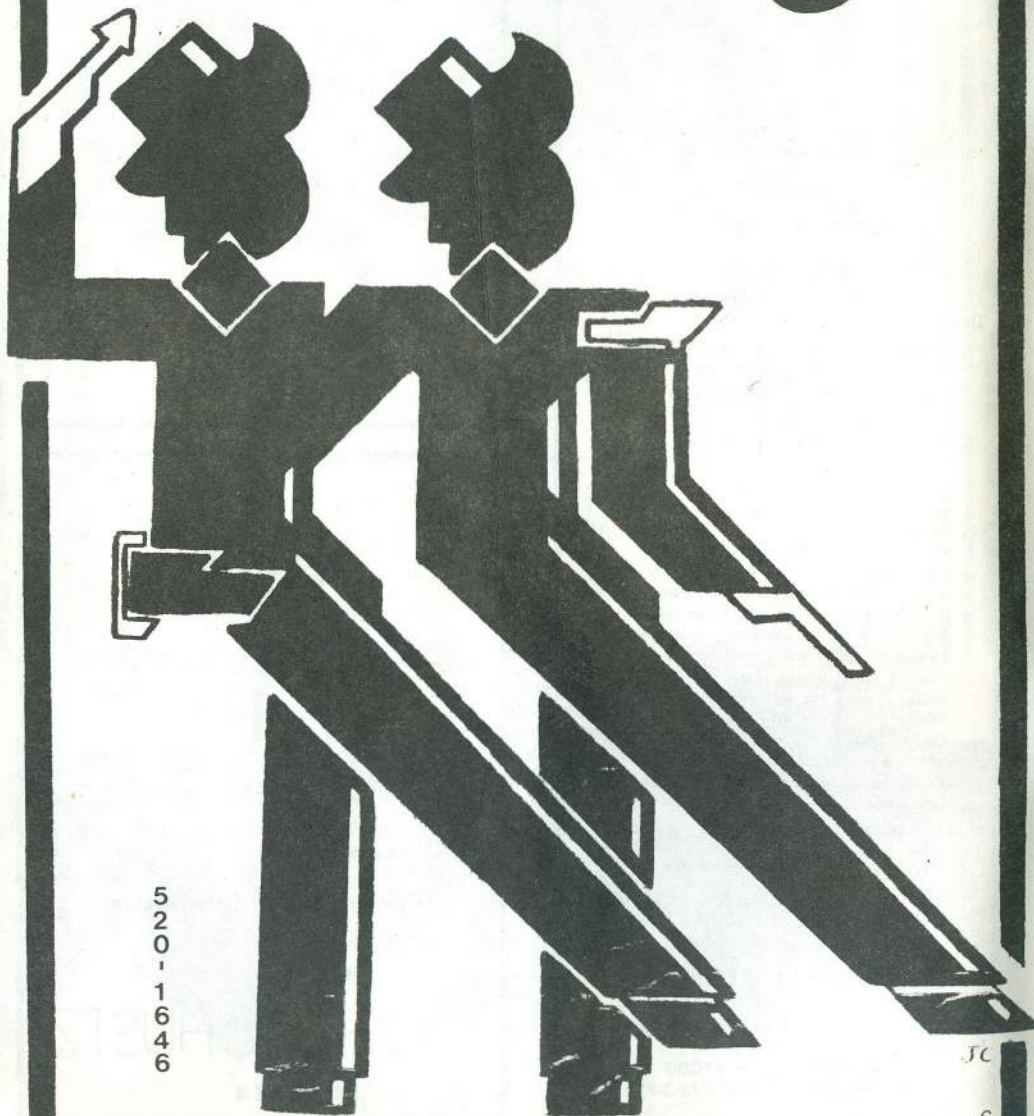

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GAY PRIDE WEEK by Dean Jacobs

The last week of June will mark the 1980 celebration of Gay Pride Week, a time when all of us can both rejoice in our gayness and remember the centuries of oppression which have been our sorrowful tradition.

At least once a year, it's good to remember—as our Jewish friends do—the results of Hitler's socialist horror on human history. What has been most publicized is the Jewish annihilation, about which enough can never be said. The idea of exterminating more than 8,000,000 human beings just because of religious prejudices should never be forgotten, else it will happen again.

But the OTHERS who also died must be remembered, too, especially those gay men and women who died for loving someone the state said they could not.

I've always been rather fascinated with gay people who supported socialism, given the track record that econo-

mic concept (and its necessary political twin, dictatorship) has in the area of human rights. If one starts from the idea that the state (a minority of people with power) can sift through the majority, select the most productive or their children, and take money from them in proportion to achievement, all logic flees.

Socialism predicates a very strong centralized power—a central government with broad outreach. For gay men and women, strong government is anathema. It is an advantage to those who dislike non-conformity, because:

1. It moves slowly. When someone is closing your bars and beating you over the head, central government moves too slowly.

2. It tends to be self-perpetuating and therefore is more responsive to the majority behavior—which is usually heterosexual and emphasizes sexism and the nuclear family unit. This is OK, as long as other lifestyles are also permitted. But central government

doesn't like non-conformity of any kind—it's not efficient and creates administrative problems. So non-conformity is suppressed.

3. A great deal of power usually winds up being used to support the *status quo*. This means making sure one stays in power, too. That's why once elected to power, the socialist mentality will justify all kinds of oppression for "the public good," which is (not surprisingly) Machiavellian in tone and hardly supports the idea of a "people's republic" or "a dictatorship for the proletariat." Socialism inculcates concentration of power in the hands of a committee, which MUST be conservative in tone.

4. The idea of public discussion of sex is not comfortable for any government anywhere in the world. Most politicians in any government anywhere will not come out strongly for sex education, birth control, abortion rights, tax advantages for live-in couples. They certainly aren't going to break those traditions by coming out for gay rights. Many governments in the world today—and 3/4 of them are "socialist" in tone—have trouble with women's rights, not to mention children's problems. They aren't just *about* to move on gay rights.

5. The socialist governments since 1917 have been brutally repressive toward gays. The three worst on record: USSR, Red China, Cuba. yet these are the three held up most often by the U.S. Socialist Workers' party and other socialist groups for American gays to imitate. Especially in Houston has the Socialist Workers Party solicited gay people as members. This follows that party's decades-old rule of getting dissatisfied people to join them in order to create havoc. Are they sincere? Let's remember that NAZI stands (in German) for the letters of the National Socialist Workers Party (**N**ational**s**ozialistische **D**eutsche **A**rbeiter **P**artei.).

6. The gay community has not suggested strongly enough that "America" means freedom of action unless someone else's rights are being violated. We can stand up for private sex acts; we cannot stand up for sex with children, sex by force, or public sex. If gays are off working with the socialists in America,

they can't use the philosophical idea which already exists—that we have a right, by U.S. constitutional law, to exist and work and love without fear. That battle *can* be won in the courts if we keep our heads together. Even the Republicans will respond to the idea that private sex acts in one's home are outside the pale of law—if all there are of age and willing. If we diffuse our focus, our people, and our strength—especially by working for the socialists, who oppose individualism and freedom—we won't win what we actually can in America today.

Jane Fonda, Vanessa Redgrave, and other have continually said Hitler was a NAZI (we've explained that abbreviation) and a fascist. They didn't consult their dictionaries sufficiently. A fascist is someone who believes in a private sector of business controlled by a strong centralized government power. That's what we already have in the U.S. today and we can see its oppressions. We'll have our hands full moving away from the present neo-facist system without confusing it with socialism.

Socialism is a transitional stage: economically, it nationalizes the major industries—steel, transportation, war material, communications and so on—while temporarily permitting a private sector to exist. But the private business has increased draining away of its resources until eventually it is declared disfunctional and also nationalized, creating a system where the state owns all—otherwise defined as communism. Needless to say, gays haven't survived either the transitional or the end regime.

When suddenly all politicians are seeking gay support and approval, it's time for gay people to look at the history of socialism and how gays have suffered under it. Hitler's Holocaust—which we remember with the pink triangles our earlier brothers and sisters wore in German socialist concentration camps—was precisely what socialism offers us. It was no bizarre accident; it was the future, especially if we, with our numbers and bright minds, support it.

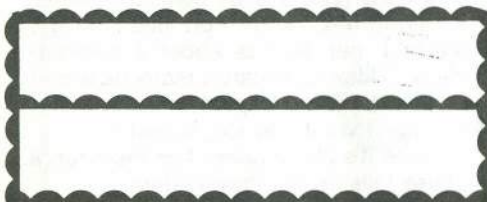
"Do you mean," asked Alice, "that you're not interested in seducing her? I find that a little hard to believe."

"You're willing to spend that kind of time on someone who may not—when push comes to shove—lay down and take it?" asked Alice incredulously.

"It keeps you off the streets," said Joan.

"I'm curious to know why you think relationships between women are so similar to relationships with men and women," I asked Alice.

"Well, aren't they?"

Not really. The whole tone of a lesbian relationship is different. It's like a wonderfully close friendship you've had for a while, but with no doors closed. You can move into touching if both people feel like it and it works to communicate."

"There's no pressure about sex," said Joan. "That really surprised me with this relationship. I'm used to having dinner with a man and fighting him off at the door. I really enjoy the ease and smoothness of women's relationships with each other. Apparently you make love when you feel like it, not when you're expected to do it to pay off somebody."

"It all sounds very idyllic," said Alice dryly. "But it just doesn't compute to me. I think everybody has to pay his dues for a long-term relationship."

"On that point I can't agree. I think relationships should be *mostly* easy and untroubled. If they are, no one should have to 'pay' for the pleasure involved."

"That's it," said Alice. "It all sounds too sinfully pleasurable. Nothing works that well."

With that remark we all knew we'd hit a mother-lode of philosophical disagreement. There's no question that many Americans have been conditioned to think anything pleasurable has to be paid for with retribution of some kind—usually painful. Having too good a time makes an adult suspect. (Is that the reason so many people over 30 never play?)

Gay people appear, to straight people, as not-serious folk. We like sex; we like going out. We don't get locked in to relationships unless we want to. (That's the clever adjustment we've made to the fact that we're not *allowed* to marry under U.S. law.) There is an ease about sex in gay life—especially among women, who tend not to be physically aggressive about sex—once one gets past the "accepting it" stage.

What's interesting to me is that so many straight people, when they talk to gay people about marriage, seem not to really like the whole marital system too much. For many straight people, marriage is a business deal worked out on an early basis of romantic love, but wearing thin with time. They talk about "sticking to your guns," or "not walking out on a contract." They equate married life with an 8-5 job. It's structured.

When children are involved, obviously more serious thought should be given to a long-range future and positive environment for the kids. but straight folks often use children to cover their very real dislike of what marriage has become. And the idea of consistent, pleasurable, nonpolitical sex with an experienced lover appears, to many of these people, either too idealistic to consider or somehow too decadent for words.

We ended the conversation, we three, with Alice looking down at the table, and saying (granted, after several large glasses of wine), "I'll bet if you asked most women what they really thought about women-women relationships—and if they told you the truth—they'd say there is nothing wrong with them at all. What's more, I think most women I know would really like to try relating much more closely with other women than they do—even becoming lovers. But they'd never say so."

Dear Editor,

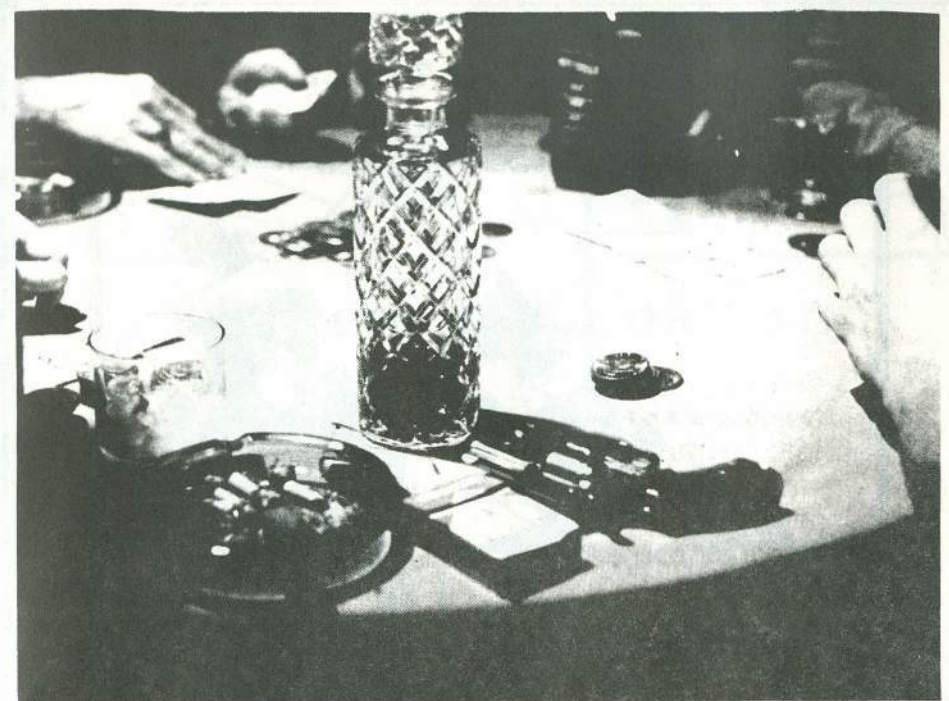

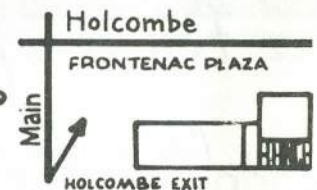

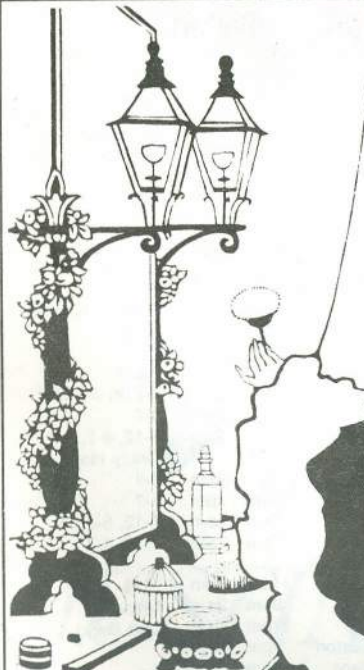
