Hola Fishies!

We have decided not to go out in December due to cold weather and the Red Snapper ban. The new season starts April 21, 2004 and runs to October 31, 2004.

In 2004 Galveston Party Boats (New Buccaneer) will require \$40 deposits which must be paid within 2 weeks of reservations. If you want the back of the boat fishing spots, the full \$75 needs to be paid up front. Total cost remains \$75. A new seven day cancellation for refund policy will apply.

Effective immediately the club will not handle reservations or deposits or refunds. Individuals need to call the boats directly (Galveston & Freeport) and make your own reservations and deposits. Galveston Party Boats is requiring full payment of \$75 up front if a group has five or more going, thus we'll have to make reservations individually. This will also be easier on the Coordinator!

For Galveston Party Boats on the New Buccaneer, call 713-222-7025 and ask for Andy Hernandez (Thursday-Monday 6am to 1pm). Insist on talking to Andy. He will take care of you. *No credit cards or checks.* Mention the Rainbow Fishing Club and he will work to get us fishing together on trip day. Deposits by money order to Galveston Party Boats. Only those making deposits and reservations soon will get back of the boat spots. You need to ask for that. Please advise the club at 713-523-6381 of your reservations so we can coordinate seating and fishing spots as best we can.

The first 4 dates are April 24, May 22 & June 26 (all Saturdays) on the New Buccaneer, Galveston and July 24 on the Captain Casey of Captain Elliott's Party Boats, Freeport. If you have questions, call the club at 713-523-6381.

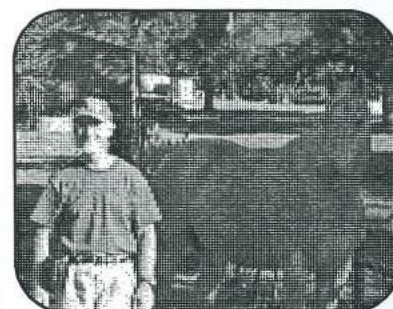

For the June 5th trip we have the whole Back of the Boat reserved (15 spots out of a possible 16). \$75 deposits in full are needed for these spots.

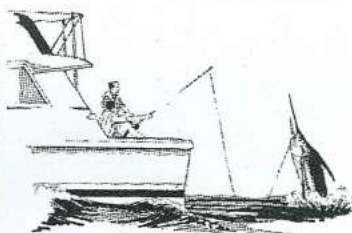
Deadline for both trips is February 26, but we expect to extend it this Saturday for another two weeks. Please call John at 713-523-6381 for reservations and information and send checks to:

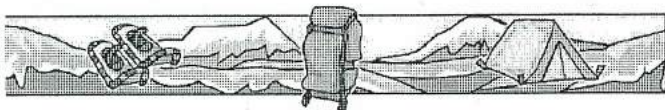

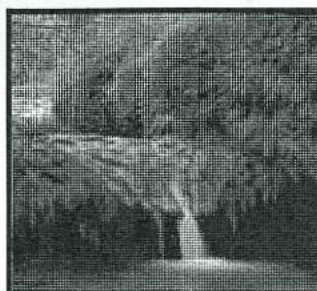

The park has some 20 miles of hiking and mountain biking trails and 14 miles of backpacking trails, as well as the Pedernales Hill Country Nature Trail.

At both the July social and the July mailout the discussion about leadership will continue. Please come and join us for those talks.

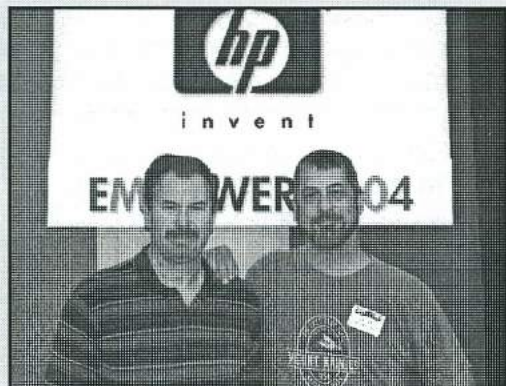

FoxFire Cabins

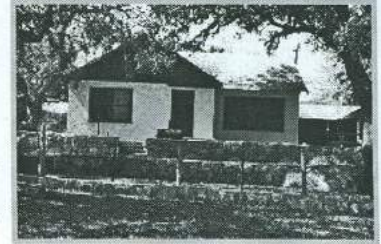

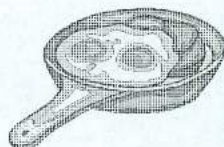


Halloweed Campout October 29-31
