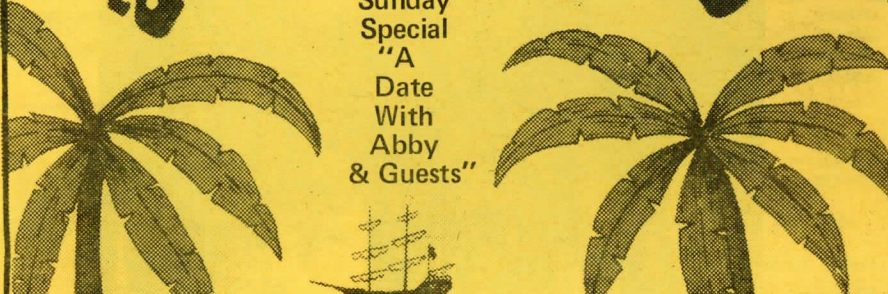

Disco recording artist Grace Jones, appearing this week at Cuddle's

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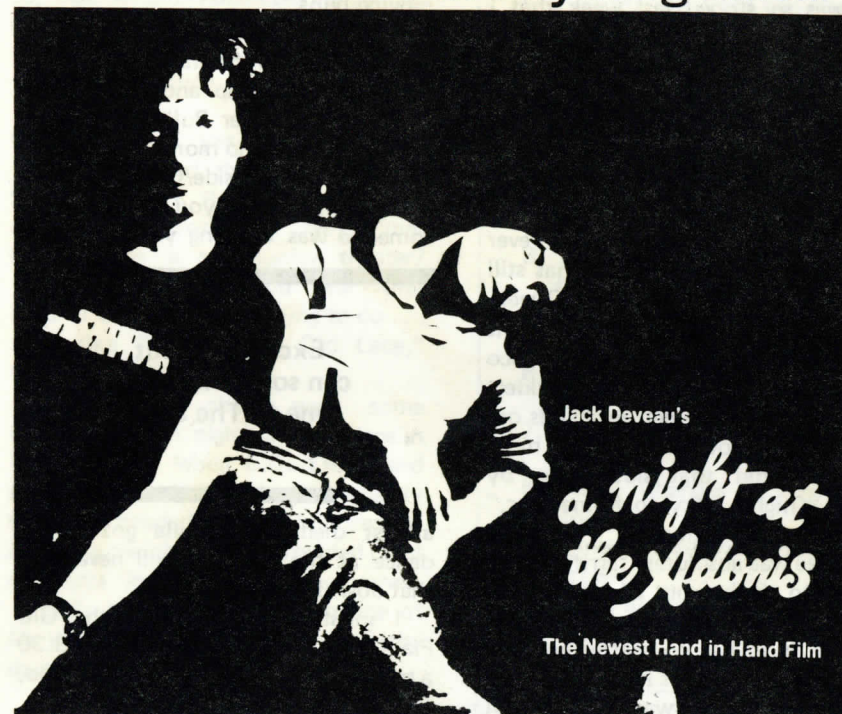
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MOTHER

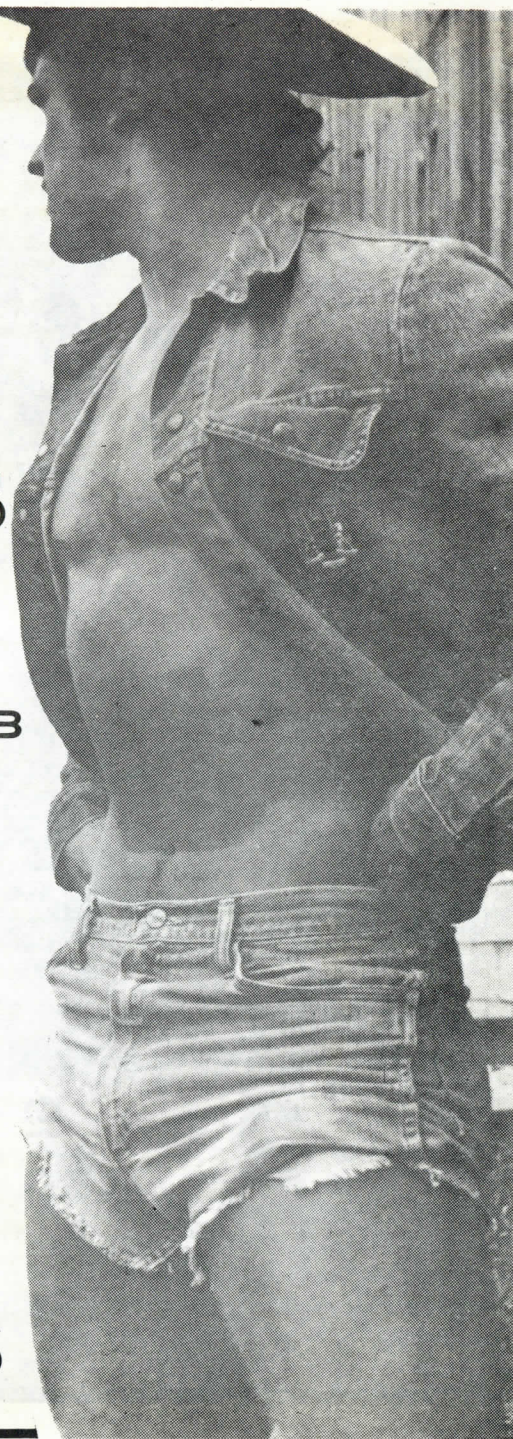

Judge bans Rush

A California judge has issued a temporary injunction that halts the distribution of Rush. A move for a permanent injunction will be heard in a few days. The injunction halts the wholesale transactions involving Rush by Pacific Western Distributing Corp., which was the sole distributor.

The director of the California Dept. of Health initiated the action, claiming that the product was not popularly used as a "room odorizer" as the defendants testified, but rather as a drug "which had not been properly tested in government labs."

Meanwhile, Pacific Western has begun distribution of Bolt, a similar product, to take the place of Rush, in the event a permanent injunction is issued.

Okla. House passes homophobic teachers bill

Teachers who engage in "public homosexual conduct" could be fired or barred from employment by Oklahoma school boards under a bill approved by the Oklahoma House, according to a dispatch by UPI.

The proposal, which now goes to the Senate, would allow school districts to dismiss or refuse to hire "people afflicted with this degenerate problem."

Judge orders Navy to stop discharging homosexuals

A federal court judge in San Francisco has ordered the Navy to stop processing servicemen for discharge on grounds of homosexuality.

The order was based upon the judge's holding that the regulation provides for mandatory processing for discharge, which the judge said was arbitrary and capricious and thus unconstitutional.

Hearing set in Kansas bias suit

A hearing has been set on a federal lawsuit filed by Robert Lewis who says the state Dept. of Social and Rehabilitation Services discriminated against him because he is gay, according to an Associated Press news release.

Lewis, president of the Wichita Homophile Alliance and an employee in the department, asked the court for a temporary restraining order to block his transfer from working with juveniles to working only with adults.

Mardi Gras was co-o-o-o-old

You couldn't tell it from looking at the crowds INSIDE the gay clubs, but it was obvious by the lack of people OUTSIDE watching the parades. It was a cold Mardi Gras.

Thousands turned out, as usual, for Fat Tuesday, but stayed inside longer, went home faster, and kept their bodies fueled with human anti-freeze — beer and mixed drinks.

A cold, steady rain that began at midday forced the cancellation of a night parade by the Krewe of Comus, traditionally the last parade of the carnival season. As always, however, formal Mardi Gras celebrations ended at midnight with the King of Comus toasting Rex, the King of Carnival, at a meeting of the courts.

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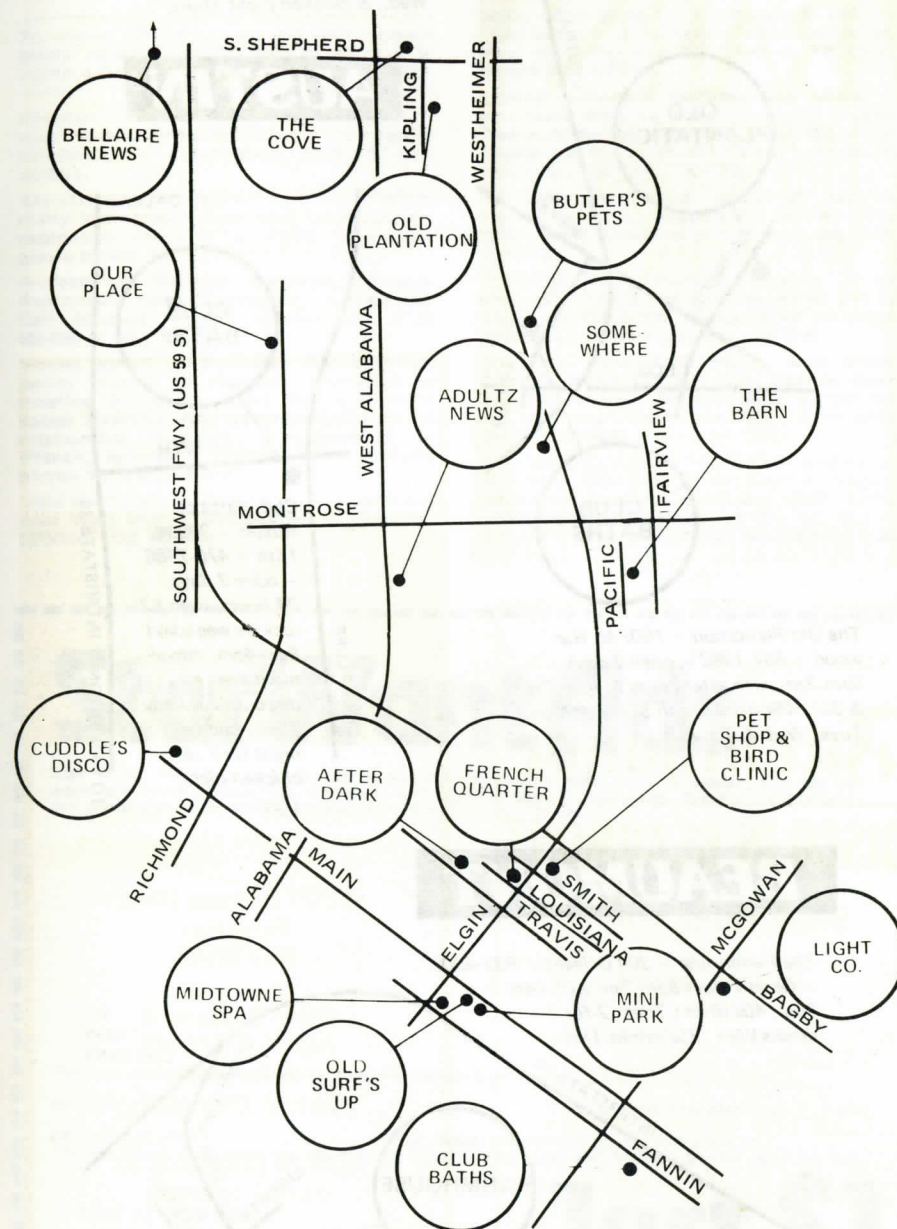
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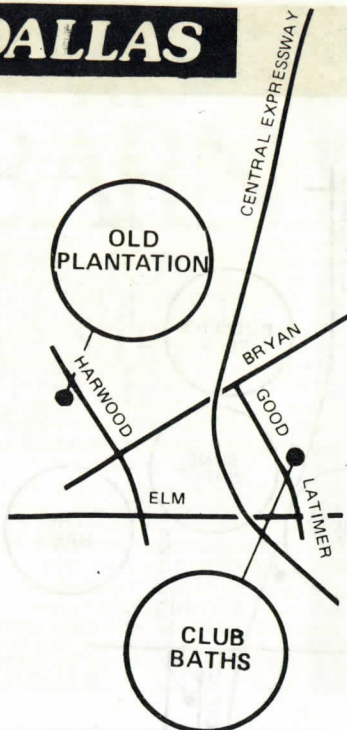
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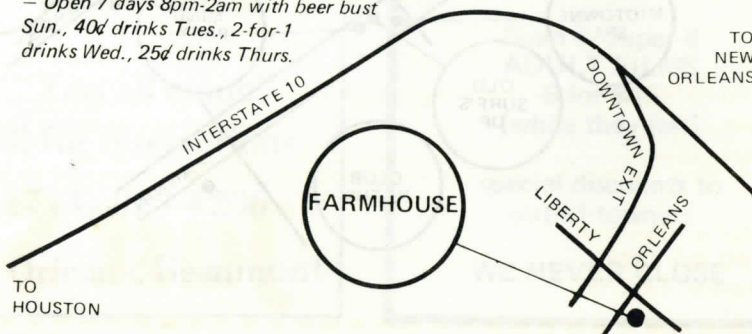
