"Town Meeting" set for June at Astrohall

Commissioners Court.

Gay leader Ray Hill pointed out however that the lease for the building for June 25 has already been signed between the county and the meeting organizers and should the county make an attempt to renege on their contractual obligation, gay leaders would not hesitate to seek remedy in the courts.

"Certainly the most ambitious project undertaken by any lesbian/gay community" is how a brochure for Houston Town Meeting 1 states it and perhaps even that is an understatement.

Houston gay leaders have leased the Astroarena, located in the Astrodome Complex, for Sunday, June 25, for a large community gathering. This event will be the climax of a month-long series of workshops on various issues affecting the gay community.

The proposed event has not escaped the notice of local anti-gay crusaders Geneva Kirk Brooks and Rev. Albert Walling. They both appeared before the Houston City Council and the Harris County Commissioners Court to voice their outrage over the idea of "such a display of sexual perversion."

Both appeared Wednesday before City Council but were told by Mayor Jim McConn that the Astroarena is county property.

"I don't know why they came here," McConn told a reporter.

"The Astrohall is a county-controlled facility and this is the wrong place to bring their grievances. Besides," the mayor added, "people should be able to hold public meetings in places designated for that purpose."

Brooks and Rev. Walling Thursday took the mayor's advice and addressed the members of the Harris County

The price of registration for attending Town Meeting 1 is variable, organizers said, not wanting lack of funds to be a reason for any gay person not to attend.

They are asking \$5.00 to \$20.00 per person, depending on ability to pay. Advance tickets are available by mail from P.O. Box 3624, Houston, TX 77001. If tickets are ordered prior to June 5, workbooks and other materials will be mailed. After that date participants can pick up workbooks on the day of the meeting.

The Houston GPC hotline is serving as a late-minute source of information about the meeting. Their number is 526-2668.

"The problems of sexual, racial and employment discrimination, police harassment and legal restraints affecting you are only a few of the issues to be addressed. From the issues voted on a list of priorities will be established to give direction to the community and its organizations. This document of priorities will be personally delivered to the mayor, the police chief, the city council and the presiding judge of the court system," the organizers stated.

Old Surf's Up burns, owner critically injured, Mini Park Theater also heavily damaged

The Old Surf's Up, a Houston gay lounge at 2009 Main, was destroyed by an explosion and fire Monday night, May 22. The Mini-Park Theater, an all-male adult theater next door, was also extensively damaged.

Donald Banning, the Old Surf's Up owner, was burned over 95% of his body and taken to Ben Taub Hospital.

Fire department investigators said they found evidence of arson. Fumes from two five-gallon cans of gasoline near a hotwater heater exploded. Investigators said they believe the cans were put there intentionally.

No arrests were immediately made.

The Venture-N, another gay club in the same block, was not damaged.

The Mini-Park meanwhile is making

plans to move one door down and take over the Screening Room Theater, a straight adult moviehouse, and convert it to all-male movies.

The explosion blew out the wall between the Old Surf's Up and the Mini-Park.

The lounge was one of Houston's oldest gay clubs but in recent years had been under a series of different owners, unstable customer flow, and name changes. It was originally simply called the Surf, later changed to the Loft, then to the Old Surf, and finally the Old Surf's Up, as each new owner took over.

Banning, the present owner, had also been talking about selling if the right buyer came along.

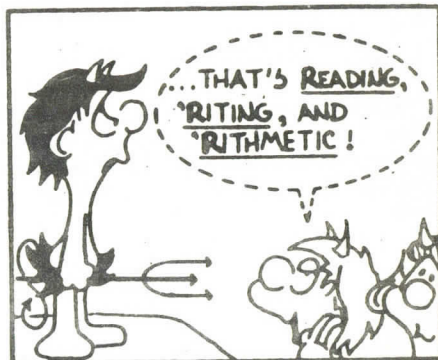
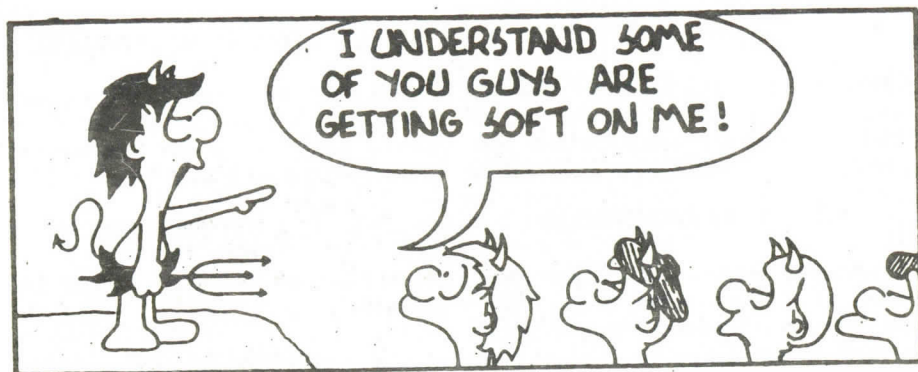
