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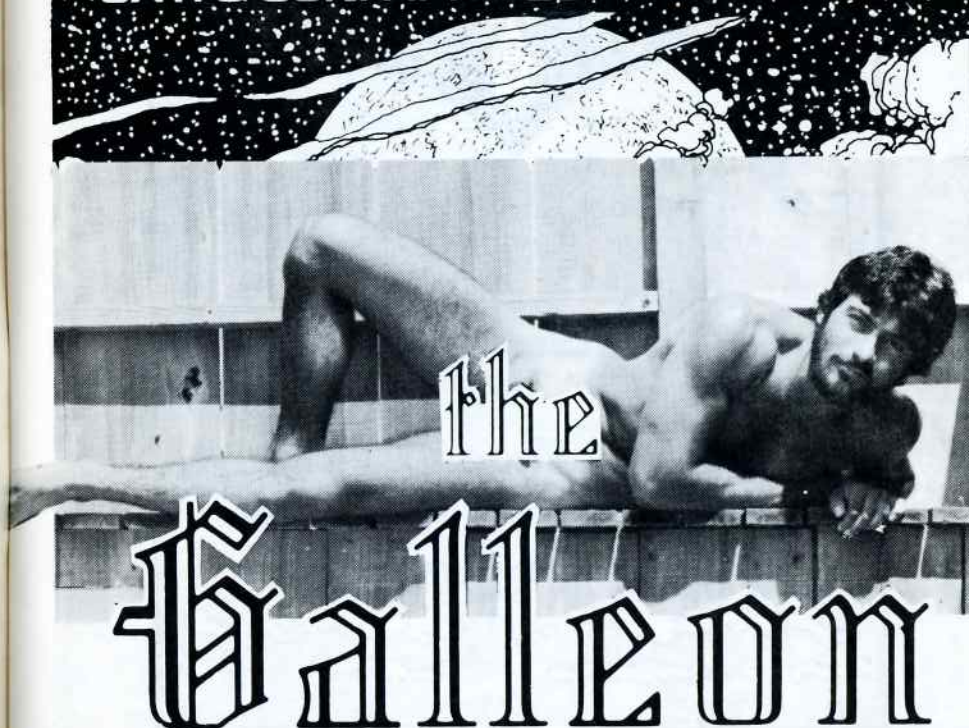
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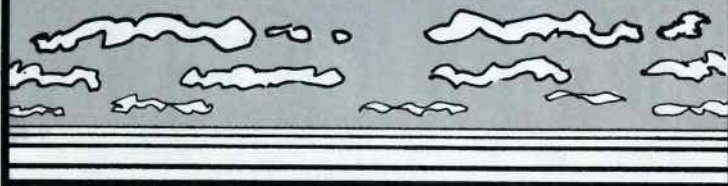


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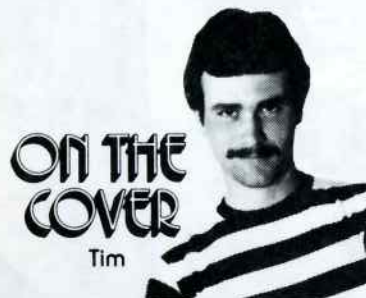

attend alone, and won't let him attend with his date — a man.

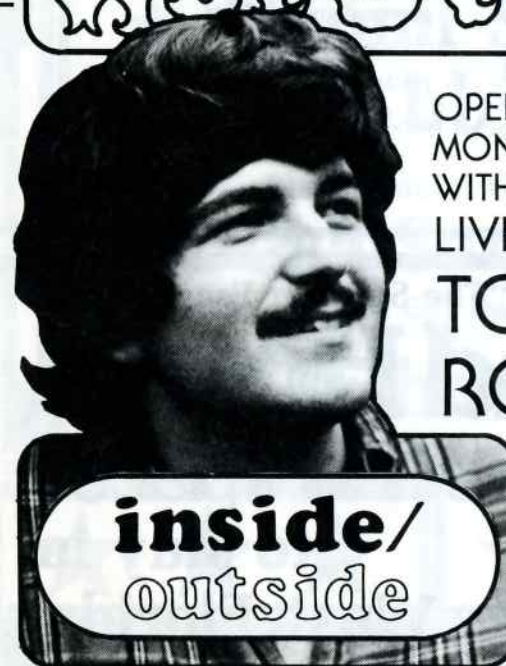

TWT supports the actions of this young man, and all other gay youth, in their stand for their rights.

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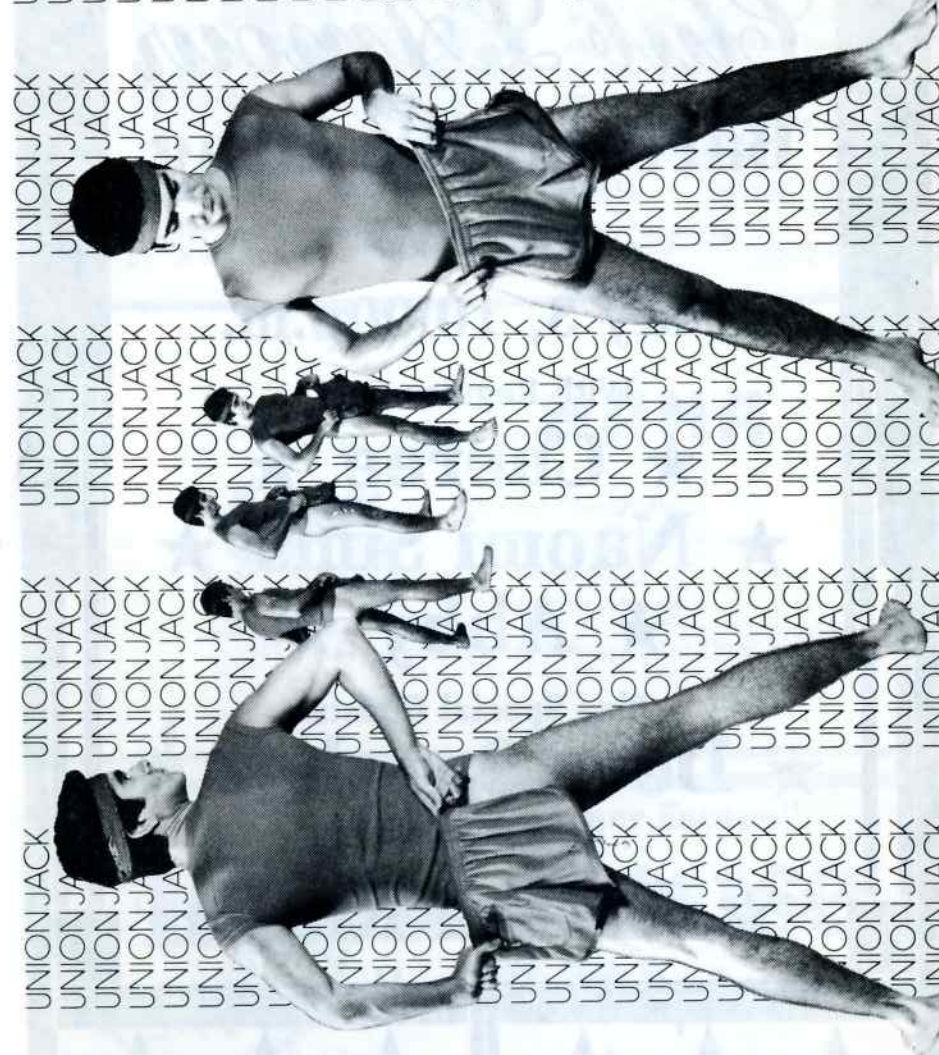

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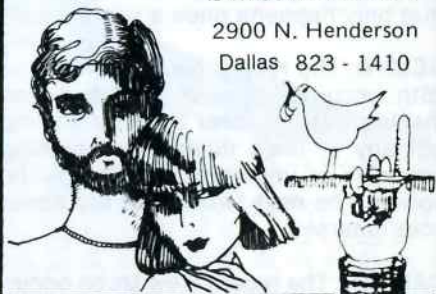

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BROADWAY

If you are planning a Spring vacation in the "Big Apple," and you still have a few pennies set aside for "cultcha," you might check out Broadway's latest offerings. Steven Sondheim's *Sweeney Todd* is playing at the Uris Theatre, but you better hurry. It may not be there for long. You see, it is a song and dance treatment of a 19th-century melodrama whose "hero" is a homicidal London barber whose victims are made into meat pies.

It is a huge physical production with a variety of beams, girders, movable steel bridges, elevated ramps and rolling platforms. Although Sondheim's music and lyrics are perhaps his best in a long while, it seems improbable that matinee audiences will flock to see a spoof about unsuspecting victims being ground into meat pies. However, if you are in a grizzly state of mind, tickets are \$20 on week-nights and \$22.50 on the week-end.

On Golden Pond, by Ernest Thompson, is a nostalgic comedy-drama about an elderly couple spending their 48th summer vacation at their cottage in Maine. Nothing really happens during the four-month period, but the subtle strength of personal bonds is masterfully portrayed. It is obviously a low-key drama, and represents a pleasant diversion from the gaudy, over-dressed productions which are in vogue on Broadway. Tickets are \$15 and \$16.50.

Strangers, by Sherman Yellen, is an absorbing study of Sinclair Lewis/Dorothy Thompson marriage. It stars Bruce Dern as Lewis, and Lois Nettleton as his wife. Thompson emerges as the more sympathetic of the two for putting up with her insecure, alcoholic husband, but the character of Lewis is the more interesting dramatic role.

Aside from concentrating on the Lewis-Thompson relationship, *Strangers* also offers an engrossing examination of the roles of men and women in modern society. It is now playing at the John Golden Theatre. Tickets are \$18.50 and \$20.

Due to a marked slow-down in the box office, several Broadway biggies just departed. *On The Twentieth*

Century closed on March 18 and *Ballroom* exited March 24.

TELEVISION

If you are a fan of "All In The Family," you are not alone. This sitcom is perhaps the most popular and provocative series ever to be produced. Within four months of its debut it became the number-one-rated show on television and remained in that rank for the next five years. In its 7½ years it always remained in the top ten and never ranked below a competing network show.

It has won a total of 13 Emmy Awards and a Peabody Award in 1978. Edith and Archie's chairs were encased in glass at the Smithsonian Institution and President Carter, in a special appearance at the opening of the display, claimed that the show had "changed the consciousness of the country."

MOVIES

In 11 weeks, *Superman* has grossed over \$31 million and is ranked #1 among the films currently in circulation. Those of us who were taught by the good sisters undoubtedly remember being told which films were good, acceptable and nasty and we immediately rushed to see those in the last category. Well, the U.S. Catholic Conference is still passing judgment on the moral value of films. The latest "no-no," in their opinion, is *The Warriors*. This violent epic treats the subject of street gangs in New York. Although *The Warriors* may not endanger the state of your soul, it may very well damage your mind and turn your stomach. There have been several violent movies within recent years, but gratuitous bloodshed has never been more rampant than in *The Warriors*. Never has a film had so little substance and so much blood.

Once upon a time Houston was billed as a great location for film. The architecture was exciting and talent and labor was cheap. Such is no longer the case. Producer Frank Yablams decided to move filming of *North Dallas 40* back to L.A., claiming that he could save \$2 million. So much for the movie industry in Houston.
