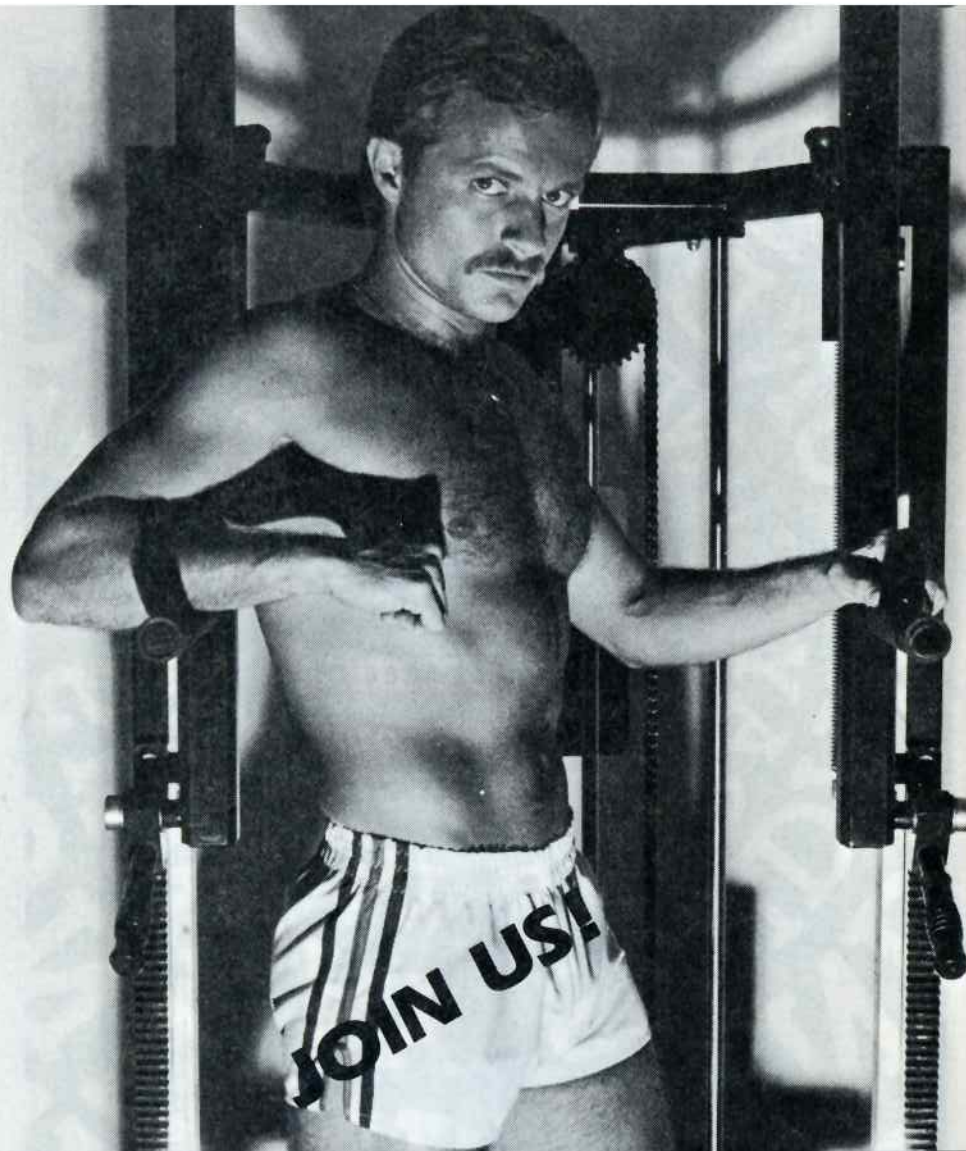

Robison Returns to WFAA-TV

The electronic evangelist, James Robison, is back on the air in Dallas/Fort Worth on WFAA-TV, ABC-TV, channel 8. The station cancelled his Sunday morning religious program last Spring after Dallas gays protested his anti-gay sermons.

Louise Young who is president of the Dallas G.P.C. remarked, "We never objected to his being on the air. We objected to his derogatory use of homosexuality in a political context."

Can he "stick to the Bible and not the political?" If not, Dallas gays are prepared to drag out the FCC fairness doctrine once again. His programs will be monitored very closely!

Methodists Fire Gay

Her name is Joan Clark. She lives in Dallas. Her job for the past six years has been field executive for women's work in not only Texas, but also in Oklahoma, Arkansas and New Mexico. On May 1, she was dismissed in a secret, closed session. Her employer was the First United Methodist Church of Dallas. The church is the second largest Protestant demonimation in the U.S.A. with around ten million members.

The burning issue has prompted two division board members to resign. The underlying issue relates to Joan Clark being a 32-year-old lesbian who openly admitted to it.

Joan had offered to resign, but the 75-member divisional council voted not to accept her resignation. The council

later reversed its position and dismissed her on the grounds that her homosexuality ran contrary to the Methodist church's Book of Discipline which "does not condone the practice of homosexuality."

Can't Deduct Lover on Income Tax

It happened in Phoenix. A gay man tried to deduct his lover on his federal income tax for 1974 and was refused by U.S. District Court Judge Carl Muecke. The man, Bill Bristow, was seeking a refund of \$275 claiming that his homosexual lover, Charles Cartier, lived with him all year, used his car, and ate his food! Furthermore, Bristow said he also paid both the utility bills and the mortgage on their home.

But the judge said no! Meanwhile, the case may now go to trial.

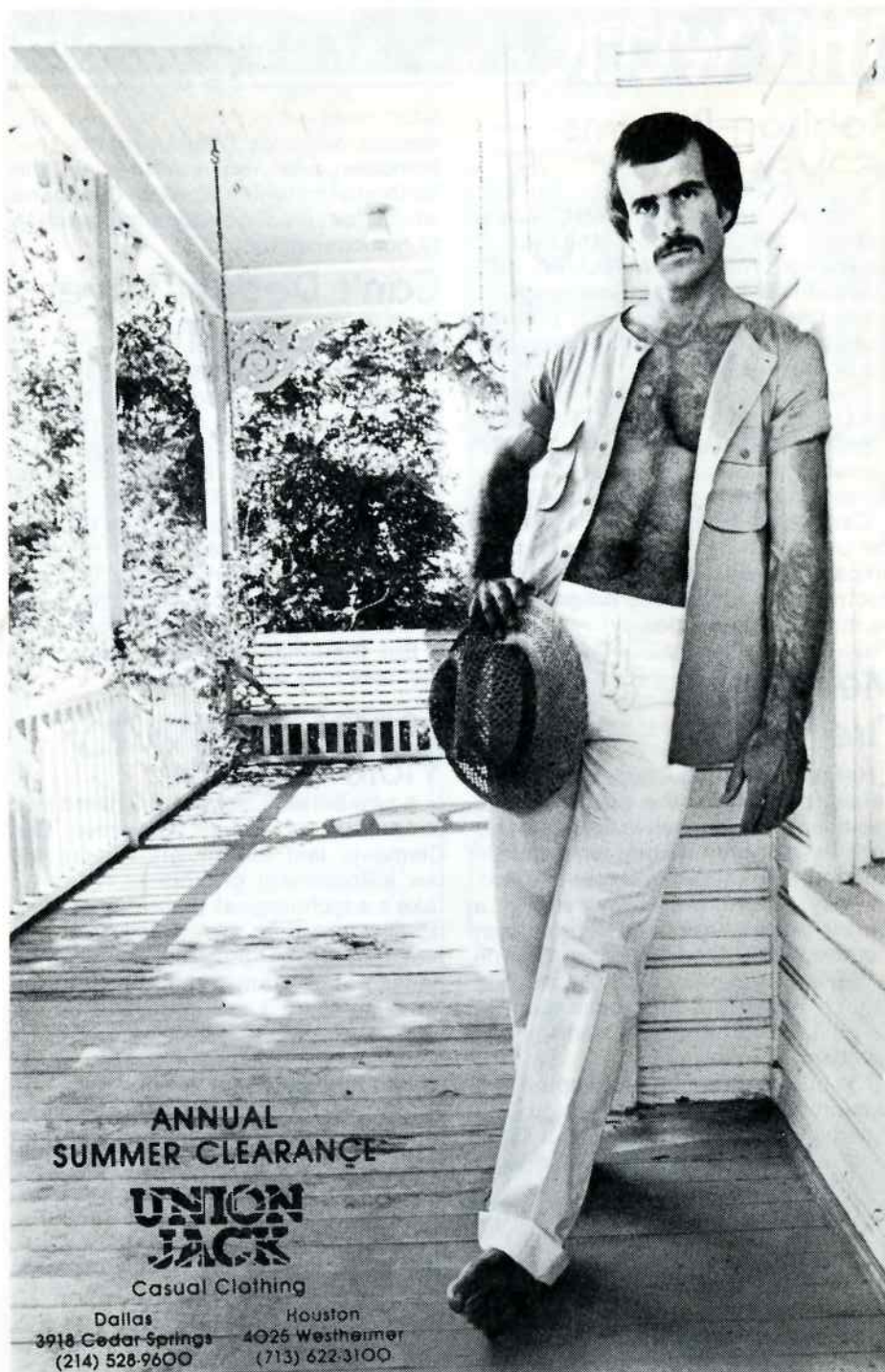
Fewer Violent Police

A new bill which was signed into law in Austin by Texas Governor Bill Clements last month will require all law enforcement officers in Texas to take a psychological test to determine how violent they are. If they fail the test, they will not be hired! The bill was passed after Frank Tejeda of San Antonio persuaded the state legislature that men should not be allowed to become police officers if they have violent tendencies.

The psychological testing should reduce police brutality as those individuals who do not test favorably will be filtered out. This new Texas law is welcomed by gays who are often victims of police brutality and harassment. ▼

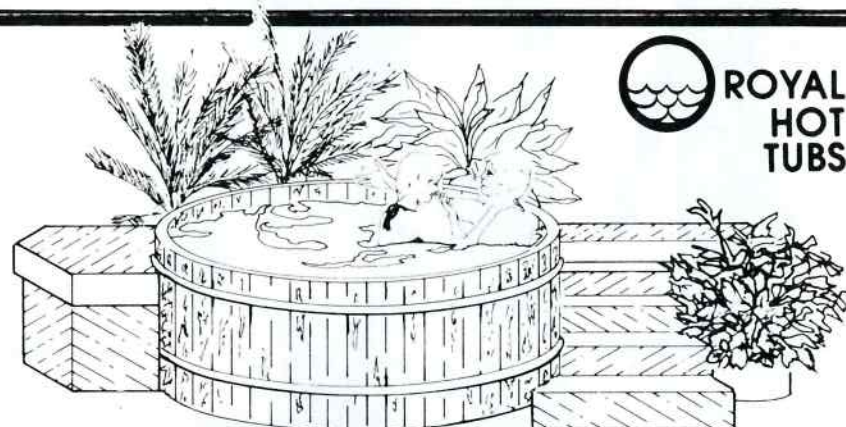

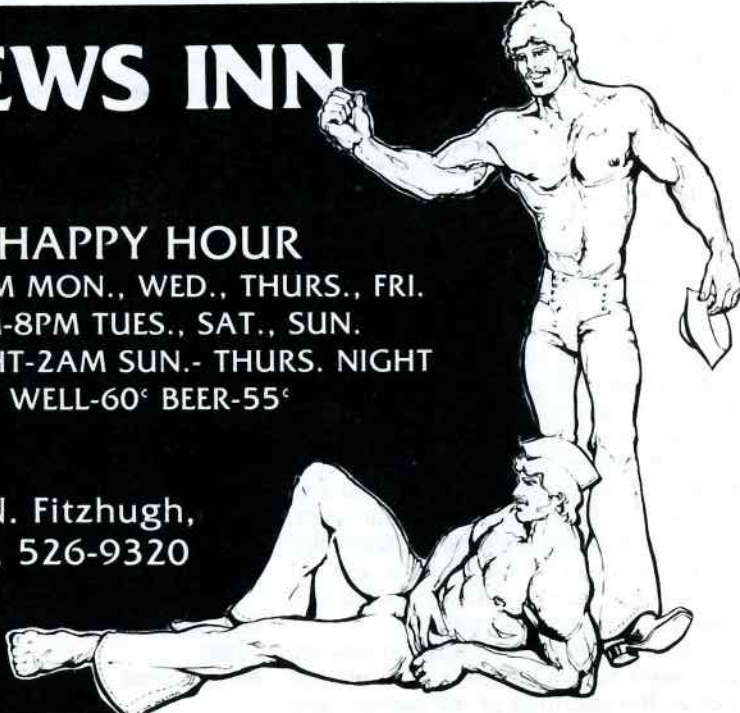

DEAR ADAM

Lonely

Dear Adam,

I am a 24-year-old white male, average build, average looks, discreet — but lonely.

I have been gay for two years now. However, I have the same problem meeting guys as I did girls. People do not turn on to me. Up to six months ago I was a virgin. The only men that seem to be interested in me are older gentlemen, queens, or someone else's lover out for a trick. I have been thinking of going straight.

I tried being more aggressive, but groping is not my bag. Moreover, it gives you a hustler image, a loose image. Sometimes I think people think I am stuck up, but I am reluctant to approach them for several reasons: 1) I might offend them, 2) they are too good for me, or 3) I do not want to be turned down again. In other words, I am totally "fucked-up."

Last Saturday I went to a gay disco. I noticed several young men cruising me, but when I worked up the courage to ask them to dance, they snubbed me.

I joined (a gym) and have been working out when I can. But results are slow and tedious.

Dear Lonely,

I think you're being a bit melodramatic when you term yourself "fucked-up;" however, I must say, you have more problems per paragraph than anyone who has written previously. Reading your words, plus attempting to "read between the lines," I recognized that your woes were a bit too much for one person to tackle. I hope you don't mind, but I took the liberty of sharing your letter with several friends at the Rice University Psychology Department, inking out your real name and address, of course.

They confirmed my original suspi-

cions — you are in need of sexual identity counseling. Any person who "turns gay" at age 22, remains a virgin until they are almost 24, and then considers "going straight" six months later has sexual-preference identification problems too profound to be dealt with lightly on these pages. Do me a favor and sneak out of Alvin at the earliest possible date and get some professional assistance. Frankly, anything I might tell you concerning the first part of your letter could do more harm than good. So please, for me, get some professional help on attacking the foundation of your problem. Okay?

The rest of your letter is a reflection of your basic problem, but I do feel free to "rap" about it, for it is very much like something I could have written eight years ago, when I was 24.

You are caught in somewhat of a gay "time warp." Your fear of being aggressive, desires to be discreet, and worries of offending others—these are all long-held gay attitudes that are, fortunately, falling by the wayside faster than the popularity of Anita Bryant. They reflect low self-esteem, as do your remarks about "too good for me" and your endeavors concerning gym attendance.

If your counseling reveals that you are truly gay, you're going to have to face up to one of the cruelest lessons of gay life: To achieve maximum joy concerning gay life, you DO have to play the game, know the rules, win!

I'm not as dogmatic in my beliefs as fellow writer Carl Cochran, who subscribes completely to the "Castro Clone" philosophy, but you DO have to recognize certain abiding principles. And the most important rule of all is: No matter what it takes to increase your self-esteem, DO IT!

Don't go to the gym "when you can," —go regularly! Don't be afraid to be aggressive—loosen up! Don't be afraid of rejection—risk it! The most pitiable persons are those who, upon discovering they don't have "what it takes,"

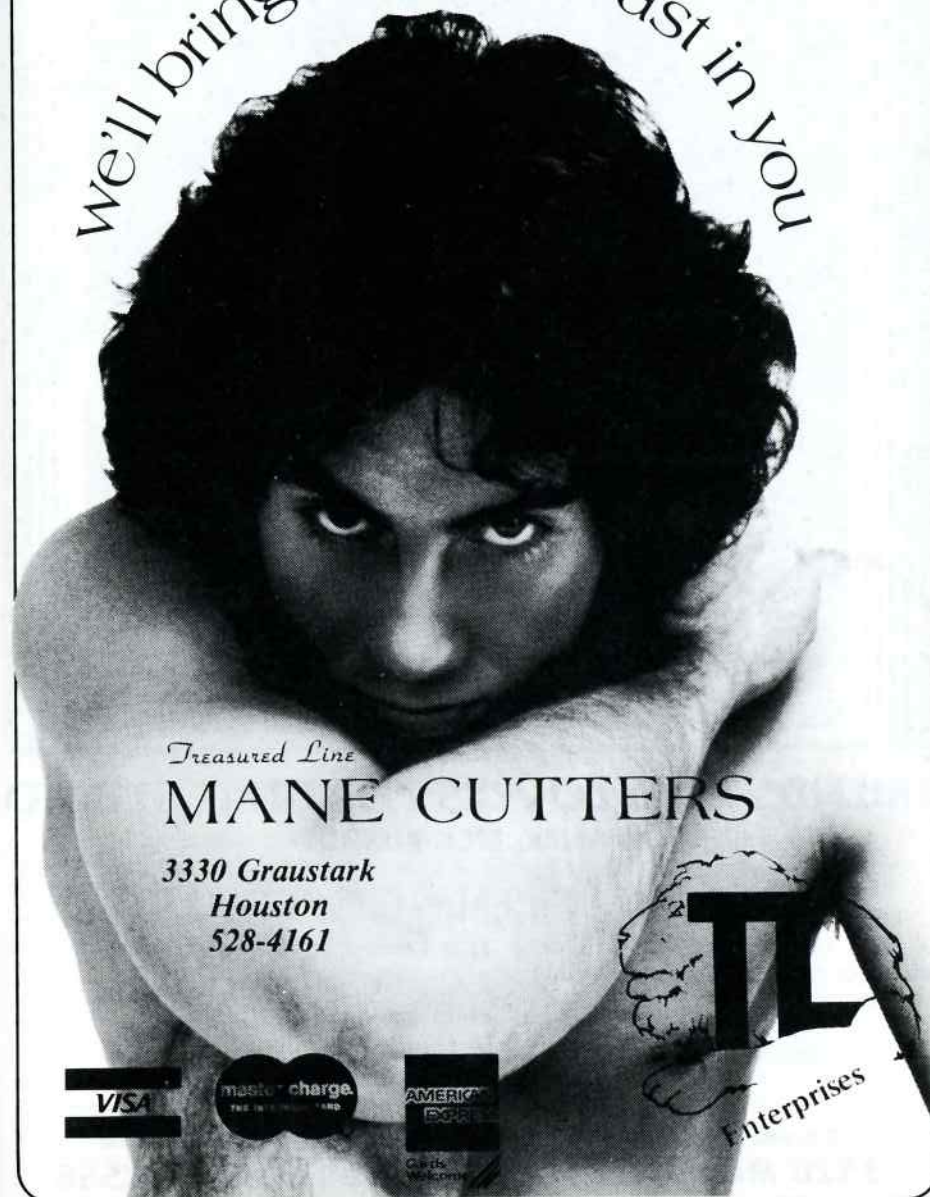

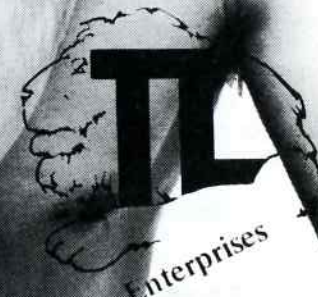

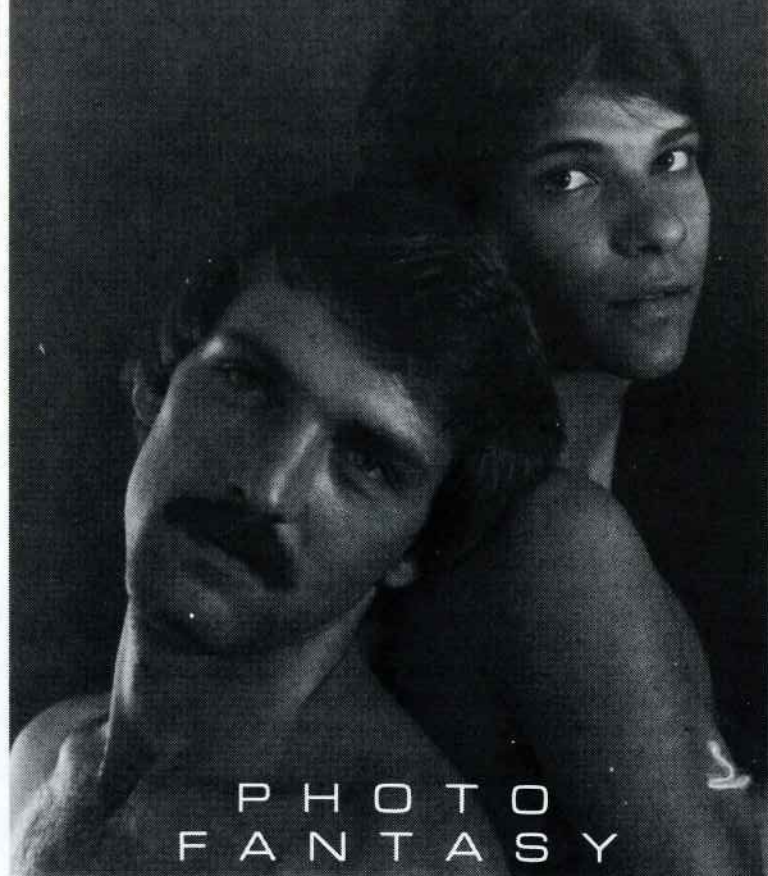

TINSELTOWN

When hot, sweaty, "get down" disco first emerged as a social phenomenon, it was praised for its ability to serve as a social equalizer. At Studio One and Studio 54, gays mixed with straights, rich with poor, beautiful with beautiful, and Liza danced with the busboys.

Fortunately, this "brotherhood of man" attitude has intensified and solidified. It's a philosophy that is now moving "out of the bars and into the streets," so to speak. Specifically, in the Castro area of San Francisco.

So many of the big names and famous faces here in Hollywood are vacationing or buying second homes in the Castro area that a popular joke currently making the rounds says the Hollywood bus tours of the stars' homes are being cancelled because the bus company can't afford the cost of the gas to go the 434 miles from West Hollywood to Castro.

The mingling of Hollywood stars with the Castro gay community is not only good for public relations, but provides gays with many once-in-a-lifetime opportunities to rap and "chew the fat" with many of the people who shape our popular culture. This not

only applies to San Francisco gays, but vacationing gays from all parts of the country who happen to drop in on the City By The Bay. The proliferation of "stars" on Castro has become so intense it's unimaginable that you could spend a week there and not rub elbows with a substantial portion of the Hollywood herd.

The liberal element of Hollywood is, of course, in the forefront. Jane Fonda, Lily Tomlin, Joan Baez, etc., etc., trod the San Francisco streets with such regularity that they're known on a first-name basis by many of the Castro street people. But it's not only the liberal element. Yes, that person that looks like the star you associate with conservative political beliefs IS the star you see walking down Castro. Liberal or conservative, rich or poor, up or down, Castro has become the epitome of social equalization.

Often the star's presence is announced. Such as Jane Fonda's visit to many of the Castro bars to drum up support for a gay voter registration drive (and the candidacy of Harry Britt

for Supervisor). But most of the time, the celebrity just slips into the bar quietly, orders a drink, and spends the next couple of hours conversing with gays who have also come in off the street seeking to quench thirst and loneliness.

One Academy Award winning actor, who I have promised not to name, says he can't survive without making it to the Castro every month or so. "To get away from the hellish, dog-eat-dog world of Hollywood," he says. "The nice thing about the Castro is it is filled with sincere, pleasant individuals who accept me as a human being, and not someone who can do them a favor or make them some money. Because of the guys on Castro, I haven't been to my shrink all year."

And, indeed, it does seem to be a process of mutual sharing. Most stars dread publicity tours and public mingling with a passion approaching rampant terror. But most agree that mingling on Castro is different. Jane Fonda,

for example, didn't want the party to end until she had hit almost EVERY bar in the area. Surrounded by adoring gay fans, she threw back her hair, giggled, and conversed wildly as she moved from one set of bar stools to the next.

While many Hollywood movie stars are making Castro their second home, it would be unkind not to mention all those other types of "stars" who make Castro their one-and-only home. Namely, many of the big disco recording artists and the ever-popular gay porn stars. It's a strange feeling to be in Castro's Alfie's disco, dancing to the latest Sylvester hit, and realize the guy standing in the corner watching you dance IS Sylvester. Or to be in a Castro grocery store and see Gordon Grant, Phillip, Jeremy, or Ed Wiley picking up brunch munchies.

Hollywood will always be Tinseltown. But the American gay community, with Castro as its focus, is certainly acquiring a sparkle all its own.

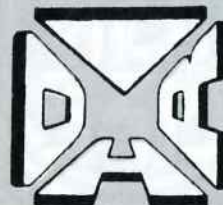

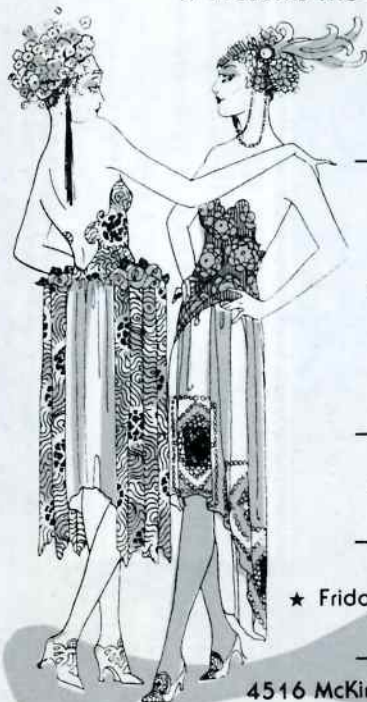

SPECIAL FEATURE

CRONKITE: Good Evening. This is Walter Cronkite again, with an update in that volatile situation now in progress in Arkansas. As we've said, we'll be monitoring the situation there through the night. And as the information comes in, we'll be passing it along to you.

As you know, it all began around eleven o'clock tonight, Arkansas time, when — as incredible as it sounds — an apparently homosexual discotheque tonight moved into what might be called "Disco Meltdown."

As the facts become known, it appears a group of gay men has reached such an intense plateau of dancing that — that they appear to have lost their ability to stop. The rather large crowd of Levi-clad men are reportedly thrashing around the confines of the disco — completely out of control.

Authorities fear the intensity of the

heated energy being generated in the discotheque is such that an explosion of catastrophic proportions could rock this state — and, indeed, have profound long-term effects on the nation as a whole.

At this hour, cause for concern seems to be mounting. Scientists at the site earlier observed what appeared to be a huge amyl nitrite bubble forming in the top of the building. This finding has been difficult to confirm, however, for temperatures around the disco are now such that authorities are not able to get within three miles of the club's core.

Fortunately, at this time, no injuries have been reported. But certainly for the people who live in this area, and, indeed, for all of us, the repercussions and potential emotional scars resulting from this night may be with us for a long, long time, indeed.

Why the Ozarks? Why Arkansas? Why was I born? Why am I living? For a perspective on these and other aspects of tonight's drama, we switch now to Dan Rather, who has just arrived in the affected area. Dan, can you fill us in?

RATHER: Yes, Walter. Here at two-thirty, three-thirty in the morning your time, the disco shows no signs of stabilization. The people, as you might suspect, are understandably upset. I just talked to one woman who said she had no idea a gay disco even existed in the area. It would be unfair, however, if I failed to point out that the same woman had previously asked me what a "disco" was.

But talking to others, more credible persons, perhaps, you still get the overriding impression that residents here had no hint of the approaching crisis. All they knew, we're told, was that

some men from the big city had come down and started building a building. The citizens had no idea it was to be a gay disco. They only knew it was something called the "Ultimate Degradation." The townsfolk assumed it was some sort of bureaucratic project — a state asylum for the mentally troubled. Not wanting to go anywhere near the place, for fear of running into assorted loose loonies, the residents refrained from seeking additional information concerning the new addition to their community.

But tonight, opening night for the disco, residents were suddenly awakened with the reality that something unusual, something unusual, indeed, was happening in their midsts.

Here with me is Milton Clements. Milton tells me he lives about a mile



down the road from the disco — and observed the events with shocked clarity. When did you first sense something was wrong, Mr. Clements?

CLEMENTS: Well, it started 'bout midnight. I was in the kitchen crumblin' up some cornbread in a glass of buttermilk, when I heard what sounded like a parade. I went out on the front stoop and looked toward the hill there. The hill the road comes over. They was comin' up the other side of the hill so I couldn't see 'em. Not just yet. But I could sure hear 'em. The bangin' of a million tambourines. There was such shoutin' and commotion — well, I went in and shook Martha awake and told her she'd best put on her robe.

RATHER: Then what happened?

CLEMENTS: Well, then we began to see 'em. They commence comin' down the hill. Oh, my Gawd! I ain't ever seen nothin' like it in my life!

This whole passle of cars, and people on roller skates, and people just runnin' along side the cars — all blowin' whistles and actin' crazy. And they must have been 'bout to wear themselves out because they kept puttin' these little bottles of smelling salts up to their noses. Must be powerful stuff. One of 'em threw an empty bottle on the yard and I thought old Bowser was gonna spin herself to death. Started flailin' 'round on her hind legs, like she was tryin' to twirl off the fleas.

Then they started to go into the ... the ... what was it you called it?

RATHER: The disco?

CLEMENTS: Yeah, that. Well, then they all started goin' inside — and we commence to hear this thumpin' sound. Thump, thump, thump. All at the same speed. Thump, thump, thump. 'Bout a hunnerd thumps a minute. At first I thought they was all in there learnin' how to slaughter hogs. But the thumpin' just went on and on.

'Course now they're saying the thumpin' is music. Ain't like no music I ever heard. And I bet if you ask 'em, the hogs'd rather they just used the old-fashioned sledge hammers on 'em.

RATHER: Thank you, Mr. Clements. That's how it looks here now, Walter. Back to you.

CRONKITE: Thank you, Dan. We now switch to Leslie Stahl, who has some of the interesting reactions to developments in Arkansas, as it begins to come in from other parts of the nation. Leslie?

STAHL: Yes, Walter. The repercussions of the Disco Meltdown are certainly far-reaching. We've learned that Liza Minnelli has just boarded a jet in New York and is desperately trying to beat Margaret Trudeau to the disco. Ms. Trudeau left from Hollywood and is clearly the odds-on favorite in the race.

However, Ms. Trudeau is handicapped by the fact that the only plane she could charter on such short notice was a DC-10. Not only is this, perhaps, dangerous — but Ms. Trudeau could also face a bit of difficulty with federal officials. Hinting that she was in no mood to quibble over the illegal flight, Ms. Trudeau issued a terse statement saying if the White House had any argument with her they could just ... and we quote ... "have Rosalynn Carter bury her face in my twat!"

Meanwhile, Ms. Minnelli has issued a statement of her own. Ms. Minnelli says that should Ms. Trudeau's plane arrive first, star-system protocol requires that the Trudeau plane circle overhead until Ms. Minnelli's plane lands at the disco. "And on top of everything else, she's a foreigner!" Ms. Minnelli added. A decision on the protocol question is expected shortly from Rona Barrett. Back to you, Walter.

CRONKITE: Thank you, Leslie. One of the plans being considered to diffuse the situation in the Ozarks has evidently been put into play. We've just received word that authorities plan to start saturating the area with Lawrence Welk music, using a complex system of portable cassette players. That attempt will be made in about an hour and we'll be back with you for live coverage at that time. For now, this is Walter Cronkite in New York. Good-night. ▼

Brothers and sisters, we conquered the streets of both Dallas and Houston this past weekend. Cedar Springs and Westheimer belong to us!

DALLAS was the site of a candlelight march Saturday night as over 2,000 proud gays walked down Cedar Springs from the Village Station to Lee Park where a rally was held. GPC President, Louise Young, and MCCD Pastor, Don Eastman, brought the crowd to their feet and Sam Young, who is the state representative for the Oak Lawn district, gave an inspiring speech. DALLAS PICNIC: Over 1,000 Dallasites came to last Sunday's Gay Pride Day picnic in Exhall Park which was sponsored by DAIR. Dancing in the streets, free food and beer, plus "being yourself" marked the course of events. All Dallas bars, except one, closed 'til 3pm so everyone could attend the picnic. Only The Boot Camp chose to remain open. Such dishonor brought "boos" from the crowd and has provoked a city-wide boycott of the bar which chose to run a drink special during the picnic. "Appalling," is an understatement.



HOUSTON PARADE: For the first time in the history of Houston, an all gay parade (see above) swooped down Westheimer from Shepherd to Bagby. Complete with police escort and side streets blocked, over twenty floats gaily motored down the "Great Gay Way of the Montrose," the home turf of the city's 250,000 gay inhabitants. Leading the parade was the MAC marching band and drill team followed by the Grand Marshall, Disco Grandma, Mary Thelma Hensel, with arms outstretched, blowing kisses to her children.

SWEEPSTAKES WINNER of the parade was awarded to Mary's "Proud To Be" beautiful float. Second place went to the Midtowne Spa, third place went to Dirty Sally's, and fourth place went to the Montrose Sports Association. (For pictures, see the two "photo essays" in this issue.) Honorable mentions are due to Club Houston, Locker, Venture-N and University of Houston! Already, everyone is talking about next year's parade! It will be bigger and longer.

HOUSTON RALLY: Sunday night, in Spotts Park, another several thousand gays jammed the sloped grassy bowl to join in "Expressions of Freedom" presented by the GPC. Ray Hill and Steve Shifflet inspired the introductions to the guest speakers. Tony Lazada spoke on the tenth anniversary of Stonewall; Kathy Whitmire spoke of being proud to seek the gay vote. Jean O'Leary (who had gone topless for a moment in the parade while putting on a Gay Pride T-shirt) spoke of the National Gay Task Force. And Midge Costanza, who was a former White House advisor to President Carter, made us all both laugh and think seriously about being the most affluent minority in America! Midge said that she sat in the President's chair and that "it fit!" At her mere mention of Anita Bryant, a loud explosion resounded across Memorial Drive and was heard for miles around. It was God's perfect timing for the beginning of the fireworks.

FIREWORKS: The rally ended with the "most spectacular fireworks display ever seen, anywhere!" Motorists even stopped along the freeway to watch the display. TWT extends a special thank you to our co-sponsors of the \$2,500 worth of nighttime pyrotechnics: The French Quarter, Miss



Camp America D.C.D.C., Numbers, Old Plantation and Silver Phoenix. As Larry Bagneris said, "I'm beginning to think that only gays can do everything right." Until next year's Gay Pride Day, "remain Gay, Proud, and most of all, yourself."

O.K.C. BEER BUST: Oklahomans For Human Rights will hold a benefit beer bust on Draper Lake this Sunday from 3-10pm. Vic Curtis reports that everyone will meet in the Free Spirit parking lot at 2pm and then motor out to the lake for the Gay Pride Beer Bust!

GAY DAY AT ASTROWORLD may be off. The Tea is that the amusement park doesn't want to give "the park over to queens for one whole day." So, there will be a Gay Awareness Meeting this Tuesday night at 7:30 at the Silver Phoenix according to Mike Bankester, "to discuss the matter."

VILLAGE STATION is the hottest new bar in all of Texas! On opening night, over 1,000 people lined Cedar Springs waiting to enter into the New York City disco. The light show is a trip. What Howard Metz did is not to be believed. In fact, the Village Station has so rocked Dallas on its arse, that other Village Stations may soon spring up across TWT-Land! 21:06 and Libertarianism

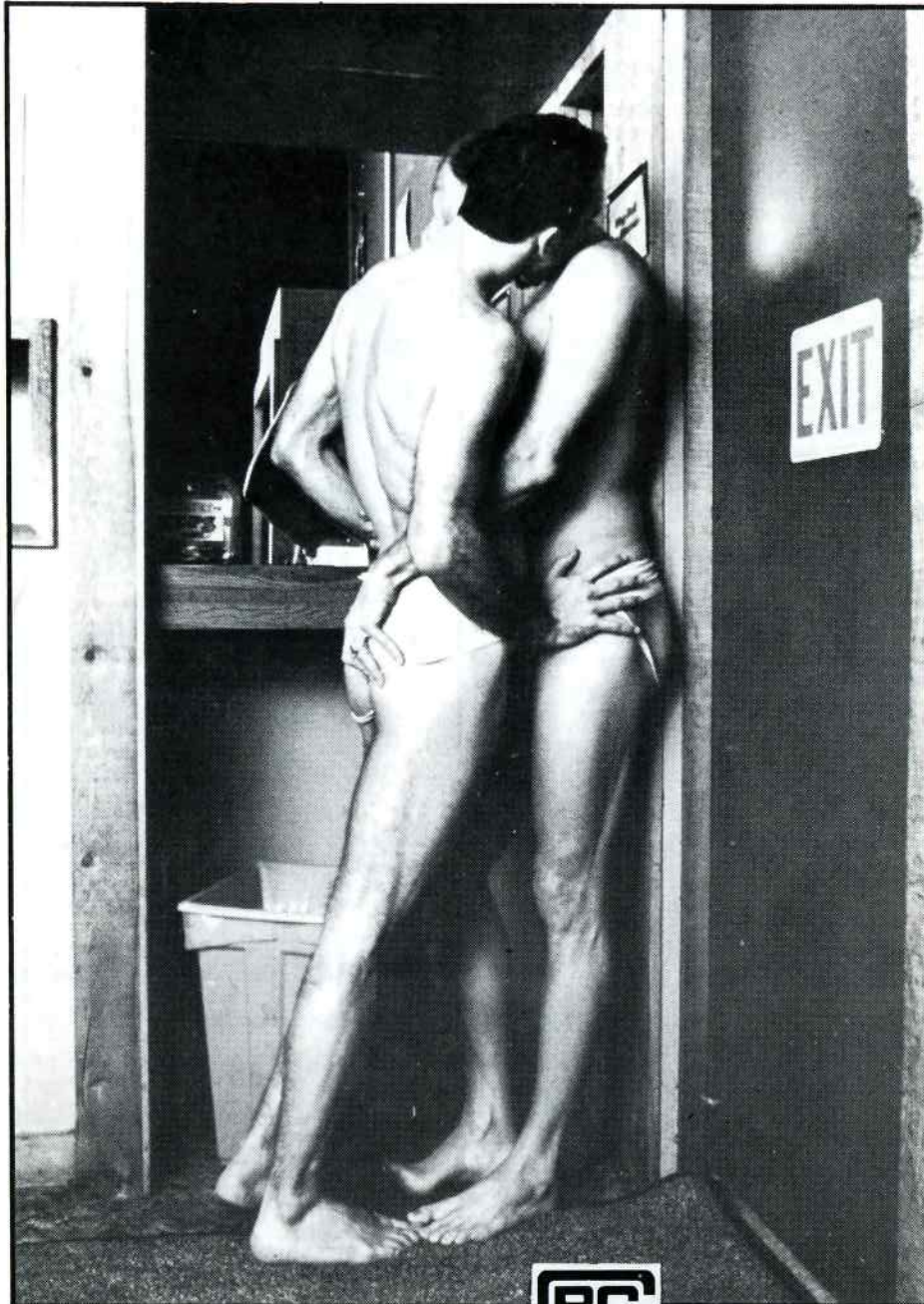

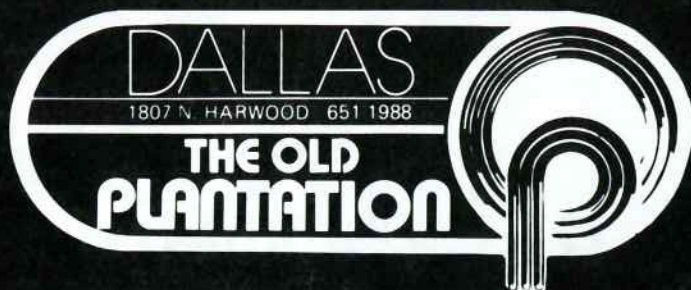
