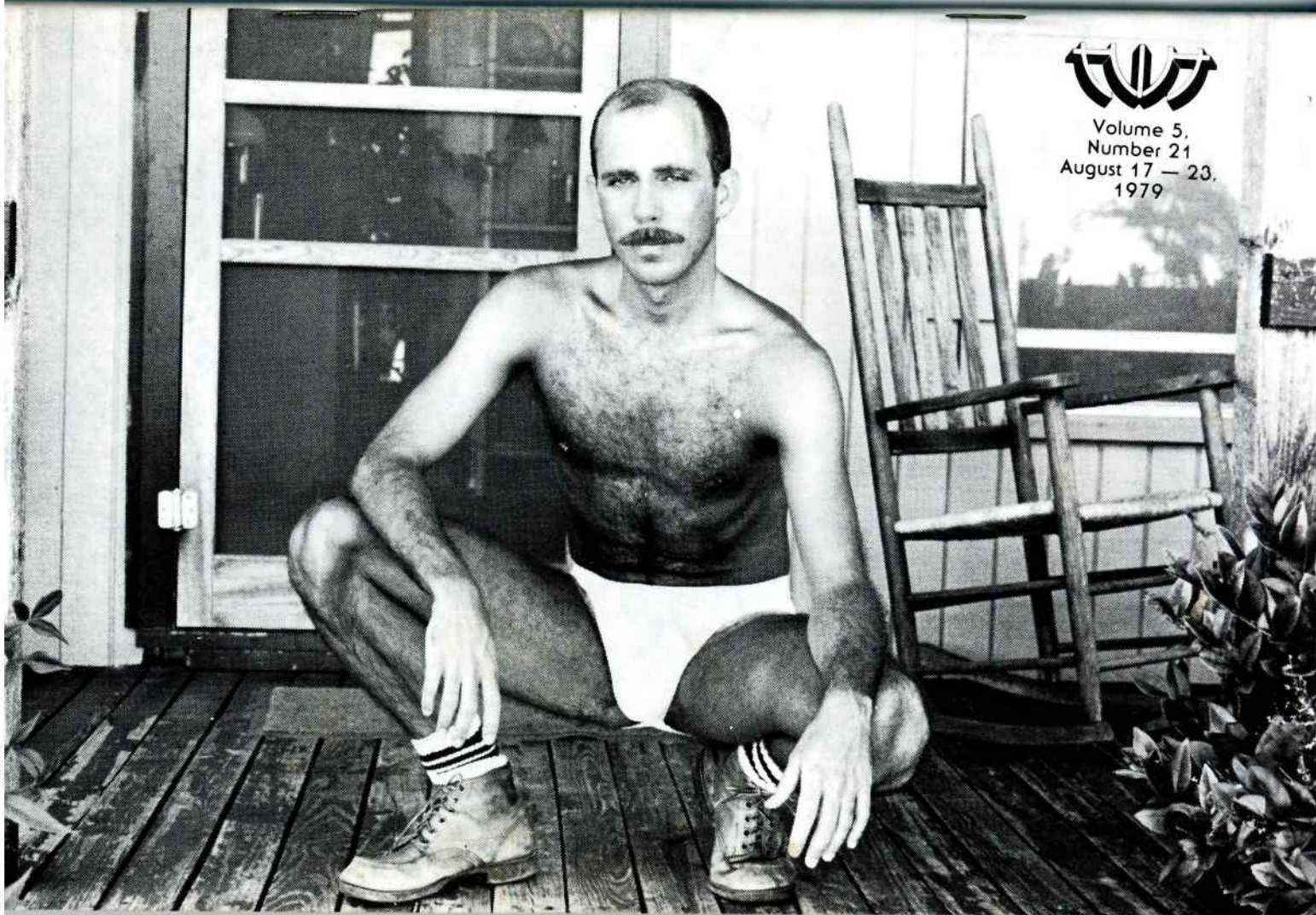
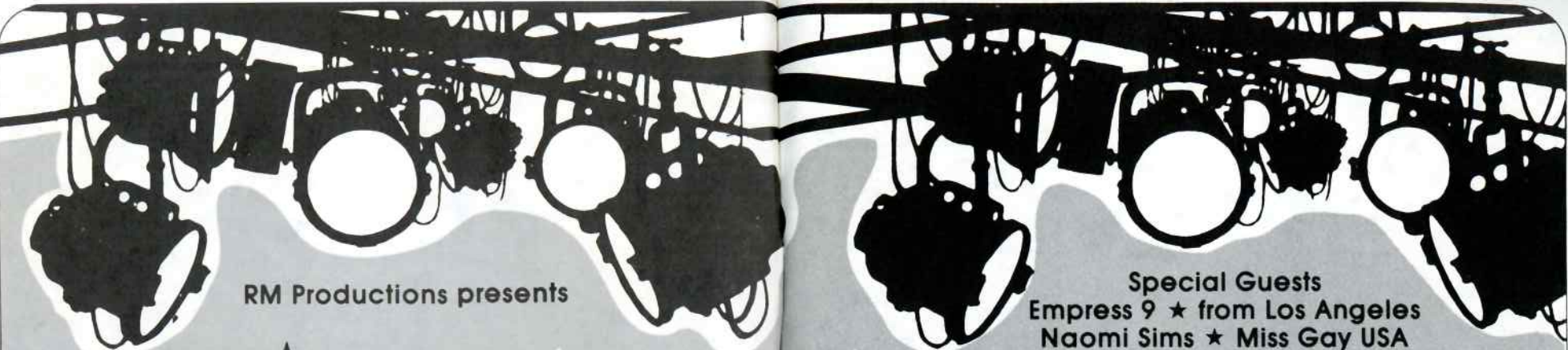

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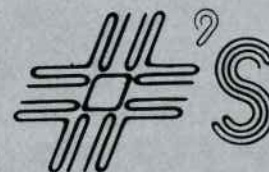

Leonard Matlovich is a current candidate for the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and Pat Bond is the ex-WAC featured in the film "Word Is Out," who is now touring as an actress depicting Gertrude Stein's life and thoughts.

Kathy Deitsch is the Texas Gay Task Force moderator and Woody Egger is the conference coordinator. The conference will conclude this Sunday with a general assembly considering resolutions and other business plus a send-off address. Come to Austin this weekend. There's no gas shortage! And, there's no gay shortage!

CARDINAL VS GAYS DIGNITY REACTS

Dignity, which is a gay Catholic organization with several thriving chapters in Texas, has received the

shock waves of a recent statement by Cardinal Humberto Medeiros of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston. He issued a directive attempting to discourage priests from joining any gay groups. Dignity has always enjoyed the support of sympathetic and loving priests who have offered spiritual guidance.

Additionally, the Cardinal urged gays to abstain from having sex. As one Texas priest said, "There are worse sins than sex in the Catholic faith." Dignity, meanwhile, continues to grow and expand.

Porno Lobby Absent in Austin

Dear TWT Readers,
A law will go into effect September 1 which could close down all the bookstores in the state that sell pornography. Where were the bookstore/porno retailers when the law was passed during this last legislative session? Quite simply they were busy selling their product and saying "it will never pass, it is just too unconstitutional." The Human Rights Advocates (HRA, the gay lobby in Austin) says, "the Texas legislature will pass anything, they don't

care if it's unconstitutional or not...no person's life, liberty or property is safe when the Texas legislature is meeting." The fact is that the conservative right wing is organized and they are closing in around us. They write letters, make phone calls to State Representatives and Senators and visit Austin when the legislature is in session. The lawmakers are intimidated by them and their program.

The gay rights lobby was present in Austin to protect gay civil rights. We made sure no new laws were passed which would deny us the few rights we now have. HRA believes it's better and less expensive to stop a bill before it becomes law than to wait and spend \$100,000 or more to fight it in the courts. In short, it's easier to raise \$25,000 than \$100,000 to protect our civil rights!

If you are concerned and want to know why the bookstores that sell pornography will be closed down September 1, call your State Representative and State Senator and ask them. They are paid by the state with your taxes to represent you and your interests. Not one of them voted to keep this law from passing. In reality, few of them would vote now in support of gay/lesbian civil rights, unless they hear

from you and you tell them what you expect from them. HRA is working to protect the gay/lesbian lifestyle. Ask your bookstore/porno retailer why they weren't present in Austin actively working to defeat the bill which could close them down September 1. If they tell you they did not know about it... tell them it's their responsibility to know about it.

The enemies of civil liberties are working hard... we must work harder. Gays/lesbians weren't singled out for discrimination this past legislative session because the Human Rights Advocates were lobbying in Austin and gay persons statewide wrote many letters. IT MAKES A DIFFERENCE!

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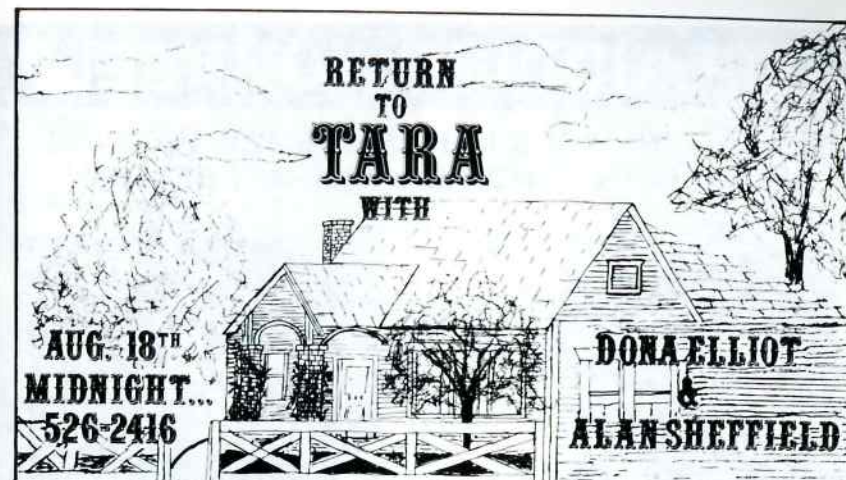
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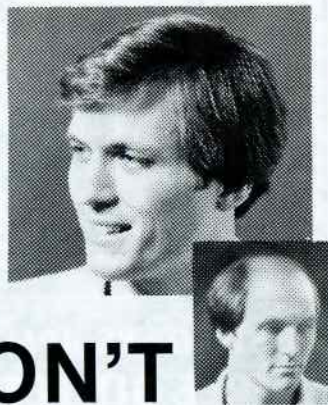
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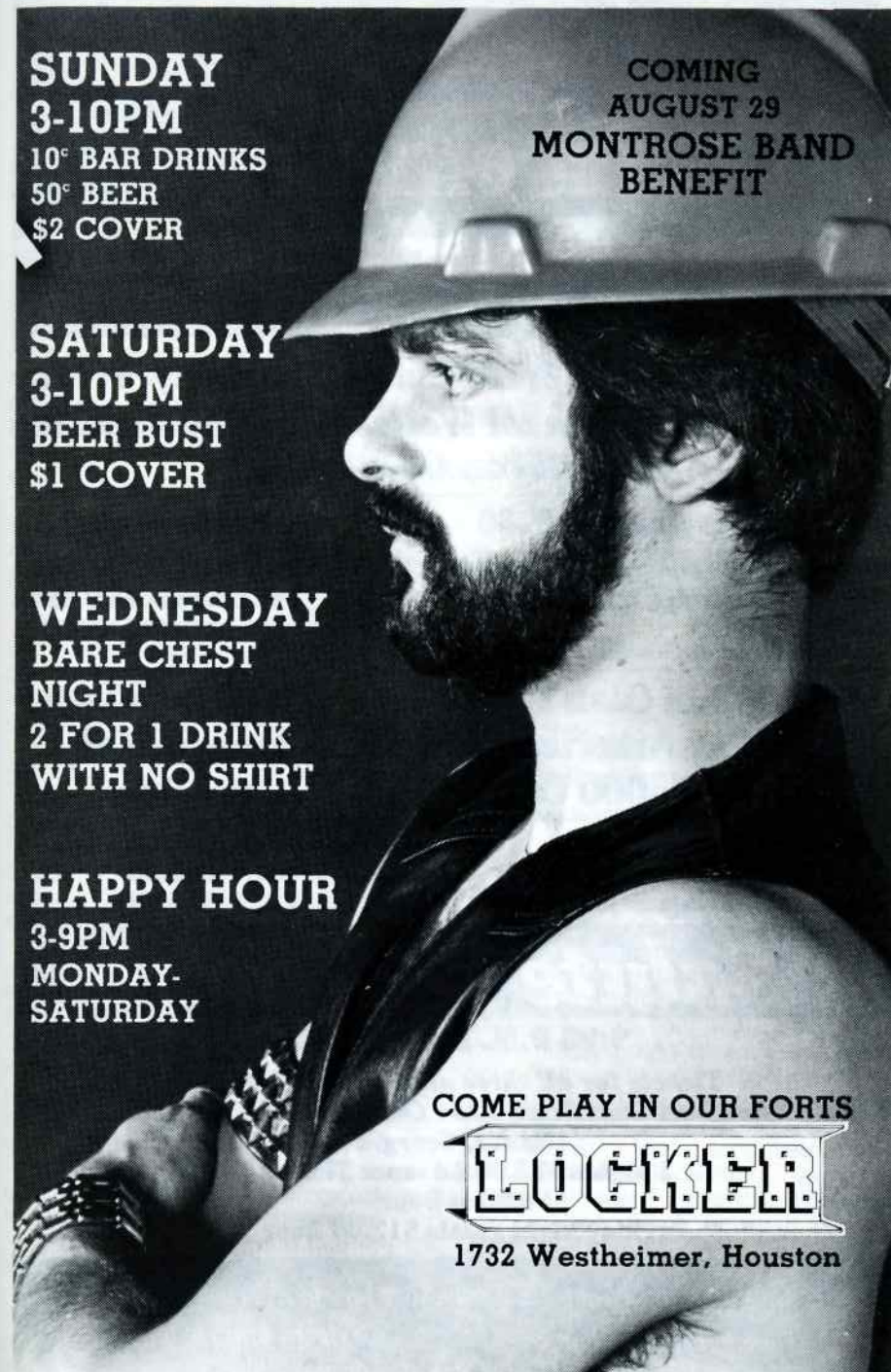
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LIFE WITH VERA by John Gardner

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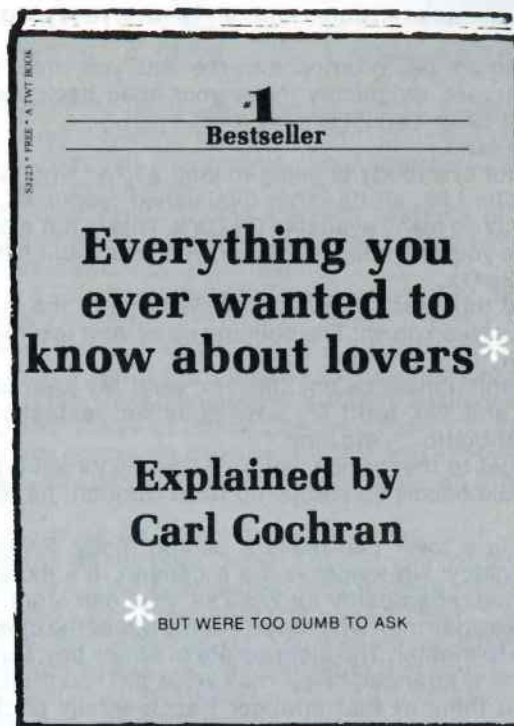
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PART II

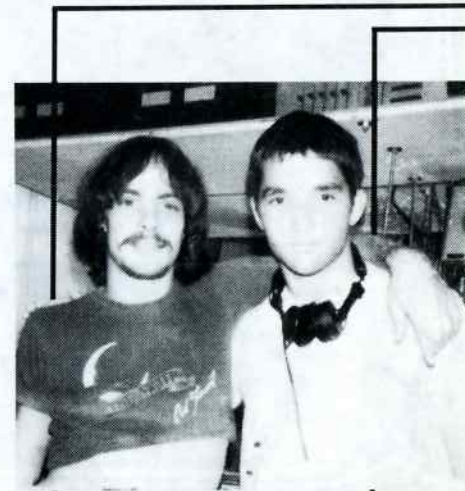

In an interview in the May/June 1979 issue of Politics Today, this question was asked of Connally: How about the issue of gay rights? California rejected a proposal to ban gay teachers from the schools. Those in opposition to the proposal included both Ronald Reagan and President Carter. How do you feel?

Connally replied: Theirs would be my position too, although again, I'm not comfortable with the idea that things such as homosexuality should be treated permissively. It's not normal, natural human behavior. But I know that there are a number of homosexuals in society and I certainly don't think that they ought to be denied the right to make a living. I think it is a question of individual behavior. If they don't bring it into their classrooms, if it doesn't influence their teaching, and particularly if it doesn't result in any kind of an impact on the students, then I certainly

don't think that they ought to be prevented from teaching. But if indeed it does have some impact on children, then I would look at it differently.

Phase I responded to cases of abuse and harassment that gay people must face from our police force and "straight" society in general. The purpose of Phase II is to document cases of abuse, harassment, and discrimination certain gay people face in the gay community by businesses which serve the community.
The Gay Political Caucus recognizes that the majority of businesses, bars, etc. have been very supportive of community activities. It is the small group of businesses
