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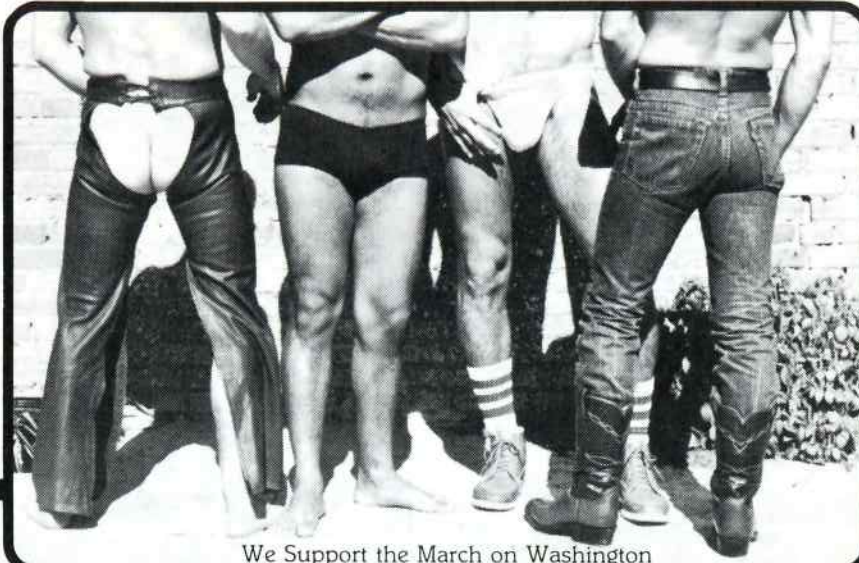

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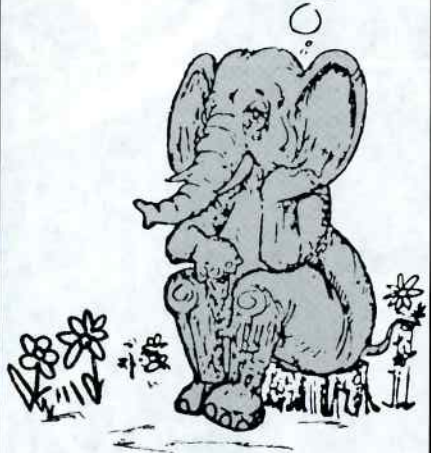

MARCH ON WASHINGTON PARADE SCHEDULE

Organizers of the National March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights have announced the final logistics plans for the October 14, 1979 event. The plans are the result of a joint meeting of the Policy/Overview and Coordinating Committees of the March held in Washington the weekend of September 15.

The organizers state that the March will include contingents from all 50 states and that these will be listed in the following order on the March roster:

Third World lesbians will lead the March followed by other lesbians; then physically challenged; children and senior citizens; international led by Puerto Rico; followed by parents and friends of lesbians and gay men.

The regions are next in the parade with the Prairie States in the lead. Texas leads the Prairie States, with Houston leading the Texas contingent which is being led by the Montrose Marching Band. Following the Prairie States are: Rocky Mountain, Far West, Midwest, Southeast, Northeast, Middle Atlantic; the remaining contingents will be those national organizations which have not already been included within regional and/or state contingents.

Buses are to park in the West Potomac Park parking lot near the Lincoln Memorial; when this is full they are to park on Constitution Ave. Each bus should have marshals chosen on a co-sexual basis. For further information call the Logistics Office, (202)789-1070.

Participants in the March will gather in the block bordered by Constitution & Independence Avenues, 3rd & 4th Streets beginning early Sunday, October 14; the March will step-off at noon and proceed down Pennsylvania Avenue. It will end at the Washington Monument end of the Mall where the rally will begin at 2pm. Confirmed speakers for the rally at this

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 13: Texas Bar-B-Que at The Lost & Found Bar, #56 L St. SE, 3-6pm, \$8 (includes 3 beers or soft drinks), dj'ed disco; all proceeds go to the North Texas Committee for the March on Washington.

The Washington Area Women's Center is sponsoring a dj'ed disco dance for lesbians at the Shoreham Americana Hotel in the Blue Room, Conn. Ave. & Calvert St. NW; cash bar, \$7 at the door.

The First National Lesbian/Gay Concert will be held in the Sylvan Theatre (near the Washington Monument) at 6pm.

Disco Dance in conjunction with the Third World Conference at Harambee House, 2225 Georgia Ave. NW, 10pm.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 14: Lesbian/Gay Business Brunch at the Washington Hilton, 1919 Conn. Ave. NW, 9:30-11am, \$12 + tax & tip.

The March steps-off from 4th St. between Constitution & Independence Aves. at noon; the rally begins at 2pm on the Mall near the Washington Monument.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 15, is the day set aside as "Lesbian and Gay Constituent Lobby Day" in Washington, D.C. Marchers are urged to stay over and lobby their Congresspersons for the five March demands and the theme, "An end to all

social, economic, judicial, and legal oppression of Lesbian and Gay people."

The Constituent Lobby Day effort will also seek to alert Senators and Congressional Representatives to the plight of Lesbians and Gays and make them aware that there are Lesbian and Gay constituents in their home districts.

Appointments are currently being completed with the White House, the Senate and the House of Representatives. Marchers representing individuals from all 50 states will converge on the Capitol to demand full constitutional and civil rights for all persons regardless of sexual orientation or affectional preference.

Statewide core groups of lobbying activists have been formed in virtually every state to plan and complete the lobbying event. Houston's Ray Hill will be representing Texas and the Prairie States at this historic meeting.

DALLAS RESTAURANT TARGET OF ARSONIST

A popular new Dallas restaurant for gays, Mom's Meatball Cafe, was destroyed by fire early Sunday morning, October 7, after 2am. Arson is charged. The building on the corner of Lemmon and McKinney housed four business locations, two of which were vacant. The fire skipped the in-between locations which suffered extensive smoke damage.

Ray's Fantastic Fish, located to the west of Mom's Cafe, burned completely. Fortunately, the fire occurred several hours after the cafe had closed at 11pm. No injuries were reported to TWT. The owners of the restaurant who are from New York's "Little Italy," reported that the cafe will survive, re-build, and re-open. No leads have been reported regarding the identity of the arsonists.

NUMBERS DEFIES LAW, HOLDS AFTER HOURS

Several weeks ago, the city of Houston decided to suddenly enforce the "no after hours" ordinance. That city ordinance states that any club serving alcoholic beverages must vacate their building no later than 2:15am. Since that recent en-

forcement, some of the straight discos in Houston have once again revived after hours. Specifically, the Honeycomb Disco, was open till 5am last Friday.

Houston's two gay super discos, The Copa and Numbers, have remained closed after 2am. However, last Saturday, October 6, Numbers decided to stay open after 2am. Although the manager and assistant manager left the club promptly at 2am, owner Beverly Wren and her assistant Jerry Vann (see photo below)



stayed at the club, positioned visibly at the front door, waiting for the vice to come and take them to jail. But, no vice or police ever came.

Reliable information reveals that the vice were called several times and informed that Numbers was still open in violation of the law. The thrust of the situation is that Numbers has taken it upon themselves to force the after hours issue. Numbers, obviously, would have an airtight case of discrimination if their disco was closed while a straight disco wasn't. If a gay disco is closed for after hours, then under the "equal protection law," all other discos would have to be closed. Numbers will hold after hours again this Friday and Saturday nights and the owners and management will be there after 2am to await further developments.

HOUSTON GPC ENDORSEMENTS

The Houston GPC, as always, has again interviewed all the candidates for the upcoming November city election and has endorsed the following because of their pro-gay principals. These are the

ones gays should vote for. At the top of the ticket is the race for mayor. GPC is naturally not endorsing the incumbent Mayor McConn since he has not lived up to his promise to work and help the gay community. Instead, GPC has endorsed Leonel Castillo for mayor. For city controller, Kathy Whitmire gets the gay endorsement and quite naturally since she has spoken out for gay rights. She should be retained in office.

In the city council race for positions at large, these are the endorsements: Jeff Daiell for Position 1, Eleanor Tinsley for Position 2, none for Position 3, Pat Ginther for Position 4, and Judson Robinson, Jr. for Position 5.

In the city council race for districts, these are the endorsements: none for District A, Ernest McGowen, Sr. for District B, Lance Lalor for District C, Moses LeRoy for District D, none for Districts E and F, Kathryn Ross for District G, Anne Wheeler for District H, and Ben T. Reyes for District 1.

The four no endorsements "at this time" will be decided by the GPC on October 17, at which time a further announcement will be made in TWT.

ASTROWORLD TICKET SALES \$11,500

Sunday, September 30 was "Gay Day at Astroworld" with nearly 5,000 gays flooding the amusement park. 4,000 of those in attendance had purchased their tickets in advance from "Family." Three dollars of each of those tickets stayed in the gay community.

The figures from ticket sales show a net of \$34,000 with around \$11,500 staying in the gay community of Family. Family is donating the money to the March on Washington, the November election, the Montrose Patrol, and its next event, a country music festival during the Thanksgiving holiday.

No unfavorable incidents were reported by Astroworld officials who complimented Houston gays on their conduct and organization. In fact, we have been invited back for another Gay Day at Astroworld next Spring.

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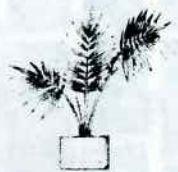

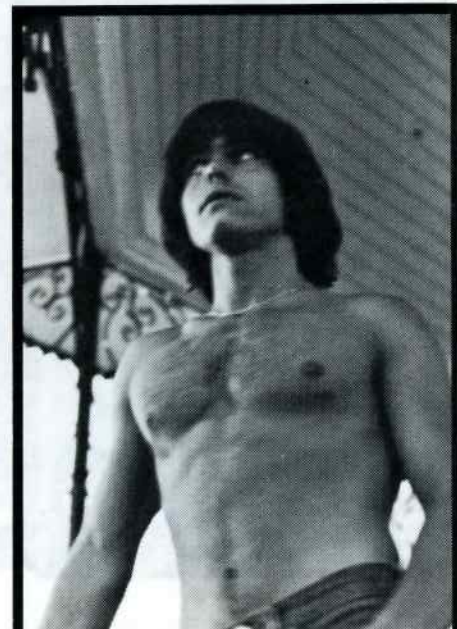

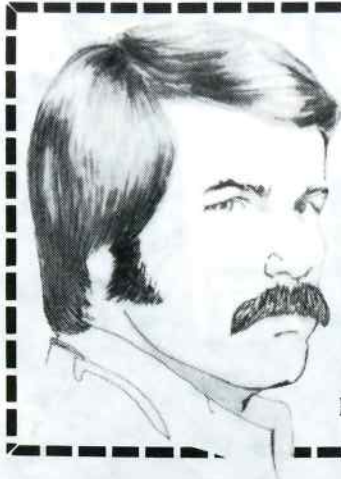

To the producer's credit the program managed to stay away from the public stereotype, showing, instead, a sensitive observation of our lifestyle.

Divided into four categories, **Oppression, Escape, Relationships, and Expression**, the film essay presented proof of our sub-culture's creativity and individuality. These subtitles alone show the program's attempt to stay away from cliches, striving to point out that gays are all "people first, and, as people, . . . can relate to . . . and love each other." 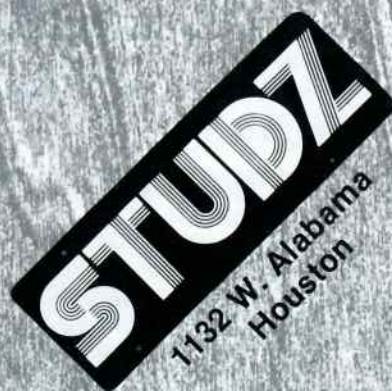

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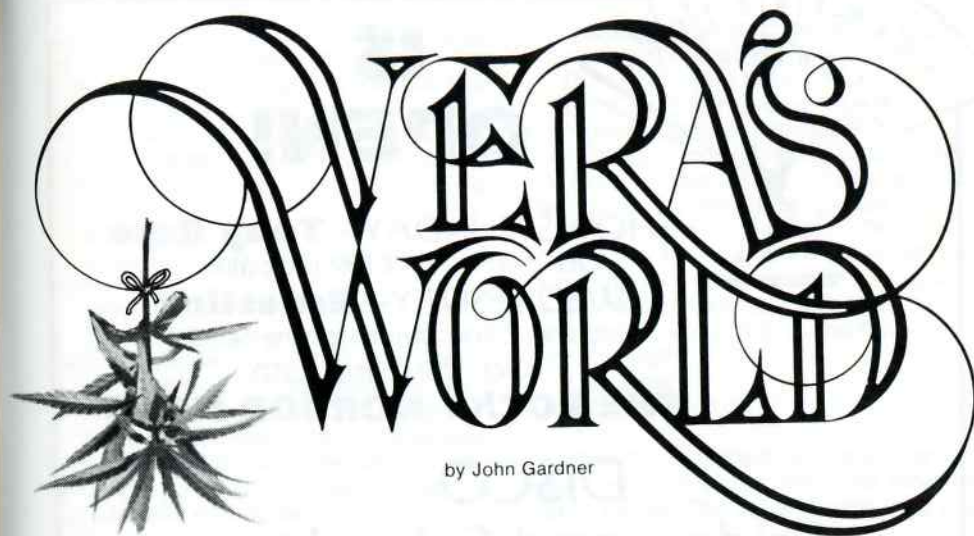

"No, no, come on. What peculiarities?"

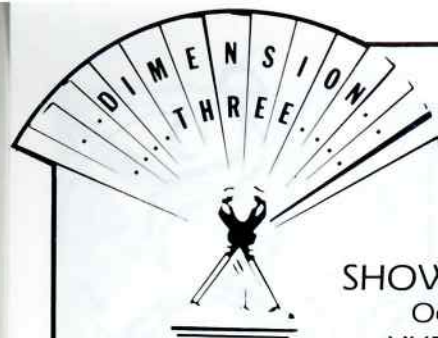

very long time."
