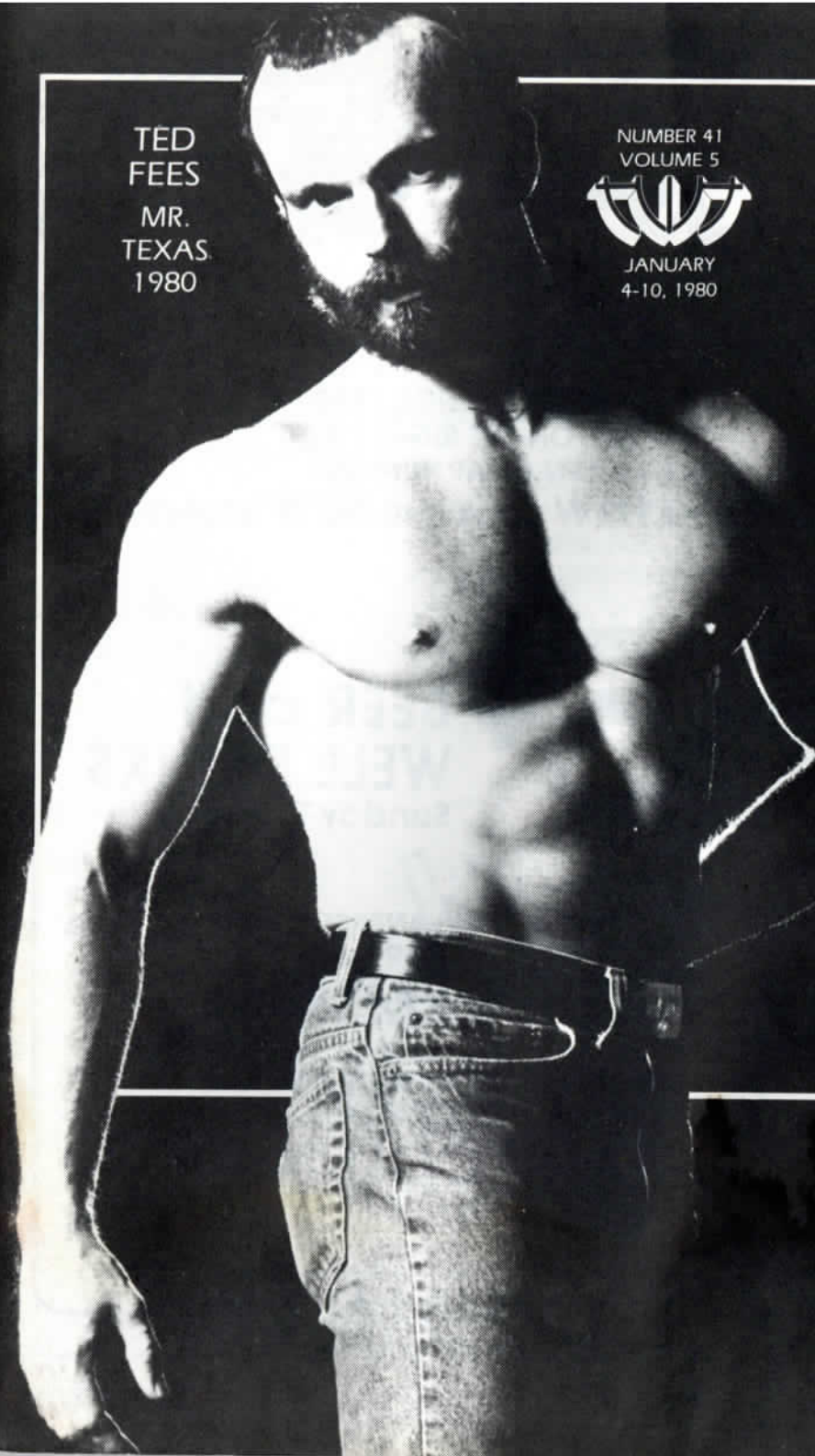

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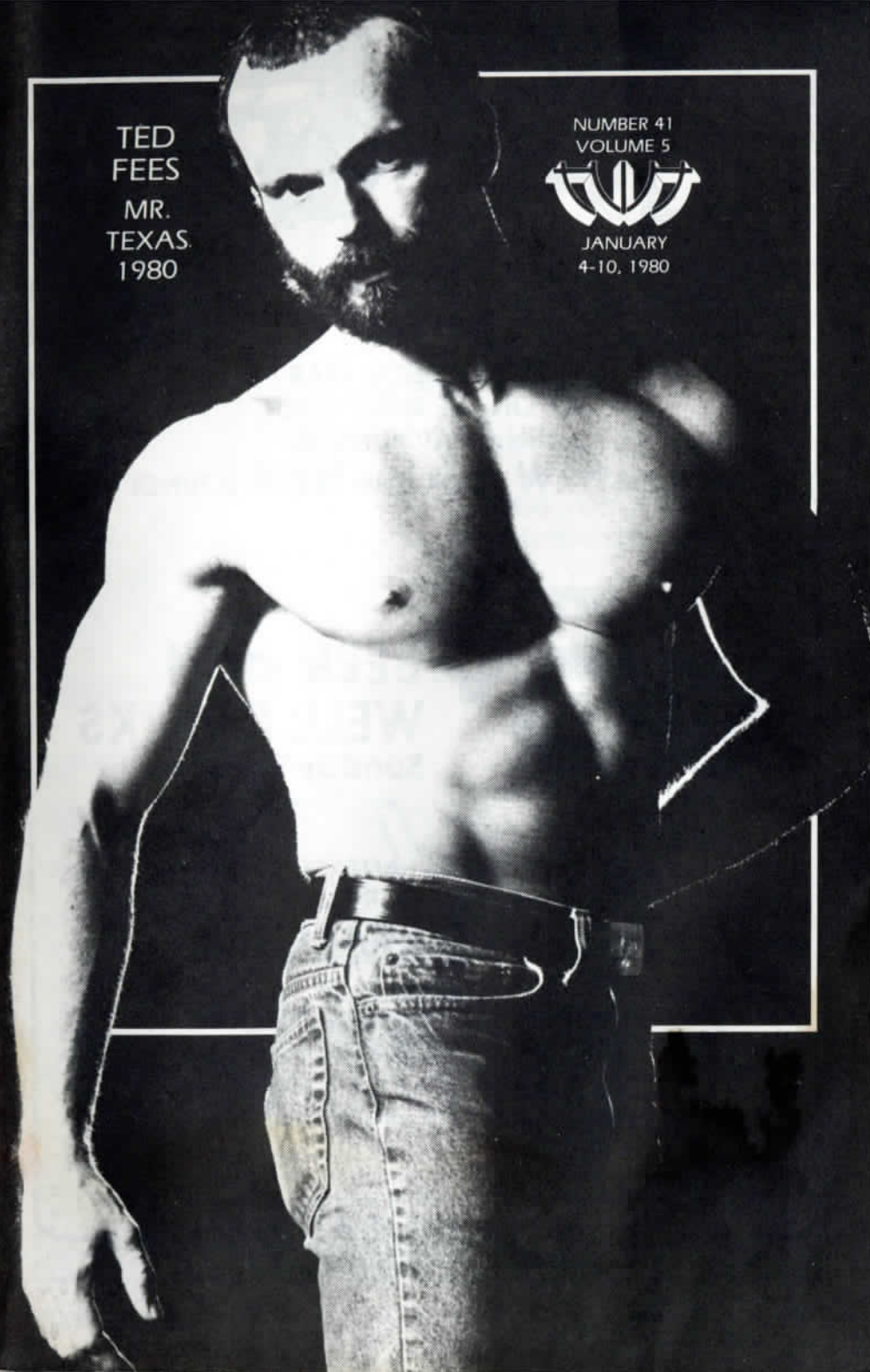

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THIS WEEK...

SAN ANTONIO GAYS FORMING POLITICAL GROUP

San Antonio: It's the third largest metropolitan area in Texas. Its gay population is growing, is becoming more open, and is catching up quickly with the Texas gay rights movement.

Yet, the third most populated area in Texas has been void of organized gay rights activities and political groups. That is about to quickly change. San Antonio is about ready to take its rightful place along side Houston, Dallas and nearby Austin. All three cities have gay organizations and political groups. Soon, three cities will become four cities.

A group of gays, lesbians and their supporters have been meeting to discuss the formation of a local San Antonio political group. The group is taking into account the need in the Alamo City to blend many different groups of persons.

The diversity of San Antonio makes for a unique new political concept in Texas for gays and lesbians. Details of the plan have not been completely disclosed to TWT, but an announcement will be forthcoming shortly as San Antonio gays and lesbians enter the new decade with activist fever!

20 MILLION GAYS ESTIMATED IN USA: MOST AFFLUENT MINORITY

Los Angeles: Kinsey estimates that 10% of the population is gay. That equates to approximately 20 million Americans. Those 20 million American gays comprise the most affluent minority in the country.

Walker and Struman, a Los Angeles market-research company which is straight, has found that the income for the average gay household of 1.4 persons "is \$23,600 which is about 50%

above the national average."

Other gay economic facts are "that 79% of the readers of the Advocate use commercial airlines an average of nearly four trips a year, that more than 80% order drinks by brand names, 70% are college graduates, 97% are employed, and 84% are regular voters." This is about double the national average.

The owner of the research company, Kenneth D. Struman, told *Business Week Magazine* that "Gay discretionary spending power is incredible."

"It is becoming more apparent to the straight community that there is a lot of buying power among gays," says George Terzian who is a lawyer heading up the Greater Gotham Business Council in New York City.

Projections from another Los Angeles based study suggest that "gays control 19% of the spendable income in America," reports *Business Week Magazine*.

No other minority can make such economic claims. As gays enter a new decade, they can truly say they are "America's most affluent minority!"

GAY POWER ELECTS SAN FRANCISCO MAYOR

San Francisco: Dianne Feinstein, as you may recall, was elected mayor of San Francisco on December 11, 1979. She had been appointed mayor after the assassinations of Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk. She has now won her four-year term at the polls.

For some time politicians have been predicting that the gay power in San Francisco would be instrumental in electing a mayor. It has come to pass.

Feinstein won her mayoral victory by some 15,000 votes with the bulk of her voter support coming out of the gay districts. She campaigned in the gay bars, along Castro and Folsom Streets



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and promised to appoint a gay to the city police commission.

Her opponent, Kopp, did little campaigning in the gay areas. As a result he lost. In San Francisco, gays are a very influential minority at the polls.

In Houston, gays are also a very influential minority at the polls. Example: Gays in Houston were the deciding election factor in the Tinsley landslide win over Frank Mann. Candidates who want to win the Eighties must campaign vigorously in the districts where gays dominate.

MONTROSE ACTIVITY CENTER RECEIVES \$\$ GIFT

Houston: The Montrose Activity Center has been given a \$1,226 gift from the Executive and Professional Association of Houston, according to Nick Escobedo of the MAC Board of Directors. Nick commented that "the money will be used to carry on the work of the center in providing space for organizations within the gay community for their meetings and functions."

Nick, on behalf of the board, expressed his deep appreciation to the Executive and Professional Association which has joined a long list of organizations in the gay community making financial contributions to the center.

Bert Hollister, president of EPAH, stated that the gift was made to MAC for its work in providing a much needed facility for the community during the past year and stated that EPAH wanted to do more in the future.

NEW DALLAS CHAPTER BEING FORMED

Dallas: A local chapter of Parents and Friends of Gays, known as PFOG is being formed in the Dallas/Ft. Worth Metroplex according to *Dialog*, the newsletter of the Dallas Gay Political Caucus. The group, which will have national affiliation, has come about in answer to the growing need of local parents and friends of lesbians and gay men who

would like to understand better the gay life style.

PFOG will open a non-political, non-sectarian discussion forum to help parents deal with their gay sons and daughters.

MONTROSE PATROL IS RECRUITING

Houston: "As the situation in the Montrose approaches something resembling normalcy, humans have a tendency to become somewhat complacent," says Steve Coates of the Montrose Patrol. The Patrol, in spite of this, needs more members.

"There are only 41 members assigned, of which about half patrol your streets on a regular basis. It is not fair to ask a few to give so much of their time and often their money for the sake of so many. We need your time, skills and money to do this job well. There will be times on duty when it appears that we have many more people than we need. That is seldom the case, but with fewer people than would like, we must depend on a random type of scheduling that does not give us an accurate prediction of manpower from shift to shift. Please consider us and the COMMUNITY in your New Year's resolutions."

However, no matter how bad the manpower situation becomes, the Montrose Patrol will not alter the minimum requirements which are: 1) over 18 years of age, 2) stable address, 3) stable employment, 4) no warrants, 5) no indictments, 6) not on felony probation or parole at the present time, 7) willing to sign a waiver of liability, and 8) able to give Montrose Patrol at least two nights a month.

WILL THERE BE A SPECIAL SESSION IN 1980?

Austin: Although the governor of Texas is not required to give advance notice of his call for a special session, Lt. Governor Bill Hobby and House Speaker Bill Clayton have stated that the governor will undoubtedly schedule his move for March or September of 1980. He intends to have lawmakers pass a wiretapping bill, which infringes on the individual liberties of all Texans. Establishing initiative and referendum powers in Texas is also a part of his call.

The Mr. Texas Pageant, sponsored by TWT, netted the lobby for lesbian/gay rights in Austin, \$2,262. The effort further assures our community representation in the special legislative session, budgeted to cost \$6,000 per special session.

A gay/lesbian lobby (the Human Rights Advocates) must be present during any meeting of lawmakers, so as to protect our opportunity and treatment under Texas law. If you are not a part of the confidential legislative alert system, please mail your name, address and phone number today. It's the goal of the Human Rights Advocates to "Buck For Our Rights." By keeping gays and their supporters informed about state law, many more gays will feel comfortable monitoring our lawmakers. HRA urges you to become involved as a constituent. SAN ANTONIO'S FIRST GAY MALE ART SHOW

San Antonio: The Alamo City's first gay male art show ran as a page one story in the *San Antonio News*—in a scandal column.

Jim Eggeling, the artist, a well-known supporter of gay human rights who was fired from his teaching job with a local

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school district for supporting gay rights, presented an exhibit of paintings and drawings of the adolescent male nude in charcoal, acrylic, ink, conte, and polychromatic gesso. According to the artist, the exhibit was a serious attempt to present the sensibilities of a gay male artist to a group of friends—men and women—at a private, invitation-only showing.

However, Eggeling's invitation was posted on the student bulletin board in the psychology department of San Antonio College.

A psychology student noticed it and wrote to the *San Antonio News* that he took umbrage "at finding something like this in our psychology department. I have a 12-year-old son, and if I ever find him involved in such activity, there will be two less spherical objects for the 'artist' to capture on canvas."

Asked about the statement, the artist replies, "I have often wondered about the quality of education in San Antonio, but to find students of psychology advocating castration as a meaningful childrearing practice is appalling; I think it says something about the homophobia and violence which our institutions of higher learning do little to address no change."

DENVER POLICE ASKED TO HIRE GAYS

Denver. The Task Force of Denver, Colorado has suggested to the Denver police that they actively recruit gay men. This, they say, would reduce tension between police and gays in the mile-high city.

Seven months ago the Task Force was organized to assess allegations that the Denver police were harassing gays. According to *The Weekly News*, "the Task Force also made several other recommendations to the Commission on Community Relations:

1. That city laws that are used to harass gays be studied and changed.
2. That gays be appointed to all city boards and commissions that deal with civil rights and public safety issues.
3. That the police department appoint

a liaison officer to improve communications with the gay community.

Captain Jerry Kennedy, head of the Denver Vice Squad, was in the audience for the Commission's meeting and said, "There's two sides to every story, and we'll be happy to present ours."

He added, according to *The Rocky Mountain News*, that his Vice Squad isn't interested in interfering with "sex for fun," but only with "sex for money," because it's illegal.

He said that many of the charges of harassment have come from homosexuals arrested for illegal acts such as prostitution and public indecency.

"They're naturally going to have a rub with the police department."

GAY NIGHT AT THE CIRCUS

Miami, Florida: Just as the Houston gay community under the umbrella of Family presented and organized Gay Day at Astroworld last September, now a group of Miami gays are unveiling plans to hold a gay night at the circus: The Greatest Show on Earth, no less.

Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey Circus will be making a South Florida tour de circus the end of January. The renowned circus will play the Miami Beach Convention Center on the night of Thursday, January 24.

The gay group ticket promotion is offering advance sale tickets for \$5 compared with the normal price of \$7.50. Group discount night will be for the Thursday night performance of the all new 110th edition of the circus. A sellout crowd would "blackout" that night at ticket outlets throughout Florida.

Tickets will be available soon according to *The Weekly News* at local establishments, or may be ordered by sending \$5 per ticket to Circus, 4250 West Hallandale Beach Blvd., Suite 200, Hollywood, Florida 33023.

TEXAS GAY REPUBLICANS

Universal City, Texas: Successful fund raising events have been recently held in San Antonio and Austin for the National Convention Project. The combined efforts netted the Washington, D.C. based project over \$1,500. The purpose of its directors, Mary Spottswood Pou and Tom Bastow, in coming to Texas was to take advantage of the groundwork already laid by gays/lesbians in the state Democratic Party.

The National Convention Project is a bi-partisan effort aimed at coordinating, nationally, local grassroots work and maintaining an information flow through both national party conventions.

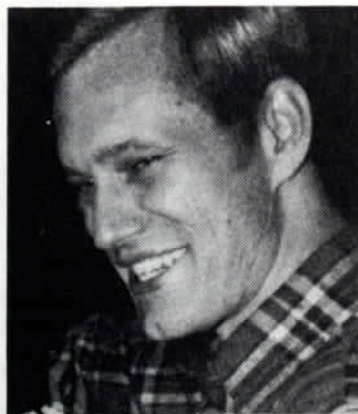
A statewide meeting was held in conjunction with the directors' visit and was aimed at disseminating project information and broadening support in Texas.

Early last December, one of the project's Board of Directors members, Republican Carolyn Handy, visited Dallas and met with Texas Republicans who expressed an interest in organizing formally and working with the convention project.

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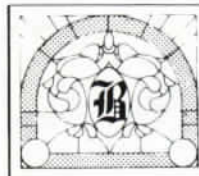

How can anyone, especially gay, support a church whose leader, the Pope, has nothing better to do than tell you and me that we meet approval as a non-functioning, non-loving, zombie homosexual, and are condemned by a god if we physically and sexually love another of the same sex?

It is beyond me how any gay person can support centuries' old attitudes that once had their brothers and sisters beheaded, and that completely and totally contradicts the very life style we uphold. Even now in Iran, Turkey, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Ireland,

etc., is a god-supported "Religion" that is advocating and propagating death, hatred, war, oppression, and all forms of violence against mankind in an effort to further a fanatic, antiquated religious belief.

It is time we lifted ourselves out of the middle ages and into the 21st century by facing our foes in a headlong effort to stamp out the very thing that threatens our very existence. And that thing, in one word, is *Religion!*

Oak Lawn Violence

Dear TWT,

I have lived in the Oak Lawn area since March of '79 and a lot has been happening lately. I didn't think much of anything happening to me until Sunday morning about 3:30. I was walking to my front door with my friend; we were at the disco before we came home. These three guys said, "Hey," and we turned around and they had guns on us, forced us into my apartment, tied us up and started going through everything. They slashed my waterbed, stole stereos, TV cameras, took our billfolds and some jewelry. They also kicked my bowling ball against my friend's head, and sexually

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abused me. It was about 5:00 and they were fixing to leave and my roommate walked in; they threw him down and tied him up and kicked him around. They then took my friend's and my car and took off. I got my feet loose and got the door unlocked and went to a neighbor's apartment; they untied me and my roommate and my friend and called the police. I don't think this happened because we are gay; they were just waiting for someone. My main concern of this letter is to urge people to please be careful and look around before you get out of a car. . . .

"Into Each Life—a Little Lorraine Must Fall."

Dear TWT,
It will be three months (on December 19) since I asked a simple question of the U.S. Air Force. As a transsexual, I requested the "right to work" in my GS-3 clerk-typist position at Keesler AFB, Biloxi, MS, as a transgender. (In preparation for hormonal and sex-reassignment *it is required* I cross-dress as part of psychotherapy.) Annual salary is (was) \$12,000. The Air Force isn't buying. Gender Dysphoria refers to my psychological state and is the primary working diagnosis applied to any and all persons requesting surgical and hormonal sex-reassignment. I am a biological male, a psychological female. (World wide, there are 30-60,000 persons like myself.)

I returned to Keesler AFB on November 5 (also November 25), 1979 dressed as a woman, only to be sent home and placed on suspension (not fired), no pay. I face eviction this coming Tuesday from my apartment, no income, and people refuse to hire me, due to notoriety. Can't draw unemployment but do get food stamps. Also spent three weeks in unheated apartment, as I couldn't pay utilities. Heat's on now, in more ways than one. Now, no joke gang, you can understand why I have "come out" as a Human Rights and Gay Activist for all minorities, both state and national.

Since I am *waiting* to become "one-hell-of-a woman" I find myself involved in helping the local gay population any way I can. They call me "Mother Gibson."

The only support I can offer now is moral. I am not a "rebel-rouser" but know the issues we all face; they're based on prejudice. I am headed for Federal Courts with my case.

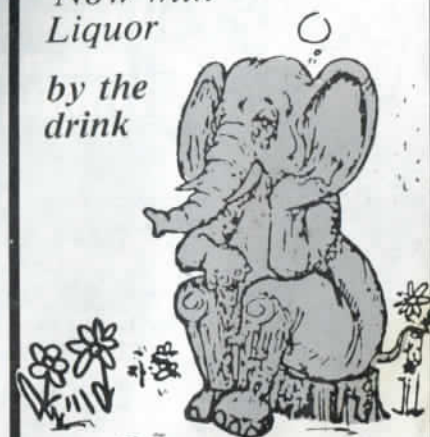

To Declare Unconstitutional or to Repeal?

Dear TWT,
 Recently it has come to my attention that confusion exists as to what the Texas Human Rights Foundation and the Human Rights Advocates can do to get rid of the Texas law 21:06 (Homosexual Conduct section of the Texas Penal Code). As many of you already know, the Texas Human Rights Foundation, through plaintiff Donald Baker, recently filed a lawsuit in a Dallas Federal District Court. The suit seeks to have the Texas law prohibiting homosexual conduct *struck down* and *declared unconstitutional*. It is my understanding that the THRF, through the *judicial process*, seeks to inquire into the extent and adequacy of civil liberties and civil rights protections. The foundation, which has tax deductible status, goes to court to test,

challenge or otherwise settle questions of a legal nature.

The Human Rights Advocates, on the other hand, is involved through the *legislative process*. It is the work of the gay/lesbian lobby in Austin to see that anti-gay laws are not passed and that protective laws be written. To remove the law through the *legislative route* is known as *repeal*. The lawmakers themselves can vote to remove the section of the penal code which criminalizes homosexual conduct. Or if the entire penal code were to be rewritten, HRA would lobby to have 21:06 simply not be a part of the new code (undoubtedly, though, one of the 181 lawmakers would move to maintain it). It is unfortunate, but true, that the Texas Legislature oftentimes passes laws which are blatantly unconstitutional.

Also, because HRA is a lobbying group, any donation or contribution to its work *can not* be tax deductible. HRA is the legislative advocacy arm of the Texas Gay Task Force, Inc.

Both groups deserve your support, as both jobs must be done to protect our life style in Texas. The Texas Gay Task Force, Inc. urges Texas gay/lesbian organizations and individuals to give their support to the

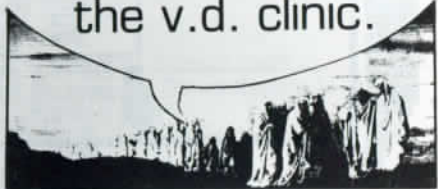

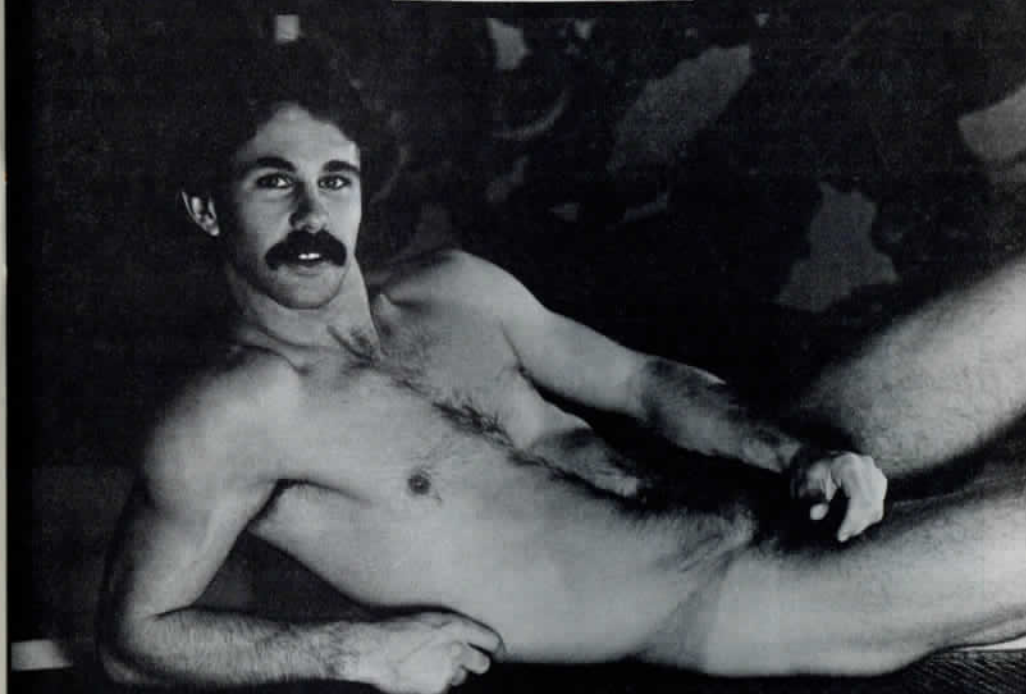
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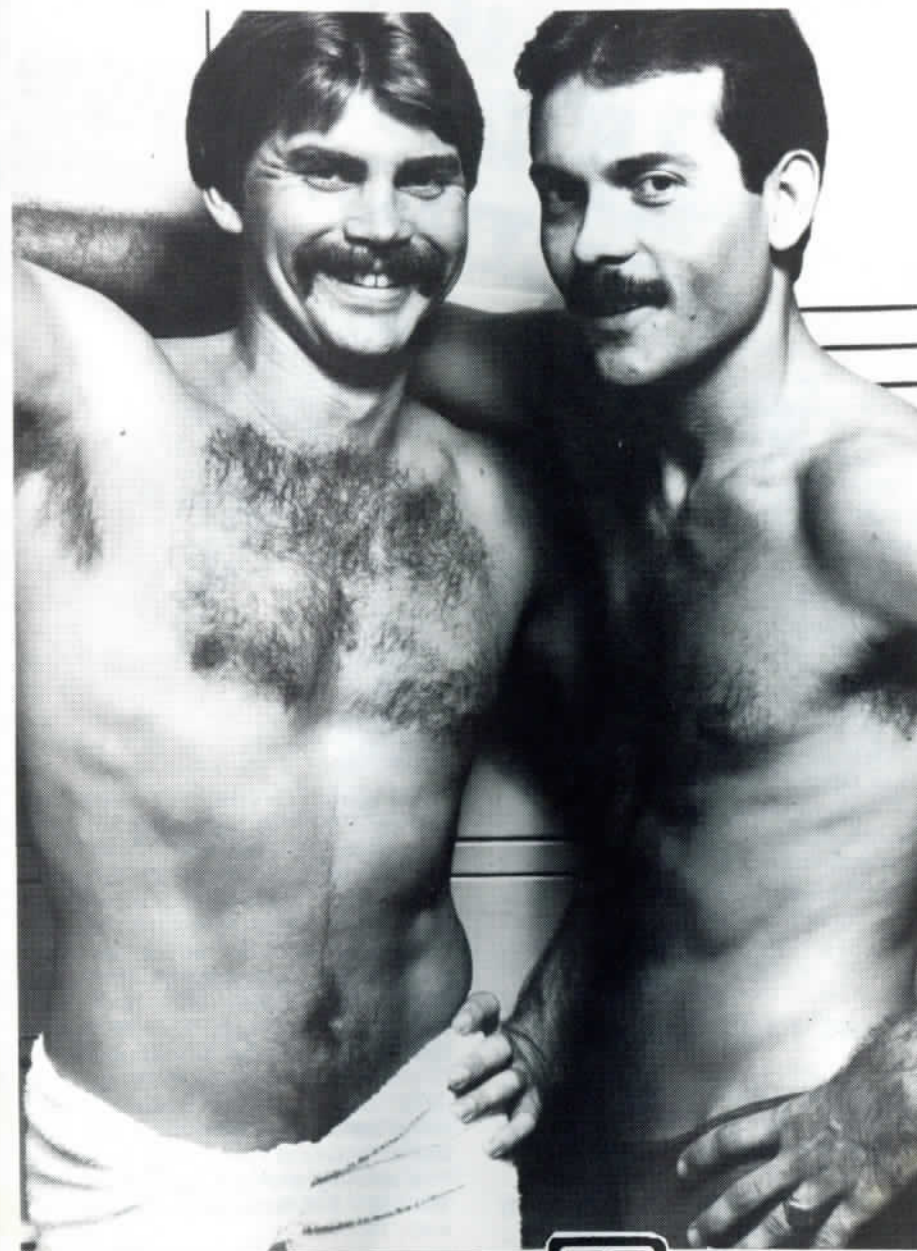

Last week's edition of TWT was a souvenir end-of-the-year issue, a summary of what happened in 1979.

This week's edition of TWT is a preview-of-the-new-year issue, a look ahead at what will happen in 1980.

Each New Year, TWT asks noted author and psychic Grethe to make her annual predictions for the coming year. Grethe's messages on the future come while she is in a deep trance. She has never been wrong! All of the predictions she made for 1979 came true. Like many gays who go to Grethe for psychic counseling, TWT also visited the oracle who now resides in Houston. Here is the question and answer interview transcript from the taped session.

What will happen . . .

What will happen to the 21:06 lawsuit filed by the Dallas schoolteacher?

He will win the lawsuit. It will be a higher court decision.

Which candidate for the presidency in 1980 will honestly be pro-gay?

Gay Rights will not be an issue in the 1980 campaign and there is no truly pro-gay candidate. There will be little emphasis on minorities in this presidential campaign.

When you made your 1979 predictions you told TWT, "Much progress has been made with gay rights but 1979 will be a time for society to adjust." You also told us last year, "There will not be any new legal advantages gained for the gay community in Texas. In fact, in some places in the country, there will be some steps backward. None of the major laws will be changed in 1979. Rights which have been demanded and thought close to receiving will not be forthcoming in 1979." This has come true! In fact, in some states and cities there have been some reversals. Very little legislation has actually changed in the course of the year. But, what about the coming year, 1980?

There does not seem to be any great force behind the gay rights movement for it to move forward. It seems to have reached a peak for this next year. 1980 is more of a standstill.

What about the lawmakers of Texas, in Austin?

There is a group who wish to make it a criminal offense to not hire a gay. This law which is hoped for, to make special concessions for persons who come under the gay minority, will not be refined or reach the floor for approval.

Last year you told TWT you "did not see that the bookstores would be closed in 1979; but that there would continue to be a force which would move to close them." All of this came true in 1979. In fact, that force nearly closed the bookstores. Last year you also told TWT that there would "be more big discos open up in Houston in 1979, but hardly any in Dallas." This has come to pass as Dallas opened up only one new location compared to Houston's four new locations for discos. As we enter 1980, what is the continued future of the super disco?

It is a fad. It will still do very well in 1980, but it will reach its peak in 1981 and then disco will begin a downward swing.

Let's now look at each of our major Texas cities. First, Fort Worth. Last year

you said Fort Worth would "be very unsettling. The climate was of a greater struggle than in Dallas or Houston." What about 1980?

There is a hope in Fort Worth that bars catering to gays would be able to have a greater breakthrough in 1980; but, this does not seem to appear in 1980. In fact, some may even have to close because there is a strong undercurrent to rid Fort Worth of those gay establishments. It is this strong anti-gay undercurrent which makes many merely travel to Dallas instead of taking the challenge of being harassed in their own town.

What is the 1980 message for Dallas?

Dallas is a city where law enforcement has great hostility toward the gays and an even greater determination to close down individually owned small gay bars. And, there will be a great effort put forward to close down the bookstores in Dallas. Some new bars will come in to Dallas, but they will be part of an already existing greater organization. Only the small bars in Dallas will have a hard time in 1980. There is great unrest, an atmosphere of turbulence in 1980, a strong force behind the law enforcement making it an uncomfortable city to be in if gay. Gays in Dallas will still not be able to be as open as they can be in Houston.

Let's discuss Austin.

In 1980, Austin will have a great deal of problems politically because of forced busing. This will affect every aspect of the city and there could very well be violent reactions. I, however, do not see any problems for the Austin gay bars, and

the bookstores will continue to have less problems in Austin than in other Texas cities. A new bar will come to Austin in 1980, but it won't be spectacular.

And in nearby San Antonio? Last year, you told TWT that "there would be a greater increase in the number of new bars than in any other Texas city except Houston." That indeed has come true as San Antonio now has five new gay bars. What's ahead in 1980?

Again, there will be growth; but it will not be as it had been in 1979. There seems to be a much more hostile, ambitious attitude toward the bookstores in San Antonio. For those thinking of moving to San Antonio to open a new bar, I see that it is not a good city to invest money in during 1980.

What is the 1980 future for Houston gay life?

I do not see any increased harassment in the entertainment world as long as the gays do not break the laws of serving liquor and closing times. There is not to be a lot of harassment inside the bars. It seems to mostly occur when individuals go outside, to leave to go to their vehicles.

What about the relationship between gays and police in 1980?

There is a lack of understanding between the two groups. Unfortunately, a few in the gay movement have been so totally obnoxious that all reasoning has stopped and all has fallen in under that same substance. Also, many of the law enforcement officers have a terrible fear of the gay movement because they can in no way comprehend the gay life style.

What about the economy in 1980 regarding gay entertainment, gay retail, gay business in general?

In 1980, especially in Houston, gays will not feel any kind of a financial squeeze in the economy. Gays will continue to spend money freely.

What about the 1980 economy in general for America?

Inflation will continue in 1980 at a higher rate than in 1979. This is how it is portrayed. I see a 15% increase over the next twelve months. Gasoline, food, electricity, and rent which gays use will

be affected considerably. The only thing that will still be reasonable for gays in 1980 will be clothing.

Can you give us a couple of examples?

By June 1980, a gallon of gasoline will be \$1.75 and a gallon of milk by June 1980 will be 25 cents higher.

Where will the economy be the best?

The north and east will be the hardest hit. Texas, less. Houston will be the best place to be in Texas.

Will there be a major recession in 1980?

It's very possible at this time, but this could be changed if circumstances regarding the world condition change.

Do you mean that only a war can keep us from another recession?

It is not for certain that the American people will accept what is planned for them by Iran. Our government will tell us not to react when Iran will publically and worldwide put our top diplomatic people on trial for espionage. It will be hard for the American people to watch and hear in the news what will occur. At this time, the mood of the country may force the President of the United States to declare war.

What do you see for Iran in 1980?

The reason why these trials will be conducted is so the Ayatollah Khomeini can save face and keep the attention away from the turmoil of his own people and how at this moment Iran is standing on the brink of another civil war.

If America goes to war, who will be the President in 1980?

Remember, the United States has never changed Presidents while we were at war.

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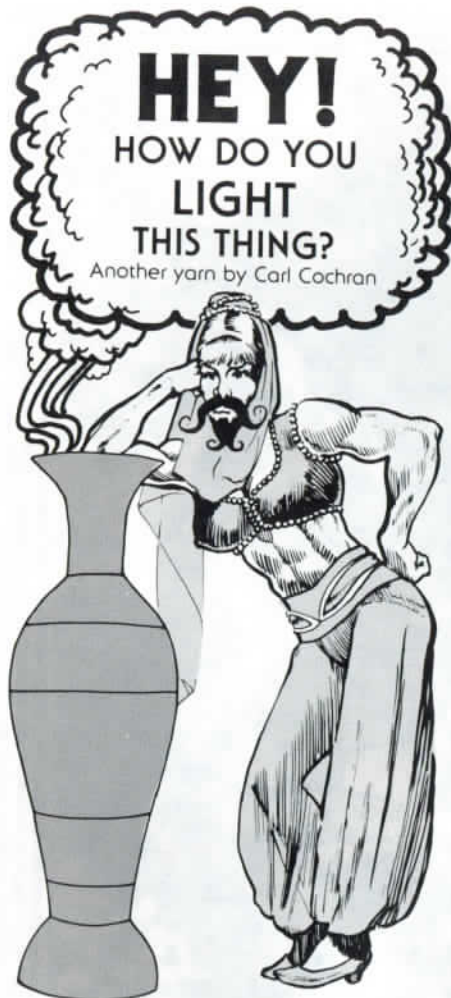

"Then, CONSIDER IT DONE!" the genie bellowed, clapping his hands majestically.

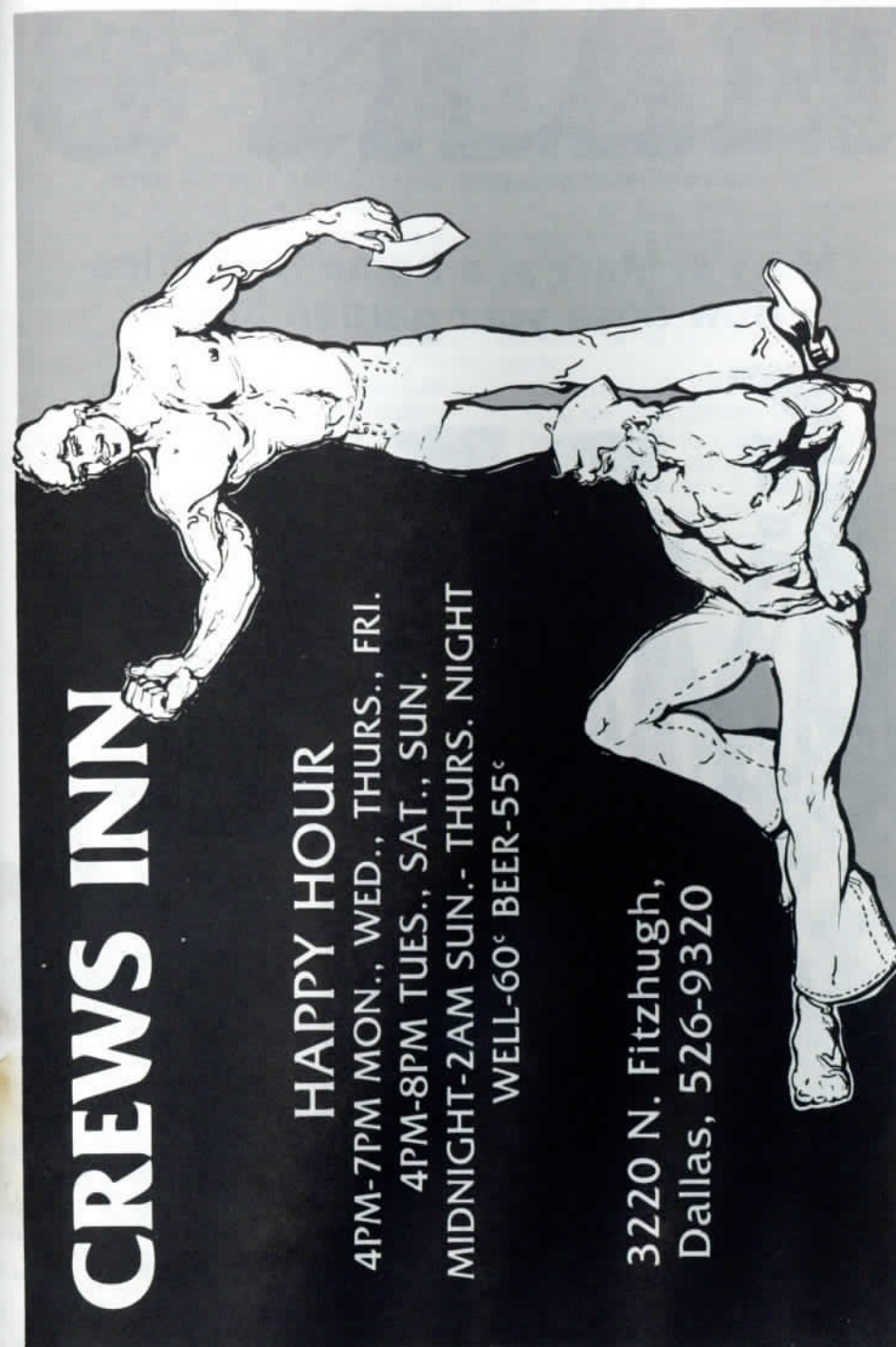
Jim had closed his eyes. He now opened them slowly, in expectant wonderment. He then closed them slowly, in disappointment.

1980 STARS COPE ANNUAL FORECAST

FOR ALL SIGNS: 1980 is a leap year as February will have 29 days. 1980 also has two eclipses. A total eclipse of the Sun on February 16 and the annular eclipse of the Sun on August 10. Eclipses always foretell major events. 1980 FULL MOONS

Since this year's conjunction will not be in an Earth sign, but rather in an Air sign, it is hoped that the conjunction jinx will be broken. The trends set in 1980 will carry through to the end of the century.

VIRGO CLUSTER

With five planets in particular in picky Virgo during this election year, America can expect some very heated campaigning as the candidates bog down in detailed knit

Additionally, we are now nearing the top of the curve in the eleventh year sun spot cycle which always brings about major change. As we approach this sun spot peak, we can expect the overall mood of the country to change.

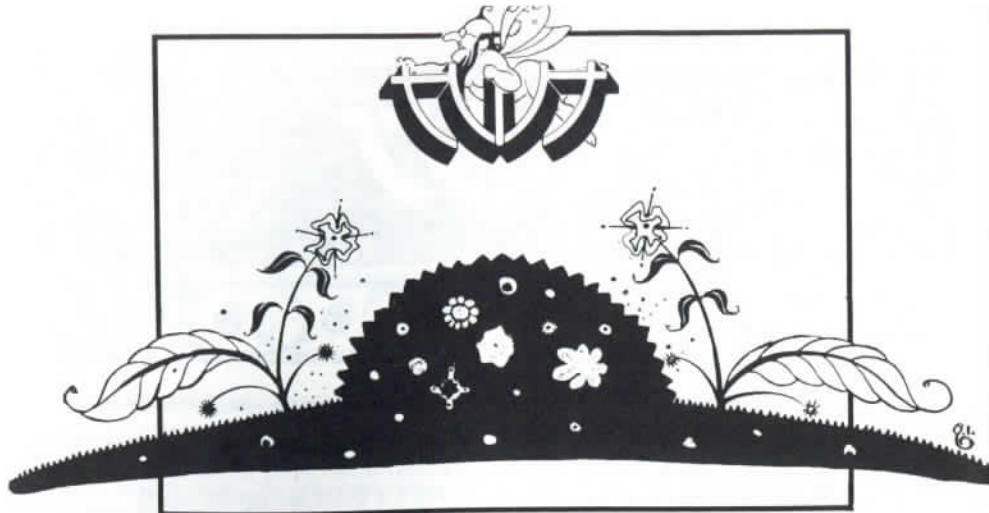

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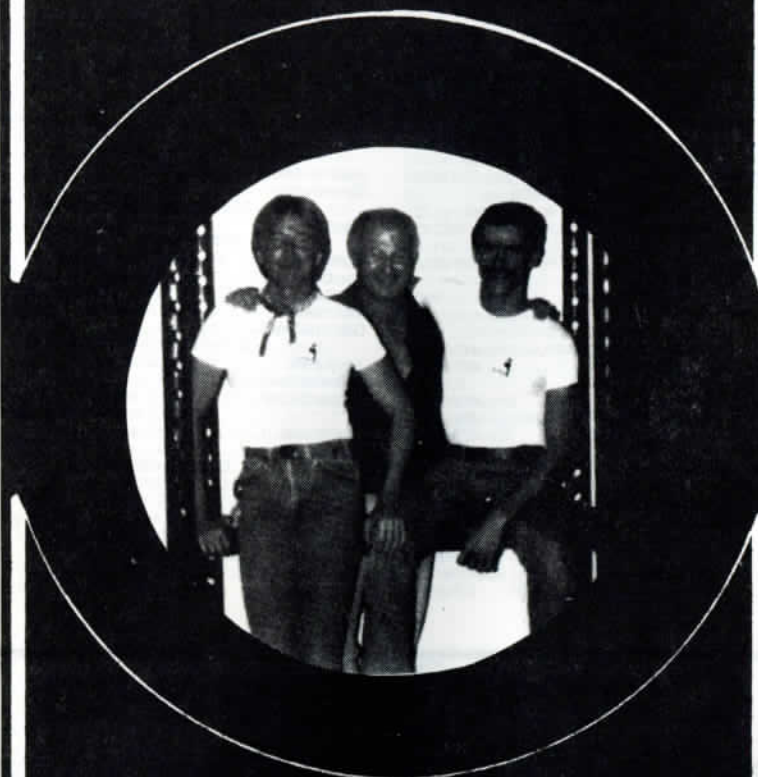

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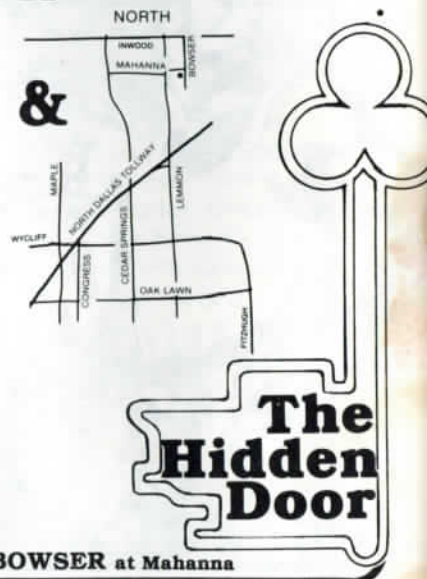
