VIOLENCE ERUPTS IN MONTROSE

HOUSTON — Last weekend more violence erupted in Montrose. There was a murder, a shooting, and a stabbing.

A young, gay, Anglo male was stabbed in the back with an ice pick by two blacks around 2am, early Saturday morning, March 8. TWT NEWS has learned that the attempted murder occurred in the parking lot on the northeast corner of Fannin and Elgin. The victim has survived.

A murder occurred around 3am Sunday morning, March 8, when two black males traveling in a car shot at a gay male. The victim crawled to nearby apartments near Mason and Avondale where he was found dead.

Early Sunday evening, March 9, another gay male was shot at with a pellet gun by two blacks. The incident occurred around 9pm on Avondale between Mason and Helena. The victim sustained minor injuries, observers told TWT NEWS.

The Montrose Patrol notes that "violence is occurring with more frequency earlier this year than before." The Montrose Patrol needs more workers and more money. This past weekend's violence only underscores the paramount need for you to support the Montrose Patrol in their Phase 3 dance benefit this Saturday night, March 15, from 10pm till 5am, at the Family Center.

COUNCIL APPROVES POLICE CHIEF

HOUSTON — As expected, the Houston City Council approved the selection of B.K. Johnson as Police Chief on Wednesday, March 5. The former assistant becomes Chief after receiving a 9 to 5 confirmation by City Council.

The five council members who voted against the Johnson confirmation were Eleanor Tinsley, Judson Robinson, Ben Reyes, Ernest McGowen, and Anthony

Hall. The vote would have been "six against" instead of "five against" had Lance Laylor been present to vote. Laylor is the councilman who represents the Montrose district. His vote, however, TWT NEWS observes, would not have changed the confirmation since simple majority is all that is required to win. "Eight is enough" and Johnson received nine.

Only time will tell if relations between the gay community and the police department will improve now that former chief Harry Caldwell has resigned. Some leaders of the gay community are hopeful, and feel they have reason to be hopeful, that relations will improve.

TURTLE CREEK CHORALE ORGANIZES

DALLAS — The first gay men's chorus held its first meeting and rehearsal February 19 and TWT NEWS reports that forty members attended. The music group is the first of its kind in the metroplex and only the second one in Texas, Houston having formed a Montrose Chorus last year.

Work has begun on music for the group's first major public performance which will be during Gay Pride Week '80 this June. The chorale is composed of serious amateur and professional musicians who feel that music is a valuable form of self-expression and social interaction. More new members are invited to the rehearsals which are held every Tuesday from 7:30 to 9:30pm.

DGPC OFFICERS ARE ELECTED

DALLAS — TWT NEWS has learned that the DGPC Board of Directors has elected the following officers of the Caucus. Don Baker, president; Steve Arnn, vice-president; Jim Williams (will continue as) treasurer, and Mike Williams (parliamentarian). The position of secretary has not yet been filled. ➤

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The new Directors elected by the membership are Campbell Read, Marc Lerro, Bill Nelson, Jim "Polack" Roberts and Mike Williams. The appointments of Terry Tebedo and Cobb Keller as Directors, to fill recently created vacancies on the Board, were ratified by the membership at the February meeting.

Of the two vacancies on the Board, one resulted when Director Gary Brock moved to New York City; the other was created by Don Baker, who resigned as a Director but retains his position on the Board by virtue of his elected position as Caucus president.

Steve Arnn, who, as vice-president, also remains on the Caucus Board, followed Baker's lead and resigned his position as Director, creating yet another vacancy. This vacancy is expected to be filled at the March general meeting. **TWT NEWS** was informed that the deadline for application to fill the vacancy was March 10.

GAY RADIO SHOW DEBUTS IN AUSTIN

AUSTIN — A new, all-gay radio program called "A Different Drummer" debuted Sunday March 2 on KUT-FM, 90.7, and will be heard each Sunday at noon. The half-hour weekly program is being produced by the Austin Gay Radio Collective which is a project of Gay Community Services. It is a first in Austin. It is the second "all-gay" radio program in Texas as Houston's KPFT-FM has been presenting a two-hour program called "Wilde 'n' Stein" on Monday nights from 10pm till midnight. At one time, Dallas had an all-gay radio program, **TWT NEWS** notes.

The premiere program featured a segment titled "We Are Everywhere—Part I," which is a series of person-in-the-street interviews with Austin citizens, both gay and straight.

"A Different Drummer" is produced by Carr Strong who says the radio program will "provide a means of communication to the lesbian/gay community, provide an educational service about gays to the non-gay community, promote cooperation, and promote partici-

pation between gay organizations in Austin."

A radio magazine-style format has been adopted for the program, reports *Connections*. The format provides segments for news, analysis, coming events, and special features.

LAMBDA AA OPENS NEW AUSTIN CENTER

AUSTIN — The gay branch of Alcoholics Anonymous, called "Lambda AA," has a new location in the Capital City. The new facility grand opened March 8. The new home is at 1403 East Sixth, next to Vikashmo's.

Several members of Lambda AA formed a foundation for the purpose of establishing a center in Austin, reports **TWT NEWS**. For more information, call the Center at (512) 472-0336 between 6 and 10pm.

Coming events have already been scheduled. There have been requests for a support group for lesbians and gay men who have children and the first gathering will be Tuesday, March 18, at 8pm at the Center. On Sunday, March 23, Austin Lambda and the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus will jointly hold a Spring Equinox Celebration at Zilker Clubhouse to celebrate and benefit a new location for the two groups.

GAY PRIDE WEEK IN NEW ORLEANS

NEW ORLEANS — Both Dallas and Houston have recently crystalized their respective schedules of activities for this summer's gay pride week. New Orleans has also been in planning session and has just released their line-up for Gay Pride Week '80.

Marty Mortensen, publicity chairman, tells **TWT NEWS** that the events will come under the umbrella theme of "Gay Fest '80" which will be held June 28 and 29 in Washington Square, as last year.

Two benefits are planned to raise needed money for Gay Fest '80. This Friday, March 14, Tim Williams and Her Band of Gold will hold a Hoedown at the

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St. Bernard Parish Cultural Center from 9pm till 1am. This Sunday, March 16, Tim Williams will play to a second benefit at Tiger's.

Gay Fest '80 has scheduled a parade, full-length gay motion pictures, and a city park picnic. For more information, contact Mr. Mortensen, 1445 Pauger Street in New Orleans.

HGPC TO ENDORSE CANDIDATES

HOUSTON — The Gay Political Caucus will have candidate endorsement night for most races of concern to the Houston gay community on Wednesday, March 26, 1980, at 7:30pm at 4600 Main Street. This meeting will take the place of the regularly scheduled meeting on March 19, **TWT NEWS** has learned.

The Board of the Caucus has targeted the County Chair of the Democratic Party race, the District Attorney's race, as well as the Legislative District 79 and Senate District 15 races.

Steve H. Shiflett, HGPC President, told **TWT NEWS**, "The gay community must create as much interest in and around the defeat of District Attorney Johnny Holmes as we did for the defeat of Frank Mann. This office has as much to do with police brutality coverups and negligent prosecution on selective law enforcement as the Houston Police Department itself does. If we want to ensure equal protection and end harassment, we must defeat Johnny Holmes."

"We have made a clean sweep at City Hall, we are on the verge of a more sensitive police chief, hopefully, and the next logical step is to clean up the District Attorney's office."

Now that the GPC election is over, the Board took bold and new steps toward getting business taken care of by creating a Political Steering Committee to manage screening, getting out the vote, endorsement procedures, and screening questionnaire composition. The Board also went on record as favoring many election procedure revisions to prevent last-minute memberships from having the privilege of voting in officer elections.

AUSTIN BOOKSTORES MAY BE RE-ZONED

AUSTIN — City Attorney Jerry Harris has suggested the City Council consider amending Austin's zoning ordinance to prohibit "sex shops" like those downtown on East Sixth Street from being concentrated in one area. The City Attorney told the *Austin American-Statesman* that the U.S. Supreme Court has upheld city ordinances that prohibit sex shops or massage parlors from being located with 500 feet of each other.

City Councilman Lee Cooke said of the proposed regulation, "I think that it is very appropriate." Two members of the Old Pecan Street Association had complained to Council that historic East Sixth Street was "in danger of becoming a center for street crime and prostitution."

Association member Jerry Creagh noted that East Sixth Street has the potential to become a "model of inner-city restoration." But, he also noted that the downtown portion of the street now contains four adult bookstores and two massage parlors.

TWT NEWS has learned that Attorney Harris has planned to meet with representatives of the Old Pecan Street Association and the City Planning Commission to discuss the possibility of limiting the number of bookstores and massage parlors in one area. Councilwoman Betty Himmelblau said after the recent meeting that she "expects Harris to report to the Council on a zoning amendment to restrict the 'density' of sex-related business."

If passed, would the bookstores on East Sixth have to close? The answer is "no" since Attorney Harris does not think the new zoning ordinance could be retroactive. It would merely mean that no more new bookstores or massage parlors could open on East Sixth in Austin.

"JOY OF GAY SEX" AUTHOR IN HOUSTON

HOUSTON — Dr. Charles Silverstein,

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author of the *Joy of Gay Sex*, will be in Houston on Sunday, March 16, and Monday, March 17, as a guest of the Montrose Counseling Center. Dr. Silverstein is a noted psychologist and the founder of the Institute of Human Identity in New York City, and is the founding editor of the *Journal of Homosexuality*. He has also authored another book entitled *Family Matter*, which was written for the families and parents of gays.

On Sunday, March 16, Dr. Silverstein will be at the Brazos River Bottom, 2400 Brazos, from 4 till 8pm. The entire gay community is invited.

On Monday, March 17, at 8pm, Dr. Silverstein will speak at a \$50-a-plate fundraising dinner at the Shamrock Hilton benefiting the Montrose Counseling Center. The Montrose Counseling Center is a non-profit organization whose focus is mainly working within the Houston gay community. FIRST THE BAD NEWS, THEN THE GOOD

DALLAS — TWT NEWS has learned of a rare strain of penicillin-resistant gonorrhea which has surfaced here in Texas and in Louisiana. Dr. J.Y. Hamrick, Deputy State Health Officer of Louisiana has confirmed UPI reports of the VD, called penicillinase-producing gonorrhea.

Cultures of the bacteria have been taken from some 23 people who were reported as having had sexual contact with seven known infected carriers of the disease. Five others who were named have not been reached. Three persons in Dallas, one in Shreveport and one in New Orleans are being sought by community health officials for testing and possible treatment.

Hamrick warns doctors and laboratories that a special test, available from his office, is required to detect the strain and that traditional treatment with penicillin is ineffective.

Meanwhile, at the University of Washington in Seattle, research technologist Duana A. Olsen reports that scientists are close to developing a vaccine to provide immunity from gonorrhea.

A research team under the direction of Dr. Tom Buchanan was recently awarded a five-year federal grant of close to \$500,000 for research in this area. The group is currently using human volunteers in its testing of a vaccine effective for about seven weeks. Olsen says that a vaccine offering immunity effectiveness of a year is within reach.

DR. JOYCE BROTHERS ON WHY WE ARE GAY

NEW YORK CITY — "Hormones may play a more significant role than environment in determining sexual preferences in males," says syndicated newspaper columnist Dr. Joyce Brothers.

In her column, Brothers answered the question of "why men are gay" with the following answer, "Androgen, the male

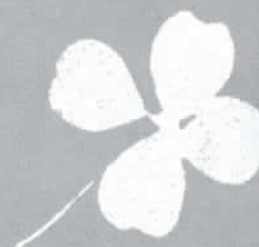
sex hormone, makes a strong and definite contribution to men's sexual preferences." The socio-cultural factors are not solely responsible for shaping men's sexual identity.

Brothers noted that "very little is known about why some members of a family are gay while others are straight. Some parents anguish with guilt feelings when they find out that one or more of their children is gay," Brothers said. "Gay children may detect their parents' feelings of guilt and that," Brothers said, "produces more guilt feelings in the children."

Brothers urged parents of gays to help their children seek psychiatric aid if they want help. However, if the children turn down the psychiatric help and feel good about their sexual preferences, Brothers told parents to "concentrate on accepting them into the family as they are. Try to respect their choice and see them as individuals. They need your understanding, your support and your love." ▼

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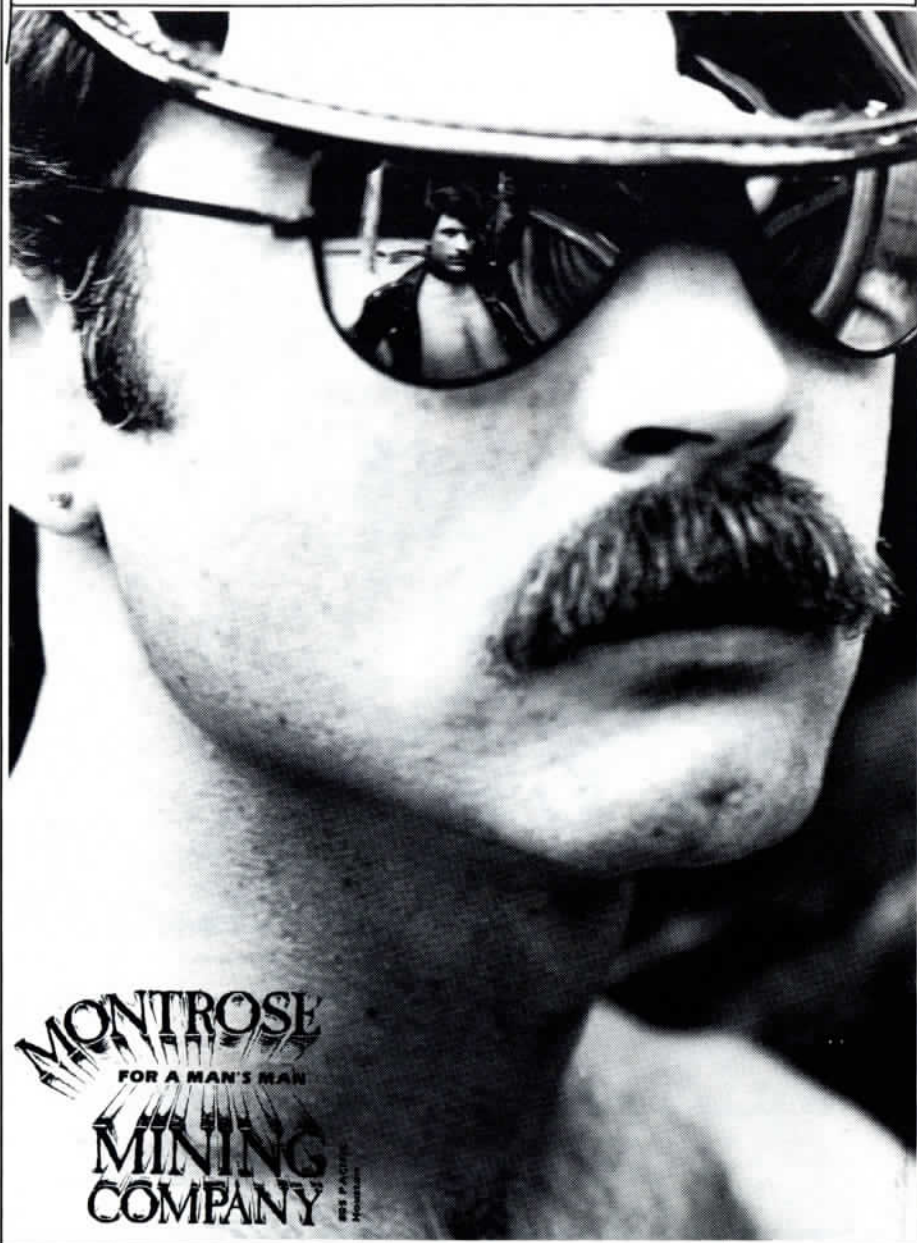

I am a 29-year-old male who is employed in a gay business in Austin. I have been involved in the gay community for the last 10 years, and have been reading your publication since its beginning. It is now, and has always been, informative and a good barometer of the gay community. This is an open letter to my brothers and sisters. I have seen many changes in the gay community, especially over the past 5 years—some very needed, some of dubious value. In any case, we, as a group, are much in public view these days. Since we have chosen to "come out" *en masse*, it is most important that we choose our issues carefully, but, more importantly, that we choose just and right "means" to our ends. I am against Anita Bryant's personal opinions, but I do not feel she should not be granted employment because of them. Nor should we ban Florida orange juice. How can we ask for the right to our private lives and sexual preference without giving others the same right? Yes, we should fight, but let's address ourselves to the issues (Anita Bryant Ministry), and not the person. Let us treat others as we wish to be treated. The best way to teach is through example. So, let us set a very high standard by which to be judged.

As no man is an island, no minority group can survive in isolation. The fact that we are gay should not supersede the fact that we are a part of the world and of all mankind. If we allow our sexuality to interfere with our positive interaction with *all* people we will be doing to ourselves what we have accused society of doing "to us." There are many people in this world who we could help, and, in turn, help ourselves. To my knowledge, no gay organization has contributed substantially to any charity or research organization. Imagine the effect of donating a half-million to Muscular Dystrophy, United Fund, or other national or international group in the name of Gay Pride! If we choose to use our financial clout to show our strength, this sort of positive action would do as much as any

collective meeting in Washington. Our day in Washington is over. The money has been spent. How much has it truly helped us or mankind? Does society think *better* of us for it—or do they just think there are more of us? Before we march in protest or in peace, let us remember what Emerson wrote: What you are speaks so loudly that I cannot hear what you say.

A Different Story

Dear TWT:

I am writing this letter anonymously; when I am through you will understand why.

I am an 18-year-old virgin female. I currently have a boyfriend, who can't understand why I won't let him make love to me. I think I know and the answer scares me.

I'm not conceited or anything like that, but I am very attractive, get along well with everyone, and I am very wealthy. I am a pretty butch-looking girl, yet very feminine.

I have also had a lot of boyfriends and have always associated with the elite, usually against my own say-so. My parents, whom I no longer live with, have always expected the best out of me, which doesn't bother me because they're basically good people.

Here's my problem: my boyfriends have never turned me on.

The only time I am sexually aroused is when I go to gay gatherings and discos with gay men friends of mine and I talk and dance with lesbians. Because of my religious beliefs and my status in town, I have never gone to bed with a girl or even kissed one.

There are several girls who I have met and like and wanted to make love with and who I know wanted to also. But, I don't let myself. I wouldn't even know how to, because I don't like butch-type girls.

It scares me to think I am a lesbian, even though I know it is a common thing now. Unless I solve this dilemma, I am afraid I am going to take my own life rather than always be frustrated, or let a man make love to me, which disgusts me. ➤

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Can anyone help solve this problem? It's a matter of life and death.

Editor's Note: Since a woman is asking for advice, TWT felt that she might prefer a response from another woman. Although Pokey Anderson is not a TWT editor or staff member, she is a long-time activist in the gay community. Here is her reply:

First of all, you are certainly not alone in your feelings. Most gay people have been through pressures and doubts like those you describe, both from other people and from themselves. You are at least ahead of the game in facing these issues head-on.

Let me outline three areas of potential help:

1. Get more information about homosexuality. Some very helpful resources in Houston are Wilde 'n' Stein Books (713-529-7014) or B.D. & Daughter (713-529-3609); in Dallas, Lobo Bookshop (214-522-1132). They can point you toward some good written material that covers your questions; for instance, a National Gay Task Force leaflet, "Coming Out;" Our Right to Love: A Lesbian Resource Book; some excellent books specifically directed at religious issues, and some others dealing with parents. The Rev. Larsen at M.C.C.R., Houston, (713-861-9149) could help you further on the religious question.

It's a long process for all of us to undo the anti-homosexual brainwashing we've been subjected to since childhood, and I recommend you start immediately.

2. Search out more opportunities to meet lesbians socially. Again, check with Wilde 'n' Stein, B.D. & Daughter, or Lobo Bookstore for current information on gatherings such as

women's concerts, gay youth activities, political efforts, coffeehouses, lesbian sports teams, camping trips, church groups, etc.

As with straight life, gay life is more than what goes on in bars. If you can get to know lesbians (not just gay men) in other contexts, you'll be in a much better position to decide whether or where you fit in, and you'll see some of the options in coping with roles, homophobia, dating rituals, etc.

3. Last, be patient with yourself. Relax. Please! Don't push yourself, and don't let anyone else pressure you about your sexual preference. Only you can discover what your true feelings are, and only you can decide what to do about these feelings. You are the one who has to live with yourself.

If you feel you need further help, in Houston contact Montrose Counseling Center (713-529-0037), which specializes in problems of gay identity and relationships. Or call Crisis Hotline in Houston (713-228-1505) any time, day or night. [For other organizations/helplines in other cities, see THE GUIDE on page 78 of this issue. —Editor] Some of their volunteers have training in this area, and they have referral listings of counselors who can help. Good luck.

Dallas Police Harassment

Dear TWT:

The police harassment in Dallas continues, and I have some suggestions for helping our cause.

The GPC should have a spokesman at every city council meeting to speak on the harassment of gays, just as the blacks ➤

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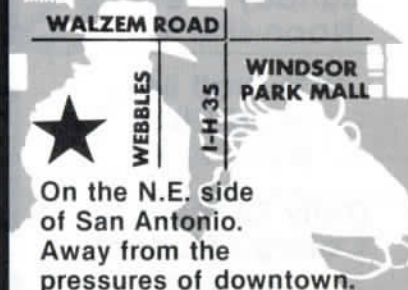
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speaking at every meeting for black rights. The spokesman should educate the Council about the harassment, brutality, false arrests, and should condemn the use of police decoys; should point out to the Council that the City's tourist business is damaged, for gay tourists are becoming afraid to come to Dallas and venture out at night; should point out that serious crime is increasing, yet cops use lots of money and manpower to harass gays; point out that in other cities the D.A. will not accept complaints from cops, but only private citizens (This practice abolishes police harassment, cop blackmail, and entrapment, and virtually all arrests for Lewdness and Indecent Exposure, since private citizens seldom complain.).

When a defendant is found "not guilty" or the case is dismissed, he should immediately file a civil suit against the cop for false arrest, Official Oppression, malicious prosecution and violation of civil rights—and ask for a substantial sum of money. If cops were regularly sued, they would soon lose their taste for making sloppy cases by entrapping and false arrest.

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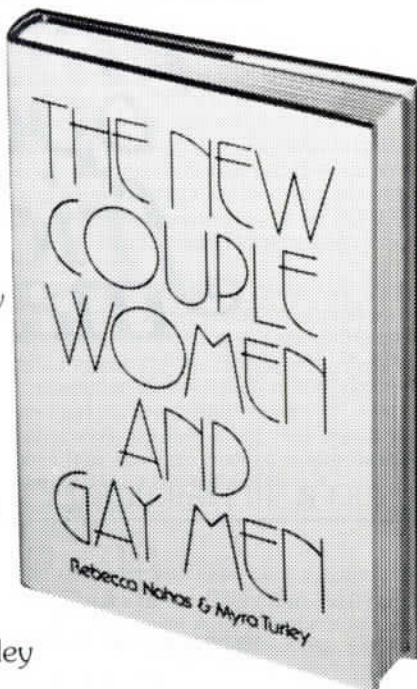
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Drugged Out

Being in the medical field and a concerned gay brother, I commend the "older" gentleman who wrote to you regarding the failing habits . . . among the gay community in Houston and elsewhere!

I just returned from a three-day visit to your beautiful city, [horried] at the seemingly limitless flow of drugs!

One of my dearest friends, whom I've known over a decade and has always shunned drugs, has found this *great* demand for drugs to be a *very* profitable business. Not only has he become a dealer, he is abusing MDA and acid. I feel compelled to express my concern.

Almost everybody I met—at my friend's apartment, at other friends' houses, the bars, at parties—were . . . using or abusing some type of drug (this includes "poppers").

All of this exclaiming is to make a point. I want to raise *ALARM!* I want to shout, *BEWARE! Take heed! Stop! Look!* Look at ourselves! Are we becoming so pompous as to think that life is nothing but one big party? Nothing but MDA-induced prolonged sexual prowess? Frills, thrills? 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ourselves in *extreme* danger.

We must find some outlet for our frustrations, for all of our pent-up feelings of remaining somewhat sexually obscure for periods of time in order to survive among our sometimes hostile environment. I agree! I agree! But for all of our sakes—for all of our minds' sakes—for all of our bodies' sakes—we *cannot* turn to drugs! We need every mind—every body—every sensibility we can muster to push forward in our uphill battle! If we continue to allow our friends and "family" members to constantly use and abuse drugs and alcohol, we will *set* ourselves back decades.

If you have a friend, lover, family member or just someone you know that is overstepping their bounds on drug use—*please* step in and make them *aware* of their problem. Usually, this is enough for a level-headed person. But if it isn't, we may find it will take drastic measures to cause a turn around in their lives!

If you are misusing drugs, *please* ask yourself "How is this benefiting me? Can I not have a good time, good relationships, a happy life without reaching the point of self-destruction?"

We all must realize the problems and obstacles confronting us during these changing times. We must definitely realize that drugs, alcohol or any other hindrance to a full-capacity use of mind and body can do nothing but block our way to realizing our goals! Beware! Stop! Look! Listen! 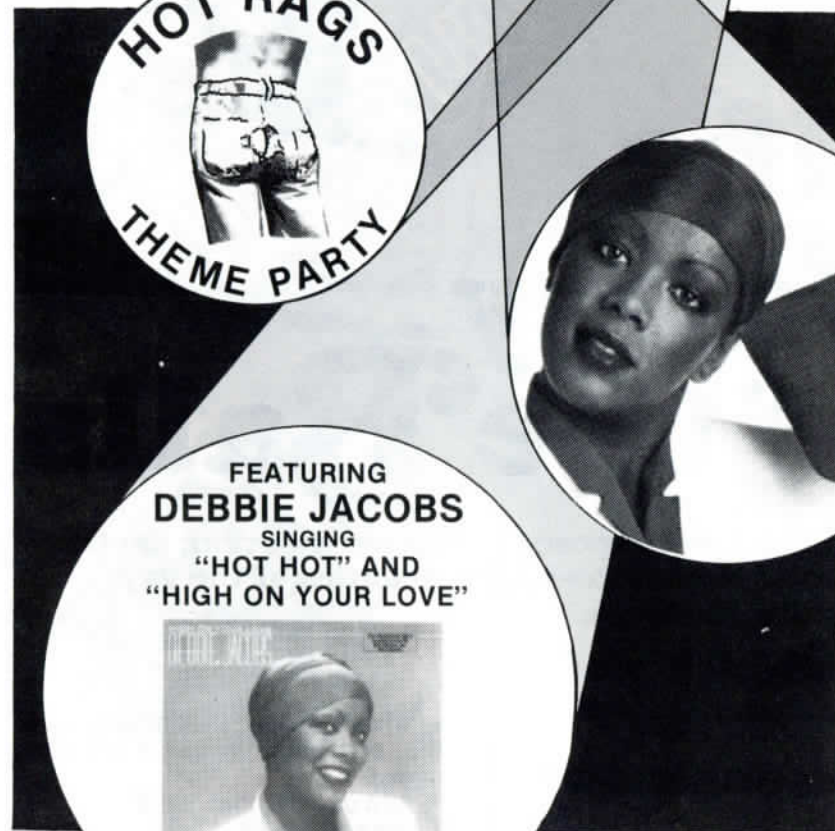
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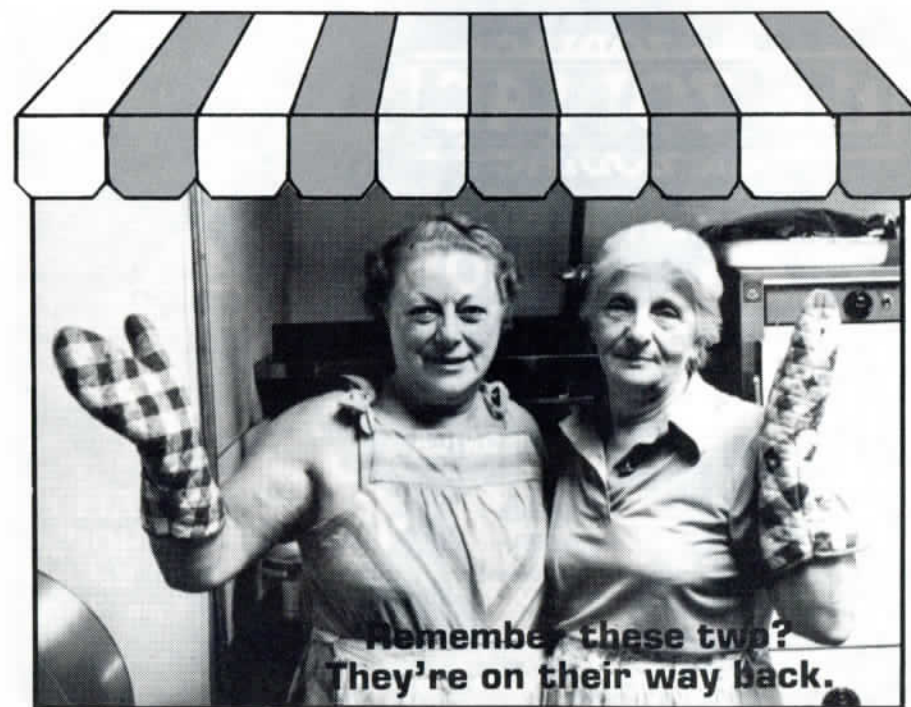


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"Send him in," Buck sighed.

"I'll never understand you guys. The damn Constitution, the damn Constitution. You've got no common sense. I'm an average American. You don't see me screaming about the Constitution."

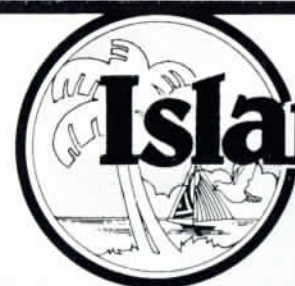
"Because you've never *had* to," Buck glared.

Danny stormed down the hall and into Blake's office.

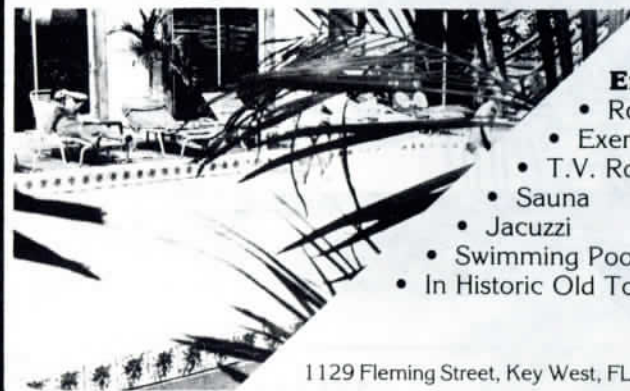

"Oh. I'll . . . eh . . . I'll give you all the centerfold pictures that were too vulgar to publish."

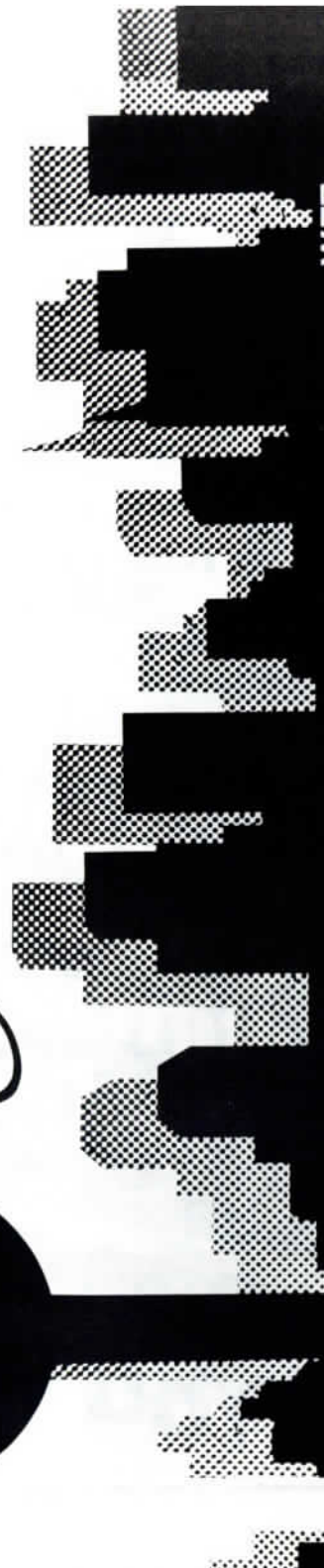
"No."

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Nation Undergoes Culture Shock

CRONKITE DISCLOSURE PARALYZES UNITED STATES

(AP) The American public remained stunned today following yesterday's revelation that newsman Walter Cronkite and kidvid star Captain Kangaroo are the same man.

"In the beginning," Cronkite confessed, "we never thought it would be a problem. In the early days of television, the formative years, everybody pitched in and did a myriad of jobs. It was no big deal."

"What we did not foresee," Cronkite continued, "was the speed with which the medium would develop in technology and sophistication. By the time we did realize it, it was too late. Both Captain Kangaroo and Walter Cronkite had become very popular commodities. The network couldn't afford to drop either of us. We were trapped."

The secret, known only by the upper echelons of CBS past and present management, was leaked into public knowledge during last night's Emmy award telecast.

"I was nominated for three awards," Cronkite explained, "two awards, as Cronkite, in the news categories. And one award, as Bob Keeshan, for being Captain Kangaroo."

"The news awards were presented in the first half of the show. The kid show awards were in the second half. This meant, of course, I'd have to do my

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usual make-up and costume change in between.

"They have dressing rooms backstage where the award presenters and performers can freshen up before going on. Unfortunately, I was in the middle of my change when Jane Pauley walked in. Intuitive newswoman and superb horsewoman she is, Jane immediately put two and two together and the secret was out. That's the way it was."

Having announced a date for his retirement from the "CBS Evening News" and planning to discontinue his lengthy stint as "Captain Kangaroo" shortly thereafter, Cronkite said he regretted the duality of his occupation had come to light so near the end of his careers.

"I have few personal apprehensions," Cronkite explained, "but I hope this disclosure will not have an adverse impact on all the youngsters who have come to believe in Captain Kangaroo. I hope they won't be bitter when they find out the Captain was only a part-time hero."

"When Mary Martin was doing 'Peter

Pan,' she told me her biggest worry was that the kids might see the wires and lose faith. Now I know what she meant."

However, Cronkite does not deny the immense relief of no longer having to continue the charade.

"My first inclination was to ask Jane not to reveal what she had discovered. We discussed the impact it would have. Jane was very understanding. We considered the issue from all the angles."

"I recounted my feelings concerning preserving the integrity of Captain Kangaroo. Not to mention the feelings of trust fostered by the public for Walter Cronkite. We talked at length."

"Then, in a manner befitting a qualified network professional, Jane brought the issue into a sharp, clear focus that would make the subsequent chain of events inevitable. The snitty bitch fled to the mezzanine and screamed her damned fool head off!"

As the word filtered through the industry, Cronkite's co-workers expressed disbelief and dismay. ➤

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"You think you know a guy, and then something like this happens," said CBS reporter Mike Wallace. "I'm startled beyond speech. Cronkite's associates on the "Kangaroo" set were equally dumbfounded.

"I suddenly feel very tired and very old," said Grandfather Clock. "Some friends have suggested a facelift. I may consider it."

comment. Likewise, Mr. Moose has evidently entered tundra seclusion.

At this time, there has been little comment from spokesmen from rival networks NBC and ABC. When asked for his comments, ABC anchor Frank Reynolds said he was preparing remarks for delivery on an ABC late-night news special, "Cronkaro Held Hostage," to be seen at 10:30 pm, 11:30 pm Central.

"Our biggest worry," she added, "was if something should happen to Wally. If he should get sick or, God preserve us, die. The network was very concerned over dealing with the sudden loss of Captain Kanagaroo."

"Considering the impressionable nature of the audience, dealing with the unexpected disappearance of the Captain would have to be handled very, very delicately. They created an extremely elaborate plan and cover story."

"On the day Walter Cronkite died, CBS was going to issue a prepared release saying an enraged Mr. Moose bit the Captain and gave him rabies. At least now, we'll all be spared that."

In remarks apparently aimed at his broadcasting peers, Cronkite issued a

veiled plea for understanding.

"I'm not asking anyone to condone what I did," Cronkite said. "Nor do I ask for compassion. But when pondering the merits of this issue, I would only hope all my friends and business associates would acknowledge the compelling circumstances. What else could I have done?"

According to Cronkite, the situation was "no bed of roses for me, either."

"For almost twenty years, I've been working 18 hours a day, 320 days a year. That doesn't leave a lot of time for leisure. When I did manage to squeeze a few moments for myself, the network kept running me out to this damned yacht to take publicity pictures. Since we're setting the record straight, I hate water."

"During the major news events, my schedule was incredibly hectic. I damn near died when I had to go to China with Nixon. We had to tape 17 advance episodes of "Captain Kangaroo" in two

days! The last four had to be done with a hammock motif so Mr. Green Jeans could lie down. The man was on a resuscitator wired to a papier-mache palm tree!

"And all those times they said I was on 'special assignment'? Some 'special assignment'. It was usually to give me time to prepare my annual 'Salute For A Thanksgiving Bounty'. I announced the landing on the moon with a pocketful of broken Crayolas and matching cuticles."

One life-long friend and associate of the famed anchorman, Eric Severeid, came to the aid of the Cronkite family with both words of support and an offer of sheltering seclusion at his New England home.

Severeid was also seen last night during televised remarks concerning the Cronkite disclosure.

"Nothing so disturbs the sleeping giant than awakening to the restless reality that the prevailing principles and precepts pertaining to the condition of

the common man upon entering hibernation are not necessarily the same as those existent upon arising," Severeid said.

"But once the shock melts to mellow reflection," Severeid continued, "as must be the case with all sleeping bears, then will come realization. Realization that the whole is, indeed, greater than the sum of its parts. Realization that severing a boulder with a sword is no small task. Realization that half a Hercules is greater than a whole Don Knotts. Realization, indeed.

"And as the bear awakens, there can be only one real response. The response of joy. For despite what we now know, we remain forever indebted for what we have been given. Rich is the bear who has six of one, half dozen of another.

"And shall we have afterthoughts? No. Sorrow, no. Remorse, no. For as the Captain would say, these are the times we must proclaim, 'Dance, bear. Dance!'"

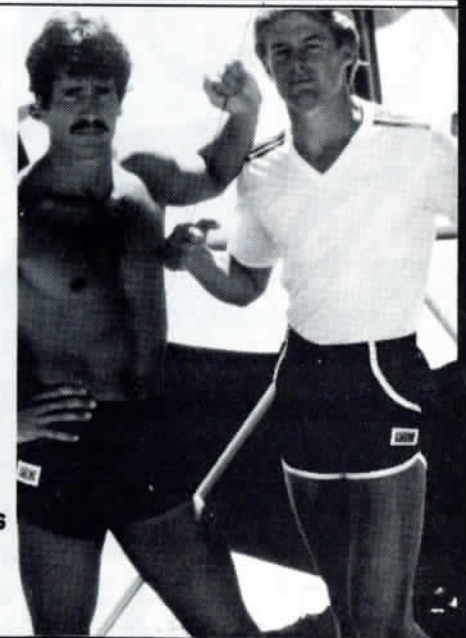

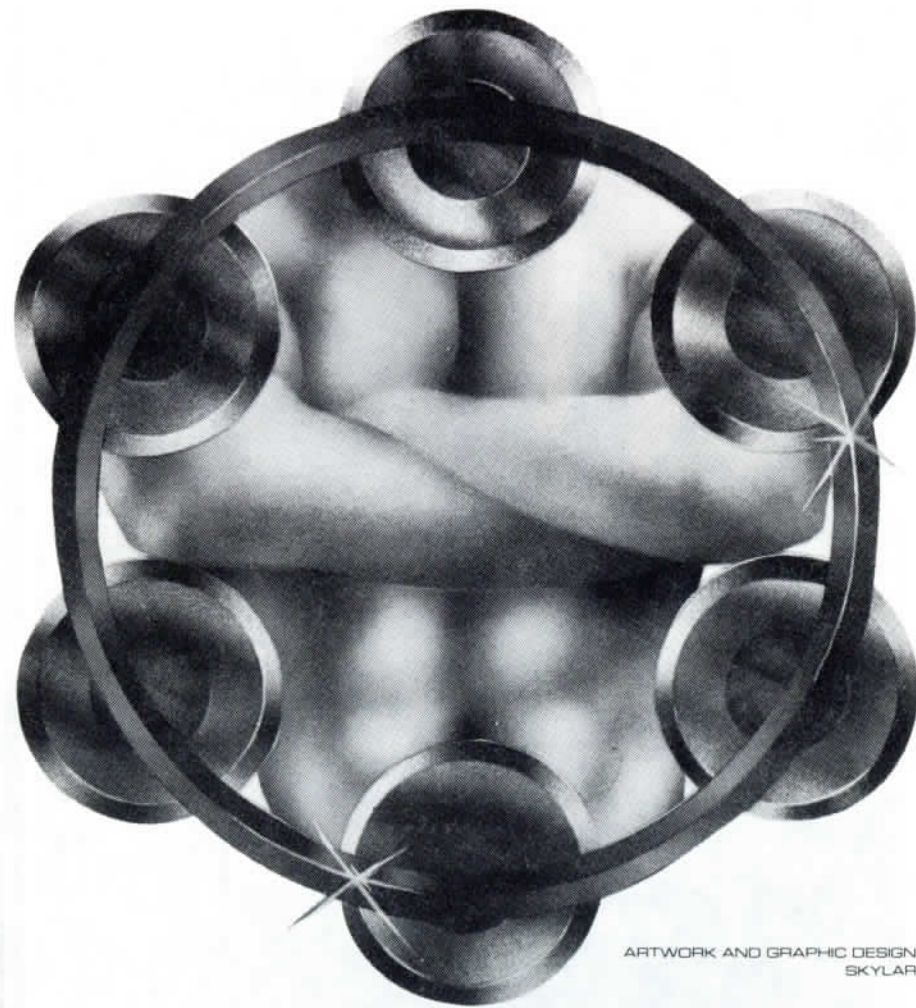

Finding them is tough in most parts of the country. The social, political and religious gay groups seem to be quite small, mostly older, with a seemingly large percentage of lovers. But where are the rest?

I have no figures—no one does. But I strongly suspect that most gays have enough outside interests that they do not need or desire the bars. Is it even correct to assume all gays are *aware* that there *are* gay bars?! I also suspect many are into long-term relationships, not all of which are "closet-y." Most young, single straights do not go to the bars and discos, obviously. But they are there.

Having just recently "bottomed out" on the bar scene, I have diversified my interests beyond that Perpetual Penis Pursuit. Lo, and Behold, I'm finding other gays, too, who are out living Life. It's so nice to meet someone who is not stoned and who doesn't check out my crotch before deciding whether I'm worthy for friendly conversation. Their values are so different, so real, so refreshing. Sounds like an orange juice commercial? Try it!

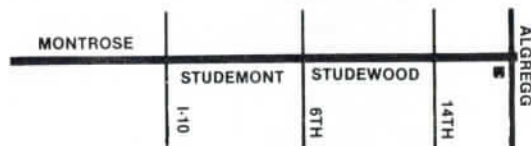
So, please, THINK before using the term "*the* Gay Lifestyle." It's not always the same as "*the* Bar Scene." ▼

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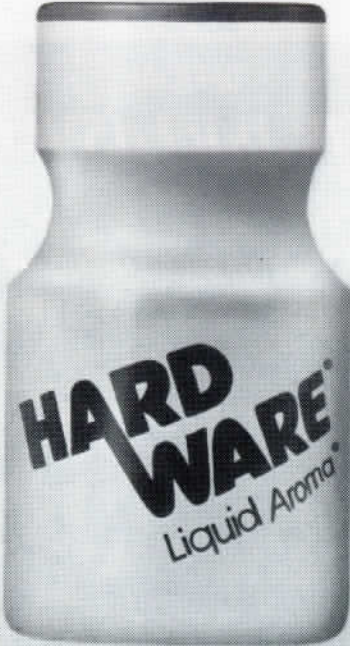
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Academy Adopts New Award Category

The motion was entered and passed

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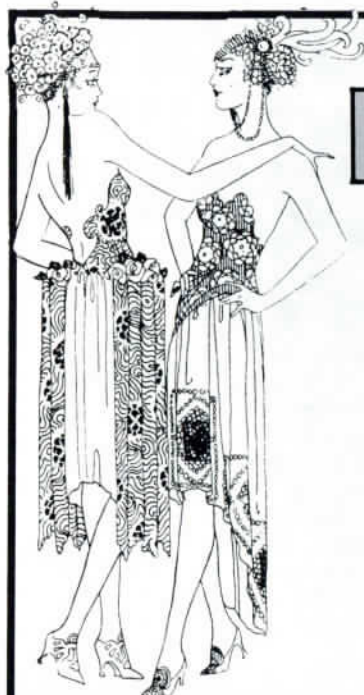
