61 ARRESTED AT MARY'S

HOUSTON — For the third year in a row, the City of Houston has held its annual pre-Gay Pride Week raid on a gay bar. Early Friday morning, June 20, at 12:05am, "the Houston Police Department and the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission arrested 61 persons," said Assistant Police Chief Tommy Mitchell. He informed that "arresting officers had been inside the bar for more than an hour and a half and had observed illegal activities. Arresting procedures began around 12:15am."

"Most of the arrests, a total of 54, were involved with public intoxication, interference with a police officer and simple assault," Mitchell told TWT NEWS in a prepared statement at a Friday afternoon press conference. "All of the arrests came with the routine enforcement of the laws of the city and state. It is both coincidental and unfortunate that this incident occurred at the beginning of Gay Pride Week; however, complaints were received and the Police Department responded to the citizens' wishes." Mitchell explained that many will perceive this action as a part of police harassment but "assured everyone that it is not the policy of the HPD to harass anyone."

Witnesses remarked to TWT NEWS that "the vice were shoving people against the wall." Another said "they just selected at random all those people who looked different, those without shirts or in leather." It has been noted that "they arrested in leather disguise a Catholic priest, a couple of lawyers and doctors." One of those arrested said, "We thought about rocking the van to turn it over," while another said, "Next time, it'll be a Stonewall." Meanwhile, Ray Hill of KPFT-FM suggested at the press conference that the police circle

the date on the calendar for the annual pre-Gay Pride Week raid so "we could hold a benefit next year."

Hill also asked for an explanation of "why, for the last three years, during the week immediately preceding Gay Pride Week, and only during that week, have there been massive police raids?" Mitchell replied that "the resulting publicity from Gay Pride Week probably causes more activity around certain areas of the city and sometimes citizens complain of lewd acts."

TWT NEWS recalls the previous incidents Hill made reference to. In 1979, there was a raid at Mary's. In 1978, prior to Town Meeting I, there was a raid at The Locker.

When asked who complained, the Assistant Police Chief responded that "the citizens have a right to remain anonymous and we must protect their interests."

"In the previous two years' raids, there have not been any convictions," remarked Hill. Mitchell said he was unaware of that. "Some of the victims claim that they had not even had a chance to finish their first beer," stated Judd McIlvain of KHOU-TV, adding that he found it unusual that so many should be arrested for drunkenness. Mitchell replied that he "did not find that unusual since there were approximately 200 people in Mary's that evening." Chuck Patrick of TWT NEWS, who was at Mary's just prior to the raid, reports that "an estimate of 90 patrons, rather than 200, was more accurate" and that "it was one of the quieter nights at Mary's."

"The bar had been under surveillance and patrols had been sent to the area periodically since there were complaints of a pajama party going on two weeks ago," stated Mitchell.

A vice officer acknowledged that arrests for public intoxication are routine,

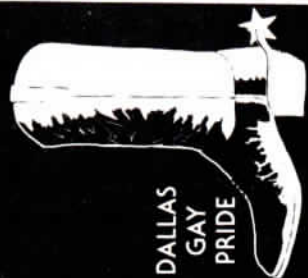
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adding that such arrests can include upwards of 200 a month. "I can recall one such raid five months ago when 80 people were arrested," that officer stated.

TWT NEWS notes that the raid referred to was at the Old Plantation, a straight Houston disco. Ironically, however, the OP, like Mary's, is gay-owned. "Both have the dubious distinction of being the two biggest recent raids on Houston bars," an observer told TWT NEWS.

OWNER AND MANAGER IN JAIL OVERNIGHT

HOUSTON — Owner of Mary's, Jim Farmer, and manager of Mary's, Andy Mills, were among those arrested and taken to jail as a result of the June 20 police raid on that bar. Both spent the night in jail. Farmer, who is one of this year's Grand Marshals in the Gay Pride Parade, told TWT NEWS that Mary's had posted bail for many of the bar's patrons. Farmer also publically thanked The Copa, The Different Drum, The

Venture-N, and bartenders from other bars for their monetary donations. In a TV interview, Farmer referred to the conduct of the raiding officers as "using gestapo tactics."

Manager Andy Mills explained to Assistant Police Chief Mitchell, "When I got into the bar, there were probably twenty officers in and out of uniform. They had everyone against the wall. Thirty-five were put in a closed van; no air ventilation of any kind. They were passing out and getting sick to their stomachs. I was at the bar handling the business, showing them the licenses, and handing over my keys to one of my employees so he could take care of the bar, when one of the uniformed officers came up behind me and wanted to know what I thought I was doing behind the bar and why wasn't I in line with the rest of the people. He was rude and not minding his business. He wouldn't tell me his name."

To this complaint, Mitchell suggest-

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ed Mills go by Internal Affairs and make a statement in reference to his complaint.

One witness at the press conference said "so many were put in the van, shoved in, some were brutalized, some were put in on top of one another." There were two vans at the scene accompanied by TV cameras which TWT NEWS observes as obviously pre-arranged as it is unlikely any TV news cameraman would happen to be in the vicinity of Mary's Lounge at 12:05 in the morning.

MARY'S RAID & GPW ON TV NEWS

HOUSTON — All three network television stations carried extensive reports of the massive police raid of Mary's Lounge, June 20. KTRK-TV, Channel 13 (ABC-TV), showed videotape of customers being shoved into police paddy wagons. Channel 13 News was obviously tipped-off to the raid which occurred "while Police Chief B.K. Johnson was conveniently out of town," according to Houston Gay Political Caucus President Lee Harrington. All newscasts carried the theme of police harassment. For those who did not see the TV newscasts, TWT NEWS reports the following:

From KHOU-TV, Channel 11 (CBS-TV), TWT NEWS microphones recorded this report by Judd McIlvain: "Police officers say they raided Mary's bar after several complaints of lewd actions and intoxication. Police would not say who complained. Officers say they have had the bar under investigation for a week. The owner of the bar, Jim Farmer, said most of the persons arrested were not drunk. He said police have harassed his customers many times. Many of those arrested complained that they had not even finished their first drink; that 35 persons were *stuffed* into one van."

One of those arrested appeared on television saying most who were arrested wore gay pride buttons. The eyewitness report was that "the police

were going down the line saying 'You're public intoxicated. You're public intoxicated. You're arrested for assault. You're ...' All these things going straight down the line-up. They [*the customers*] weren't doing anything."

McIlvain concluded his report by saying "HPD says what happened was routine; it happens at other bars. But, members of the gay community and those arrested say they don't buy that. They call it harassment."

On KPRC-TV, Channel 2 (NBC-TV), Ron Stone reported: "At a place called Mary's, police made a big raid early this morning and it has damaged relations with the police and the gay community. Police went to the bar along Westheimer and arrested over 60 people on various charges of liquor law violations. Patrons of the bar think the timing of the raid was a bit strange. The Acting Police Chief disagreed." Stone concluded saying that the Montrose Sports Association Gay Pride Week softball double-header game with the Houston City Police and Fire Departments would see the gays playing with "renewed vigor."

But, in that game, it was the cops who had the renewed vigor as they shut-out the MSA All-Stars 22-to-0. Don O'Rourke of Channel 2 reported "the time of the softball game could not have been more dramatic at the outset of Gay Pride Week because the relationship between the gay community and the police had been improving until two nights ago when that relationship was shattered when police raided one of the most popular homosexual bars in Montrose. The cops hit a home run in the first inning and two more in the second inning. The MSA All-Stars hit sparingly, never getting a man past first base and that was in part because the man playing second base was a vice officer who just two nights ago led the raid on Mary's bar. The police were piling the score on. This came after some members of the gay community have felt that the police have shown too much muscle this week. Finally, mercifully, the game was over." ➤

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KTRK-TV, Channel 13, reported: "The week of June 20-29 is Gay Pride Week in Houston. Members of the gay community have festivities planned throughout the week including a softball double-header with the Houston Police Department and the Houston Firefighters. An enthusiastic crowd filled the stands in Memorial Park for what has become an annual event, a softball game between the gays and the cops. Gay Pride Week got off to a bad start between these two groups when, in the wee hours of the morning, police raided a local gay bar. Many members of the gay community charged harassment but HPD said it was just a routine investigation prompted by citizen complaints. But, at the softball game, it was all good, clean fun. The gay cheerleaders masqueraded appropriately as Miss Piggy. The Montrose Marching Band provided pre-game festivities. The games are friendly competition rather than confrontation," reported *Eyewitness News*.

FIRST DALLAS GAY PARADE

DALLAS — This Sunday, June 29, Gay Pride Week comes to a stunning climax with the first annual Gay Pride Parade. The parade will begin promptly at 3pm, stepping off from Throckmorton and Cedar Springs and proceed proudly to Lee Park. The parade route will be down Cedar Springs, past Oak Lawn to Turtle Creek; on Turtle Creek to Hall where the parade will turn left as "our pride spurs us on!"

The parade will assemble between Knight and Throckmorton. All floats, horses, cars, and other parade units must be in place by 2pm. Theme of this year's parade is "The Round-up", suggesting a western flavor.

Unit judging will take place during the course of the parade, **TWT NEWS** has learned. Prizes will be awarded in four categories: Best Float, Best Vintage Car, Best Organizational Representation, and Best Interpretation of Tradi-

tional Western.

After the parade, all units must remain on Lee Street for the duration of the Lee Park Rally on the grounds of the Arlington Mansion. After the rally, there will be a free beer bust in the Village Station parking lot, sponsored by the Dallas Gay Political Caucus.

GAY PRIDE PARADE AXED IN AUSTIN

AUSTIN — The Gay Pride Week Organizational Committee of Austin has decided to cancel this year's scheduled Gay Pride Week march and rally. There will, however, be a picnic at Pease Park on June 28, at 12pm.

"It was mutually felt that Austin could produce no more than two hundred marchers and that such a small number would not be representative of Austin's large gay population," it was explained to **TWT NEWS** by GPW Organizational Committee Co-Chairperson Gary J. Fitzsimmons.

The picnic is open to all gay people and is an interim Gay Pride Week celebration. Austin Lambda will continue their scheduled activities.

TWO-MILE LONG HOUSTON PARADE

HOUSTON — Gay Pride Week comes to a spectacular climax this Sunday, June 29, with a 49-unit parade down Westheimer for two miles from Shepherd to Bagby, starting at 3pm. "Westheimer will be closed to traffic during the parade," said Parade Committee Chairperson Larry Bagnieris, Jr., who also told **TWT NEWS** that "the reviewing stand will be at the corner of Grant and Westheimer."

All participants in the parade must meet in their designated spaces by 1pm at The Old Plantation, 2020 Kipling. Five judges will select the winners between 1 and 1:30 pm. Floats not in place by 1pm will be disqualified from competition. ➤

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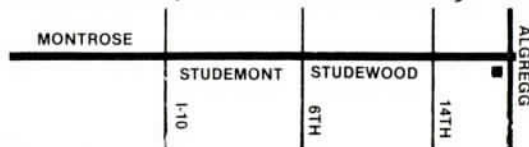
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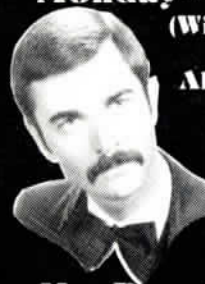
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Announcement of the winning parade units will be held between 1:45 and 2:15 pm. There will be a Grand Prize Sweepstakes winner plus First and Second Runners-up in both commercial and non-profit categories.

Twice as many people will see this year's parade which is twice as long as last year's. The Parade Committee has noted that competition to see who can engineer the biggest and most fabulous float has been running strong.

The parade permit and insurance were secured for \$1500, funds available due to Andy Mills and Jim Farmer. The insurance was underwritten by two companies to save money.

Media coverage will be extensive. TV news cameras will videotape the parade for Sunday night news reports at 6 and 10 pm. The Gay Pride Week Parade Committee and **TWT NEWS** remind that it is imperative that everyone conduct themselves in an adult manner and with good taste as millions of Houstonians will be watching on TV. Live, on-the-scene radio reports will be broadcast on KRLY-FM 94. **TWT NEWS** will photograph the parade with a battery of cameras from four vantage points.

Bagneris and GPW Committee Chairperson Greer Price will be interviewed this Saturday night at 6pm on KUHT-TV, Channel 8's program *Interchange*.

GPW Media Committee Chairperson Roz Vecchio has announced that her committee will present a multi-media presentation on July 12, at 8pm in Agnes Arnold Hall, Auditorium #2, on the University of Houston campus. Vecchio said that "the event will show film and pictures of all the highlights of Gay Pride Week."

FIREWORKS AT HOUSTON'S RALLY

HOUSTON — Over \$2000 worth of fireworks will climax Gay Pride Week this Sunday night at the second annual rally in Spotts Park, corner of Waugh and Memorial Drives. The pyrotechnics will be seen for miles around, bursting high above the Houston downtown sky-

line. A fitting patriotic climax to Gay Pride Week, **TWT NEWS** notes.

The rally, sponsored by the Gay Political Caucus, will feature speakers such as City Comptroller Kathy Whitmire and City Council Members Lance Lalor and Eleanor Tinsley.

A concert combining the talents of the Montrose Singers and the Montrose Marching Band will add to the gay pride festivities. Rally starting time is 7:30pm. Bring your blankets and sit on the grassy knolls looking down upon the rally platform in Spotts Park.

REPUBLICANS TO IGNORE GAYS

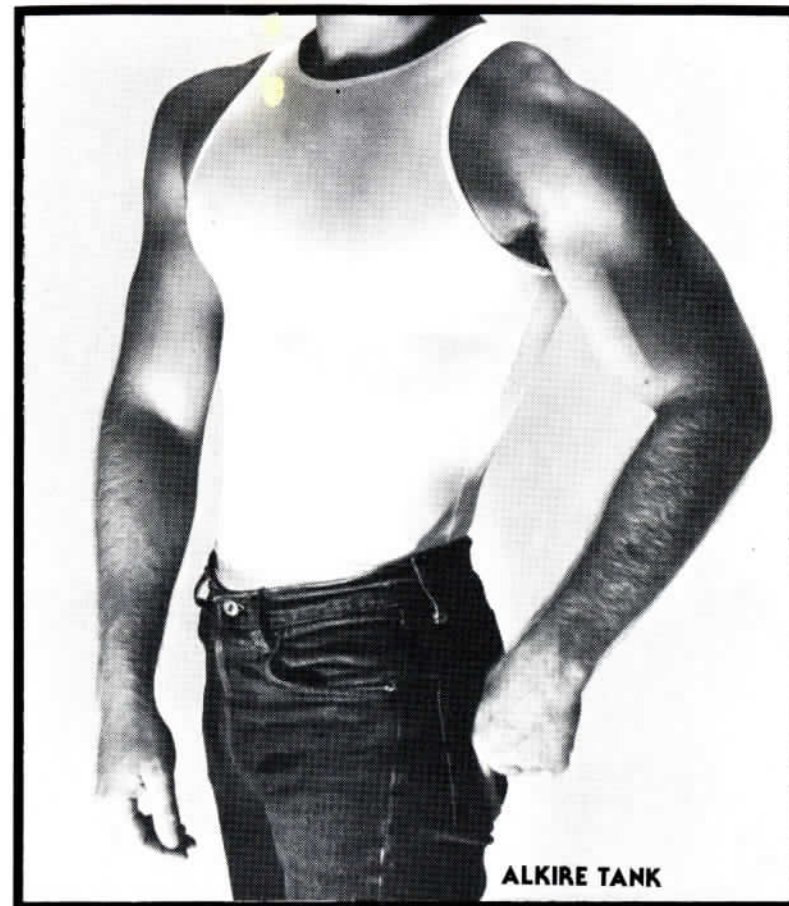
HOUSTON — Gay rights suffered an expected defeat at last weekend's Republican State Convention. The gay rights plank never even made it to the convention floor.

In a death blow, the Republican conservative ground swell passed several resolutions which one gay rights leader called "appalling." A resolution was passed outlawing homosexual marriages and gay rights. The pro-ERA plank was also defeated which has upset many feminist activists. Additionally, the conservative vote steam rolled a resolution disallowing abortion. "Texas Republicans have become very conservative at this year's state convention," an observer told **TWT NEWS**.

While the convention was in progress, simultaneously speaking was Texas Senator John Tower on KTRK-TV, Channel 13's *Eyewitness News Issues and Answers* program. Tower said that, for the most part, gays will probably be ignored as a political group in the 1980 Republican party.

From his televised statements, **TWT NEWS** quotes Tower as saying, "As the Chairman of the Republican Platform Committee for the National Convention, I have been holding hearings in various cities throughout the country, we have had a couple of witnesses representing the gay rights interests. My guess is the Republican National Plat-

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form will probably be silent on that point."

"It is just a guess on my part," Tower added. "There will be 108 members of the Platform Committee and any one of them can offer anything they want to. But, I think the disposition is to ignore the gays for the most part," he explained.

DEMOCRATS TO NOT IGNORE GAYS

SAN ANTONIO — Gay rights took a giant step forward at last weekend's Democratic State Convention. "It's the first time that I can remember that a gay rights resolution has ever reached the floor of a Texas State Democratic Convention," exclaimed Betty Naylor of the Texas Gay Task Force, a delegate to the convention. In Naylor's district, only 11 people voted against the resolution while an overwhelming 104 voted in favor. "Two years ago, it would have been quickly defeated," explained Naylor to **TWT NEWS**.

Similar sentiments were expressed to **TWT NEWS** by Houston Gay Political Caucus President Lee Harrington who added that he was "proud that three HGPC board members had been elected as delegates to the convention."

From the entire state convention delegation, only one openly-gay delegate, Larry Bagneris, Jr. of Houston, was elected a delegate to the national convention to be held in New York. Two at-large alternate delegates were elected: Louise Young of the Dallas GPC and a Carter supporter, and Steve Thomas of Austin, a Kennedy supporter. Additionally, elected to be alternate delegates for their districts were Max Todd of Houston for the 15th Senatorial District and Al Calkins of Dallas for the 16th Senatorial District. Jann Zumbrum of Austin was elected a permanent member of the Platform Committee. Renee Rabb was appointed to the Resolutions Committee and Chuck Hickman was appointed to the Nominations Committee. Both Rabb and Hickman are from Houston.

"There were over 150 gay delegates to the convention," stated DGPC board member Louise Young to **TWT NEWS**, adding "that's 50% more than two years ago."

The Resolutions Committee voted 20-to-7 to take to the convention floor the resolution favoring abolition of Section 21.06 of the Texas State Penal Code, the Sodomy Law. That resolution lost by the slim margin of 2073 against and 1692 for. Nevertheless, gay rights made it to the floor of the convention for the first time.

Bill Nelson, school teacher and DGPC board member, moved for repeal of 21.06 in the Teachers' Caucus which passed his motion 78-to-74. "The Teachers' Caucus also came out in support of human rights for educators," remarked Nelson to **TWT NEWS**.

GAY HISTORIAN DON AMADOR

HOUSTON — Considered America's greatest historian of homosexuality, urban anthropologist Don Amador held an audience of over 700 spellbound last Monday night at the First Unitarian Church.

Such historical figures as Alexander Hamilton, George Washington, Socrates, and the translator of the King James Version of the Bible "all had more than just a passing fancy for men," asserted Amador. Michelangelo, Beethoven, Handel, Walt Whitman, Susan B. Anthony, Emily Dickinson, Stephen Foster, and James Dean were other names dropped by Amador.

"Councilwoman Eleanor Tinsley and City Comptroller Kathy Whitmire were in attendance along with network TV, the *Post*, and *Chronicle*," observed Lee Harrington, President of the HGPC which sponsored the GPW event.

Proud to Be . . . In Jail

Dear TWT:

June 19, a night that started as a Gay Pride Week fund-raising event at the Venture-N, was turned into a free surprise party at Mary's Lounge, compliments of the Houston Police Department. It was a night not soon to be forgotten.

At 12:05am, June 20, 1980, the HPD Vice Squad descended on Mary's Lounge and proceeded to order everyone to "grab a piece of the wall". Well, without further adieu, we made our ways to the nearest unoccupied space remaining. The officers, both in uniform and plainclothes, proceeded to pick out the people who they wanted. The police officers proceeded to "lead" them outside to the waiting wagons. It was then that a plainclothesman tapped me on the shoulder and asked me to "please" turn around. After looking me over, he said, "You're okay." To myself I said, "Thank you, Jesus." The obvious absconding continued. Then it was heard from somebody in the doorway, "We have room for three more." Another plainclothesman picked two men from the remaining selection on the wall and walked around the room, tapped another person on the shoulder and said, "You'll do." The third man was me.

I was escorted to a waiting squad car (whose windows were rolled up and the window handles removed) and put in with three other men. With the four of us and no ventilation, it became very hot and stuffy. I have claustrophobia. We waited in the car for close to fifteen minutes and were then transferred to the second wagon (also no ventilation). By the time the wagon started its trek to Reasoner Street, there were thirty-three persons in it. As we departed, we counted off and then I led the group in prayer. Arrival at our first of two stops found us in a building with a long white hallway. There, the Mary's employees were separated from the rest of us and initial booking proceedings began. We were transported to the jail and the

holding tank. We waited approximately thirty minutes until the police took our personal property and handcuffed us in sets of eight to lead us to our cells. I made my one phone call (to my father, at 3am) and was then shown my way to the cell. Once inside, some talked, some slept (as I) and some partied. In the morning, an officer ran a metal cup along the bars to wake us for breakfast. I had to try it, if only to say that I had. And yes, Houston, the food was very bland.

After breakfast we were lined up for court appearances. An officer entered and said, "Some of you don't have to go to court" and he read off a list of names. Well, thank God, my name was eventually read. They processed me and called for the person who paid my bail. Expecting to see my father, who knows I'm gay and has been to Mary's with me, I was surprised to find a friend of mine, who was standing next to me the previous night, had paid my bail.

When I got home at 8:30am, I "let my fingers do the walking." I called the American Civil Liberties Union, who knew nothing about the previous night's happenings until I filled them in; Eleanor Tinsley, out for the morning; Lance Lalor, in a meeting; B.K. Johnson, out of town; Mayor McConn, in his weekly press conference; Bob Heard, in Kerrville; the HPD Internal Affairs Department, referred me to Vice; the HPD Vice Department, had nothing to say on the phone; City Comptroller Kathy Whitmire, not in yet.

Secretaries for Tinsley, Lalor and Whitmire said that the officials would return my calls. I hoped, and Lalor and Whitmire did [return my calls]. Tinsley was with McConn discussing what had occurred. Upon speaking with Ms. Whitmire and her confidante, Kay Little, I was made aware of what was happening at City Hall. Both women were very informative and encouraging. Mr. Lalor was inquisitive as to details of charges and attitudes of the people. These three (four, counting Ms. Little) care and know who put them in office and I whole- ➤

heartedly thank them.

Our day in court (July 8, 6pm) is coming and we should wait to show our prowess then and there. Y'all come! I feel, and this should go without saying, that next time something like this happens, we will have a Bloody Stonewall, Houston-style.

We must *act* and *show* that we are PROUD TO BE! If it means spending a night in jail or walking down the street hand-in-hand during the parade.

Bodycenter Members Meet

Dear TWT:

In two meetings this past week, Bodycenter members began their effort to bring the Bodycenter back as a local member-owned cooperative, affiliated with the Bodycenter organization in Los Angeles.

Monday, June 2, over a fifth of the members attended a meeting to discuss the co-op. Under this plan, those with current memberships will pay a monthly fee of about \$30 with new memberships going for \$300.

Tony Linville of the Members' Steering

Committee explains that "the monthly fee will drop every month until the charter members will be paying almost nothing. We feel that this type of plan will allow old members to continue working out and give us money to keep the place open. This also saves them the money they would have had to pay for another full-year membership."

At the second meeting, Thursday, June 5, Bodycenter President Ed Mayers talked with the Steering Committee about ways the Bodycenter organization in Los Angeles plans to help in setting up the co-op.

Mayers assured everyone that the Bodycenter has always stood behind their gyms and the Dallas one is no exception. All of the agreements with the previous

owners, including the national coverage, will continue. He also promised to personally give as much advice as possible to make the Dallas Bodycenter better than before.

About the closing, Mayers said that the Bodycenter organization had tried, for the benefit of the members, to save the club but the local owners disposed of the contracts and machines before anyone in California knew what was happening.

When the Center closed May 30, the local response was almost immediate.

"The most encouraging thing so far is that the members are really enthused and pulling together like nothing I've ever seen," Linville explained. "Even the building manager is going out of his way to keep us as tenants. This has been a ➤

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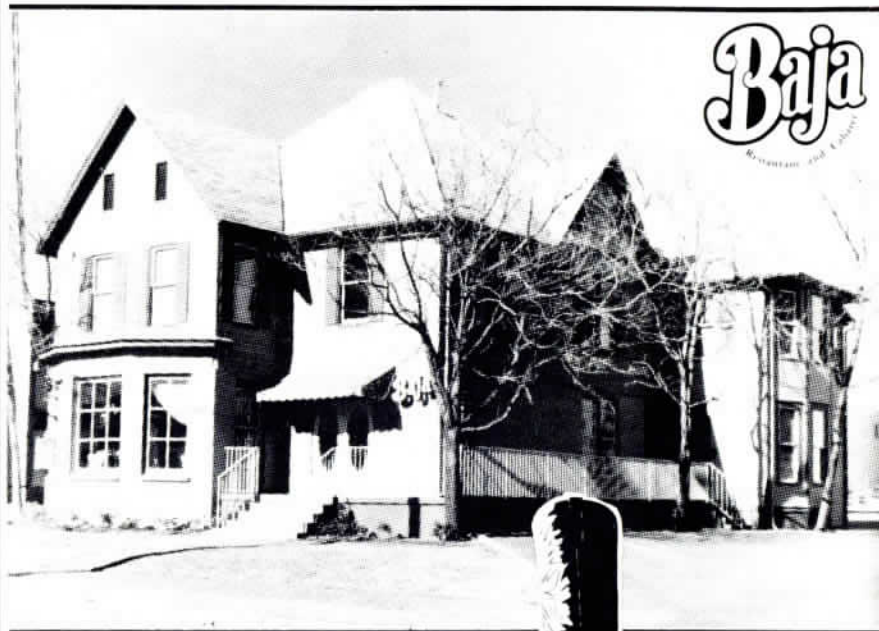

Duly Sworn On His Oath

The following is a reprint of a notarized statement on file with the Internal Affairs Division of the Houston Police Department regarding alleged misbehavior by a Houston Police Officer, Badge #1822. The officer's name is unknown but the following description has been given to TWT COMMENT:

"Before me, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared Steven Benjamin Cole, who after being duly sworn on his oath deposes and says:

"My name is Steven Benjamin Cole. I live at 2218 Chenevert #1, Houston, Texas 77003. I have no home phone. I work at the Diner's News, 240 Westheimer, Houston, Texas 77019. My work phone number is 528-8950. I am 22 years of age.

"At about 3:45 A.M., Tuesday, June 17, 1980, an officer walked through the door of the store, passed a customer that was on his way out (between the railings of our turnstyle), and went past the turnstyle. I asked him if I could help him. The officer ignored my question. He called the customer back and demanded to see identification, looked it over, handed it back to him and told him to be gone. The officer turned away and proceeded to walk into the joint hallway of the smaller two (2) movie arcades. The customer that had his identification checked made a comment about the officer acting strange and left. I

then wrote down the license plate number (UKX 185) of the only other car besides mine in the parking lot, called Police Dispatcher, told them that an officer was in the store and I wanted to know if there was any way I could have him checked out to make sure he was an officer. She (the dispatcher) asked if he (the officer) was in uniform. I said he was. She asked what his name and badge number was. I said I did not know. She said he should have a name plate on. About this time, the officer came back out from the arcades when he got close enough, I told her the badge number. By then two (2) customers had came up front from the other arcade room. Ray Hill was up by the register where I was. The officer walked up near the counter where we were at and asked Mr. Hill what the hell he was doing here.

The officer told him to move on. The dispatcher said she wanted to talk to the officer. I handed the phone to the officer and told him it was police dispatch. The officer listened a few seconds, then yelled into the phone something like 'Hell yes I'm an officer.' His final comment was definitely 'Fuck you' to the dispatcher. He handed the phone back to me. When I had the phone close enough to hear I interrupted the dispatcher and told her the officer wasn't on the phone. I hung the phone up. The officer asked me if I was 'ready to go to jail.' I said 'no.' He then proceeded to walk around the counter from the northern end. The officer stopped about three feet (3') from me, said 'You see this?' pointing to his badge, then pointing to his shoulder patch repeated 'You see this', then pointing to the large chrome-plated automatic he had stuck in near the front center of his belt then pointed to the black automatic on his left side repeated one more time 'You see this? You still think I'm not an officer?' I shook my head no. He had asked for my identification just prior to this and was writing down information from it. He then said he was going to kick my ass and fuck me. I started to shake my head no and back out from behind the counter. He said he wasn't going to do it now that there was nothing I could do about it, that he was going to get me. By that time I had backed to the end of the counter. I ducked under the railing, went out the door, got my keys out and was trying to get the door locked. By the time I got the key in the door the officer was already forcing his way out. I

The Gay Unwanted Youth Service of Dallas, in conjunction with United Community church and in agreement with Catholic Charities of the Dallas Diocese, has initiated a pilot program to resettle

Cuban refugees in Texas and elsewhere. To our knowledge, at this point in time, we are the only group attempting to help the gay Cubans.

These brothers and sisters are under terrible duress and harassment in the relocation centers. Some are being exploited by hardened criminals. Living conditions are beyond inadequate.

Our own *Dallas Morning News* (Sunday, June 8) referred to these people as the "worst" segment of Cuban society along with the "crazy people" Mr. Castro is sending to our shores. With such press coverage, placement will be difficult at best, if not impossible.

They need our help! GUYS and UCC are very small groups without any funding whatsoever. This is truly a venture of faith

on our part. Will you step out and help with any of the following: money, bedding, towels, clothing, staple foodstuffs, toiletries, employment, and sponsorship.

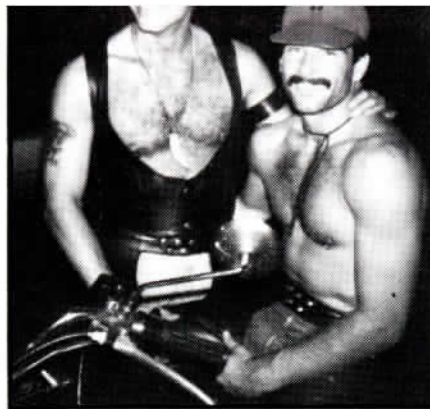

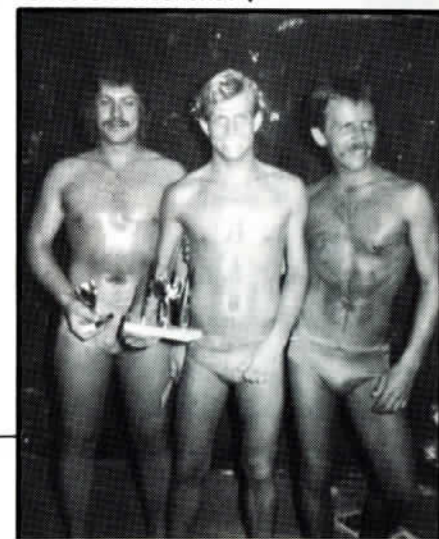

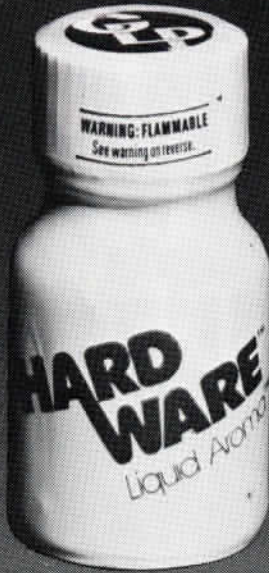
