DALLAS D.A. ACCUSED OF FORUM-SHOPPING

DALLAS — On October 25, 1979, ten customers were arrested at Village Station on trumped-up charges of allegedly fondling the genitals of other male patrons. Two of the defendants, as reported earlier by TWT NEWS, were acquitted by County Criminal Court Judge Chuck Miller.

Last May, Judge Miller made a public statement regarding the six remaining cases, saying that District Attorney Henry Wade was guilty of "forum shopping" since Wade had withdrawn those cases from Judge Miller's court and refiled them in other County Criminal Courts.

"Since May, of the 79 public lewdness cases that have been filed in Dallas, none of them have been filed in Judge Miller's court," stated the Village Station attorney to TWT NEWS.

It has been further learned that Judge Tom Price has requested a court of inquiry into Wade's alleged forum shopping. Additionally, Price has asked for the support of the Dallas Bar Association into his request.

In an interview on WFAA-TV, Wade and Village Station attorney Don Mason discussed the matter of forum shopping. Wade stated the refile of cases was to ease the load on some of the judges and more evenly distribute cases among court dockets. Mason pointed out that these cases have been withdrawn by the D.A. and refiled in seven different courts.

But, TWT NEWS has learned from a reliable source that, since May, over 800 cases have been heaped upon Judge Price. "This is unusually high," said a spokesperson at County Court House, adding that "this only adds fuel to the fire between Judge Price and D.A. Wade."

TGTF FUND-RAISER IN EL PASO

EL PASO — Over \$700 was raised for the Texas Gay Task Force during a benefit show at The Old Plantation on July 16, TWT NEWS has learned. Approximately 275 persons attended the fund-raiser which was one of the first organized gay benefits to be held in El Paso.

"This initial show of support will be followed up by contacting interested gays and lesbians and by working on a membership drive," said TGTF regional representative John Sutton. Jack Allen Foster worked with seven local female impersonators in putting together the show. The entertainers donated their time, as well as their tips, to help support the activities of TGTF. Bob Bonaventure, manager of The Old Plantation, donated proceeds from the door as well.

The benefit provided an opportuni-

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ty to tell the gay and lesbian community of El Paso about TGTF and some of the activities going on at the state level. "This fund-raising event gave us a point from which to grow and expand," added Sutton, "not only for TGTF, but for the El Paso gay and lesbian community as well."

HGPC STREAMLINED, EXPANDED

HOUSTON — Houston Gay Political Caucus President Lee Harrington has made several major changes in the operation of that organization. For 30 days, TWT NEWS notes, Harrington has intensely reviewed the work structure and needs of a rapidly growing HGPC and concludes: "In an effort to accommodate and better organize the substantially increased number of people involved in Caucus work, promote efficiency in the heavy day-to-day workload, and to streamline communication, I am announcing [changes] effective August 1, 1980."

Changes will include a new phone network and number (521-1000) and relocation of offices to suite 217, 4600 Main, tripling present office space and accommodating a Receptionist/Administrative Assistant area, a private office, and a large conference/work room.

Member Mark Gwin is in charge of adapting new office space to Caucus needs. "As soon as Mark's work is completed, I will ask our Board of Trustees to set a date for an open house and reception at which the community will be invited to make inspection and meet everyone involved in what now totals some 26 leadership positions," Harrington told **TWT NEWS**.

In an organization structural change, Harrington announced creation of a Minority Issues Coordinator position, along with eight other Coordinators who, like present committee chairpersons, are responsible to oversee and report the progress of their committees efforts in the many areas of Caucus



work. Serving in an advisory capacity and reporting directly to the HGPC President will be Coordinators in the following areas: Cases of Discrimination, Communication, Education, Financial Support, Health Services, Internal Affairs, Political Action, and Special Projects/Community Issues.

"All future committees and projects, and their chairpersons, will fall under the responsibility of the appropriate Coordinator," stated Harrington. Revised organizational charts are available from HGPC upon request.

In addition, the position of Press Liaison was created. Named to the post was Kent Spear.

GAY MOTHER TO KEEP CHILDREN

FLEMINGTON, NJ — A divorced mother who lives with another woman cannot be denied custody of her children simply because she is homosex-

ual. TWT NEWS has learned of the favorable ruling which was recently handed down by a New Jersey Superior Court Judge.

Judge William M. D'Annunzio said Rosemary Dempsey, 35, of Trenton, was raising her two children in an "unconventional household". But, he ruled, there was no evidence that her sexual behavior was harming her children.

Dempsey's ex-husband, Edward Belmont, 34, had obtained a temporary injunction last March which granted him custody of their two children, Edward and Christina, ages 11 and 10.

U.S. REP. MICKEY LELAND HOLDS OPEN HOUSE

HOUSTON — The Houston Gay Political Caucus has been invited to take part in United States Congressman Mickey Leland's Open House Bazaar and Street Festival. The event will be

held this coming Sunday, August 3, from 2-6 pm, at 4101 San Jacinto.

According to Johnny Peden, HGPC Board Member and Education Committee Co-Chair, the HGPC will have an information booth at the festival to serve at least four purposes.

Peden outlined for TWT NEWS the purposes as "voter registration, addition of new names to GPC's mailing list, distribution of literature regarding homosexuality to thousands of straight people who will be there, and building friendships and strengthening our ties with our good friends of the black and brown communities."

The event is open to the general public. There will also be free music and entertainment as well as food and games for a small charge.

BOB GREENE TO BATTLE GAYS

MAIMI — Bob Greene, estranged husband of Anita Bryant, says he "will continue to battle the gay movement" despite his pending divorce from his wife. "Anita Bryant has also been attempting to disassociate herself from the Anita Bryant Ministries," said Greene.

Greene's assumption of duties as head of that organization, which will now be called "Crusade for Morality," is not inconsistent with charges by Bryant that Greene had "used" her and her campaign for his own, personal and financial purposes.

Still pending is an IRS investigation into the financial books and records of the anti-gay organization.

MCCR INSTALLS NEW ASS'T PASTOR

HOUSTON — This Sunday, August 3, the Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection, 1919 Decatur, will hold a special service of celebration at 10:45am to license Exhorter Dee Lamb as a professional minister within the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches. During the service, the Rev. Lamb will be installed as

Assistant Pastor of MCCR and will be delivering the sermon, reports TWT NEWS.

Invitations to the Rev. Lamb's licensing and installation have been sent to all churches within the South-Central District of the UFMCC. The district includes the states of Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and part of Missouri and has 13 church groups.

The Rev. Lamb and her spouse, Billie Stoffel, first attended MCCR in March, 1975. After several months of faithful attendance, the Rev. Lamb became aware that God was calling her to an active ministry within MCCR. She responded, after a long candidacy period, by becoming a deacon under the Rev. Jeri Ann Harvey who was, at that time, Pastor of MCCR.

Through her service as a deacon, the Rev. Lamb realized that her ministry for God should be a lifetime commitment. She petitioned the Board of Directors of MCCR for a change in her status and became an exhorter, or student minister, in 1977. She has also maintained a successful relationship with her companion of over seven years, who serves as Church Treasurer and Vice-Moderator of the Board of Directors of MCCR.

The Rev. Lamb and her spouse have participated in the growth of MCCR from a group of about 35 people renting a storefront building at 2020 Waugh Drive to the present membership of 350.

who worship in the building purchased in March, 1979.

The Rev. Lamb designed, implemented, and is currently directing the parish families program within MCCR. Parish families are geographical sub-divisions within the greater Houston area and are used to promote closer fellowship and peer support among the members and friends of the church.

After meeting the stringent educational and experiential requirements set by the UFMCC, the Rev. Lamb was recommended for licensing by the Rev. Charles W. Larsen, present pastor of MCCR. In order to be approved for licensing, the Rev. Lamb first had to take and pass a ministerial proficiency test required by the UFMCC. The Rev. Lamb made a composite score of 94 (out of 100) on all sections of the test, and was ranked in the top five percent of those tested.

From two rather timid women who first crept into a tiny church, Dee Lamb and Billie Stoffel have become two of

the shining lights of MCCR. "The licensing ceremony will be a triumph and a celebration for both of them, as well as a joyous declaration of pride by MCCR in two of our own people who have achieved together an arduous and wonderful goal," said Virginia Galloway of MCCR.

MCCR invites all people to attend the services Sunday, August 3, at 10:45am and share in the celebration.

TROUT FOUND GUILTY IN GLOVER MURDER

DALLAS — Lynn Edward Trout, 32, has been found guilty of murdering Michael Glover, a construction worker from Austin and known by reputation to have been a hustler. The verdict was handed down Tuesday, July 22, 1980. An earlier trial ended in a mis-trial, TWT NEWS reminds.

Trout, a Dallas accountant, had claimed self-defense against a male prostitute. Hillcrest High School Assis-

tant Principal George Blair had become involved in the trial when he testified that his roommate, Trout, fatally stabbed Glover on Christmas Eve of 1979 in their White Rock Lake residence.

It was brought out in testimony that Trout and Blair "had the habit of picking up male prostitutes in downtown Dallas several times every month for the past three years."

The partially-clad body of the fatally stabbed Glover was found wearing no underwear or socks indicating that he had been killed while unclothed and then hastily dressed. The underwear and socks were found elsewhere in the house.

During the trial, the two roommates had changed their story several times. A juror serving in the first trial remarked that she had felt the stabbing was "in self-defense" but, because of the shabbily faulty way the case had been presented by the defense attorney, she had voted for conviction.

Meanwhile, TWT NEWS has learned

that Blair has resigned his position as Assistant Principal at Hillcrest High School in North Dallas and that Trout has asked for an appeal to a higher court.

MCCSA MOVES TO NEW BUILDING

SAN ANTONIO — The Metropolitan Community Church of San Antonio proudly announced to TWT NEWS its move to its own church building located at 107 South Pine, just off of East Commerce. Members are already enthusiastically working on renovations to the 50-year-old church.

This Sunday, August 3, will mark the first service in the new building. Formal worship is scheduled at 11am, prayer and preaching at 7pm, each Sunday with rap sessions at 7:30pm each Tuesday. 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TRIAL IN DALLAS FOR MURDER OF GAY

DALLAS — Last November, TWT NEWS reported the killing of 19-year-old Mark Payne who was shot while on Maple Avenue walking from a disco. His assailant was allegedly Florentino "Sam" Sendejas, age 16. The teenager is being tried as an adult for the November 16 robbery and murder. On that date, Sendejas was only 15.

Accused as an accomplice in the robbery is 17-year-old Lute Bernal. Murder charges against Bernal have been dropped. Both were seen shortly after 1am on the morning of November 16 while dragging a body into Pikes Park on Harry Hines Boulevard.

At first, Bernal told jurors he didn't want to testify. Later, however, he told how he and Sendejas were out driving that night and planned on "robbing somebody for some money."

Bernal said he was holding a BB gun when he got out of the car and told Payne to "give me your money." Bernal said he fired one shot over Payne's head when "the man started running."

Sendejas, who was carrying a .22-caliber rifle, fired two or three times at Payne. Payne fell, and the two teenagers then carried his body to Sendejas's car where they searched Payne's pockets but found "no money," reported Bernal.

Bernal said they took the body to Pikes Park where they removed Payne's pants and threw them into a dumpster. Witnesses called police after watching the body being searched and after obtaining the license number of the Sendejas car.

300 GAY REFUGEES GIVEN AID

FORT CHAFFEE, Ark. — The Metropolitan Community Church of Los Angeles has agreed to help find sponsors for 300 homosexual Cuban refugees living at the Army base here which has become a temporary reset-

tlement center.

The MCC had sent a representative to the center to seek out gay refugees so they could register in an effort to seek sponsors. Not many more gay refugees are expected to come forth, TWT NEWS was told.

Cuban refugees have made reports of discrimination and employment harassment while in their native country. More specifically, about 20 of the new-comers to this country related that they had been jailed for as long as four years under a Cuban law which proclaims homosexuality to be dangerous. Those jailed were without benefit of court or trial.

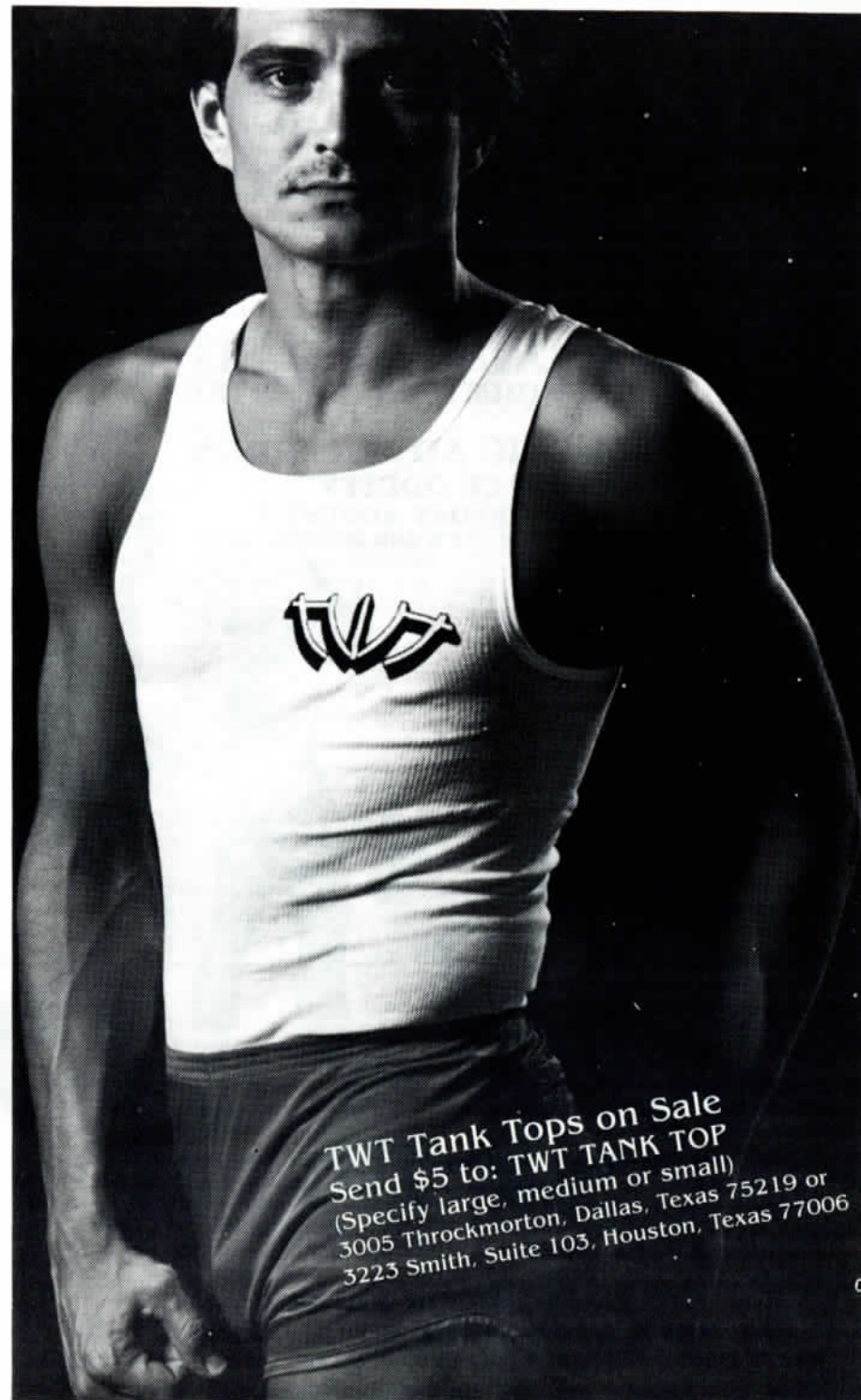
The unidentified church spokesperson said he had taken sponsorship applications from two people at Fort Smith, Arkansas. Other people who had called were from Memphis, Tulsa, and Oklahoma City. All sponsor applicants will be carefully screened.

San Antonio had been suggested as a resettlement area for some gay Cuban refugees because of its strong Spanish-speaking community. Houston and Dallas have also responded through gay civic organizations and gay churches.

Callers have been told that sponsorship is conducted as a religious, charitable service and that it is in no way a matching service, according to Dale Leech, an official of the MCC mother church in Los Angeles. "We're basically finding gay living arrangements for gay Cubans because it seems to work out better that way," he said.

Leech said that the sponsorship effort included requests sent to 113 Metropolitan Community Churches in the United States as well as to other sympathetic religious groups. He stressed the need for additional sponsors.

Social service programs have been a part of the MCC ministry since its founding 12 years ago; however, Leech said, "this is the first major opportunity to work as a worldwide church in such a large program." ▼

Positive Actions

Dear TWT:

The letter from Mr. Williams in TWT [Vol. 6, No. 17] is probably not uncommon. Anger, fear and frustration are just a few of the mixed emotions being felt by the entire gay and lesbian community in the wake of this horrible tragedy. But, criticism of the Houston Gay Political Caucus and the community is misunderstood and misinformed.

We learned of Fred's tragic death on the morning of June 28, just one day prior to the parade. To cancel the parade, and march an angry community to the steps of City Hall the very next day, without permits and without knowing any more facts about this case other than the unbelievable police report, would have resulted in more violence and possibly the deaths of other members of our community. This type of response would have been exactly what a few homophobic HPD officers wanted: *An open license to beat, arrest, and kill the queers.* This type of response would have destroyed any chances of obtaining truth or justice.

You should know that a committee of

five people was elected by the community to form the Fred Paez Task Force. The Task Force has been working day and night investigating every possible lead in an effort to assimilate all the facts surrounding this case in order that the truth may come to light, whatever the truth may be.

The HGPC, through the Public Redress Committee, has put together a peaceful march and rally. This march was organized in only two weeks' time. Is that passive?

The "March for Justice" will not only be the gay and lesbian community protesting this brutal slaying and past police harassment but a unified protest of all the minorities and people of Houston who have been victims of police abuse, whether they are straight or gay.

It might interest people to know that the outrage of Fred's death is not limited to the Houston gay and lesbian community. Gay and lesbian organizations and straight people and organizations throughout Houston and the entire nation have either personally stopped by the HGPC offices or sent telegrams expressing their outrage and sympathy and offering their complete and total support.

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The Houston gay and lesbian community has always responded in a mature and responsible manner. We are, to the best of our ability, trying to obtain the truth and justice for Fred. I cannot and will not promise that justice will ever be rendered in this case. But, I believe with all my heart that our actions and response to this tragedy is the response and actions Fred would have believed in, supported and recommended.

To Mr. Williams: I noticed you are a part of an educational process involving law enforcement and criminal justice. Where have you been throughout this crisis? If you are so outraged, what would you recommend we do? Partake in violence and riots so we could commit wholesale slaughter?

It seems to me that some people find it easier to sit on their duffs and criticize the actions and works of other caring and concerned people and organizations rather than trying to take positive actions for positive results and help the community during this crisis.

Please let me say this letter does not represent the viewpoints of the HGPC, its president, board members, or officers.

Rather, this letter represents only my views and opinions. Let each person speak for themselves.

Cuban Gays in the U.S.

Councilman: We won't welcome gay Cubans by Bill Hendricks, News Staff Writer

"San Antonio opening its arms to a tide of Cuban homosexuals would be a 'disgrace,' a city councilman says.

"I think it is disgraceful to take these people with that kind of lifestyle," Councilman Van Archer has told *The News*.

"A spokesman for a national church order headquartered in Los Angeles said his organization is looking at San Antonio as a place to relocate gay Cuban refugees.

"Dale Leeche, spokesman for the world headquarters of Metropolitan Community Church, said what he believes is a large population of Spanish-speaking homosexuals makes San Antonio an ideal relocation city.

"Archer disagrees.

"I don't know where anybody got the idea San Antonio would be an ideal ►

location for this crud."

"Archer indicated he doubts the city is an especially hospitable climate for any Cuban refugees, especially homosexuals."

"I think it is absurd," Archer said. "We have many fine people trying to immigrate to this country and they can't get in."

"Believing that San Antonio would be hospitable to Cuban gays 'couldn't be further from the truth,' Archer said."

"Government officials have said as many as half the 40,000 Cuban refugees still being held at four camps across the country are gays."

"Leeche said many were forced at bayonet point to leave Cuba and seek refuge in the United States. He mentioned representatives of gay activist organizations who have visited refugee camps and seen the bayonet scars on the backs of gays."

"His church organization is looking at several Texas cities, including San Antonio, as possible relocation points."

"While he agrees San Antonio may have a large submerged population of Spanish-speaking homosexuals, the pastor of the Metropolitan Community Church here said he thinks other Texas cities might be more

receptive to the Cubans."

"The Rev. James Lewey told *The News* he believes homosexuality is more open in cities like Dallas, Houston, and Austin."

"Mayor Lila Cockrell said she had 'no information on the subject,' and declined comment."

"Lewey said he asked Sunday for donations from his 75 church members to aid Cuban gays and plans to ask for another donation next Sunday."

The preceding news story provoked outrage in the San Antonio gay community. The following letters addressed themselves to Councilman Archer's comments.

An open letter to City Councilman Van Henry Archer:

Bill Hendricks reported in the July 9 issue of the *San Antonio News*, "San Antonio opening its arms to a tide of Cuban homosexuals would be a 'disgrace'." He attributed this remark to you.

He further quoted you as saying, "I think it is disgraceful to take these people with that kind of lifestyle." Later in the article, you referred to the Cuban gays as "crud," and compared them unfavorably to the "fine people trying to immigrate into this



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country."

I believed that today's society, even here in conservative San Antonio, had reached a point where an ill-informed and bigoted person such as yourself would be incapable of being elected to public office. Apparently I am wrong.

However, as the owner of one of the largest gay establishments in this area of Texas, I can assure you that your re-election will not be an easy task. As the gay community has become more and more politically active, it has proven that it has the strength to effect the outcome of political races of interest.

If your attitudes toward the gay community and its "lifestyle" have not changed before you face re-election, the gay community can and will use all of the power it has available to prevent your return to office.

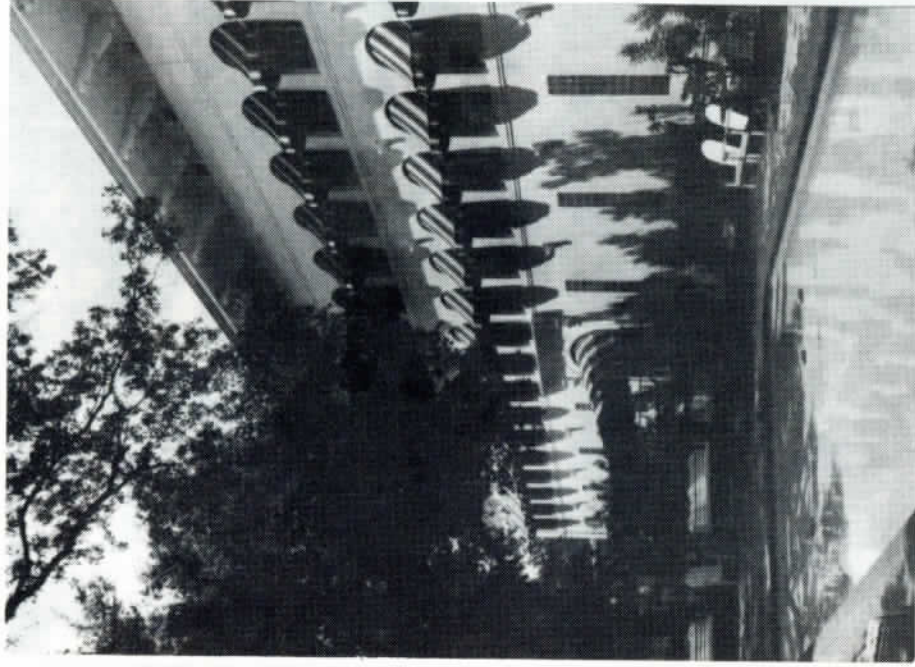
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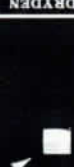
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INFLATION CRISIS, AND GAY RIGHTS

Ipi-Tombi will run from July 25 through August 17 at the Tower Theatre in Houston. This show is a must for you to experience. ▼

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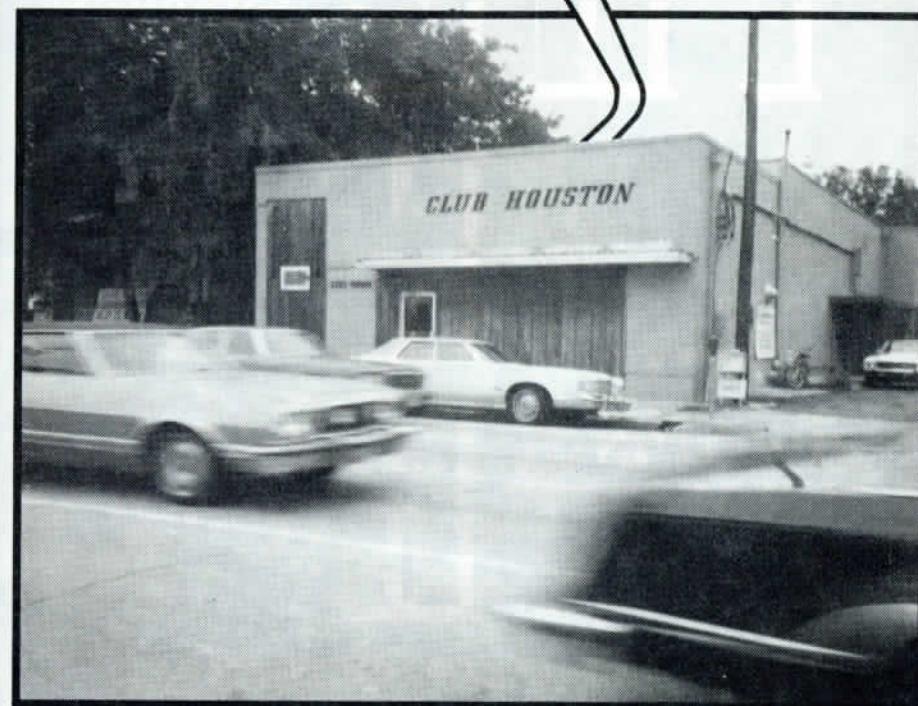

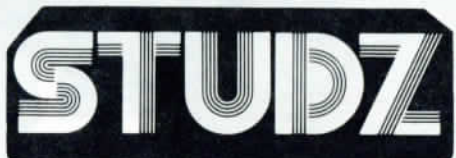


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In dealing with all this, I've had to make some decisions and learn a few good lessons worth sharing. On the advice of several friends and administrators, I've decided it may not be advantageous to my health for me to live in the dorm. So, I'll be getting an apartment and an unlisted phone number. But, to do this, since I'm losing my father's support, I'll have to carry a heavier job, which means I'll have to carry much fewer hours, which in turn means I'll not graduate on schedule. I've had to think really hard to see what all I was putting on the line to retain this position and see if it was worth it.

These weren't decisions made with ease. I tried to run from them and, at one point, nearly resigned to avoid all the change it will make in my life. That's when I learned that the problems you run away from will always run faster than you can, and, when they catch up to you, you're even less prepared to face them and deal with them accordingly.

You see, I'm no different than any other homosexual. I just have reached a point we all are confronted with sometime or another. We all will face a situation sometime in our life where we must stand up for ourselves or fail when confronted with our sexual preference by an authority figure like a parent, employer, or even friend. Those that I've seen succeed may have had a hard go at it, but they have earned the confidence to push ahead and become

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productive. Those that I've observed fail never really pick up all the pieces of their life and seem to seclude themselves more and more as time goes by.

I've also learned that there is no drug, drink, or sexual act that will lighten that burden, much less solve it. Might I suggest that the main reason we are not accepted by the straight majority is because, with their exposure to gay life, all they can see are drugs, drunkenness, and sex sex sex from the majority of our out of the closet minority. Most of us probably don't overindulge in all three categories, but nearly all of us do in at least one. I'm not excluded.

No wonder they don't want us teaching their children! We keep asking Anita Bryant and James Robison types to try and see things from our point of view, but how many of us have *objectively* looked at our lifestyle and society from theirs? I don't think it is the homo-

sexual they disapprove of so much, but the addict, the alcoholic, and the person who is indiscreet about their sex life. I would scare me off, too, if I didn't know life from our side of the fence.

I believe there can and must be some standard code of "gay morality". Why not? We have a code for everything else.

I am challenging the gay community of Texas to be the state to begin this trend. It is the only means by which we will finally achieve the civil rights and freedom we ask for. We can learn a good lesson from the late Dr. Martin Luther King who advocated protests of a peaceful nature, void of petty prejudice and violence; and, from Booker T. Washington who asked his people to give the white man something to trust and believe in. What I'm saying is we can't demand "rights" and "freedom" unless we can offer something productive in our society to assure the American



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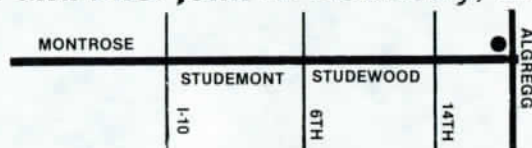
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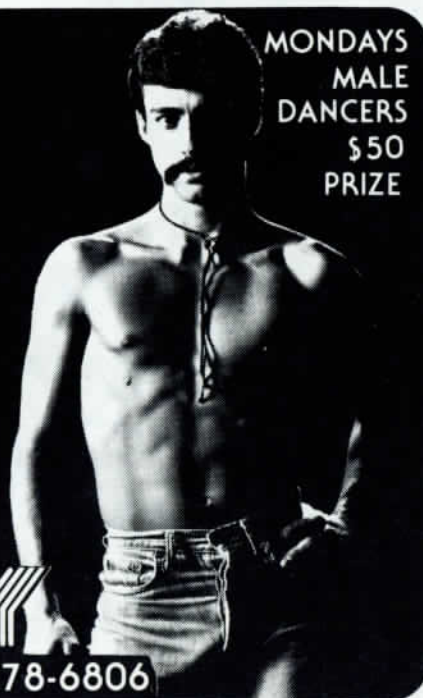
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an public that we are worthy. Freedom has never been free.

Let's clean up house before we invite everyone to inspect us for approval. Only through this will life be easier for the next guy to be in the position I'm in.

I wish to thank all the people who've sent me letters of advice and support,

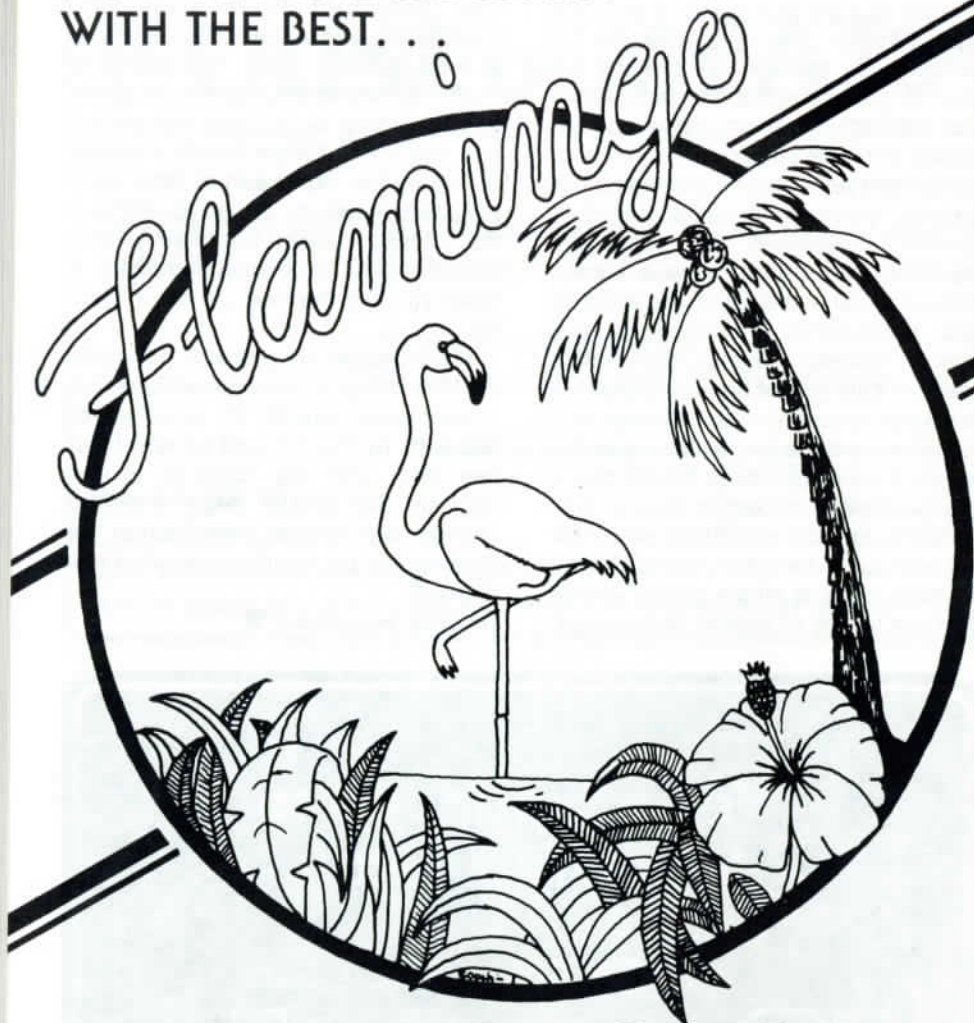

I'm not dissatisfied with my lifestyle and society; I just feel that, with the facilities at our disposal, we should begin initiating change and reform even though we may not see the results in our life time.
