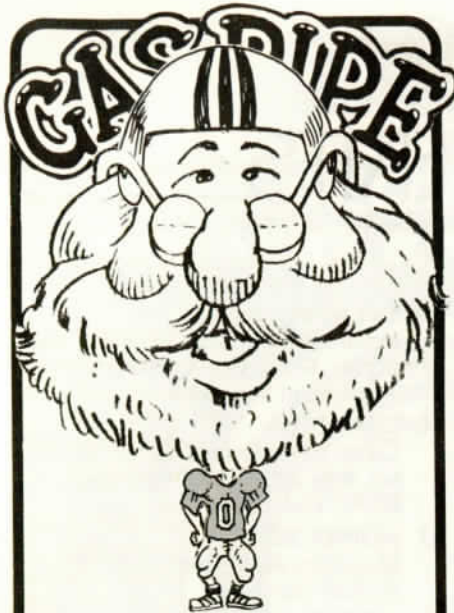

RASH OF MONTROSE GAY MUGGINGS

HOUSTON — Every night in Montrose about twenty people are being mugged, robbed, and beaten, reports a spokesman of local law enforcement to TWT NEWS.

Recently there has been a rash of muggings in the heart of Montrose and the Houston Police Department says that all of the reports from the victims indicate that all were "hit by the same two black guys."

One is tall, about 6'2"; the other is shorter, about 5'10". . . "it's always the same two!"

TWT NEWS has been inundated with reports of muggings in the past two weeks. In every instance, the victims report that they were mugged by two young black men, one very tall, the other average.

Last Friday night on Lovett, a victim was leaving a restaurant and walking to his car, when he was hit from behind while getting into his car. A gun was pointed to his head and he was told "to give me your wallet or I'll shoot you."

Another victim on the same night, in the same vicinity, reported being hit on the head by two black guys while walking by some bushes. He was knocked unconscious.

On the previous evening, a TWT employee was bashed on the head and knocked unconscious by a tall black man in front of his townhouse on Kipling. The assailant was hiding on the victim's patio and delivered a severe blow to his head with the butt of a gun, at his own front door. He was taken to his doctor where he received eight stitches to the scalp.

Another TWT employee was assaulted by a tall black man and his partner while walking home late at night in the vicinity of Waugh and

Missouri. He was hit on the side of the head with a board by a tall black man while another black man pointed a gun at him. The victim immediately turned and ran, escaping injury.

Still another victim told TWT NEWS that he was hit on the head with the butt of a gun. The gun was then pointed between his eyes and told, "If you move, you're dead." Again, two black men were involved, matching all previous descriptions.

"It's the same two men everytime," reports HPD, "and on some nights, 20 to 25 people in Montrose are attacked by them."

Obviously a pattern of attack has set in! The method is always the same, involving a gun and a blow to the head. The vicinity is always the same, involving the heart of Montrose. The time is always the same, too, being late at night. And, the assailants are always the same two black men, TWT NEWS observes.

VANDALISM SOAKS ROBISON OFFICE

EULESS — The offices of television evangelist James Robison were recently flooded by a strategically placed hose. Authorities speculate the vandalism may have been provoked by someone who telephoned a threat to the electronic minister.

Robison's office has received many threats since he began making anti-gay statements during his Sunday sermons on TV. As reported by TWT NEWS several times in the past, Robison's Sunday Sermon was once cancelled by WFAA-TV in Dallas for anti-homosexual remarks.

Jim DeWeerd, supervisor of Robison's large phone bank, said the water destroyed the carpeting of the 7,500 square foot first floor office. The

office was soaked in five inches of water. The \$75,000 carpet was all that was damaged.

"The vandalism was not done by any child. It was too well planned," said DeWeerd. Apparently, the vandals failed to force a lock on some double doors, then knotted a water hose around the handles so the nozzle pointed into a 1/8 inch crack in the doors.

The vandals were either motivated by Robison's recent political or anti-gay statements. However, a spokesperson did not point the finger at gays, as Robison usually does. Politics is more likely behind the vandalism.

UT TEACHERS PROTEST DISMISSAL

AUSTIN — As reported recently by TWT NEWS [Vol. 6, No. 26], Kathleen Kelleher, an assistant instructor at UT in the Department of Government, lost her teaching job when university administrators reassigned her classes to another professor.

Kelleher unexpectedly learned she would not be teaching her government courses after controversy arose surrounding the content of her summer course.

Approximately 100 students in the 10:30am and 6:30pm sections of Government 310L were told their course had been cancelled. No other sections were available in the same time slots.

A former chairman of the Department of Government at the University of Texas at Austin and two assistant instructors were contacted about teaching the Kelleher courses, but according to Karen Ann Broe of the *Daily Texan*, all of them declined. That is why the courses were cancelled. There was no one willing to teach them, TWT NEWS was told.

"We made a genuine effort to get someone to teach the courses, but got no one," said Elizabeth Manning, administrative assistant for the department.

Dr. Karl Schmitt was chairman of the department at the time two students objected to material in Kelleher's Government 312L course this summer.

The students who walked out of the class lodged complaints with the department chairman Schmitt against not only the gay speakers, but also against several speakers who had visited class at Kelleher's invitation.

The course deals with black power, feminism, gay rights, the anti-war movement, and other minority topics.

TEXAS GAY CONFERENCE VII

DENTON, TX — Registration for Texas Gay Conference VII will begin next Friday evening, October 17, at La Quinta Motor Inn in Denton, TX, TWT NEWS has learned. Featured at the Denton Civic Center will be Morris Kight, organizer of the Gay Community Services Center of Los Angeles.

Workshop leaders include Susan Caudill of KERA-TV, and politicians from throughout the state in a politicians panel. Workshop topics are Relationships; Coming Out; Gay History; Legal Harassment; Organizing Gaylines; the Far Right Wing; Lesbians and the Feminist Movement; and Feminism for Gay Men.

Advance registration is \$15, due this Saturday, October 11; otherwise it's \$20 at the door. Students are half-price. Registrations or requests for additional information may be mailed to TGC VII, Box A-K, Denton, Texas 76201, or phone (214) 528-9079.

CONGRESSMAN HAS SEX WITH BOY

WASHINGTON, DC — Last March, Congressman Bauman (R—Maryland), approached a 16-year-old boy in the Capitol Hill district and performed oral sodomy on the young lad.

Last week, Bauman, a leading conservative and president of the 200,000 member American Conservative Union,

pleaded innocent to that sex-solicitation charge. In a report made available to TWT NEWS, he was placed in a six-month treatment program for first offenders.

Bauman, 43, a three-term congressman, who is married and has four children, entered the plea in the District of Columbia Superior Court of Judge David Norman.

The official charge was "soliciting for lewd and immoral purposes." He will appear before the court again next April 3 at the conclusion of the program. If his treatment is satisfactory, the charges will be dismissed.

The program will include continuing treatment with an Alcoholics Anonymous program, TWT NEWS has learned.

Bauman attributed his problems to alcoholism, which he said he had overcome in recent months.

MEET THE HGPC CANDIDATES PARTY

HOUSTON — The Gay Political Caucus will present their "Meet the Candidates Party" next Sunday, October 19 at the Houston Guest House, 106 Avondale, between the hours of 2:00 and 6:00pm, reports HGPC Press Liaison Kent Speer to TWT NEWS. There will be food and beer served as you hear and meet the candidates HGPC has endorsed.

"Because of recent victories concerning Gay Rights, it is very important to elect those individuals who will be responsive to our issues. Therefore, if you do not know some of the candidates and their issues, this is your chance to become better informed," said Speer.

As Johnny Peden, member of the Gay Political Caucus Board of Trustees, states: "This is one of the most important political functions a gay man or lesbian can attend; it also combines politics with a good time. We want to encourage everyone in Harris County to attend. Many people have the opinion that the only support we can deliver comes from the Montrose

area, and while this is our largest base, we would like to show the candidates that there are also bases of support outside of Montrose.

OAK LAWN BAND UPDATE

DALLAS — The Oak Lawn Symphonic Band, formerly the Oak Lawn Marching Band, which made its debut at Gay Pride Week is "alive and we are all working to be a group Dallas gays can be proud of," reports President Mike Coll to TWT NEWS.

"Total support from the Dallas gay community is desperately needed," he added. The band needs money, instruments, and new members.

If such support is not forthcoming, the Dallas band may go to the way of the Houston band which recently dissolved. As reported by TWT NEWS last month, the Montrose Marching Band was disbanded because of lack of support. The same sad scenario could happen in Dallas.

The new band meets every Thursday night at 7:00pm. For more information on how to donate money, instruments, or to become a member, call Mike Coll at (214) 526-3197, or contact Carl Mallies of Butler's Pantry Too.

The date of the first concert has yet to be announced, TWT NEWS has learned.

NGTF MOVES TOWARD CARTER ENDORSEMENT

NEW YORK — Historically, the National Gay Task Force has never endorsed any candidate running for elective office. Because feeling this year is most crucial to gays and lesbians, Larry Bagneris, Jr., member of the Executive Committee of NGTF, has challenged the board to poll itself and make a decision.

The decision to support or not support the resolution will be made next Wednesday, October 15. The board, however, has voted to form a Political Action Committee for the first time in its history. ➤

"I learned that the NGTF charter and by-laws allow NGTF to endorse candidates for office," said Bagneris to TWT NEWS. This was revealed in a discussion with the Board of Directors of NGTF September 14.

The resolution, released to TWT NEWS includes four points leading to an endorsement of President Jimmy Carter.

Whereas Jimmy Carter and John Anderson, both supporters of lesbian and gay rights, are candidates for President of the United States, and even though the Carter administration has not met all NGTF expectations, it has opened the doors to the gay and lesbian community in an unprecedented fashion, resulting in more substantive advances for gay rights than under any previous administration.

The political reality is that failure to support Jimmy Carter in this important and close election may lead to a Reagan administration which will be

blatantly hostile to NGTF goals and will not only prevent further gains, but will clearly nullify past accomplishments.

Therefore, it has been resolved that the Board of Directors of NGTF endorses the reelection of President Jimmy Carter.

FIGHT OVER ANTI-GAY LAW

SAN ANTONIO — Homosexuality is under rapid fire again. A law which forbids deviate sexual acts in private between consenting adults of the same sex is in for a "likely fight," reports a government spokesman to TWT NEWS.

If a move is made to repeal the Texas anti-homosexuality law as the State Democratic Convention asked, a battle will be imminent in the legislature, according to a poll of Bexar County candidates.

Candidates Matt Garcia, Frank Madla, Al Brown, Thomas Adkisson,

GAY MAN JUMPS TO HIS DEATH

SAN FRANCISCO — A 29-year-old Veterans Administration clerk, distraught over the imminent loss of his temporary job and the end of an affair with a male lover has jumped 170 feet to his death from the towering, glass-enclosed San Francisco office building where he worked.

A low cry of horror rose, reports Michael Grieg of the *S.F. Chronicle*, from a waiting downtown crowd of onlookers as Thomas McGuire, a supply clerk in the building at 211 Main Street, finally took the fatal leap at 9:40am, from the 14th floor.

McGuire was silhouetted against the jagged opening of glass, which he broke shortly after 6am, while police negotiators tried to talk him out of jumping.

In a three-page handwritten letter to the press, released later by police, the former Navy medical corpsman, attached to the Marines, said "an oversexual drive" and hard drugs led to his suicide decision.

"As a matter of fact my drug usage has only been for the last three years and already I have lost three jobs because of it and even more important to me—a possible long-lasting love relationship," wrote McGuire who had been enrolled in a Palo Alto drug treatment program. "A lasting love relationship has been something I have yearned for the last 10 years of my life and it has never come about..."

Officers Ray Mullane and Vicki Quinn of the police negotiating unit, who noted that the letter had been prepared before the tense drama began, said McGuire told them he was "upset with himself" for starting with drugs again. He had taken the powerful hallucinogen LSD at 5am, he told the

negotiators.

"We thought we were doing pretty good in talking with Mr. McGuire," a shaken Mullane said later. "All of a sudden he told us to 'just leave me alone.' The last thing he said was, 'Fuck it, ... fuck everything!'"

Police held back a surging crowd who tried to get a closer look at the crumpled body in jeans and a checkered shirt before a Fire Department rescue crew draped a cover over him.

All that McGuire himself cared to let anyone know was spelled out in his moving letter to the press, and printed in the *Advocate* and *San Francisco Chronicle*.

"Please print this... in the daily newspaper or *Advocate* (a local gay newspaper) as the last request of a dying man and for the betterment of mankind so that the many others who have my problem may not resort to the same violent ordeal I am about to endure," he wrote.

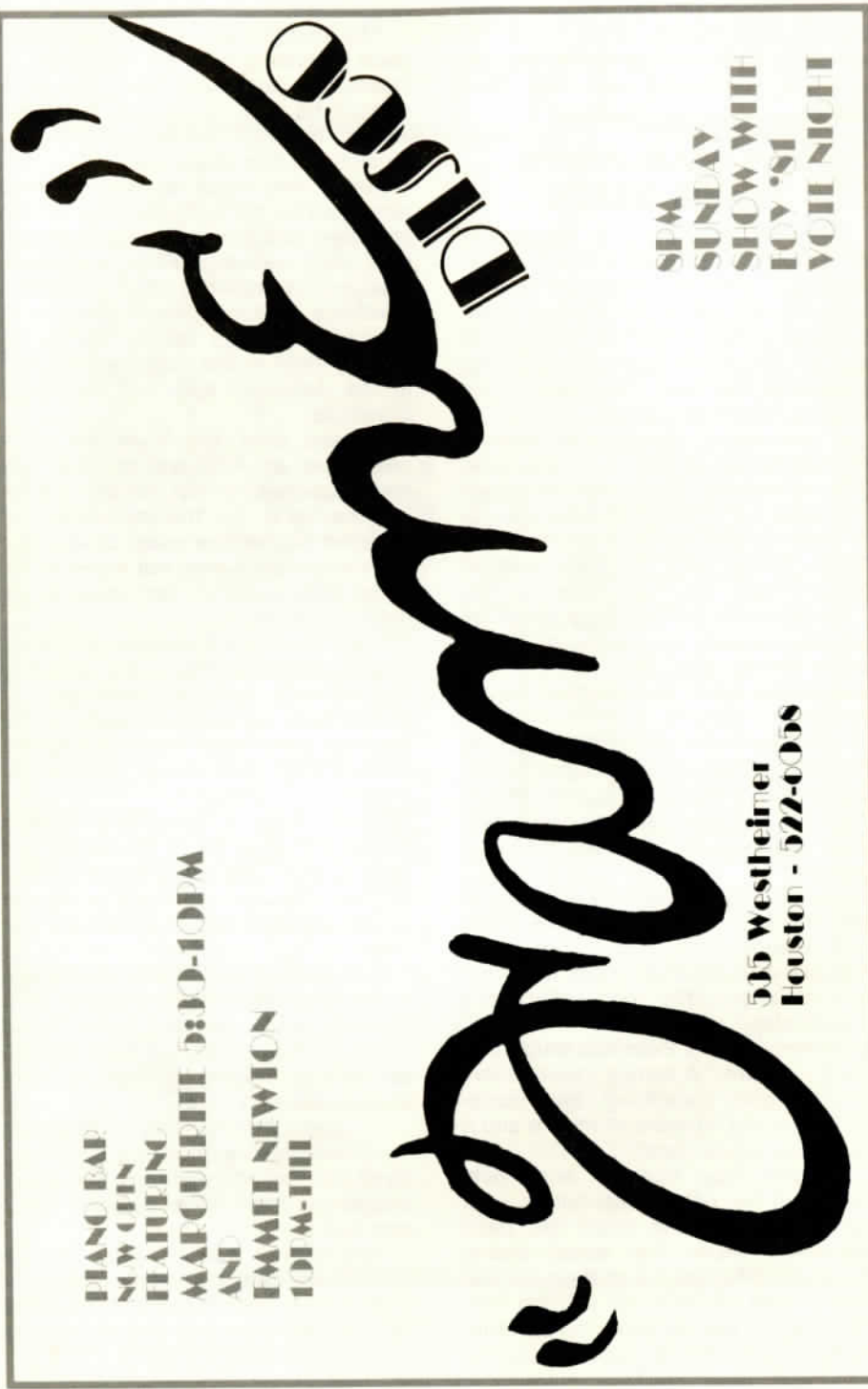
"I am twenty-nine and ever (sic) since I was nineteen or when I first went into the military, I have been gay or homosexual as you wish and my life has been governed more or less by one predominant factor—an oversexual drive."

"Now there is essentially nothing wrong with one being oversexed but there is when one becomes dominated by that drive and especially when one lets drug involvement intervene the way I did."

Ever since a relationship that began in San Diego in 1973 and ended in 1977, McGuire wrote, he had been "using hard core drugs and practically living in bathhouses hoping to find a lover through sex and drugs."

"... I was hoping that I might meet my dreamboy through drugs. I really enjoyed the feeling created by the drugs and sexual intercourse was the best I ever had."

"But when it was all over I was the same lonely person still searching for a lover. I have been playing this routine up until this very day and the results have always been the same..." ▼

Re: false arrest in a T-room in a Dallas Mall, Sept. 26 edition (**TWT**, Vol. 6, No. 27). In the State of Texas, a person not proved guilty (and not pleading *nolo contendere*) can have his arrest record expunged.

Since an arrest record creates suspicion of guilt, it is itself a penalty unless removed. Some employers, probably illegally, ask about "arrest" records, rather than "convictions". Thus one of "Falsely Arrested's" concerns was his arrest record.

He should be advised that if the prosecutor does not prove him guilty, he can remove this arrest from his record. Perhaps this fact will encourage him to defend himself, although it still remains an inconvenience and expense.

Dear TWT:

We regret that the October Colony Art Festival has been we felt that the lack of coop the merchants and property Westheimer from the 100 to necessitated the canceling o preserve the quality of the A



it has become.

Wanting to secure their own artists and keep the profits from rental space on their property along with a percentage of the profits, many of the property owners and shopkeepers kept their own property, cutting into the needed spaces for the more than 350 artists who reserve space from the Colony Association, the non-profit organization that sponsors the festival.

The art festival has successfully been presented two times a year since 1975 with artists submitting photos or slides of their individual art and craft work along with a \$100 entrance fee for booth space rental and \$25 for the registration fee. Following the judging of their work by a panel of impartial judges, the artist is sent the booth space number which he will occupy for the two-day festival. Funds derived from these funds are used to defray the expenses needed to operate what the artists say is the best and biggest outdoor art festival in the country.

The funds are used to pay the required insurance, sanitation, garbage pickup, and the police security needed. We have used the remaining funds to improve the area

which is the opening line in our Westheimer Colony Association By-Laws. We have in the past used the funds for placing trash receptacles in each block from Bagby to Montrose on Westheimer; last year we not only paid for the development and maintenance of the Westheimer Colony Plaza, a park at Bagby and Westheimer, but placed Christmas decorations along the street. This year the proceeds were to be used for a brighter street lighting project.

The association's deadline for the acceptance of artists' registration was September 15 and there was a need for more than 350 spaces for those artists who were coming from Washington, California, Wisconsin, Maine, West Virginia and Florida, as well as Mexico and Canada. In contrast to the previous festivals when the Association had secured as many as 400 spaces from the area merchants, property owners and shopkeepers, the Art Festival sponsors had only received 225 spaces for the Fall Festival.

Hi! My name is Ruth Ravas, also known in Houston as "Mother Ruth".
I work for the City of Houston Health Department as a Health Advisor in the VD Control Program. If you live in Houston or come to visit, you'll find me out in the bars, bookstores, and baths doing VD screening.

The new TWT column will be a regular feature and is going to be one that I hope will help educate all of you about VD and answer your questions. Any questions you may have can be addressed to me at TWT; I'll try my best to answer them all in this new column, however, if you want to have an immediate or individual answer, enclose your phone number and I will give you a call.

All questions and names will be kept confidential, I assure you. All letters addressed to MOTHER SEZ will be forwarded to me by TWT unopened.

Dear Mother:

I'd like to get checked for VD, but I've heard that the city health people work with the police department and give them the names of gays. Is this true?

Out, but in the closet

Dear Out but in:

Medical records are strictly confidential; the police department or no one else can get any information from the Health Department, except with a court order. At the screenings, information is asked primarily because about 20% of the people tested call back for their results. If anyone is infected with VD, then I get in contact with them to insure that they get treatment, so they aren't out spreading it to others. I am the one who keeps the list and everyone else, laboratory, etc., only get the number assigned. Who says you have to be gay because you drink at Mary's or the BRB?

Dear Mother:

Last night a trick I had about two weeks ago said he had been treated for syphilis a couple of days ago. I had a blood test last month and it was OK. Do I need another one?

Feeling Safe in Houston

Dear Feeling Safe:

You not only need another blood test, but it is important that you get some medication. You could be incubating the disease and medications will stop you from coming down with it. By the way, your blood test will be negative or OK if you are incubating the disease.

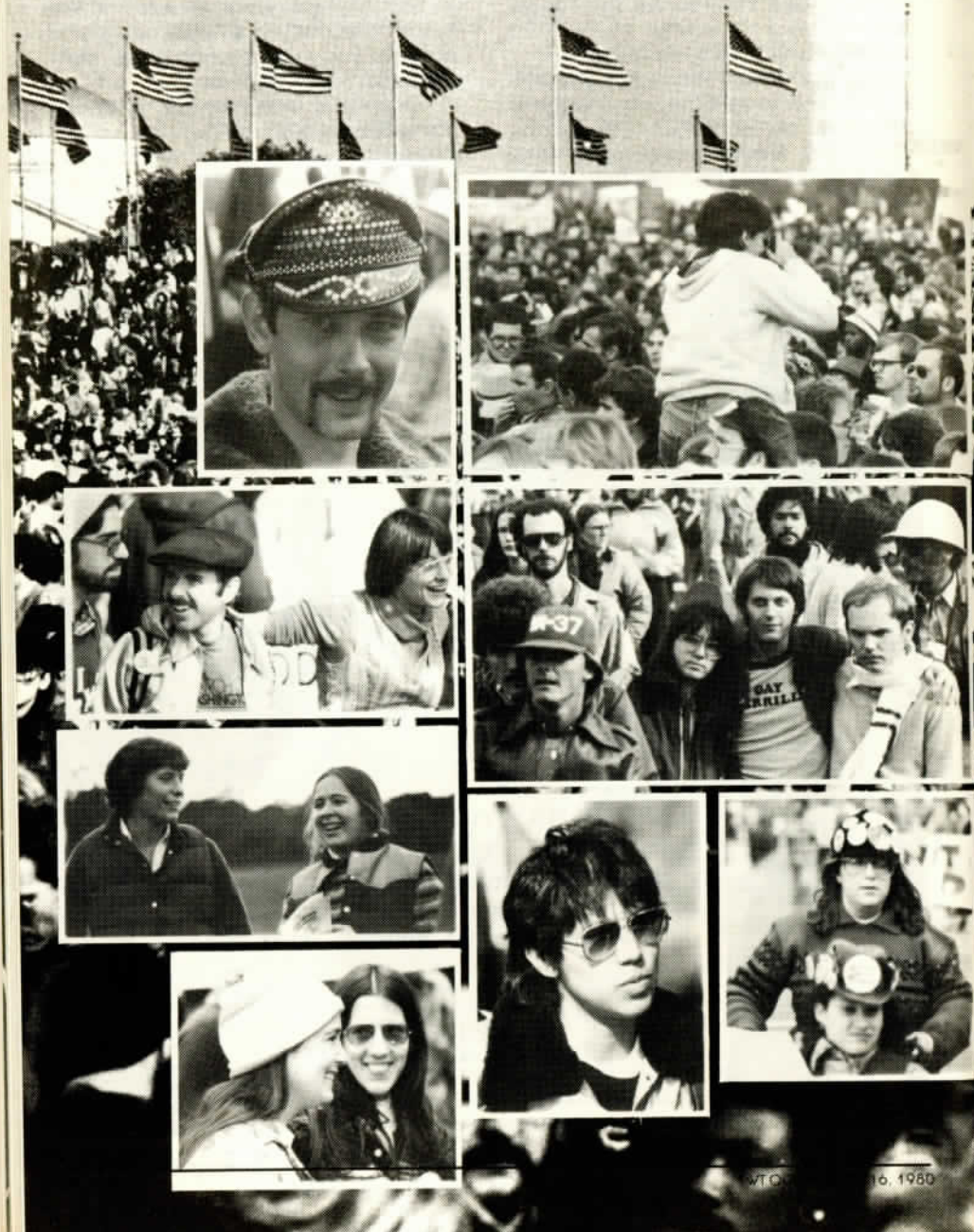

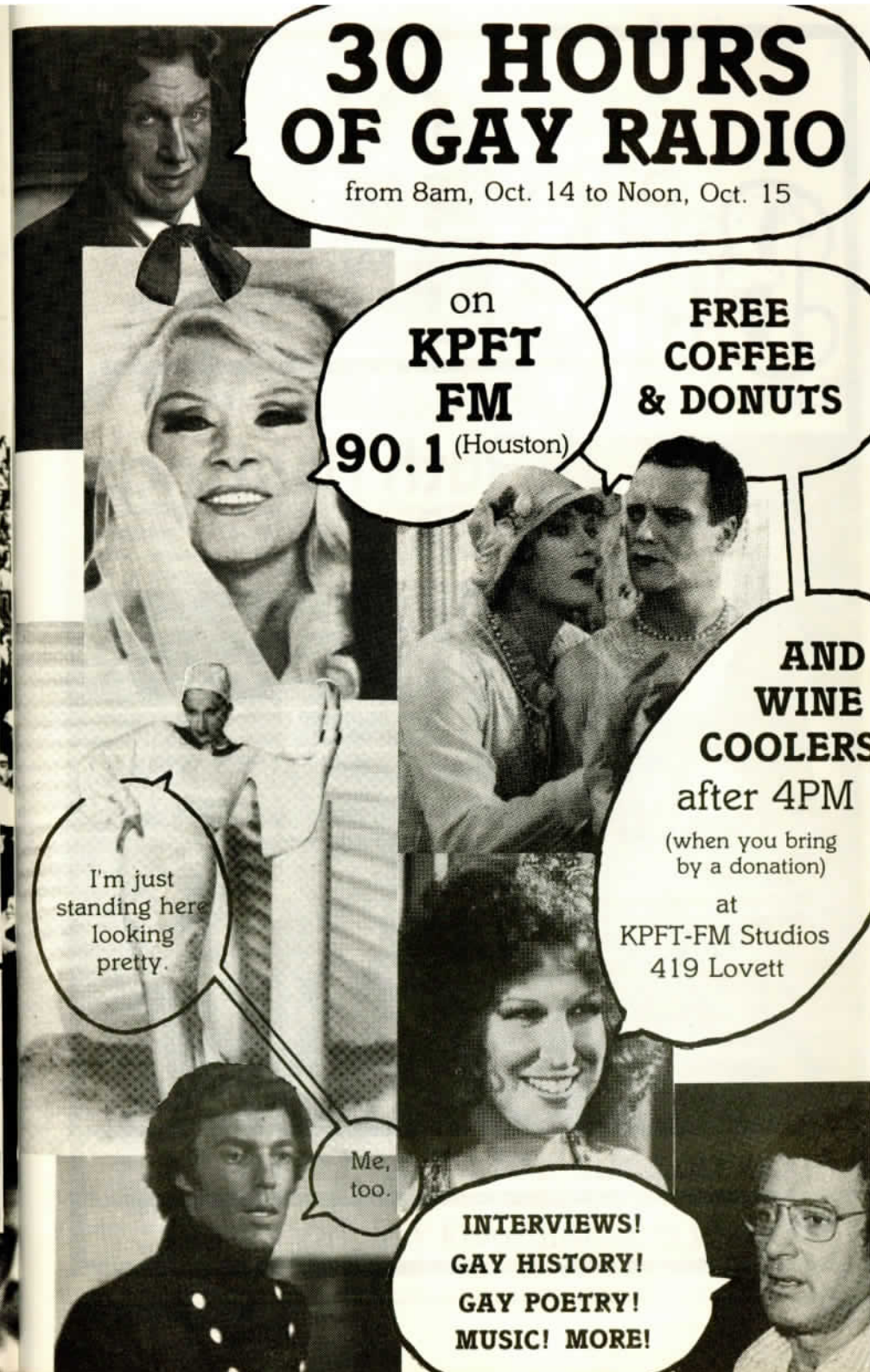

GAY RIGHTS AT TEXAS DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION

AN INTERVIEW
with Barbara Cigainero and Steve Henley

Barbara Cigainero and Steve Henley were the State co-chairs for the Lesbian/Gay Democrats of Texas, and in that position coordinated the successful Gay Civil Rights movement September 26 & 27, 1980 at the Texas Democratic Convention held at Hofheinz Pavillion in Houston.

Kent: Basically, what was the difference between the Convention held in San Antonio this past June and the one we just completed here in Houston?

Barbara: We were better prepared and organized because of our experiences in San Antonio in dealing in the areas of the Platform and Resolution Committees. Also, the focus of the September Convention was State oriented as opposed to national in San Antonio.

In following up, what was, in your opinion, the major accomplishment that came out of the convention?

Steve: The Democratic Party of Texas now has in its Platform a plank on non-discrimination according to the sexual orientation of an individual and calls for the repeal of 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code.

Simply, what was accomplished by this inclusion in the Platform?

It puts the Democratic Party on the line to support Gay Rights and gives us the leverage to work in the legislature for the repeal of 21.06. As far as official party thinking, this sort of Platform plank has never happened before.

If that is the case, was there a problem when it came time for the vote?

First, there was an official motion to accept the Platform. Then a man known to the Chair, Billy Goldberg, questioned whether there was a quorum present. Goldberg ruled that there was a quorum. This ruling was challenged. The voice vote, or challenge, was ruled to have failed and the Chair was sustained. A call for a standing vote confirmed that result. The opposition then called for a roll call vote, but failed to achieve a needed 20% of the delegates to force a roll call. The Chair, Goldberg, then coached the man on the microphone (still!) into offering a motion to delete the "repeal of 21.06" sentence. The Chair failed to rule on the voice on the motion to delete and instead took a standing vote to determine if 20% wanted a roll call vote. This time the opposition was successful.

We did well in most urban districts (notable exceptions: Galveston and Beaumont), and were obliterated in the rural East and West Texas districts. ►

The Chicanos of South Texas and urban Blacks were most supportive. When the vote was taken, we won 1,922 to 1,609 with 32 abstaining. This was almost the same margin we lost by at the San Antonio convention.

This is different from the figures the public received from the *Chronicle*. Why did the paper misrepresent the figures?

I do not know. The reporter evidently was referring to a comment by the opposition speaker and failed to check the facts.

Was the fact that so many delegates were absent during this crucial vote an aid in achieving your victory on the Platform as was suggested by the straight press?

No, that is absolutely incorrect. Everyone pushed for an early vote. Had the vote come early, with the full delegation in attendance, we project we could have by 52 to 55%. But as the Chair delayed we lost just as many of our delegates as did the opposition.

There was even a motion to adjourn because some felt a quorum was not present; when in reality there was more than a quorum present and the motion was made simply so our issue would not be heard.

Is this a more significant victory than was achieved at the National Convention held in New York?

Both are significant. The outcome of the Houston Convention makes a strong case for equal rights for lesbians and gays on the state level. Yet the equal rights plank that came out of New York gives lesbians and gays everywhere a national forum from which to work.

What is the next step in insuring this victory?

To mobilize for the November election, plan an active lobbying effort in Austin, and a major effort to organize a community where Lesbian and Gay Democrats of Texas are not represented (particularly Corpus Christi and Beaumont).

Going back for a moment, not all the support came from Lesbian and Gay Democrats did it?

No.

Can you give us an indication of who or what organizations helped in this victory?

Bob Beckel, State Coordinator for the Carter/Mondale Campaign, Richard Perkins, Secretary of the State Democratic Party, Bob Slagle, newly elected Chairman of the Democratic Party, along with teachers, blacks, hispanics, and individuals of every other caucus. Of course, most of the support came from more urban areas as opposed to the rural sections of the state.

How would you answer the statement of an individual quoted in the Post indicating that such a plank in the State Platform will bring the churches down on the Democratic Party?

The churches are already down on Carter. That is why he is reaching out to us.

Overall, was treatment fair to lesbian and gay delegates aside from the platform fight?

That is hard to answer. The new Party Chair was very fair and helpful. However, Billy Goldberg, the out-going Chair and his staff put up every roadblock possible to keep our issue from coming before the convention.

I appreciate the time you have given me. Do you wish to say anything in closing?

Steve and I feel grateful to be in a leadership position during this time; however, the credit must go to all the delegates and alternates who were members of Lesbian and Gay Democrats of Texas and all those who volunteered to assist during the convention.
