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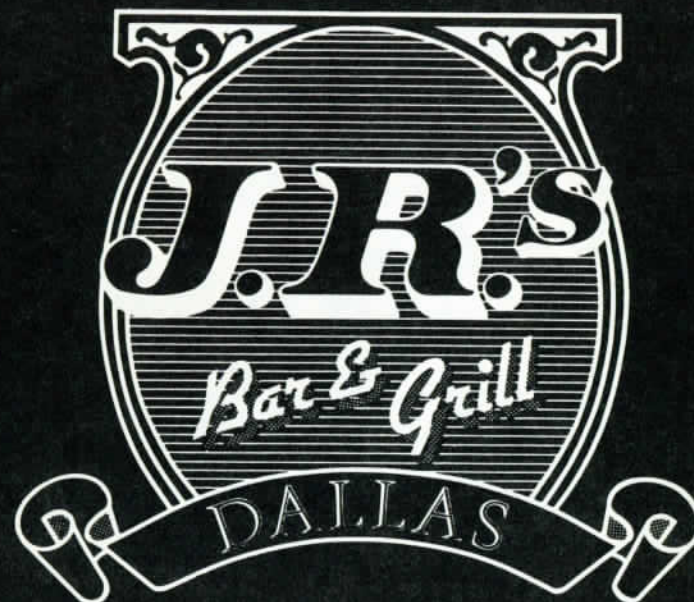
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America deserves better leadership, but we will only get the quality of leadership that we are willing to vote for. Do not waste your vote on the lesser of evils. A strong showing by Anderson, whether he wins or loses will alter the choices we have in the future.

ON THE ECONOMY. Anderson advocates fiscal restraint and the stimulation of American productivity by investment in labor, capital and basic research. Instead of continual dole outs while waiting for a stagnant economy to recover, Anderson advocates what other Western nations with low unemployment have—**intensive government/industry programs to retrain labor.**

Instead of an inflationary consumer tax cut, Anderson advocates **tax credits for businesses** to replace antiquated plants and equipment.

Instead of continuing a 15 year, 20% decline in real dollars of basic scientific research, Anderson advocated increased investment. Anderson understood how the technological spinoffs of the space program created new industries and millions of jobs. **Anderson is the only candidate advocating a revitalized space program.**

ON THE NATIONAL DEFENSE. Anderson advocates a strong political defense, but not the purchase of every fancy weapon proposed. Opposed to the draft, Anderson advocates increased pay to retain our skilled military personnel.

ON THE 50/50 PLAN. 50 cent gasoline tax and a 50% reduction in Social Security taxes. Shunning warnings to conserve our resources, we waited until OPEC made fuel efficient cars competitive. Prices will rise again and make solar power, insulation, mass transit, etc. . . more competitive. Our oil import bill was \$60 billion last year. **The question is, do we wait for OPEC to raise the prices and make conservation and alternative energy competitive, or do we raise our own prices and keep the money in this country?** Under Anderson's plan, if people conserve, the higher cost at the pump would be returned in lower Social Security taxes.

ON CIVIL RIGHTS. Anderson has been a courageous and consistent advocate of every major piece of civil rights legislation in the last twenty-years. Today Anderson, is a co-sponsor of two gay rights bills. When challenged in his 1978 re-election, Anderson defended his support of gay rights. Addressing the National Association of Religious Broadcasters in September of this year, Anderson continued his defense, equating the legitimacy of gay rights with the legitimacy of black civil rights. **Anderson has answered an Executive Order to ban discrimination based on sexual orientation.** A strong supporter of women's issues, Anderson has also pledged to make the ratification of the ERA a strong priority.

On issue after issue, Anderson and Lucey demonstrate their ability and courage. In 1975, independent James B. Longley became Governor of Maine with 40% of the vote. Yet, three days earlier the polls showed Longley with only 13% of the vote. **John Anderson can win if people will vote their conscience for the best candidate.** Have you the courage, like Sissy Farenthold, to vote your conscience.

In 1976, Jimmy Carter asked, "Why not the best?"

Answer that question before your vote out of fear or disgust.

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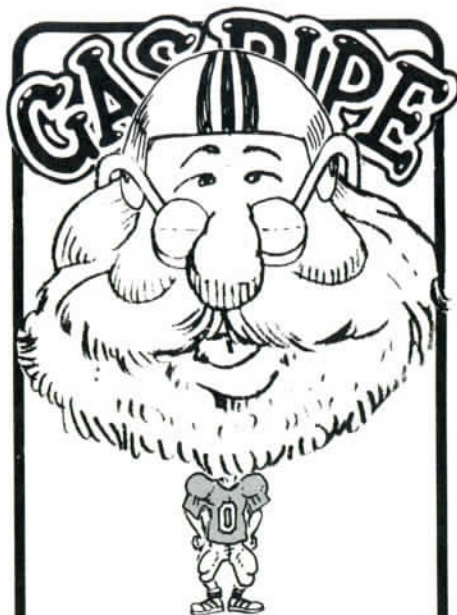

VOTE CARTER SAYS DALLAS/HOUSTON GPCs

President Carter's achievements for gay men and lesbians have been assembled for the gay voter by the Carter campaign and released to TWT NEWS on the eve of the November 4 election.

"I don't think there ought to be any discrimination against a person because of their sexual desires or beliefs," Carter said in an interview with John Chancellor on January 7, 1980, on NBC-TV.

"We must affirm the dignity of all people and the right of each individual to have equal access to and participation in the institutions and services of our society," according to the 1980 Democratic Platform. "All groups must be protected from discrimination based on race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, or sexual orientation. This includes specifically the right of foreign citizens to enter the country. Appropriate legislative and administrative action to achieve these goals should be undertaken."

"President Carter is the first major party Presidential candidate to openly discuss gay and lesbian concerns, including his opposition to improper employment discrimination," a spokesman for the GPCs said.

In reference to Carter's record, the following facts are cited:

President Carter signed into law in 1978 the Civil Service Reform Act

prohibiting discrimination against homosexuals in about 95% of all federal civil service jobs.

Two exempted agencies, the Peace Corps and the Agency for International Development, have ruled that homosexuality is not a bar to overseas employment.

The Justice Department will no longer initiate inquiries with foreign visitors about their sexual orientation or preference.

The Carter Administration has formally adopted a position favoring the repeal of the law barring homosexual aliens from visiting this country.

Gay and lesbian organizations now qualify for exemptions and deductions from federal income taxes.

A Federal Communications Commission rule requires that broadcasters must meet the needs of significant community groups, including gay and lesbian organizations.

Gay and lesbian literature is now allowed in federal prisons.

The CETA program provides funds for workers in gay and lesbian organizations.

WHY IS REAGAN ANTI-GAY?

HOUSTON — Not one gay political organization in Texas or across the nation has endorsed Ronald Reagan for President. Most gay organizations, including the Dallas and Houston GPCs have instead endorsed Carter.

Why not Reagan?

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gay groups is the following statement from *The Voters Guide by Gays*, 1980 edition.

"As Governor of California, Mr. Reagan blocked repeal of the state sodomy law for many years by letting it be known that he would veto any repeal bill that reached his desk.

"He dismissed two of his top aides after he learned that reporters were about to 'expose' them as homosexuals.

"Although he called gays 'sick unfortunates' while Governor, he refrained from any openly anti-gay statements during his 1976 presidential bid.

"During his current Presidential campaign, Mr. Reagan has made few attempts to secure votes from the gay community. He has recently attacked the gay rights movement on the grounds that gays are trying to win an endorsement of their lifestyle by the public at large.

"He has come out against local gay rights laws which, he charges, would

compel employers to hire homosexuals.

"Mr. Reagan has received the support of many anti-gay fundamentalist and New Right leaders for his position on so-called 'morality issues.'"

Reagan's personal attitude toward gays is reflected by the following statement made to the *Los Angeles Times*, January 24, 1980 edition:

"I don't think American society should be asked to accept that homosexuality is a standard which should be held up for acceptance. I just don't believe that, and I'm not going to push for it."

In his own column which he wrote on December 9, 1977, Ronald Reagan made the following statement about homosexuality:

"By and large, Americans seem to have a live-and-let live attitude for those (gay rights militants) who march to another drummer in their personal lives. But try to convert that tolerance into a positive endorsement and you

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run the risk of appearing to threaten the home and family as the central units in American society... (abortion and lesbian rights) deny womanhood."

Because of the aforementioned statements made personally by Reagan and because of his anti-gay track record as Governor of California, neither the Dallas or Houston GPCs have endorsed Reagan for President.

Instead, both endorse Carter!

JOHN ANDERSON PRO-GAY RIGHTS

AUSTIN — Although the Houston and Dallas GPC organizations have officially endorsed the Democratic presidential ticket of Carter/Mondale, there still remains a following in the gay community for John Anderson, the independent candidate. Although the following is small, it is loyal.

The Anderson supporters point to his pro-gay record by saying he has been "a consistent and courageous advocate of every major piece of civil rights legislation in the past twenty years."

He voted for the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Voting Rights Act of 1965, and the Open Housing Bill of 1968.

Anderson supporters point to an interview in **TWT NEWS** this past summer when he said, "What two people do in the privacy of their own home is no business of the government."

John Anderson voted against the MacDonald amendment both in 1977 and 1978. The MacDonald amendment called for the legalization of discrimination against homosexuals.

In his 1978 re-election campaign for Congress, Anderson was attacked for his votes on the MacDonald amendment. John Anderson publicly defended his support for gay and lesbian civil rights.

John Anderson is currently co-sponsoring two pro-gay bills: HR 6303, which would repeal anti-gay clauses in the Immigration laws; and HR 2074, which would extend the civil rights Open Housing Acts to gay men and lesbians.

In September, John Anderson ad-

ressed the Association of National Religious Broadcasters. He criticized attempts by some religious leaders to use political muscle to enforce private morality.

Under question, he defended his support for gay rights declaring that the civil rights of gay Americans are as legitimate as the civil rights of black Americans.

Also under question, he affirmed his pledge to make gay rights a top priority of his administration, saying that under his leadership, the civil rights of all Americans would be the law of the land.

VELTMAN vs VOLERO OVER SMEAR TACTICS

SAN ANTONIO — For the past several months two groups, on opposite sides of the river and holding opposite points of view, have been seeking to purchase the property which is the location of San Antonio Country and the River City Bar and Grill.

Those two groups are the Volero Energy Corporation and the 1122 Corporation, which is owned by Art "Hap" Veltman.

On Tuesday, October 21, Veltman was at long last awarded the property. Within hours after the closing of the property transaction, Veltman was served a temporary restraining order on his businesses.

The petition alleged that Veltman and the 1122 Corporation had allowed patrons of his businesses to engage in such activities as unlawful sexual contact, indecent exposure, unlawful use of drugs, and the use of obscene language.

Volero Energy Corporation officials have requested the two businesses be declared a "public nuisance" and be restricted from continuing to permit alleged conduct that is disruptive to persons living, working, or visiting the area.

Meanwhile, Veltman has filed a counter motion on Valero. "If Valero can't get my property legally, they will turn to other underhanded means,"

Veltman told TWT NEWS.

The outcome of this sad scenario is frightening and has far-reaching implications for all gay businesses, not only in San Antonio, but in the entire State of Texas.

"The bottom line is that Veltman may now own the property and building; but, the city won't let him run his business. He now finally owns it, but won't be allowed to operate it," a spokesman for Veltman said. "Valero is using smear tactics."

The Veltman counter-motion charges that Valero's petition is an attempt "in bad faith" to secure eventual rights to the property owned by Veltman.

"The whole lawsuit is ruthless and a blatant attempt to run me out of business," said Veltman. "I'm going to fight it with everything I've got. It is an underhanded attempt to prevail in a property matter. Valero has long been interested in my property for long-term expansion plans," he added.

Veltman operates San Antonio

Country, the River City Bar and Grill, the Kangaroo Court, Maximillian's, and The Greenhouse restaurants. Veltman told TWT NEWS, "I still plan to open the Bonham Exchange downtown."

A hearing to consider an injunction was to be held October 27 by 45th District Court Judge Carol Haberman.

FRED DAILEY ENDORSED BY HGPC FOR DA

HOUSTON — On election day, the Houston GPC points to a key race; the race for District Attorney is crucial, notes TWT NEWS.

The present DA, John Holmes, must be defeated, expounds the HGPC. That can happen as did Frank Mann's defeat, if the Houston gay community block votes for challenger Fred Dailey, Democrat.

A recent unbiased and factual story by Mike Snyder of the *Houston Chronicle* states that Harris County District

Attorney John B. Holmes, Jr., is not happy over the Fred Paez indictment.

It all stems from speculation that political pressure may have led to that indictment of a Houston police officer in the shooting death of gay rights activist Fred Paez.

After the recent misdemeanor negligent homicide indictment of officer Kevin McCoy, Houston Police Officers Association President Dave Collier said the grand jury action "may be politically motivated" because "the gay community has been active in trying to get an indictment in this case."

The issue surfaced by chance Thursday night, when Collier and Holmes appeared at a board meeting of the Houston chapter of Citizens for Decency Through Law Inc., an anti-pornography group.

The Rev. Albert C. Walling, a leader of the group, was discussing what he termed growing political power among gays here, and pointed to the McCoy indictment—and speculation that pres-

sure from gays prompted it—as a possible example.

Holmes, who had been sitting quietly in the back of the room, interrupted moments later to ask Walling and Collier what evidence they had to support the statement.

Collier said his comment was based on the fact that two gay leaders had testified before the grand jury that indicted McCoy. But that did not satisfy Holmes, who said the two had not testified about evidence in the case.

"That stinkin' indictment," the visibly angry Holmes declared, "was not based on politics."

A few minutes later Holmes apologized, saying he had "overreacted," but that he had "strong feelings" about the matter.

TARRANT COUNTY GPC VOTES

FT WORTH — The newly formed Tarrant County Gay Political Caucus voted in its board of directors and of-



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ficers on September 19, 1980, at the Agape MCC Church on Hemphill.

The members of the board are Lee Moss, Carolyn Amos, Duane Littlefield, Bill Todd, and Carol Hughes. Alternates for the board of directors are Gerald Ford and Twyla Wallace.

Officers of the caucus are President Duane Littlefield, Vice-President Bill Todd, Secretary Twyla Wallace, Treasurer Carolyn Amos, and Parliamentarian Lee Moss.

Regular meetings of the caucus are held at 8:00pm on the Friday after the first Monday of the month, TWT NEWS was informed. Meetings are held at 2336 Hemphill, at Agape MCC in Ft. Worth.

LIBERTARIAN LAUDS GAY RIGHTS RESOLUTION

AUSTIN — David Kelley, Libertarian candidate for State Senate, District 8, issued a statement to supporters, saying in part: "I was pleased to see that the recent State Democratic Conven-

tion adopted a resolution supporting the repeal of Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code. It's about time; the Libertarian Party has always supported the right of gay men and women to engage in sexual activity with partners of their own gender," TWT NEWS has learned.

"It remains to be seen," Kelley continued, "whether any Democrats elected to the legislature this year will have the strength of their newly-found conviction and support legislation to repeal Section 21.06. My Democratic opponent has certainly not come out of the closet on this issue. On the other hand, I and all other Libertarians who are elected will certainly work to repeal 21.06. This will finally recognize the equal right of gay people to their own personal lifestyles."

David Kelley, notes TWT NEWS, is only one of 27 candidates running active campaigns on the Libertarian ticket in Texas. Each of the candidates will appear on the November ballot, along with the Party's Presidential candidate,

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Ed Clark. Ed Clark recently announced that the Libertarian Party had attained ballot status in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

DALLAS GPC ENDORSEMENTS

DALLAS — TWT NEWS has been informed of the following candidate endorsements by the Dallas GPC in the upcoming election, November 4.

In the presidential race, Jimmy Carter has been endorsed, with Walter Mondale endorsed as his running mate.

John Wiley Price has won the endorsement for Precinct 8 Constable. In the 5th District congressional race, Democrat Earl S. Porter has the GPC endorsement.

Caucus endorsements in state races include Railroad Commission candidate Buddy Temple, incumbent state senator Ron Clower, District 8 senate candidate James L. McNeese, and District 16 senate candidate Ron Kessler.

State representative candidates endorsements included unopposed incumbent Sam Hudson, District 33C; Democrat Mary G. Nichols, District 33D; Democrat David Cahn, District 33K; Democrat Christopher Craig, District 33P; and Republican Lee Jackson, District 33Q.

In state judicial races, Democrat Joe B. Humphreys won the endorsement for Place 4 on the 5th District Court of Civil Appeals. The caucus declined to endorse a candidate for state supreme court.

In Dallas County races, the caucus voted no endorsement of sheriff's candidates, but did endorse Jim Tyson for County Commissioner.

Endorsements in Dallas County judicial races included Democrat B.F. (Bill) Coker, 95th civil district court; incumbent Democrat Joan T. Winn, 191st civil district court; Democrat Alan Kazdoy, 302nd family district court; and Democrat Paul Wisdom, 330th family district court.

In the three new county criminal courts, Democrats Rick Danna, Tom

Sands, and Michael Byck were endorsed for the 8th, 9th, and 10th courts, respectively.

Endorsements in other county judicial races included Democrat Joe B. Brown, county court at law No. 2; Democrat Robert C. McGuire, Probate Court No. 1; and Democrat Mary A. Strickland, Precinct 1 justice of the peace.

Incumbent country tax assessor John Childs was endorsed for reelection.

Attention Houston Gays

Dear TWT:

I am very concerned about our participation in the presidential election on November 4. I feel human rights... our rights... have not been so threatened since the era of McCarthyism.

Though a vote for John Anderson as a protest is admirable, the reality is that it could cost us dearly, and although I respect the concerns of some in our community regarding President Carter, and even though he does not meet absolutely every standard I have for a president—there is no question in my mind that he is the choice in this race.

The event made history. It marked the first time that any U.S. President has ever officially recognized a gay leader. Representing the lesbian/gay community, Harrington also was asked to ride in the motorcade into the city.

The facts show that Ronald Reagan is not our friend. In California, he blocked repeal of the sodomy law and he

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dismissed top aides when "exposure" was threatened. More recently, he has made himself beholden to the right-wing, ultra conservative *Moral Majority* and *Christian Voice* groups, and a few weeks ago his homophobia caused him to persuade the ballet company with whom his son performs to issue a statement that none of their performers is a homosexual.

Political reality is that Mr. Reagan will appoint to positions people diametrically opposed to our cause, not people who will just let our issues slide but people who will put into motion laws and processes which will set the entire human rights movement back years.

Carter, on the other hand, has been at work quietly. He relaxed the rules for gays entering the country, favors changing that law altogether, made 95% of civil service jobs legally free of discrimination based on sexual orientation and is working on the remainder, reversed an IRS position under Nixon and Ford which barred tax exemption for gay organizations, and much more . . .

I maintain that if for personal reasons you are unable at this time to stand up for Gay Rights wherever you are, that you

can do so in the voting booth. I ask you to do that on November 4 by voting for all the Republican and Democratic candidates sympathetic to our cause, including Jimmy Carter. You cannot attach a monetary value to our dignity.

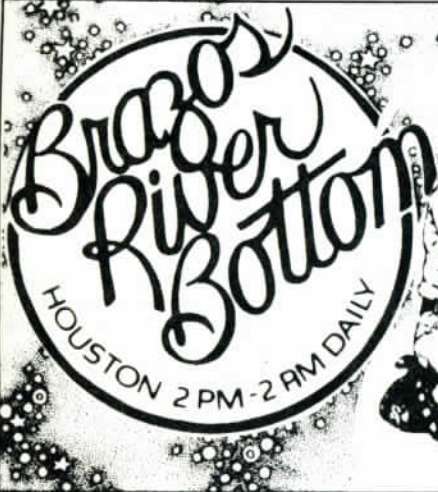

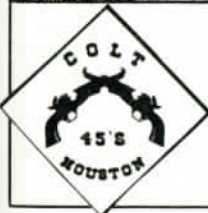

outcome.

Jimmy Carter has a good record on gay rights—with the greatest number of positive actions on gay rights in history:

Just imagine the kinds of communication and support the lesbian/gay organizations would receive from a Reagan administration. Do you think Reagan, supported by right-wing religious fundamentalists, would allow a White House meeting with NGTF? 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A Vote for Justice

Dear TWT:

Not much has been said about an extremely important factor in the upcoming presidential elections—the Supreme Court and its future impact on Gay Rights and Civil Libertarian issues. Cases of this nature will continue to be filed with the high court, and the makeup of this judicial body will have far-reaching consequences on the outcome of such briefs before the Court.

Currently, gay rights issues are generally not heard by these justices because of the number of conservatives who sit on the bench. Four of the justices now sitting were appointed to the Court by President Nixon. All of these men tend to rule conservatively when deciding issues of civil liberties and personal rights.

The startling fact is that the next President will appoint from three to four justices to the nation's highest court. To me, this is the single most important issue of the 1980 Presidential campaign. Should Ronald Reagan win this election, he will fill these vacancies with additional ultra

conservative judges. The Supreme Court will then have a definite anti-homosexual, anti-civil liberties bias for many more years.

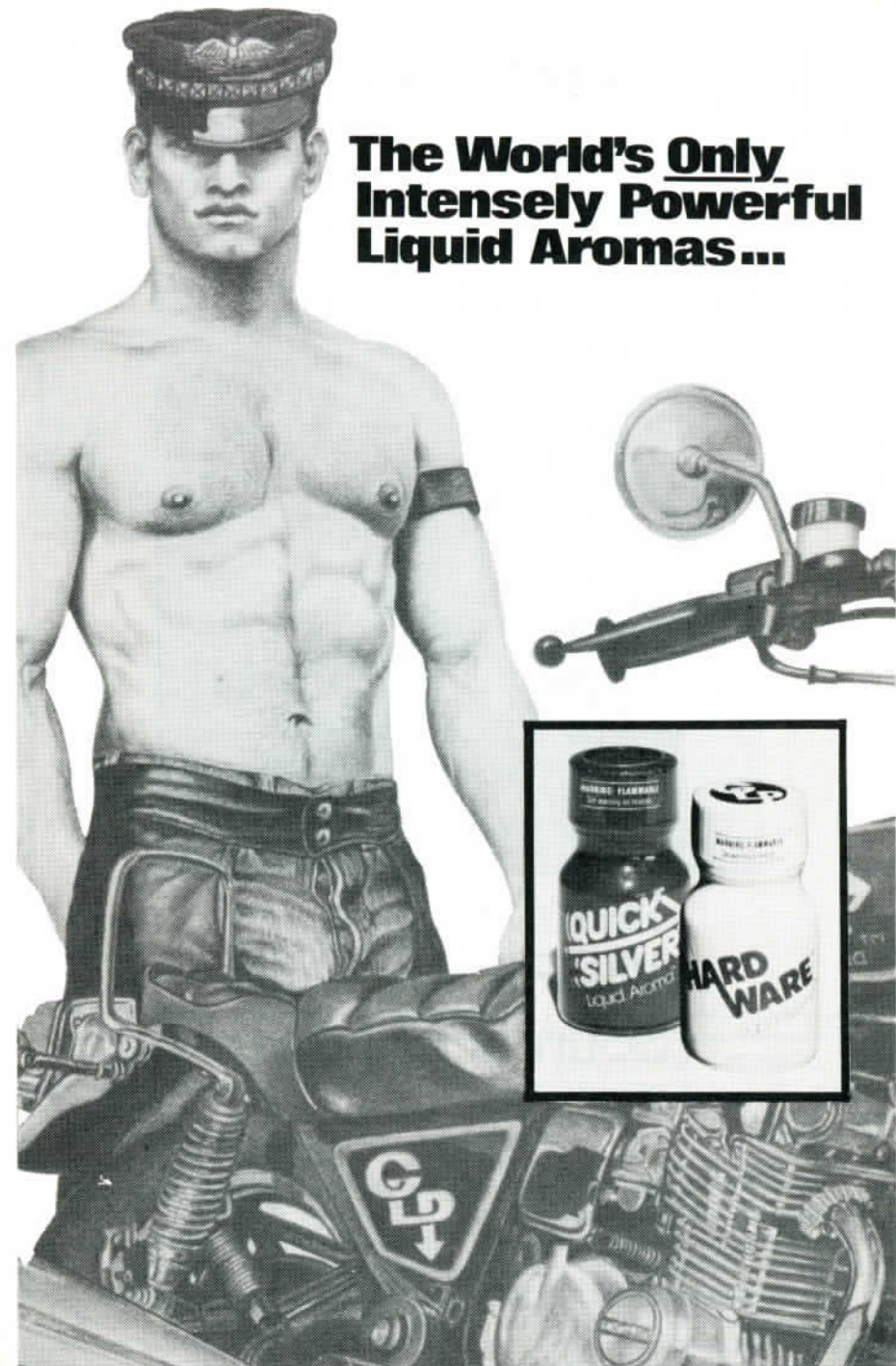

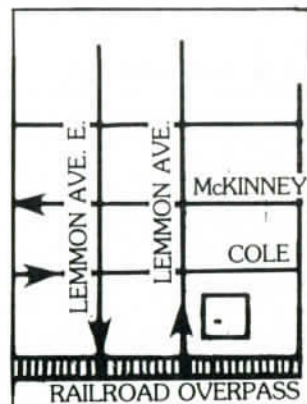

Hi! My name is Ruth Ravas, also known in Houston as "Mother Ruth". I work for the City of Houston Health Department as a Health Advisor in the VD Control Program. If you live in Houston or come to visit, you'll find me out in the bars, bookstores, and baths doing VD screening.

The new TWT column will be a regular feature and is going to be one that I hope will help educate all of you about VD and answer your questions. Any questions you may have can be addressed to me at TWT; I'll try my best to answer them all in this new column, however, if you want to have an immediate or individual answer, enclose your phone number and I will give you a call.

All questions and names will be kept confidential, I assure you. All letters addressed to **MOTHER SEZ** will be forwarded to me by TWT unopened.

Dear Mother:

I have read that there is now a vaccine for hepatitis. Is this vaccine available at the VD clinic?

No Desire to Be Yellow

Dear No Desire:

You are partially correct. A vaccine has been researched and developed for hepatitis B, thanks to the many gay clinics and volunteers throughout the United States. However, the vaccine is not available to the general public at this time. It is expected to be on the market sometime next year.

The vaccine will make you immune to Hepatitis B, also called Serum Hepatitis, only. This is a break-through, as there has

been no effective prevention of Type B previously.

I doubt if the vaccine will be made available at the VD clinic, as the projected cost of the series of injections is \$100. You will be able to get it through a private physician. The series is given at 3-month intervals and there are three injections in a series. The cost seems very high, but it is actually very reasonable, if you consider the cost of getting Hepatitis B (medical costs, lost time at work, etc.).

Remember, there are three kinds of hepatitis. Type A, Type B, and non-A - non-B. So, this vaccine will not prevent you from getting all forms of hepatitis.

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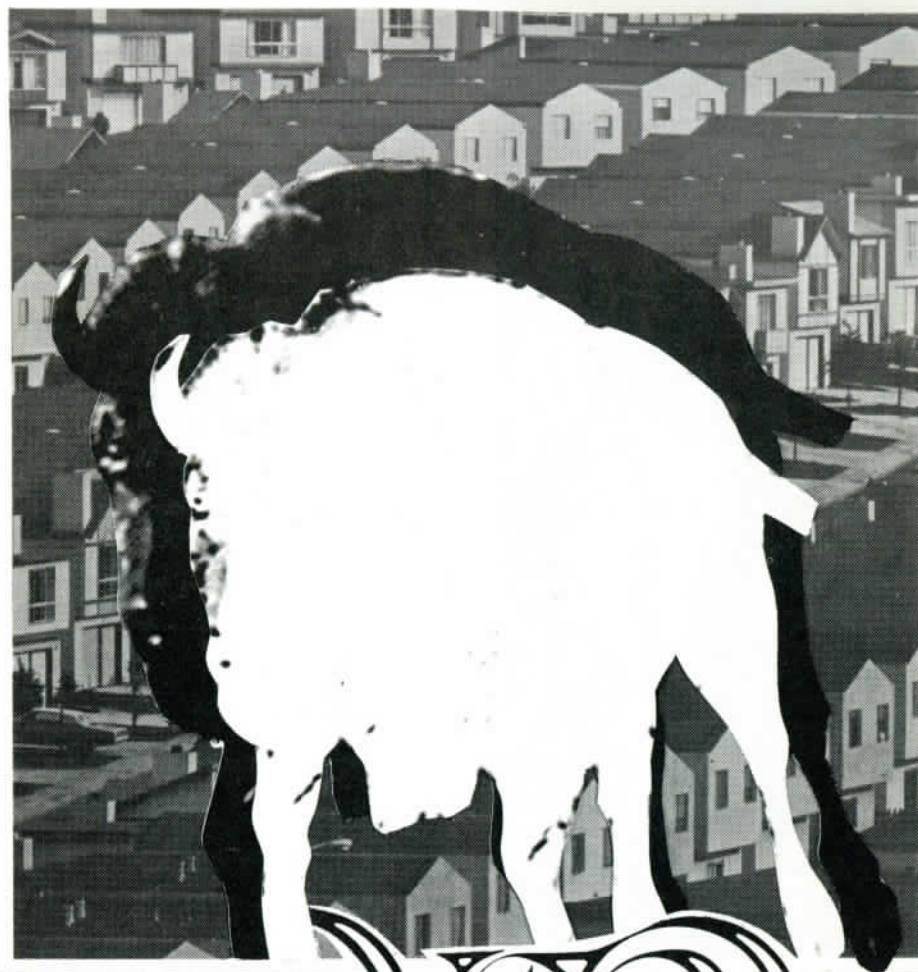

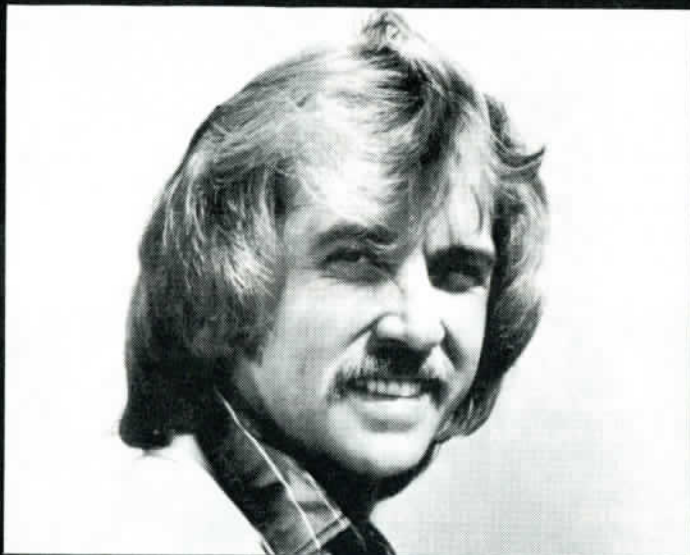

WHO WILL BE ELECTED PRESIDENT?

Can Astrology predict who will win an election? The answer is yes, provided an astrologer knows the exact birthday data of the candidate. This astrologer, the author of TWT's **STARSCOPE** has acquired partial birthday data on the three leading candidates for President in the 1980 general election.

The word partial is used because the exact time of birth is not available from either of the three campaign headquarters. Without exact birth time, an astrologer cannot determine the rising sign which is often referred to as the ascendent.

But, we can erect solar horoscopes by just knowing the birthdays.

Jimmy Carter is a Libra. He was born October 1, 1924.

Ronald Reagan is an Aquarius. He was born February 6, 1911.

John Anderson is also an Aquarian. He was born February 15, 1922.

Both of the Aquarians do not fare as well as the Libran on election day when the Moon will be in Libra.

Astrologically, we can dispose of Anderson quickly as will the public on election day. His planets indicate his chances of being a spoiler are lessening. Thus, Anderson is most likely out of the picture.

We are therefore left with the two

major candidates, Reagan and Carter.

Reagan's planets were stronger in early 1980 when he was winning primaries. His planets are presently not as strong.

Reagan remains an astrological enigma receiving no major aspects to either his natal or progressed Sun.

In fact, the only major factor in the Reagan horoscope on election day is a partially helpful Mars in semi-exile from Sagittarius. It is Mars which causes Reagan to impulsively make statements which he later has to explain.

Reagan is an Aquarius, and on election day there will be no planets in Aquarius. This void of planets in his Sun sign gives us few clues.

Since there are so few clues in the Reagan horoscope, we turn our attention to Carter's horoscope where there are four big clues. Four heavenly bodies. Saturn, Jupiter, Venus, and the Moon. All four will be in his sign on election day. A boost!

Carter's planets were better placed during early 1980 during the primaries when he was so victorious over Kennedy. Kennedy's horoscope looked better one year ago than it did this past summer when he lost the nomination.

Carter's main problem stems from

fiery Mars in Sagittarius in his third house of communication in his solar horoscope. His main problem has obviously been with communication. Mars has increased his inability to communicate with the public. Mars in his third house makes him a poor public speaker. Yet, Mars has made him more outspoken.

Carter's horoscope was at its peak in 1976. Since then, adverse aspects have held him back. However, shortly after his nomination this past summer, his Libra horoscope was drastically changed. On September 22, 1980, restrictive Saturn entered his sign. That is negative. And it was in late September and most of October that Carter was in a restrictive slump in the popularity polls. Blame Saturn's restrictive influence.

But of late, he has been gaining in popularity. Why? Because two positive planets have now turned the tide.

Two favorable planets have entered his Libra picture lately. On October 28, 1980, Jupiter entered Libra and two days later on October 30, Venus also entered Libra. Jupiter brings good luck and Venus brings love.

Therefore, the Carter horoscope this November is two parts good (Venus and Jupiter), and one part bad (Saturn). Slightly more favorable than unfavorable. It is a turn in the tide for Carter. Since October 28-30, when beneficial Jupiter and Venus entered his Libra horoscope, his chances for a slim win become greater. His popularity should continue to increase. The polls show him somewhat improved.

On election day, another plus for Carter occurs. On Tuesday, November 4, the Moon will also be in Libra, his sign. The Moon rules the public. It is the public which votes. A Libra Moon strives for balance. A Libra Moon can bring about a public desire to keep the status quo; to not tip the scales; to not change presidents.

It is generally felt in astrology that when the Moon is in your sign, it is a favorable time for lunar activities.

And, public voting is certainly under the jurisdiction of the ever-changing Moon which changes signs every 2 1/2 days.

1980 places Carter in a similar, but not identical astrological situation. 1980 could repeat 1948 for the Democrats.

Although most astrologers have avoided predicting the close 1980 election for fear of being wrong, **STARSCOPE** takes the plunge.

Carter just may win. Not by much, but enough to hold on to the presidency. If he wins, it will be at the last moment. If he doesn't win, he will certainly come much closer than early November polls indicated.

Speaking Out At City Hall

On Tuesday, October 21, a number of gay people assembled at City Hall to voice their concerns. Some were undoubtedly City Council "regulars". But, for me, (and those with me), it was an introduction to local government in action and a chance to be a part of it.

Other issues came up first: a children's playground, highway problems, garbage pick-up. All those issues were covered in the next day's *Houston Post*. Not surprisingly, the *Post* did not even mention that the majority of the people there were gays, turning out to support calling on our elected officials to address our community's needs and problems.

Disco Grandma touched us all with her warm words about the affection and respect she has for gay people. Kent Naasz, *Lutherans Concerned*, made us remember the March on Washington. Ray Hill delivered a few well-chosen slaps, i.e., criticisms, to the council. Reverend Larsen of MCCR, spoke passionately about violence against gays, perpetrated by "queer bashers" and police. GPC President Lee Harrington reminded the council of gay voting power.

YOU should have been there. And I direct that statement more strongly to lesbians than gay men. Were the women in our community too "separatist" to show up? Are you too busy being "married" to the woman

of your dreams? Where were the women who were busted at The Lampost? Where were the women who were fired from their jobs? Where were the mothers who are fighting to keep their children?

I was the only lesbian speaking before the council. While proud and willing to do that, I felt a little *alone*. I felt a hell of a burden, (and an impossible task), to represent *all* Houston lesbians. But if nobody else shows up... that's what it boils down to.

Following is my statement to the City Council. Next time, it's YOUR turn.

"Some feel that gay rights is a 'moral issue'—I both disagree and agree with them. I am not here to debate whether or not homosexuality is moral under a system of fundamentalist Christianity. I have been under the impression that we live in a country that *separates* church and state.

"Nevertheless, I agree that gay rights is an issue of morality—or, perhaps more accurately, an issue of the *immorality* of prejudice; the *immorality* of denying due process of the law to gay people by making an act of love criminal; the *immorality* of denying gay people their jobs, their children, and, as in the case of Fred Paez, their very lives.

"A stand for gay rights is nothing less than a stand for upholding the constitution: protecting the individual's right to life, liberty, and the

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pursuit of happiness.

"I urge the City Council to take *im-
mediate* action, using your resources
and influence to humanize the police
department, to make it clear that it is
absolutely NOT acceptable to harass,
intimidate, unlawfully arrest and
murder gay Houstonians. It's pretty
sad when the people we pay to pro-
tect us, kill us, and can get away with
it.

"I also urge the City Council to
pass an anti-discrimination ordi-
nance protecting gay people in the
areas of housing, employment, and
public accommodations.

"Such actions would affirm the im-
portance and dignity of the individual
in a democratic and free society.

"As each member of the council
considers these actions, ask yourself
one question, 'What more *basic* right
is there for *any* human being than the
right to love whomever the heart
chooses without penalty?'

"THINK ABOUT THAT!"

So, you couldn't come to City
Council and make your voice heard;
all is not lost! Yes, you have another
chance coming up. (And you're a fool
or worse if you don't take it.) Get out
and VOTE, November 4. A voting
booth is even *safer* than a closet,
folks. And it's a hell of a lot more con-
structive. Involve yourself in at least
one political act in 1980: VOTE!▼
