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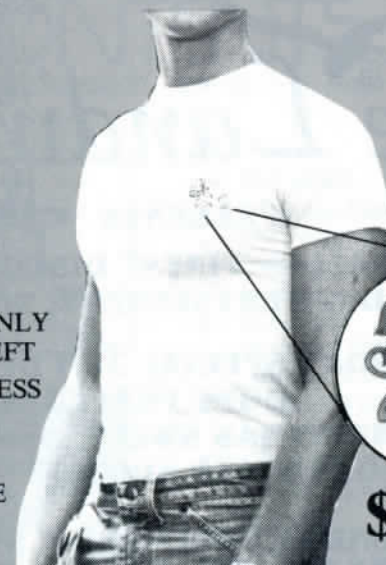

MONTROSE MURDERS MAR THANKSGIVING

HOUSTON — The Thanksgiving holiday was marred by two more slayings and a rash of robberies. The two murders and ten armed robberies all occurred in Montrose and all occurred in a twelve-hour period, notes **TWT NEWS**.

The first homicide was discovered shortly before 11:00am Wednesday, November 26, when the body of Michael Beavers, 30, was found shot in the head in a parking lot outside his apartment.

A witness found the body after hearing a shot. Beavers died in Ben Taub Hospital Thanksgiving, November 27 at 3:10am.

A second witness told police he had seen a car near the scene of the shooting which police say matched the description of a vehicle taken during a robbery of another individual a day earlier.

That same car was believed to have been used in at least one other robbery the same day. The vehicle was discovered late Wednesday in the 1500 block of Castle Court, also in Montrose, near the scene of another robbery whose victim's car was also taken.

The latter car was recovered early Thursday in a jewelry store parking lot in the 4300 block of Main.

The second homicide was discovered around 2:00pm Thanksgiving Day, when the body of Larry Wayne Wiggings, 20, was found by a passerby in the backseat of his car in the 3300 block of Yoakum.

Detectives said the man was shot to death about midnight. He had apparently been robbed. Wiggings had moved to Montrose from Oklahoma.

In addition to the two Thanksgiving Eve murders, ten holdups occurred between noon and midnight at two conve-

nience stores, a fried chicken restaurant, and involved seven individuals.

Of the seven people robbed, two reported their cars stolen, **TWT NEWS** was told.

Although no suspects have been arrested, authorities believe all the offenses were committed by "the same bandits."

Authorities have found similarities between the suspects in all the robberies and in the two homicides. There is a likelihood that the villains are the same two men whom **TWT NEWS** reported several weeks ago of attacking fifteen to twenty homosexuals a night in Montrose.

Earlier descriptions to **TWT NEWS** indicated both men were black, one taller than the other. See **TWT NEWS** (Vol. 6, No. 29).

Outraged citizens of Montrose have called for more protection. Many are carrying their own guns, **TWT NEWS** learned.

UPI ABOLISHES ANTI-GAY POLICY

NEW YORK — It is believed by **TWT NEWS**, that **UPI**, *United Press International*, is the first international news agency to adopt an anti-gay policy. Negotiators have been seeking such a policy since 1974.

As a result of five months of negotiations with the Wire Service Guild, **UPI** has at last adopted a policy of nondiscrimination on the basis of "sexual preference".

In the past, **UPI** would have reported statements thus: "A homosexual man was arrested last night...". Under the new policy, the word "homosexual" would be deleted. Instead, **UPI** would now most likely report the same statement as: "A man was arrested last night for...".

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Although the new policy was not made part of the labor contract itself, proponents were satisfied with the move. "I am personally proud that my colleagues were so supportive of this effort and that another union has taken a strong stand on this issue of human rights," said Dan Carmichael, a member of the Guild's National Executive Committee. Carmichael said his committee will continue to seek inclusion of the policy in the contract's non-discrimination article.

"I believe our victory is the beginning of an effort by labor unions in this country to exhibit greater sensitivity toward the gay men and women in their constituencies," Carmichael said.

LESBIAN MOTHER WINS CUSTODY SUIT

TRENTON, NJ — In a split decision, the New Jersey Appellate Court ruled that two minor children were better off with their "dutiful" mother than their father, whose sexual behavior indicated a "troubled and deviant" personality.

In a report received by TWT NEWS, the landmark ruling said that even though the children may suffer some harassment due to the mother's lesbianism, "this doesn't necessarily detract from the healthy development of the children."

The ruling stated that the children may in fact "emerge better equipped to search out their own standards of right and wrong, better able to perceive that the majority is not always correct in its moral judgments, and better able to understand the importance of confirming their beliefs to the requirements of reason and tested knowledge, not the constraints of currently popular sentiment or prejudice."

GAY PLAYWRITING CONTEST WINNERS

NEW YORK — The Gay Theatre Alliance and The Glines have issued to TWT NEWS the winners of the National

Gay Playwriting Contest.

The winner of the \$250 first prize is Loretta Lotman of Los Angeles for her play, *Thanksgiving*, about a lesbian who visits her family at Thanksgiving one year after coming out to each of them individually.

Yves Lubin, of Queens Village, New York, won the runner-up award of \$100 for his play, *Rising*, about various aspects of the lives of black gay men.

Both plays will be considered for production by The Glines, TWT NEWS was told.

GAYS TESTING FAIRNESS DOCTRINE

WASHINGTON, DC — Remember when electronic evangelist James Robison's Sunday TV program was jerked off the air by WFAA-TV in Dallas because he sermonized against homosexuality?

The program was cancelled because gay rights leaders in Dallas protested to the station and the FCC that Robison should tone down his anti-gay remarks.

A similar situation also developed last December in Charlotte, North Carolina, when fundamentalist Rev. Charles Sustar called homosexuality "an offensive and degrading sin" on his weekly syndicated television program *Flames of Revival* on WSOC-TV in Charlotte. Gay rights leaders there protested to both the station and the FCC, also.

As a result, the station cancelled the paid religious program and replaced it one Sunday morning last March with a response from the gay community. The gay response was offered free by WSOC-TV because the FCC's fairness doctrine stipulates a broadcaster must give equal time to oppositions.

As TV Guide remarked, "A holy war is raging in television and it...has touched off a \$20 million law suit against the station."

Because homosexuals were given free time to "respond to a program the doctrine finds offensive", the ministers



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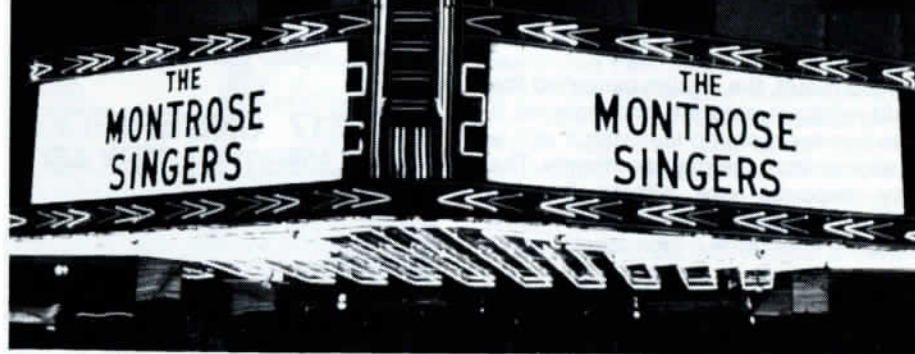

are now demanding the federal government overhaul the fairness doctrine so they too can gain free air time to respond.

"A clash between fundamentalist ministers and gay rights groups could lead to an acid test for the fairness doctrine," concluded *TV Guide*. Obviously,

GAYS WHO VOTED FOR REAGAN

WASHINGTON, DC — Did any homosexuals vote for Ronald Reagan? The answer is, "Yes, of course!"

In spite of a media blitz in most gay publications across the country for homosexuals to vote for Carter, many still voted for Reagan.

In spite of Kennedy's human rights appeal to repressed groups such as blacks, Hispanics, and gays, many still voted Republican.

Why? "They put their pocketbooks ahead of human rights," an observer noted. "Gays are no different than

anyone else. They were as tired of the mess Carter had made in Washington and as tired of inflation as their straight brothers and sisters."

For instance, the all-gay Log Cabin Republican Club in Los Angeles, endorsed Reagan and worked actively for his election. They asserted that "the Reagan camp had begun to actively bid for the vote of the gay people in California. Gay life in San Francisco grew and flourished under Reagan's governorship," they continued.

A story during the campaign in *The Globe* headlined "Gays Back Reagan" and talked of his "ballet-dancing" son, who had appeared on ABC-TV's *20/20* news magazine program, prior to the election.

There were a few gay groups for Reagan, but most were poorly organized. Most gays who voted for Reagan were not as open. Instead, they kept their feelings about their preference to themselves. "We did it secretly," a Republican voter told *TWT NEWS*. "We

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were afraid to tell other gays we weren't voting for Carter because they would want to argue with us and tell us we were anti-gay.

"So like many other voters in America, we simply said we hadn't made up our mind. But, when we got into the privacy of the voting booth, we pulled the lever for Reagan."

But, all of these last-minute votes for Reagan are not all that surprising, notes TWT NEWS. Pollsters had said all along that Reagan's supporters were not extroverts. Reagan has always had a lot of "quiet supporters", even when he ran for Governor of California.

At the moment of decision, election day, Reagan's magnetism, again, quietly drew another victory.

MATLOVICH SETTLEMENT

WASHINGTON, DC — Ex-Sgt. Leonard Matlovich, 37, a decorated Vietnam veteran discharged from the

U.S. Air Force for admitting his homosexuality, has finally settled his court battle with the government.

As reported previously in TWT NEWS (Vol. 6, No. 28), Matlovich won his case on various appeals since his discharge in 1975. The government agreed to end the five-year battle by paying \$160,000 to Matlovich, who in return agreed not to seek further damages or to re-enlist in the service.

In pressing his test case for gay rights, Matlovich had previously said he would try to rejoin the Air Force to serve as an example to other homosexuals serving in the military.

Justice Department lawyers planned to file the negotiated settlement in U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. Patricia Douglass, Matlovich's Washington lawyer said, "I think it's a satisfactory settlement for Mr. Matlovich's part."

The settlement was prompted after U.S. District Judge Gerhard Gesell ruled in Matlovich's favor in his civil rights

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suit in September. Gesell ordered Matlovich reinstated, declaring that "without clear, reasonable regulations" the Air Force could not discharge Matlovich. The standards say homosexuals will be discharged except in "unusual circumstances", but the appeals court said the standard "never defines those circumstances."

"THESE FAGGOTS FROM CUBA"

LOS ANGELES — "These faggots from Cuba," was the recent remark made by U.S. District Judge Andrew Hauk, which could lead to his downfall, TWT NEWS has learned.

Two judges, one of whom is the first openly admitted gay appointed to the California bench, have asked the federal judge to resign because of his anti-homosexual remarks.

Hauk does not deny having said what he did. In fact, he told reporters that he thinks the criticism is "presumptuous and arrogant".

Superior Court Judge Stephen Lachs and Van Nuys Municipal Court Judge Rand Schrader told Hauk in a letter that they were "deeply offended and dismayed" by the remark. They suggested he resign or retract the statement.

Hauk was quoted in the Los Angeles *Daily Journal* as saying, during the sentencing of a Mexican for crossing the border illegally: "I don't know what's happening. We let all these Iranian ignoramous in, but not this man who wants to support his child. And he isn't even a fag, like all these faggots from Cuba we're letting in."

Judge Lachs said that Hauk's comment called into question his impartiality in cases involving homosexuals.

STATE DEPARTMENT HIRES HOMOSEXUAL

MIAMI — The U.S. State Department has hired a gay man as an administrative advisor on Cuban refugees at Fort Chaffee, Arkansas. The man, Joe Fraga, had been a trustee of the Dade

County Coalition for Human Rights and coordinator of the Coalition's Refugee Assistance Program.

TWN reported to TWT NEWS that Fraga "becomes possibly the first openly gay person hired by the State Department to work specifically in an area directly concerning gays."

Reporter Harry R. Losleben said, "State Department officials were impressed with the work Fraga had done since May with the gay Cuban refugees and by the letters of recommendation he received from the social service agencies with which he has worked and coordinated local efforts."

Lines of communication have now been opened, it was observed; "Lines that can be expanded and broadened for the benefit of the entire gay community, locally and nationally."

"ROCKY HORROR" AND "SUPERMAN"

HOUSTON — The Community Coffeehouse has announced its movies for December. TWT NEWS was informed that *Superman* will be shown on December 5, and *The Rocky Horror Picture Show* will be shown December 12. Both films are open to the public and are free of charge. Each will begin at 9:00pm, a spokesperson said.

The Community Coffeehouse is open each Friday night at 3405 Mulberry in Houston. Operating hours are from 7:30pm until midnight. The Coffeehouse is sponsored by Bering Memorial Church and the films and educational programs provided by Integrity/Houston, Inc.

KKK BEATS THE HELL OUT OF GAYS

FONTANA, CALIF. — "We ran across three 'fags' by accident in a roadside rest area restroom and when we were finished with two of the faggots, they aren't good for anybody's use," report three members of the Southern California Ku Klux Klan.

In a press conference, the three Klan



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members bragged about how they tied up two of the gay men and then "stuck tire irons we heated with a blow torch up their asses."

The Klan members claimed that this is "the way real men deal with these disgusting creatures of Satan."

The three Klansmen told their story to a crowd at a Klan rally outside Fontana, California. The rally was organized to encourage political support for their candidate for Congress, Tom Metzger.

HOUSTON TO HOST GAY CONFERENCE

HOUSTON — Labor Day Weekend, September 4-7, 1981, has been selected by the Texas Gay Task Force as the date for Texas Gay Conference VIII. All Texas gays and lesbians and their families and supporters will be invited to participate in the Conference, which is to be held in Houston. This year's conference was held in Denton, Texas,

recalls TWT NEWS.

Like its seven predecessors, Conference VIII is designed to provide information about gay lifestyles and to address and suggest solutions to the special concerns of gays. "The focus of Texas Gay Conference VIII, however, will be on individual possibilities and development, as distinguished from political or other group concerns," a spokesperson explained.

A tentative schedule has been released to TWT NEWS. Friday evening a reception is planned. Saturday's events include remarks of a guest speaker, workshops, a coffeehouse with entertainment, a keynote address, dinner, and more entertainment. Religious services will be held Sunday, to be followed by a fundraising performance. Monday is the annual business meeting.

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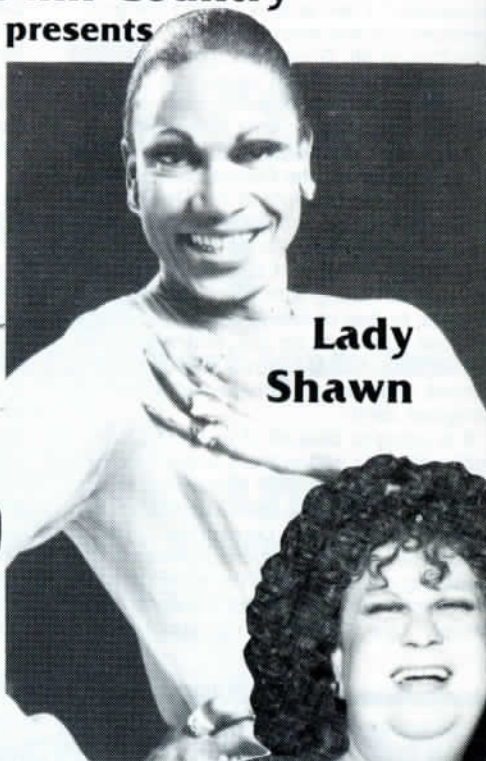
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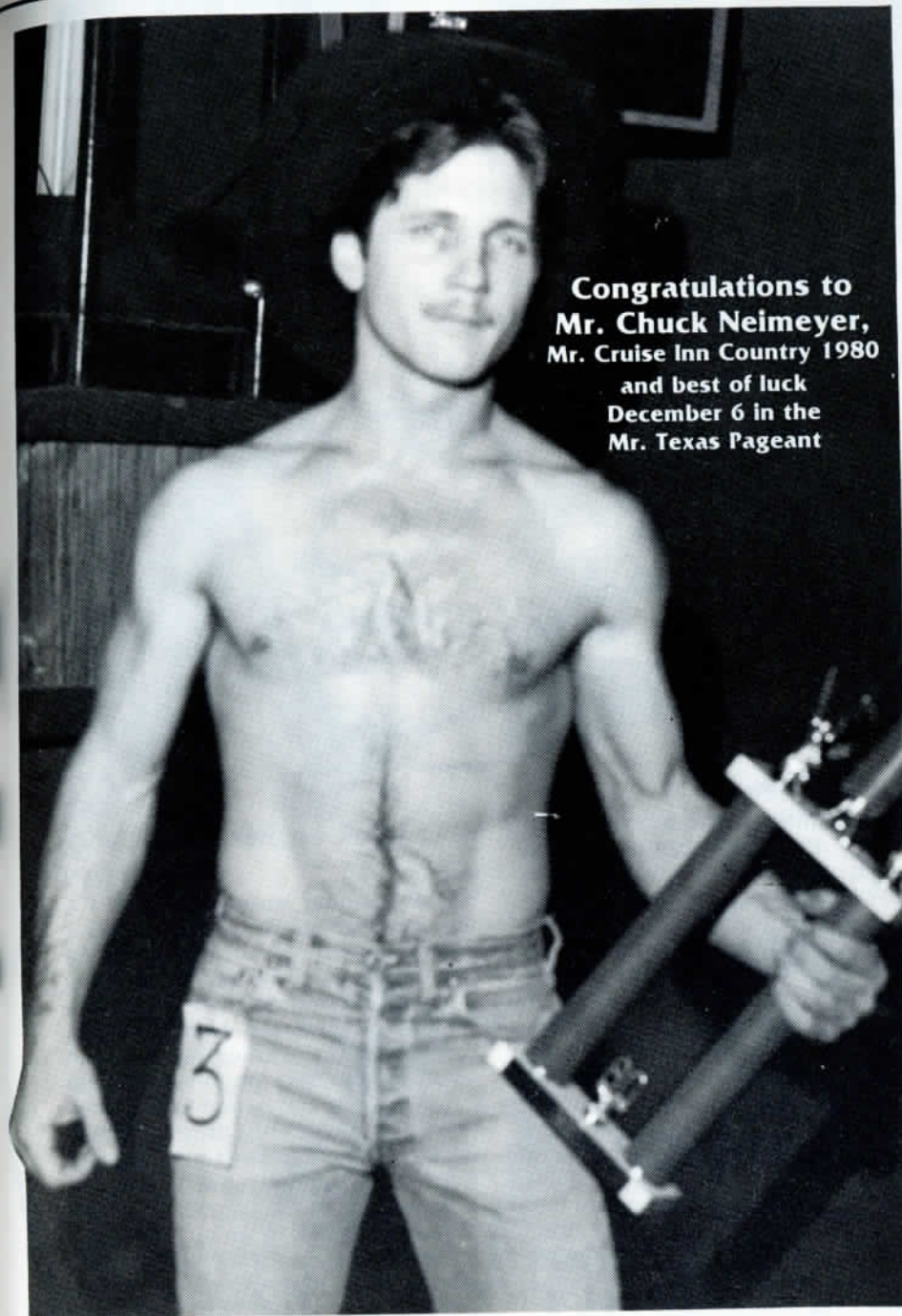

"I'm tired of that. I want to move out here so I can be close to the orange trees. Fresh orange juice every morning. You can't argue that that wouldn't

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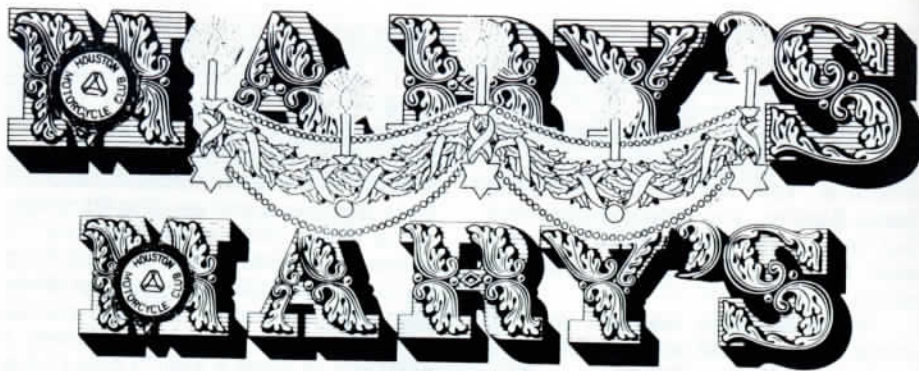

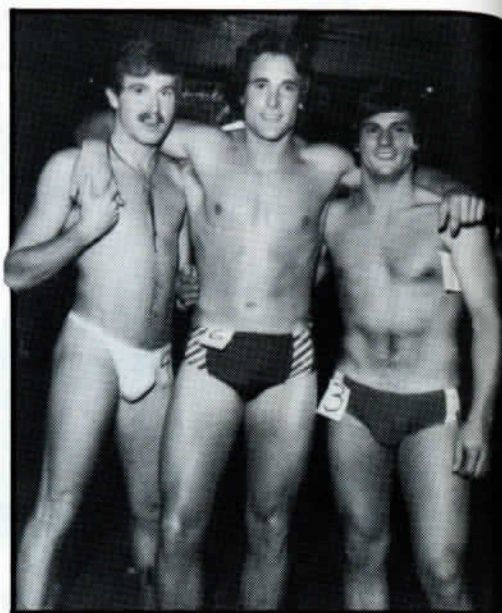
