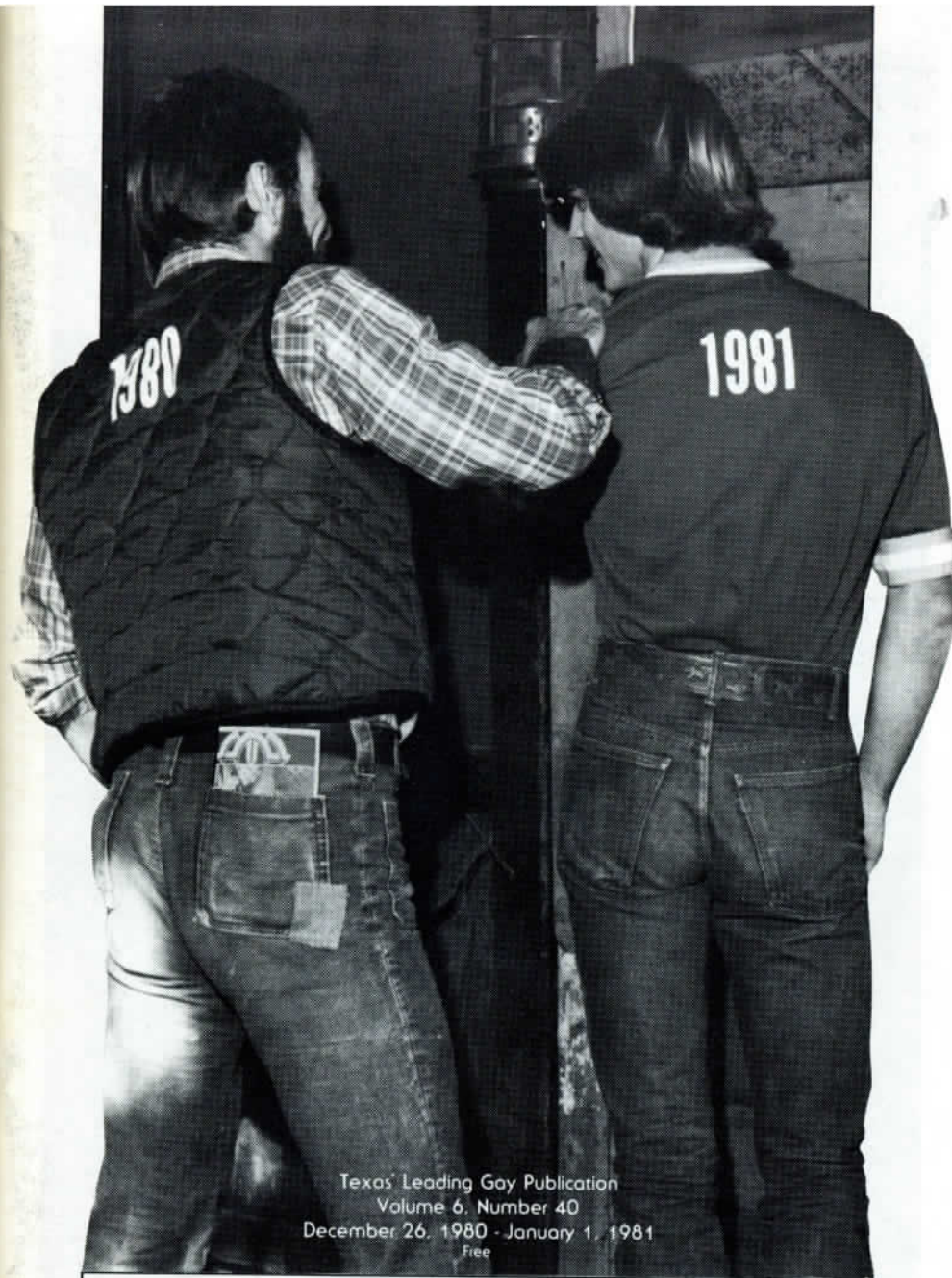

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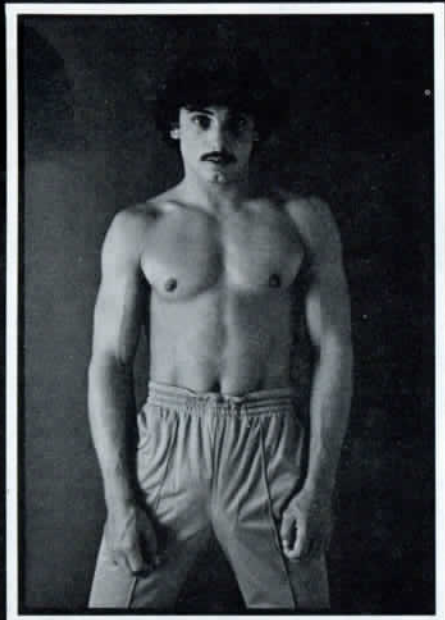

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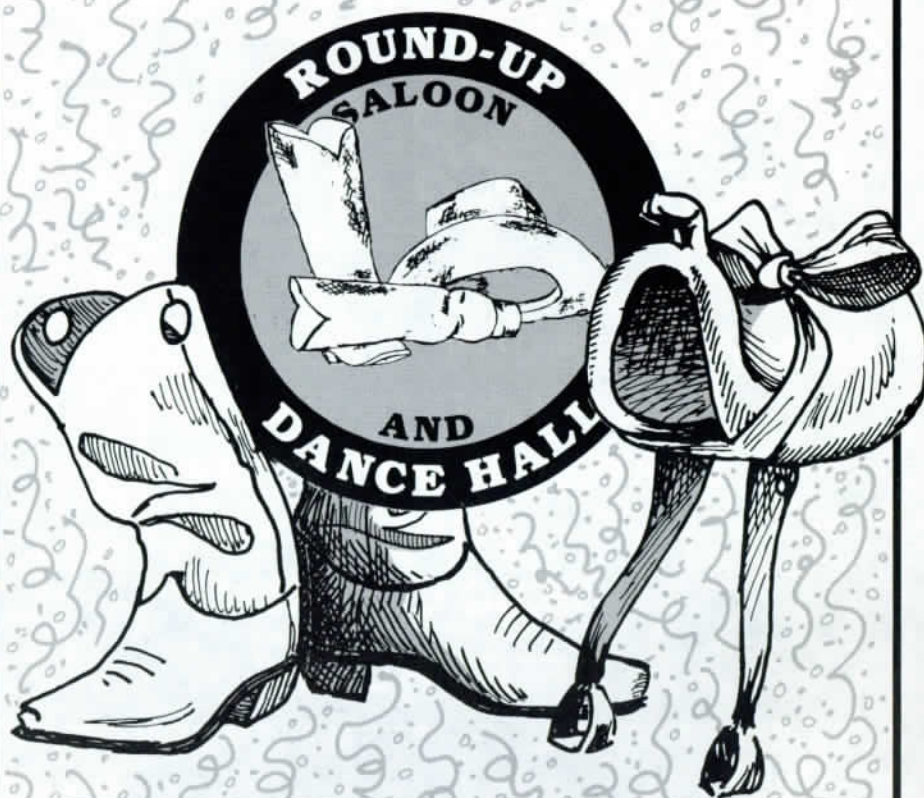

TOP TEN GAY NEWS STORIES OF 1980

This week, TWT reviews THIS YEAR, 1980. These are the top ten news stories of the year as taken from the pages of the past fifty-two issues of TWT. These are the most important news developments of the year as determined by the TWT editorial staff.

The Top Ten News Stories are designed to give you, our readers, a look over the past year before entering the new year. As you read these top news stories of 1980, note they are presented in descending order. The stories were selected on the basis of how they relate and affect the gay life style.

Violence was a key word in 1980, but there were positive notes, also. Yet, from these events, the gay rights movement has again been shocked into increased strength.

Top Story of 1980 HARASSMENT AND VIOLENCE

It is unfortunate that half of the top ten stories of the year are of violence and harassment within the gay community, but without a doubt, TWT NEWS observes that violence has been the most continuous story of the year; on the lips of most, constantly deplored during the preceding twelve months. Nearly every month of 1980 has had its moments of violence, sending a shock wave onto gay shores.

In January, 1980, Dallas police continued to harass customers of gay establishments. Two victims were arrested for public lewdness, another for public intoxication, and a fourth victim for serving liquor to an intoxicated person. Several witnesses told TWT NEWS that none were intoxicated, performing lewd acts or violating the law. Yet, they

spent a nightmare in Dallas City Jail.

On January 9, 1980, Houston police arrested 87 customers at the Old Plantation. Six of the eight bartenders were also taken to the city jail. Some people were even arrested while standing in line waiting to get into the club. A gay rights leader sent a telegram to Police Chief Harry Caldwell accusing him of "being pathologically homophobic."

On January 26 at 1:00am, Houston police and vice officers arrested seven people at Mary's Lounge on trumped up charges of public intoxication. The ACLU was alarmed. The new year was off to a poor start after just one month! February was no better.

On February 11, Dallas Police Officer Danny Cain and Police Chief King were sued for \$20,000 by citizen George Lee on charges of police harassment that had stemmed from an occurrence at the Old Plantation in Dallas in 1978.

On February 12, Houston Police Chief Caldwell resigned in face of great disruptions within his department. He was succeeded by B.K. Johnson. HPD's attitude improved only slightly.

On March 8 at 3:00am, two black males traveling in a car shot a gay male in Montrose. The victim crawled to a nearby apartment where he died.

On March 9 at 9:00pm, another gay male was shot with a pellet gun by two blacks. He lived. The Montrose Patrol noted to TWT NEWS that "violence is occurring with more frequency earlier this year than before."

In Dallas, police harassment had gotten so bad within the Oak Lawn area that a mysterious painter appeared in the middle of the night and painted the words "Stop Police Harassment" on the side of Village Station which had been the site of a midnight raid in October, 1979. The Village Station public lewdness cases dragged on for a full twelve months before the last one was settled in October, 1980. Amid

it all, a judge was accused of forum-shopping.

A 19-year-old gay male was shot and killed while walking from a Dallas disco. His body was tossed into a garbage dumpster in Pike's Park. A witness led police to his murderers, one of whom was Sam Senjeas, a 16-year-old. He was tried as an adult on murder charges in mid-summer. It was becoming a long, hot summer.

On June 20 at 12:05am, Houston police and vice officers arrested 61 persons at Mary's Lounge again. It was the eve of Gay Pride Week and TWT NEWS observed that a similar raid had occurred the previous year on the eve of Town Meeting I. The planned raid was filmed by local TV stations, who had obviously been alerted beforehand. As 1980 ended, ACLU coordinator Sharon Taylor was looking for ten victims of the Mary's summer raid who had their cases either dismissed or found not guilty, to step forward by calling (713) 522-0604, so that the harassment case could be fought!

On June 28, GPC secretary Fred Paez was shot and killed by an off-duty police officer, Kevin McCoy, who claimed the shooting was accidental. The gay community set up an investigating task force and before the year was over, the accused was indicted with a class "C" misdemeanor, which carries only a light sentence if convicted.

On September 25, twelve Houston gay men and women became known as "The Unlucky Dozen". They were falsely arrested on mistaken identity and hauled off to jail where some were beaten, kicked, verbally and physically abused. One victim told TWT NEWS "We were nearly killed." The twelve had been walking from one Montrose bar to another. Several councilpersons were outraged over the senseless incident.

On October 17, it was revealed to TWT NEWS that two black men were mugging an average of twenty people in Montrose, nightly. Police told TWT NEWS that they had few leads and none of the victims were able to identify their assailants.

On November 26, in the time span of twelve hours on Thanksgiving eve, two Montrose men were murdered and seven people robbed. It was suspected that all the incidents were tied to one another.

As 1980 closed, HPD informed TWT NEWS that they had arrested two men in connection with the rash of crime in the Montrose area. HPD stated that they felt the testimony of these men could lead to solving several robberies and to at least two of the recent murders.

News Story #2 FRED PAEZ SHOT AND KILLED

On the eve of Houston's 1980 Gay Pride Week Parade, the gay community was shocked to learn of the shooting death of Frederick William Paez, 27, who had been the office secretary for the Houston GPC.



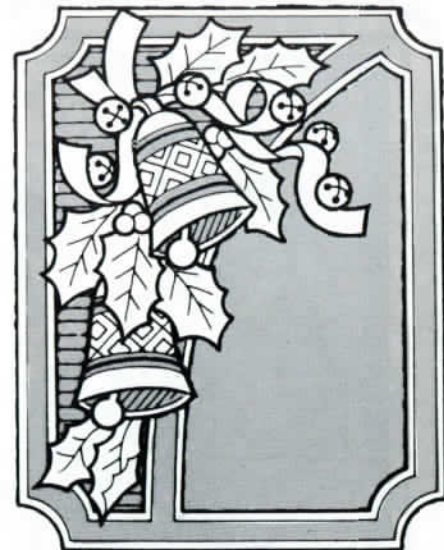
Paez was shot and killed by an off-duty Houston police officer, Kevin McCoy. In September, the shooting was ruled accidental by the Harris County Examiner's Office.

An investigating task force, formed by gays in the Houston area, probed the shooting and pressed City Hall for action to be taken.

Before 1980 ended, Officer McCoy was indicted in the murder. The indictment carries with it the least serious charge of homicide in Texas, a class "C" misdemeanor punishable by one year in jail and/or a \$2,000 fine.

It is the same charge used against two policemen who were given probation sentences in the death of Joe Campos Torres.

The 12-member grand jury heard three days of testimony in the case, in-

News Story #3

JOHN GACY GUILTY OF 33 MURDERS

CHICAGO — Prosecutors called him the "worst of all murderers." His name is John W. Gacy Jr., and he was found guilty last March of murdering thirty-three young men and boys and of taking "indecent liberties with minors, and deviate sexual assaults."

Gacy had stashed most of his victim's bodies in his house through a trap door in the floor. His penalty carries the maximum set by the State of Illinois, noted **TWT NEWS**.

The trial began on February 6 and lasted six weeks. The verdict was delivered by a seven-man, five-woman jury, who deliberated less than two hours. During the reading of his death sentence, Gacy remained "passive and without expression," said reporters.

News Story #4

THE ANITA BRYANT TURNABOUT

MIAMI — In 1980, the world's greatest crusader against gays and the disintegration of the American family, saw her own family unit fall apart before her eyes. On May 22, Anita Bryant filed for divorce from husband Bob Green.



The 20-year marriage was "irretrievably broken," she said. Anita moved with her children to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where she said she was "pushed to the edge of suicide" while being hooked on wine and Valium.

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By November, TWT NEWS observed, she had even changed her mind about gays, saying "I'm more inclined to say live and let live, just don't flaunt it or try to legalize it."

The self-styled religious woman shocked the world with her statements that she had not been faithful to her former husband.

News Story #5

LEONARD MATLOVICH FINALLY WINS

WASHINGTON, DC — Ex-Sgt. Leonard Matlovich, 37, a decorated Vietnam veteran finally won his landmark case against the U.S. Air Force. Matlovich openly admitted his homosexuality and thereby challenged the government's policy on gays in the service.

Matlovich won his case earlier in the year on various appeals since his discharge in 1975. During the past five years, Matlovich and his attorneys had

pressed on with the precedent setting suit. It was a test case.

As 1980 ended, TWT NEWS observed that Justice Department lawyers were planning to file the negotiated settlement in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia.

News Story #6

MAN FIRES ON NYC GAY BARS

NEW YORK — On November 19 in Greenwich Village, Ronald Crumpley, 38, went berserk and began shooting at the doorways on a street lined with gay bars. He fired from his speeding car at pedestrians and bar patrons.

When it was all over, two people were dead and more were seriously injured.

Crumpley is a former Transit policeman and the son of a preacher. A hustler from New Jersey came forward and claimed Crumpley had paid him for sexual favors in the past.

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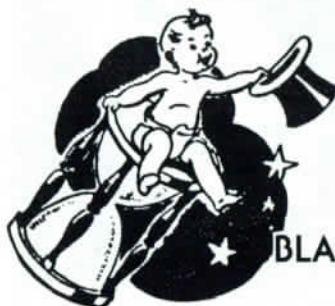

Manhattan's New York State Supreme Court indicted Crumpley and charged him with illegal possession of weapons. He faces a minimum of fifteen years to life in prison on second-degree murder charges.

News Story #7 **WESLEY HILL SHOT AND KILLED**

On April 20, Wesley Hill, manager of the Boot Camp Club in Dallas, was shot and killed while on an outing at Queen's Point on Lake Dallas. His assailant fled the scene in a pickup truck, but was later apprehended and brought to trial.

Eight months later, Mitchell Hill, 20, was found guilty, but received only a light sentence of ten years probation.

News Story #8 **CARTER LETS THE GAY CUBANS IN**

WASHINGTON, DC — One of the most controversial decisions made by President Carter was to allow the Cuban refugees to take asylum in the United States. During 1980, the refugees came by air and sea from their homeland, arriving in Miami and Key West.

They had been "kicked out of the prisons and off the island by Castro. The refugees were Cuba's undesirables," commented a political observer.

What the U.S. Government did not know was that a large percentage of the refugees were gay.

Many of the gay Cuban refugees were relocated to Fort Chafee, Arkansas. Some were to be sent to a military base in San Antonio, but protests kept them out.

The Metropolitan Community Churches from around the country tried to rescue many of the gay refugees and resettle them into communities like Houston, Dallas, San Francisco, New York and Los Angeles. They were successful to an extent.

As 1980 ended, many of the gay refugees had found their place among American gays; but many more were still being held prior to relocation.

The Carter handling of the refugee situation was said to have contributed to his defeat by Ronald Reagan in the November general election.

News Story #9 **GAYS AND THE ELECTIONS**

In both the May primaries and the November general elections, homosexuals in Texas claimed both victory and defeat. Most notable was the defeat of Jimmy Carter in his bid for reelection. Carter had been endorsed by most of the gay political caucuses in Texas.

In the Houston general elections, the HGPC claimed a landslide of endorsed candidates' victories. Sixteen in all! The winners were Mickey Leland, Debra Danburg, Albert Luna, Walter Rankin, Kenneth Pacetti and Mike Driscoll. The major defeat for gays was the unsuccessful bid by Fred Daily to unseat John Holmes for District Attorney.

In the May primaries, Debra Danburg and Peter Armato waged a heated race which divided many gay Houstonians, but Ms. Danburg was the winner. She won the seat vacated by pro-gay Ron Waters, who chose to run for State Senator only to lose by two percentage points to Jack Ogg.

In Austin, the ALGPC claimed victories with all but one of their endorsed candidates. Among the winners were Jimmy Snell, Bill Aleshire, Ann Richards and Guy Herman. The only loss was Mary Jane Bode.

In Dallas, the news on election night was not quite as comforting as only six of twenty-seven pro-gay candidates won. Among the few winners were Jim Mattox, Sam Hudson, John Childs and Jim Tyson.

In February, DGPC-endorsed Richard Medrano was successful in the run-off election for Dallas City Councilman. Also winning was DGPC-endorsed Lee

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Simpson, giving Metroplex gays two important pro-gay seats on City Council.

During 1980 in Houston, Dallas and Austin, the gay bloc vote was heavily felt in many races as gay power in politics was achieved at the polls.

In Fort Worth and San Antonio no formal endorsements of pro-gay candidates were made, but several nominees who campaigned heavily for the gay vote were victorious.

News Story #10 **GAY PRIDE WEEK 1980**

TWT NEWS toiled over the positioning of this story in the Top Ten, but in the end, the final decision was made to place it at the end. Let's end the year on a forward-moving note.

During a violent 1980, there were many positive moments. But, none is ever so emphatic as Gay Pride Week. In both Houston and Dallas, GPW '80 far

surpassed in scope any previous GPW.

Oak Lawn in Dallas presented its first real gay pride parade down Cedar Springs. The second Razzle Dazzle Dallas party was an overwhelming 6,000-strong success. The Carnival and Art Fair were highly attended. And, before GPW '80 in Dallas had ended, many were already making plans for 1981.

In Houston, Montrose presented its second gay parade and this year's version was 2 miles long. Fireworks and a rally climaxed the week's events at Spott's Park. Billboards proclaiming "Proud To Be" were put up around the city and remained for two months after during which time the gay community was still recovering from the shock of the Paez shooting. Many wore black arm bands in memory at the parade; but regardless, throughout all of 1980, whether in defeat or in victory, whether in moments of happiness or in moments of despair, we remained "Proud To Be". ▼

What a year!

Iran crisis, Afghanistan crisis. Major recession. Volcano goes bunkers out west. Texas sweating under record heat. Miami blacks get mad.

Troubles all around. And not one single force to blame it on.

People plagued by prices going through the roof, unemployment in the millions, injustice against minorities; blacks, Mexicans, Cubans, Hispanics altogether. And then there are those guys who still

dare to speak up! Trouble all around....

Iran, Afghanistan, Mount St. Helens. It seems there's not much that can be done, except to wait and watch what happens next. What should be done about the increasing unrest by blacks in several areas of the country? The higher-ups' attitude is, it seems, to give them another token cabinet member and if that doesn't satisfy 'em, give them a bundle of dollars, not enough to get by on, just enough for the claim: "You

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can't say we didn't do anything for you."

And the gay issue? Leave it as it is. Those people are needed. Everybody wants someone to look down on. In Nazi concentration camps the Jewish inmates, for that purpose, had the Pink Triangles whom even the dreaded SS considered still one step below the Jews. And to the low-income worker or unemployed here, there is always the knowledge that no matter in what poor shape he or she is, there is always a group that is basically worse off and hated more: gays. They need this bunch of outsiders to maintain their sanity and self-respect.

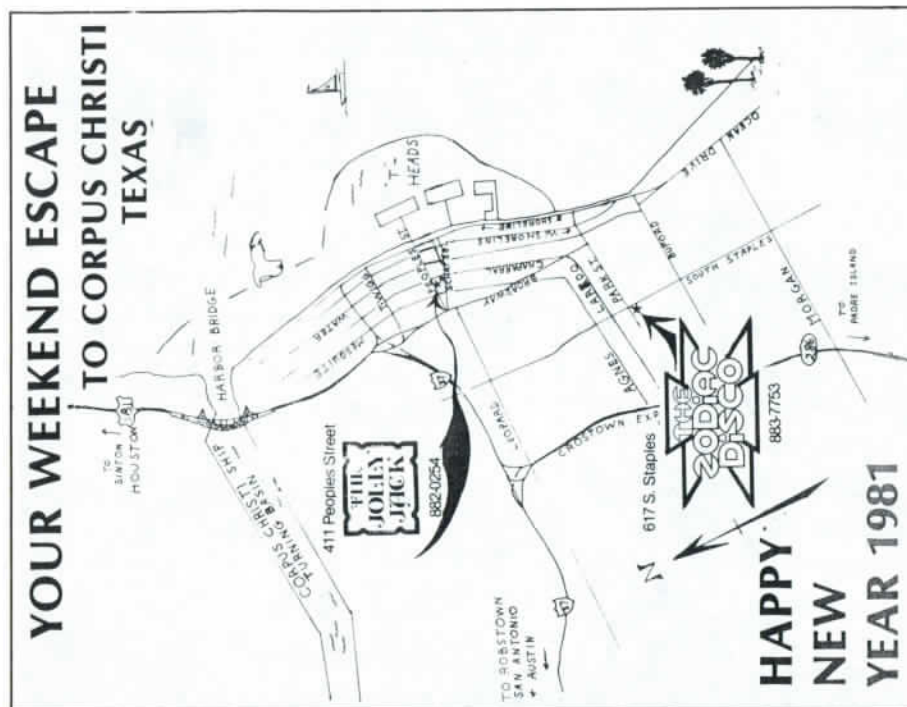
The harshest insult for an eleven-year-old is to say he's a faggot. Gays have got to realize one thing: If they were all of a sudden loved and respected, what suitable derogatory term that might apply to all human colors and sizes could the poor little kids possibly come up with???

There are indeed some mighty fine

reasons why the media, for instance, has this tendency not to report somewhat accurate "attendance" figures for a gay parade or demonstration. The numbers usually reported represent about 25% of the actual turnout. Or the press chooses not to cover such events at all. Crime against gays has never been a hot newspaper item. Gay mass murderers (see the Gacy case) sell better.

I tend to believe that the media does not do this to annoy the group as such. It is rather that they have long ago detected how much society needs to see homosexuals portrayed in a somewhat negative way.

Writers and reporters generally agree that the word that describes them best is "bizarre" (prime example CBS' low-hitting docu-drama *Gay Power*—*Gay Politics* last April); in addition, they simply don't want to confuse Mr. Average Straight America by stating that gays are really everywhere and not just in the more tradi-



tional professions of hair cutters, interior decorators and waiters. The golden rule in the media business appears to be that one positive story on this subject should trigger at least five others focusing on aspects of the gay life style or, preferably, its subculture, that are presented as being "truly disgusting" (again, this was done convincingly in *GP-GP*). This kind of reporting evidently helps society find an ideal scapegoat to blame its various ills on.

The past year has seen other forces who try their damndest to do just the same, mainly the Moral Majority clowns. One of the fellows who had the questioned benefit of their undivided support, the ultra-conservative Congressman Robert Bauman (R. Maryland), a fierce gay rights opponent, had bad luck and got caught having "lewd and immoral contact" with a 16-year-old boy.

Another major moral apostle also lost face completely in the last twelve

months: Anita Bigot split up with Mr. Hypocrite himself, Bob Green—maybe that's a first step toward saving their children. Anita has meanwhile come out with horror stories of how miserable and frustrating her married life has actually been.

A third example of how the Right has helped to produce some people who are just as dangerous as they are obnoxious is the case of this minister's son & ex-policeman (what a coincidence!) who went on a shooting spree in NYC this past November, machine-gunning men in and outside Greenwich Village leather bars (killing two, injuring half a dozen). His rage and sudden determination "to do away with them all" was probably ignited by various factors such as watching Falwell's *Gospel Hour* too often, having sensed what *Cruising* was all about (remember Hollywood's ugliest creation of the year?), and his own clergy/cop background; in addition, it was rumored by New York's

"You could earn up to \$3,100 extra cash."

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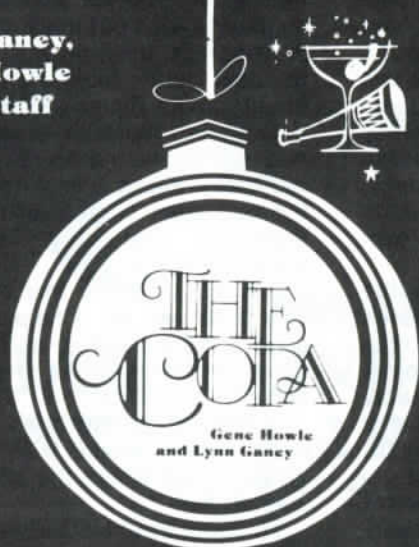

1980, THE YEAR FOR GAY SPORTS

1980 will be remembered as the year for gay sports—the year when the gay athlete and gay sports competition emerged beyond the tennis courts. In 1980, gay sports grew and blossomed more than any previous year in gay Texas history, summarizes **TWT SPORTS**.

In June of 1980, the annual Gay Pride Week softball game was played between the Houston Police Department and the Montrose Sports Association. For the second consecutive year, HPD beat MSA in a shut-out, 22-0. This year, the Houston Fire Department joined the GPW athletic encounter and also won, 15-6. Maybe next year?

During the long hot summer in Dallas, sports took to the air-conditioned inside atmosphere for a backgammon tournament at The Conference Room. Mike Williamson was the ace, as reported by **TWT SPORTS**.

In July, the MSA Softball League concluded regular season play. At the championship play-offs, The Galleon came from behind to beat The Parade, 2 out of 3 games, and win the city title. The final standings were: 1) Galleon; 2) Parade; 3) Briar Patch; 4) The Copa; 5) The Brazos River Bottom; and 6) The Tavern Guild. Arthur Castillo was voted most valuable player.

The Galleon softball team then journeyed to Los Angeles for the Gay World Series, but returned in defeat. The final standings in the World Series were: 1) Los Angeles; 2) Boston; 3) Milwaukee; 4) Houston's Galleon; 5) Chicago; 6) Minneapolis-St. Paul; 7) NYC; 8) San Francisco; and 9) Toronto. It was the third consecutive win for Los Angeles.

Joggers were an integral part of the gay sports year as the Gay Joggers Association of Houston began running through Memorial Park. Several Texas joggers journeyed to San Francisco for Gayrun '80. At its conclusion, plans were announced for a Gay Olympics in the summer of '82.

During July, the Dallas Volleyball Tournament was held in Turtle Creek Park. Division A winners were the West End Stars of Houston, with the "A" Team of Dallas placing as

runner-ups. Division B winners were from San Antonio and the Dallas Sorte Sisters were the runner-ups.

At the summer MSA Volleyball Tournament at Houston's Recreation Center, the Division A champs were the Houston West End Stars, followed by the Houston Bolts and Dallas One. The Division B champs were the Dallas SSS Team, followed by the Houston Misfits and Austin Rainbow Works.

At the Austin Volleyball Tournament in Duncan Park in September, the Houston West End Stars were again the winners in Division AA over the Dallas Red Hots. In Division A, Austin's Private Cellar beat the Houston Hawks. In Division B, Mary Ellen's beat The Crew, both of San Antonio.

At the San Antonio annual Volleyball Tournament held in San Pedro Park, the Houston West End Stars captured first place, followed by the Dallas Red Hots and Sunset Boulevard of San Antonio. In Division B, Tex's Colorado Street Bar was the victor, followed by Mary Ellen's and The Crew of San Antonio.

In August, the intra-city San Antonio volleyball action completed regular season play with Sunset Boulevard winning the championship of the bar's summer skirmish. The Crew captured second place honors, and Mary Ellen's came in third.

In August, the MSA Summer Bowling League ended regular weekly action and the final results released to **TWT SPORTS** gave the bowling championship to Versatile 5, with a 32 win - 16 loss record for the season. Second place went to Ladies and Tramps, 31-17; 5 Easy Pieces, 30-18, third place; Five Card Studs, 29-19, came in fourth; and Spare Balls, 29-19, placed fifth. The MSA Winter League began action on September 8.

In Dallas, the Metroplex Young Adults held a bowling night at the Cotton Bowling Lanes, and Spare Parts won the series, followed by Pin Me Downs and Space Queens. By December, Dallas had formed its first gay bowling league with regular weekly action.
