THE MYSTERY OF IRMA VEP

The Alley Theatre in Houston
Presents Charles Ludlam's
Outrageous Vaudeville Spoof

Anyone who has ever needed to pull a fast costume change—be it from lunch hour workout clothes back to business suit, from evening wear to swimsuit in the Miss Texas Pageant, or simply the morning ritual from birthday suit to conservative office attire when you've overslept by half an hour—can appreciate the technical complexity of the current production of Houston's Alley Theatre, *The Mystery of Irma Vep*. Billed as a "hilarious quick-change farce," the play features Alley Company members Jeffrey Bean and John Felch, who create dual male and female roles in a fast-paced frenzy that would exhaust a hyperactive Chihuahua!

The script, by the late Charles Ludlam, founder of the popular New York acting company The Theatre of the Ridiculous, places its characters in a vaudeville-like setting as they deliver rapid-fire puns and double-entendres that spark the audience to chuckle and/or groan with sheer delight. As the curtain rises (a first for the Alley as set designer Jeff Cowie has erected an elaborate Gothic proscenium), we find the towering matron Jane Twisden (Felch in campy, drab, gender-bending apparel) attending to her duties as the housekeeper of Mandecrest on the moors. Content with her dusting, she frequently eyes with affection the portrait of Lady Irma Vep, deceased dame of the estate, but is interrupted by frequent gusts of wind and inter-

mittent thunder and lightning.

The creepy stable-keeper, Nicodemus (Bean), enters, limping awkwardly on his wooden leg, to discuss preparations for the arrival of Lady Enid Hillcrest, the new wife of Lord Edgar Hillcrest, the master of Mandecrest. As Jane dodges Nicodemus' playful advances, the loyal employee of the late mistress professes her disdain for the tasteless Lady Enid, a former actress of the stage, a profession held in low regard in those days.

After Nicodemus exits, Lady Enid (Bean) arrives in a long, red bugle-beaded gown and ghostly blonde locks. Sensing her attendant's dislike for her, Lady Enid discusses their icy relationship with Jane, who divulges Lord Edgar's undying love for his deceased wife. When Jane leaves the room, the handsome and dapper Lord (Felch, who makes a much more attractive man!) quickly enters to be with his bride. Enid demands that he prove his love for her by removing the portrait of his former wife from the mantle.

Lord Edgar orders Nicodemus to execute the deed, over the objections of Jane. All hell breaks loose after the portrait is replaced with that of Lady Enid and the eternal flame which illuminated the image of Irma Vep is extinguished. Jane later horrifies her new mistress with lurid tales of the late Irma Vep, who kept a pet wolf named Victor. We also learn that she bore

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Wolf howls accompany the rise of the Full Moon, and Nicodemus is suspected of being a werewolf. Lord Edgar places a fragile Lady Enid in a sanitarium and journeys to Egypt seeking answers to the unsolved mysteries that beleaguer his household.

With assistance from Ludlam's outrageous script, Bean and Felch are given the opportunity to stretch the range of their outstanding comedic talents—not to mention having a lot of fun in the process, as they satirize everything from *Rebecca* to *The Turn of the Screw* to *The Werewolf* with focused madness.

A big fan of Ludlam's, director Michael Wilson feels Ludlam is one of the great gay playwrights. "So much attention has been paid to *Harvey Milk* and *Angels in America*, but even Tony Kushner (creator of *Angels*) has talked about Ludlam's influence on his own works," Wilson says. "His [Ludlam's] love for grandeur is especially important. This play takes us back to the vignettes, parodies and shtick of vaudeville."

Wilson took a bold and unique approach with Lord Edgar's journey to Egypt by bringing the character and his guide into the audience with flashlights, as if they were moving about a dark tomb. This allowed the actors room for hysterical adlibs as they uncovered numerous artifacts in the crowd. Commenting on this risky yet successful bit of direction, Wilson avowed, "When you can make the relationship between the actors and the audience more intimate, then you should try to achieve it. You don't get to do that enough in the theatre."

Although the audience took a few side roads on the journey through the excessive plot twists and turns of the wacky second act, the evening certainly didn't get lost in the woods. Exceptional staging, acting and comedic timing make *The Mystery of Irma Vep* a gender-bending costume artistry event to remember.

Charles Ludlam's *The Mystery of Irma Vep* is being presented by the Alley Theatre, 615 Texas Ave. in downtown Houston, through Feb. 4. 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SEXUAL AND SPIRITUAL HEALING

A whole other realm of abuse involves that which is physical sexual abuse in that it involves sexual activity and/or touch. This includes but is not limited to incest. It is important to understand that sometimes persons who were abused by adults when they were children report liking the experience because it was often the only time they got attention and felt important and loved. This wounds the person victimized, regardless of gender or sexual orientation.

The only difference is that gay and lesbian victims of this form of abuse sometimes erroneously think the abuse may have caused them to become homosexual. Heterosexual victims don't wonder if their abuse caused them to become heterosexual, primarily because they don't have all the messages telling them that their sexual orientation is wrong and therefore don't have a tendency to search for what caused it. We will find out what causes homosexuality as soon as we find out what causes heterosexuality.

Except for rape and other forceful sex, sexual behavior is a choice. Sexual orientation,

tation, however, is not a choice, and sexual behavior that is not congruent with one's orientation will not change his or her orientation.

There are many methods and resources to overcome and heal from the consequences of sexual and/or spiritual abuse. The healing begins as soon as you start to change the way you treat yourself and to externalize the shame that is often at the core of the survivor. Shame is different

than guilt in that guilt is about behavior and shame is about identity. Guilt says, "I made a mistake," whereas shame says, "I am something wrong, I am a mistake." Survivors of abuse usually suffer from what is called "internal dialogue disorder"—that

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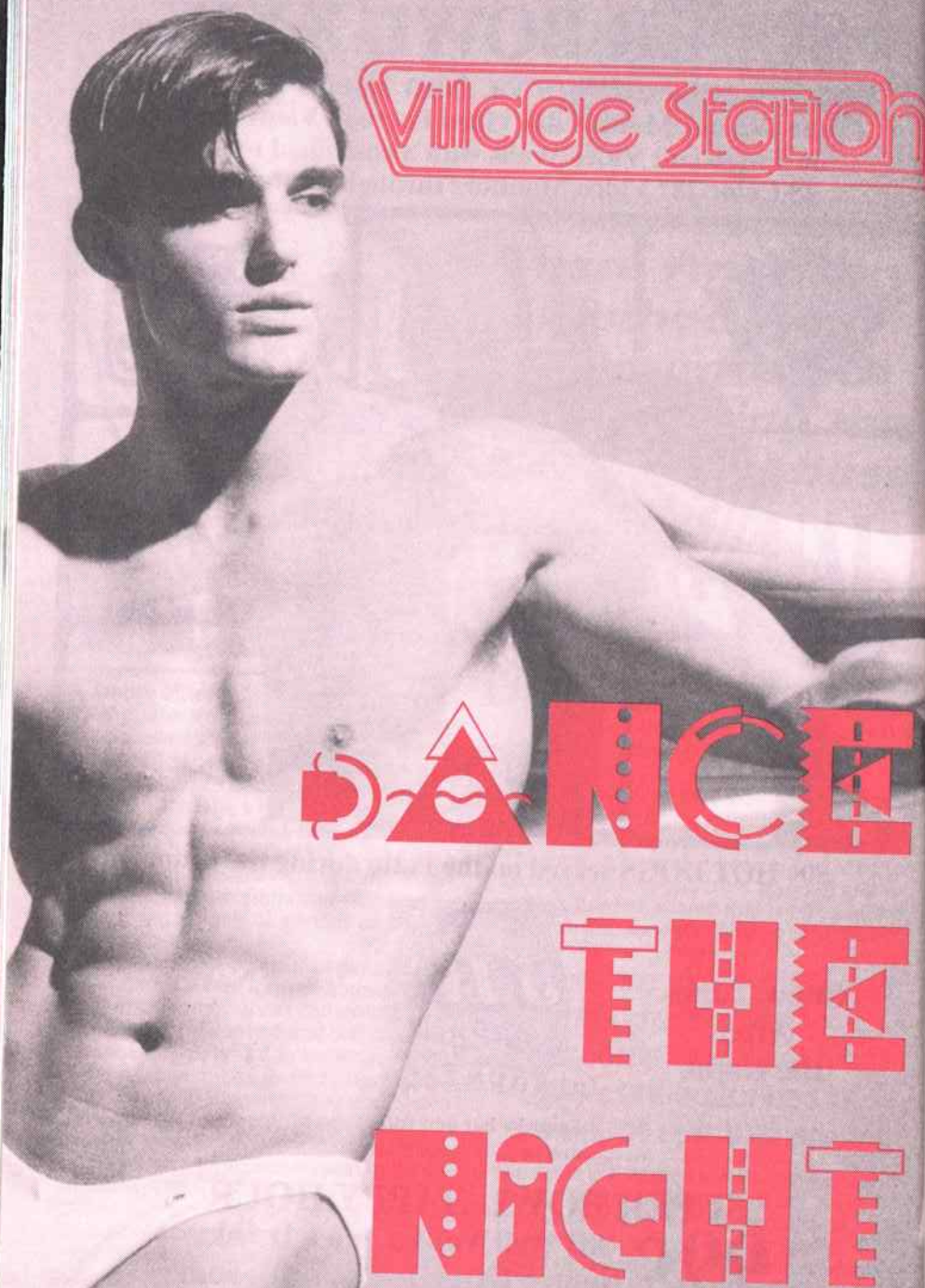
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is, they are constantly saying negative and shaming things to themselves.

It helps to understand that a vast amount of the shame imbedded in the soul of a survivor is not even theirs; rather, it is the shame of the person who abused them. The shame becomes lodged in the victim's soul because the victim's boundaries were annihilated by the abuse, especially if the abuse occurred at a young age.

Effective techniques for externalizing shame include reframing memories, age regression, guided imagery and affirmations. Some of these methods are best employed under the direction and guidance of a qualified professional. Those not familiar with these dynamics can actually

cause one further harm. Support can also be found in one or more of the twelve-step spiritual programs; metaphysics; New Age churches; the Course in Miracles; gay- and lesbian-affirming churches; experiential workshops and lectures; one or more of the

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many books on the topic; reevaluation counseling; and other self-help programs. Many of these are free of charge.

Just for today, begin by realizing that you are exactly the way you were intended to be (including your sexuality). Know that, by externalizing the shame from the core of a survivor, what will emerge from underneath is extraordinary and profound. That false self will disintegrate and the true self will come alive. What will surface is a happy, vibrant and energized spirit that is child-like, precious, innocent, talented, creative, playful and full of joy! A lovable person in awe of the stimulating world around them who radiates love, gentleness, affection, tenderness and compassion wherever they go.

Be not so much concerned about the destination when healing, but rather enjoy and embrace the journey. The journey to becoming the wonderful person that you were meant to be. The valuable person that you already are. All those negative messages that you were told were lies. You truly are the greatest, most precious, and valuable miracle in the world.

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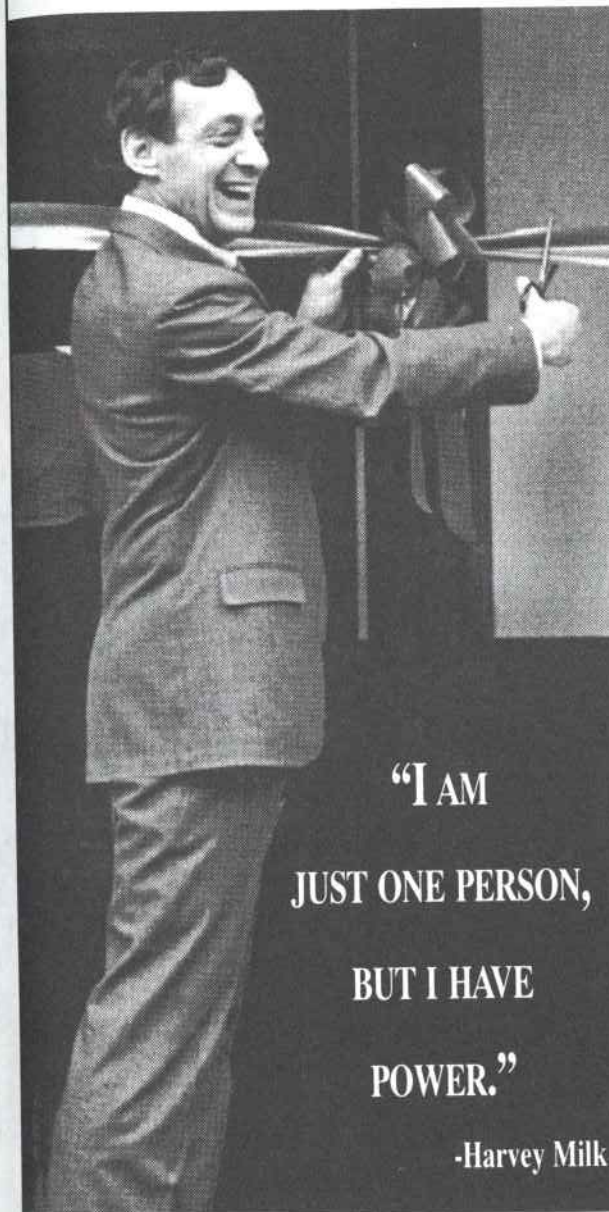

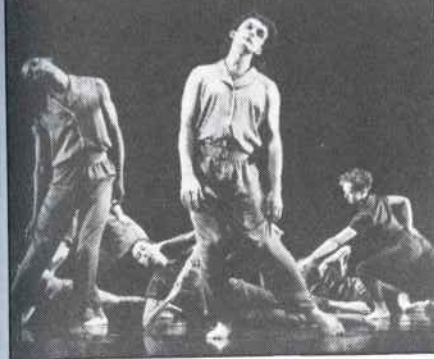

MARK MORRIS DANCE GROUP MAKES DALLAS DEBUT

**TITAS Bringing Acclaimed Choreographer
To SMU's McFarlin Next Weekend**

In a coup for the city of Dallas, the International Theatrical Arts Society [TITAS] is bringing choreographer Mark Morris, considered by some to be "the new Balanchine," to the Metroplex next Friday and Saturday night in the Dallas debut of his dance group. It will also be the only Texas stop for the acclaimed dance company.

The Mark Morris Dance Group was formed in 1980 and gave its first concert that year in New York City. In addition to touring widely, the troupe has been the subject of television specials, including PBS' *Dance in America* series and *Great Performances*. They were also featured on London Weekend Television's *South Bank Show*. In addition, the group has earned rave reviews at the Brooklyn Academy of Music and at the Edinburgh Festival.

From 1986-1991, the Mark Morris Dance Group was the resident company at the Theatre Royal de la Monnaie in Brussels, Belgium.

Their Dallas repertoire will feature "Lucky Charms," a glitzy takeoff on a Broadway chorus line; "Three Preludes," a Morris solo set to three Gershwin pieces; "Going Away Party," an eight-part piece with comic touches that will include some country-western music; and "Grand Duo," a four-part work of spiritually powerful dances that, in typical Morris fashion, ends with a polka.

A native of Seattle, Washington, Mark

Morris was immersed in ballet, flamenco and Balkan folk dance as a youth. Incorporating these varied influences into his adult works has earned him such glowing praise as "today's cleverest, most inventive choreographer" and "volatile, entertaining, irresistible." One reviewer said of his work, "It's exciting to see an artist with Morris' craft pursuing it in dance. Even when he misses—or rather, succeeds only partially—his attempts are always full of imagination and the pleasure of dancing."

One of the youngest artists ever to receive a MacArthur Genius Award, and already the subject of a biography at age 37, Mark Morris has performed with several companies that have appeared in Dallas, including the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company and the Feld Ballet.

Morris has created dances for the San Francisco Ballet, American Ballet Theatre and the Paris Opera Ballet. In 1990, he founded the White Oak Dance Project with Mikhail Baryshnikov. He has also created 103 dance works, set to music ranging from Handel to the rock group Violent Femmes.

Performances are scheduled for Friday and Saturday, Jan. 27 and 28 at 8 p.m. at McFarlin Auditorium on the campus of Southern Methodist University.

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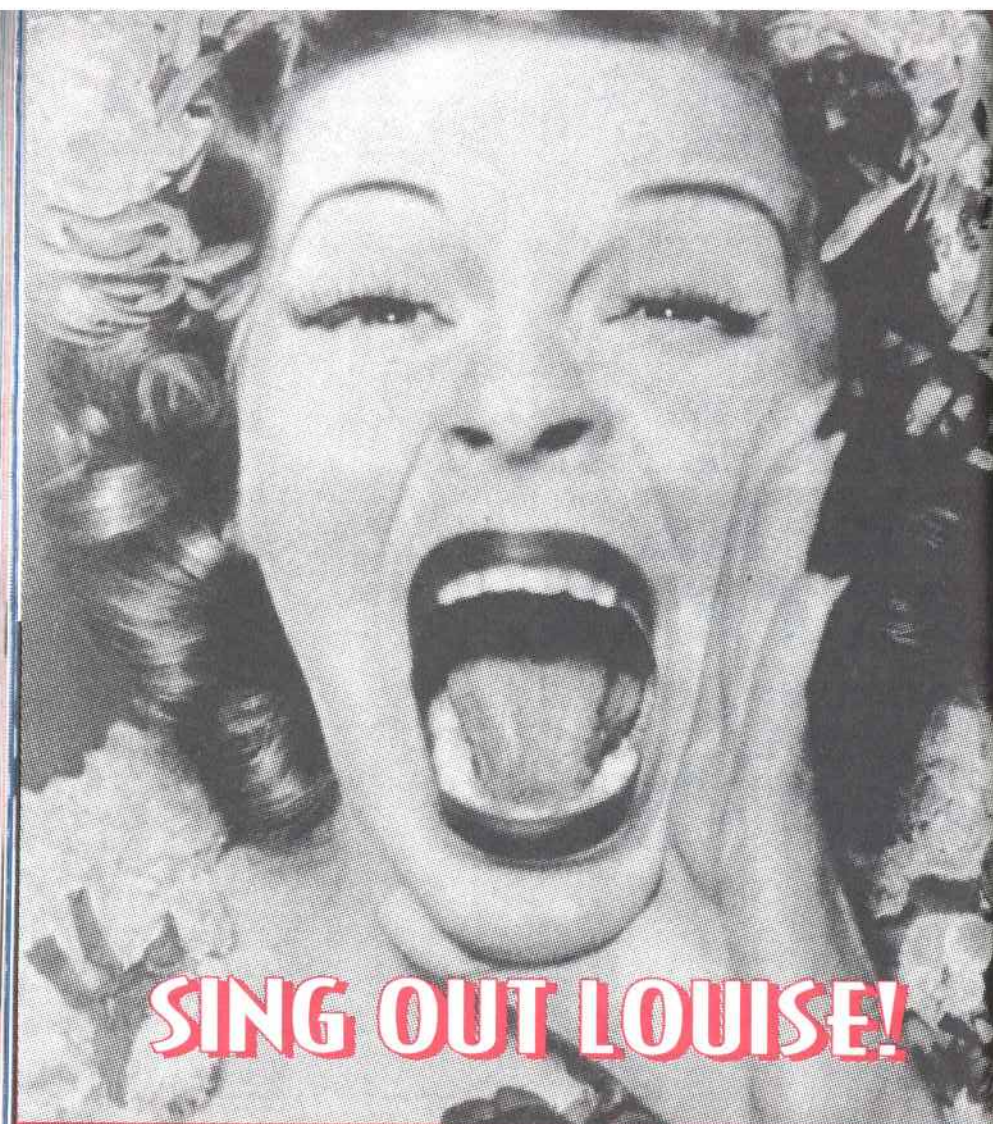

A Houston political race that has drawn little attention and created few sparks culminates this Saturday [Jan. 21] when voters—probably only a small percentage of them—go to the polls to choose a new City Councilmember.

The special election to fill the at-large seat left vacant by Sheila Jackson Lee's election to Congress has drawn an almost unheard-of 19 candidates. A crowded ballot and an expected turnout of little more than 10% of city voters will favor those candidates who can get their supporters to the polls in healthy numbers. Annise Parker, the only openly gay candidate in the race, hopes the dynamics will favor her second bid for a seat on City Council. A strong gay voter turnout and significant support among Inner-Loop non-gay supporters are crucial to her hopes of making it into a likely runoff.

A Rice University graduate employed by Mosbacher Energy as an engineering technologist, Parker already boasts a long record of involvement and accomplishment, both on gay issues and in the community at large. A former president of the Houston Gay & Lesbian Political Caucus (HGLPC) and a co-owner of Inklings bookstore, she is also a committee member with the United Way and serves on the Police Advisory Committee and the Police Citizen Review Committee. She currently serves as president of the Neartown Asso-

ciation, and has taken strong stands on neighborhood and environmental issues.

Parker believes that gaining public office would enable her to strengthen her involvement as well as provide the gay community with a voice in the halls of power that it has never really had, not even among its non-gay friends.

"It would be an extension of the things that I already do," she says. "I would not be doing anything differently if I weren't ever going to run for office again. I would still be involved in the community and involved in my neighborhood. Potholes and street resurfacing and things like that really don't have a gay agenda. But then, every so often something comes along like the Brentwood PWA housing issue."

Late last year, Houston City Council killed a grant of federal funds to Brentwood Baptist Church, an African-American congregation, which planned to use the money to establish a residential facility on its property for families dealing with AIDS. After residents in the area objected to the project and threatened legal action, City Council withdrew its support.

"I can never go away from the gay issue; that's the difference between having gay people in and having [non-gay] supporters in office... Because when it comes right down to it, our issues are affected by matters of political expediency."

She also believes having a gay person

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serving in a high-profile position would help educate non-gay citizens, citing the case of another openly gay candidate. In 1991, in a special election called to fill a state House seat, Glen Maxey made it into a runoff which he then won. He has easily been reelected twice since then. In polling conducted before his first run and later, there was a dramatic change in voters' attitudes. The number of people who had positive feelings about gays jumped dramatically after Maxey had served some time in office.

"The more people there are out there who see us and know us as everyday people just like they are and see us functioning in society, the fewer hate crimes we have, the less problems we have holding onto our civil rights."

In 1991, Parker challenged Councilmember Vince Ryan for the District C seat, which at the time included the Montrose area. But this race is different.

"When I ran before, I ran against an incumbent and I ran on principle; I ran to raise gay issues, for name ID, for experience, a whole lot of other reasons, not thinking that I had a good chance of winning. It was a good experience, and it's paid off for me in this race. This time, though, I feel like the race is mine to lose."

The tone of the campaign has been civil, with little or no apparent gay-baiting on the part of the other candidates.

"It's funny; my literature has the words 'gay and lesbian' at least twice," she notes, "and I distribute those when I go to candidate forums. It's never been discussed once, in probably a dozen joint appearances by all the candidates; never once. People talk about city issues, and I can talk about potholes and police policy all day long. So it's been good." But she believes that would probably change in a runoff, with its focus on just two candidates.

"It's a numbers game," a phrase Parker repeats at appearances and fund-raisers, emphasizes how important a strong gay turnout is to her hopes of getting into a runoff. With the assistance of HGLPC, which endorsed her earlier this month, Parker's campaign has made targeted mailings to likely supporters culled from the Harris County voter registration list.

"This is a race where one or two or three votes could make a difference," Parker says, "and it is the best shot that we have ever had to elect an openly gay person.... We won't have this kind of opportunity again, not for a long time."



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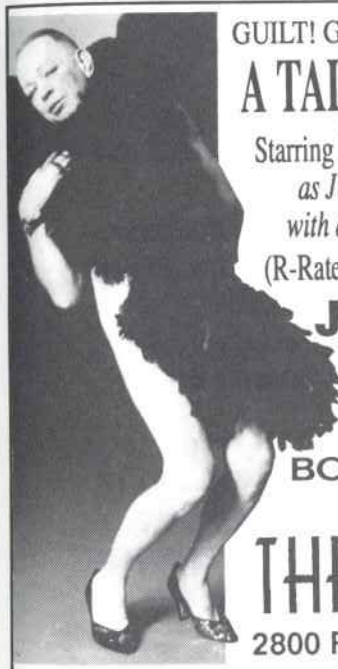
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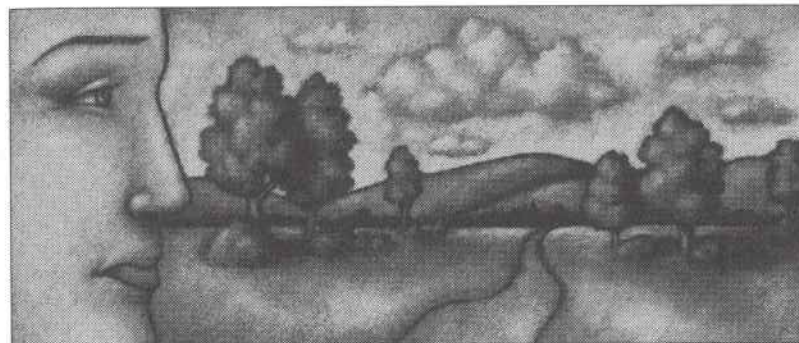

Pulitzer Prize-winning author H.G. Bissinger, in the February edition of *Vanity Fair*, chronicles the trail of blood that has crossed and crisscrossed our state for the

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past 18 months. Eight gay men have been
brutally murdered during that time.

similar segment on *Prime Time Live*.

It is of special importance to us that as
many people as possible see and read
these presentations. You see, one of those
who died and is featured in these stories is
our beloved brother, Benny Hogan.

Benny was 41 years old when he died,
but had never shared with us the fact that
he was gay. We were therefore unable to
be there for him, in the way that he needed
for us to be, in those final hours before he
took his own life.

Bissinger's article tells the story of Benny's
death and how it has affected our lives far
better than we could ever tell it ourselves.
This is an experience we feel compelled to
share with as many people as possible.

We encourage you to pick up a copy of
the February issue of *Vanity Fair* and to
tune in to *Prime Time Live* on Jan. 25. Our
hope is that by telling our own story, others
may be spared a similar experience.

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**AUSTIN HIV STUDY
GROUP SEEKING
NEW FUNDING**

*Change in AmFAR Policy Leaves
Local Agency Looking for New
Sources to Pay for Drug Testing.*

AUSTIN — The Austin HIV Study Group has nine ongoing studies. It was chosen to take part in another, on protease inhibitors, starting in February, and may be chosen as a participant in still another, on a therapeutic vaccine.

"We've done over 35 in the last five years," said Caryll Pithey, who has been the group's project director since it opened in 1989. "We have over 700 clients, to whom we provide medical services. Unlike ASA [AIDS Services of Austin], we are the only unduplicated service in this area."

However, like so many other health care providers nowadays, the Study Group faces a major problem—money. The American Foundation for AIDS Research [AmFAR], based in New York and Washington, D.C., was one of the Austin agency's original funders. But AmFAR is changing the way it hands out its grants, and that's going to cost the HIV Study Group nearly half the money it counted on for its annual operating budget.

"AmFAR has changed to a three-year funding cycle instead of annually," Pithey explained. "They're now funding only 12 sites, instead of 27 or 28 as they had in the past. They funded Houston as their only Texas site, so the study groups here and in Dallas will be left out."

"It seems they've decided to fund on a more university-based plan than...community-based priorities. That cut about at least \$80,000 from our annual budget. We've managed to secure some funding from the Ryan White Care Act and some other grants. But we're still waiting to find out about supplemental money from Ryan White that's crucial to us. I don't know where we stand; nobody does. We're not in any immediate danger of closing this year, but..."

The Austin HIV Study Group has five employees and three physicians. When it receives grant money or becomes part of a new study, it advertises to recruit clients who meet the criteria of the study. Pithey said her group has a 2,500-member mailing list.



One of the new studies will look at protease inhibitors, whose exciting possibilities are the focus of an article in the latest issue of *Nature* magazine. "We're going to be doing our study on one inhibitor, in-verse," Pithey explained. "It's been around awhile, but there hasn't been much extensive testing of it."

Pithey paused, then added, "The groups back east don't realize how big and spread out Texas is. If Houston was the only site, people in Austin would have to travel great distances to take part, and that would be a hardship, especially if they're sick. So we serve a definite need here."

**DALLAS CITY COUNCIL
ADDS GAYS TO
ANTIBIAS POLICY**

*Opponents Say They Will Press for
Reconsideration of Measure.*

DALLAS — In a somewhat surprising vote for what is generally considered a conservative city, Dallas City Council recently passed by a 9-5 margin an amendment to hiring practices that will add sexual orientation to city employment non-discrimination guidelines.

Discrimination against any city employee or anyone applying for employment based on marital status or sexual orientation will now be prohibited under these new rules. Past city policy protected employees based on age, race, religion, sex, national origin, disability and political affiliation or opinions.

Also surprising to some was the vote of Mayor Steve Bartlett, a Republican, who had earlier backed the Dallas Police Department's past policy of discriminating against gay men and lesbians. Bartlett, who is not running for reelection, was quoted as saying of his vote, "It was the right thing to do."

Councilmember Glenn Box was not con-

vinced. "I think it is absolutely abhorrent to give special status to homosexuals," he said. "The public outrage will be so substantial that phone lines and fax machines will be lit up at City Hall." Box, a Republican who represents conservative North Dallas, was right. Debate now rages over the new rule, and hundreds of people have deluged City Hall with pro and anti sentiments on the measure.

Box and fellow Councilmember Donna Blumer said they would push for the decision to be reconsidered. Councilmember Don Hicks, who supported the measure, said he may ask for a second vote "in the spirit of democracy." All it would take to have the amendment reconsidered is one proponent asking for such, and Hicks could prove to be that one crucial voice.

Operation Rescue Director Flip Benham said of the new policy in a massively faxed document that "the Dallas City Council endorses sodomy" and had "usurped the authority of Almighty God." In that same document, he demanded the resignation of Bartlett and the eight other City Councilmembers who supported the measure.

City Councilmen Chris Luna and Craig McDaniel had originally brought the amendment up for a vote. "We knew we had enough votes, but didn't know it would pass so overwhelmingly," McDaniel told TWT NEWS. "I'm really proud of my colleagues, especially the mayor."

McDaniel said that public reaction reaching City Hall the day after the antidiscrimination measure passed was about half in favor of the change and half against it. "The thing people need to do is to call or write or fax those people who supported the measure. Letters to the editor at TWT, the *Dallas Morning News* and others are what needs to be done."

"Ultra-extremists will flood the others [City Councilmembers]," McDaniel added, "and a vocal minority like Operation Rescue will try to sway them. I wouldn't underestimate the opposition; they'll be trying every way they can to reverse this. The other City Councilmembers need to know this was a reasonable and rational measure. This new policy says, bottom line, if you do your job at the City of Dallas, you get to keep your job."

In fact, according to McDaniel, the City of Dallas was behind most other major municipalities in enacting such a policy. Over 120 cities, including Austin, have adopted such hiring practices.

In addition to Bartlett, Luna, McDaniel and Hicks, councilmembers voting for the amendment were Paul Fielding, Sandra Crenshaw, Bob Stimson, Domingo Garcia and Larry Duncan. Besides Box and Blumer, those voting against were Donna Halstead, Barbara Mallory, Max Wells. Councilmember Charlotte Mayes was not present for the vote.

At press time, no formal challenge to bring the amendment up for reconsideration had been offered.

VOLUNTEERS HONORED AT DALLAS AGENCY

*Longtime Activist Dick Weaver
Among Those Recognized.*

DALLAS — One of the most vital resources of any nonprofit organization is its volunteers. Without those people who tirelessly contribute thousands and thousands of hours, such groups would surely grind to a halt. The Foundation for Human Understanding, an umbrella organization for several different Dallas AIDS service groups, recognized that fact and honored its 800 volunteers last week. They collectively contributed 55,000 hours to the Gay and Lesbian Community Center, the AIDS Resource Center, the Food Pantry and the Nelson-Tebedo Community Clinic, all components of the Foundation.

Longtime community activist Dick Weaver was awarded the 1994 Volunteer Spirit Award, which goes to those who have not only contributed time and effort, "but also embody the spirit of commitment and community involvement." Weaver is a founding member of the Foundation's Board of Directors and has been involved in a number of other Dallas gay organizations. Previous recipients include Alan Ross (Texas Freedom Parade) and modeling executive Kim Dawson.

Receiving the Business Award this year was the weekly newspaper *The Dallas Observer*, honored for its efforts in publicizing the organization's need for volunteers.

The Foundation for Human Understanding provided direct care to over 3,000 people with HIV/AIDS through the various

services it offers, such as the Food Pantry, dental programs, hot lunch meal program and clinical support. Volunteers have also reached over 150,000 people through educational outreaches, training and the AIDS Resource Center's information hotline.

Executive Director John Thomas had high praise for those who give their time and energy to his organization. "Volunteers of the Foundation are what make all the elements so cost-effective and efficient. Because of you and your efforts, we're able to do so much."

Others honored at the event were Drew Whitlock of the Food Pantry, who was recognized for serving over 1,602 hours last year; Dick Jefcoat of the AIDS Hotline, who contributed 1,523 hours; and John Stewart, also involved with the Food Pantry, who gave 1,398 hours of his time.

AUSTIN FORUM COVERS GAY ISSUES AND LEGISLATURE

*State Rep. Maxey, LGRL Head
Hardy-Garcia Speak of Goals,
Hopes for Upcoming Session.*

AUSTIN — State Rep. Glen Maxey [D-Dist. 51] and Dianne Hardy-Garcia, executive director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, spoke about their hopes and plans for the upcoming legislative session Tuesday night at Metropolitan Community Church of Austin.

The panel discussion before about 50 spectators was the third in the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus' [ALGPC] series of informative forums for the public on a variety of issues.

Maxey said his legislative goals included having a more focused agenda for the 1995 session. "I'm working primarily in three specific areas," the third-term representative said. "I want to create an office of health data in the state health department. I want to work on welfare reform with my human services committee, making it a true safety net for people. Also, I want to work on HIV issues, such as regulation of viatical settlements and the issue of home collection for HIV tests."

Hardy-Garcia outlined the three-pronged gay agenda her group is pushing: "Hate crimes, kill bad bills and employment non-

discrimination, especially on the issue of sexual orientation." She and LGRL are hard at work planning the Texas March to Stop the Violence/Stop the Hate in Austin on April 2.

"I'm proud the march will focus on our legislators," Hardy-Garcia added. "We plan to make April 3 Lobby Day, and seek the community's support to go to the Legislature and speak to as many representatives and senators as possible. We'd also like to train people, to better keep alert about the 2,000 to 5,000 bills that are started each session."

Maxey noted that he's ready to support HIV home testing, as long as certain protections are included. "I've made a decision we should make the test as available as possible. There are downsides; it's not going to be cheap, it's not going to be as accessible.... I felt that it was incumbent that I lead the charge to see this is done accurately and responsibly. Johnson & Johnson [manufacturer of the tests] is very powerful; this is going to pass the Legislature. That is a very conservative place where I work, where I live, right now!"

Maxey said he doesn't believe new Gov. George W. Bush would veto a hate crime bill if one is passed by the Legislature, despite the Republican's strong conservatism. Hardy-Garcia said that such legislation is vital for everyone, noting, "This bill was carried by one African-American who knows that hate crimes based on race are the highest in the state. I think there's broad interest in [stopping] this kind of violence. One thing you should know is that violence against lesbians and gays increased from 11.5% to 16% here in a year."

"Before we can stop the violence, we have to stop the hate," added ALGPC's Allan Baker, who served as moderator. "The hate is the source of the violence."

ALGPC will sponsor another forum in February at MCC-Austin on the media and the gay and lesbian community.



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Who was Crystal Waters five years ago? She was a computer assistant at the DC Board of Paroles.

The gay community is my base. Will Kremling passed away from AIDS complications on Saturday, Jan. 7, 1995 at Ben Taub Hospital in Houston.

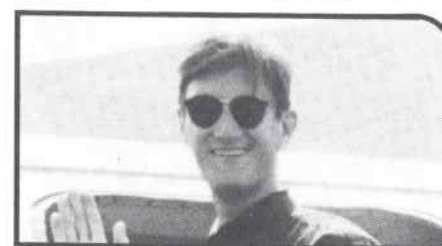
