Halloween Magic's Campy, Inside-the-Loop MONTROSE BOULEVARD to Benefit AIDS Organizations in Houston

Get ready for your close up, Norma Desperate! Houston's Halloween Magic will unveil the world premiere of *Montrose Boulevard* on Oct. 21 in the Conference Center Ballroom, located in the Texas Medical Center. This new musical spoof of Billy Wilder's 1950 film classic *Sunset Boulevard* promises an evening of zany, irreverent fun, and is especially written for the "Inner Loop community."

Act I opens with former film queen Norma Desperate sitting in her Montrose mansion on a dark, stormy night. Max, her devoted butler, is there, along with several bizarre characters who appear to have ulterior motives for their interest in the aging star.

Suddenly, amid a huge clap of thunder, screaming and other hysterics, Norma is discovered standing over the dead body of her lover Dirk Rambone, a smoking gun in her hand.

The second act picks up where the film left off: Norma must stand trial for the murder.

"Our biggest challenge in writing the script was: what do you do with an aging '30s star from *Sunset Boulevard*, and how do you make her relevant to what's going on today in the '90s?" observes co-author Gary Rod.

The solution was to make the second act a parody of the O.J. Simpson trial, keeping in theme with the musical.

Halloween Magic began in 1988 as a way to raise money for AIDS charities. "It started as a series of private dinner parties throughout the community. People would host parties at their homes and charge admission.

The proceeds would then go to Halloween Magic," says co-author Gilbert Perez, who's been a participant in the annual event since its inception. "The third year a show was added and it was a big success. It actually brought in more money than the private parties, so we started doing shows every year."

In 1991, Halloween Magic presented *The Roxie Horror Beauty Shop*, a combination of *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*, *Steel Magnolias*, *Little Shop of Horrors* and *The Wizard of Oz*. It premiered at the Majestic Metro Theater in downtown Houston.

Its sequel, *Hair Wars*, was presented in 1992 at the Metropolitan Multi-Service Center. *The Sound of Montrose*, in 1993, and last year's *The Phantom of Montrose*, were both staged at the Texas Medical Center Conference Center. Last season's show entertained over 500 theatre-goers.

As with past productions, Halloween Magic is keeping this year's show strongly focused on the Montrose area.

"We want to involve both Montrose resi-

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dents and area businesses in the project," says Perez, "and all the money raised stays right here in the community."

Proceeds from *Montrose Boulevard* will benefit the Bering Community Service Foundation, HIV/AIDS education and service programs of the Houston chapter of the American Red Cross, and Body Positive/Houston.

"It's become a year-round event," says Perez. "We start planning right after one show ends."

"Yeah," interjects Rod, "we start conceptualizing almost immediately. We give ourselves a break in November and December, but in January we already feel compelled to have or be developing or outlining the vehicle that we're going to put the next show in. Because ever since *The Sound of Montrose*, it's been a vehicle that's really worked great. You pick something that already exists, and use the parts of it that you want, and add other things to it. For instance, the music in this year's show includes Madonna's "Hanky Panky" and Barry Manilow's "Copacabana," and other songs from the *Sunset Boulevard* musical. It's really eclectic, as we do eclectic best."

In keeping with the overall spirit of the production, lyrics for all the songs have been reworked in an Inner Loop vernacular for maximum camp and comedy effect.

The selection of *Sunset Boulevard* for this year's vehicle provoked some controversy among Rod, Perez and writers Shana Ross and John Tucker.

"To me," Rod observes, "it was a dark and depressing kind of show. But the other writers said, 'Oh, no! There's lots of room for ridicule and high camp and drama!' It was very successful on Broadway and we had hopes that it would be included in the road shows that were coming through Houston, but it was still too new."

"Halloween Magic has become such a big effort," says Perez, "that it now takes over 100 volunteers to put this event together. We have a steering committee of over 30 individuals who work really hard, and this doesn't include the cast, crew and volunteers. To date, we have sold seating for over 400 people, and individual ticket sales have not been started yet. We were estimating around 600, but it looks more like 700-800 people will attend. We have doubled in size in the last year. We're hoping to net \$60,000, so that each agency will receive \$20,000."

"The cast is composed of 18 actors, with some returns of favorite characters from past

productions. Jimmy Phillips will portray the aging, delusional Norma Desperate, while Scott Sawyer returns as Wanda June Smathers. The Countess de Bossa Nova will be portrayed by co-writer Shana Ross, and Dirk Rambone is Brent Shockley.

This year's event is being co-chaired by Perez and Stacie Cokinos, Bering's Director of Development and Outreach. U.S. Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee serves as Honorary Chair.

Montrose Boulevard is directed by noted Houston theatre artist Robin Robinson. Musical director is David Stotlar.

Sponsors for the event include Absolut Vodka, Silver Eagle Distributors, Continental Airlines, Clive Watson Public Relations, Houston Ballet, Tarrant Distributors, Pepsi, Minuteman Press, In Bloom and Clear Lake Flowers. Food for the evening will be donated by Sausalito Seafood & Pasta and Los Tios Mexican Restaurants.

The event begins at 7 p.m. with a cocktail buffet and silent auction. Around 100 items will be featured in the silent auction. Actress Glenn Close (who starred in the lead role of *Sunset Boulevard* on Broadway) has donated two autographed pictures of herself. Also featured will be a huge collection of Diana Ross and the Supremes posters, videos and music, valued at over \$3,000. A live auction will be staged at intermission.

Also part of the evening will be a raffle featuring as first prize a round trip to New York City with two box seats to *Sunset Boulevard*.

Another fabulous prize is called a "Weekend in Montrose." Dominion Jaguar is donating a Jaguar automobile for the weekend. The prize package also includes a room at the Wyndham Warwick, dinner and theatre seats. Other items have also been donated by local artists.

Volunteers are still needed, especially bartenders and food handlers. For further information, call (713)524-2374.

Halloween Magic begins at 7 p.m. at the Texas Medical Center, Conference Center ballroom at 2151 W. Holcombe in Houston. Attire is casual. Individual tickets are \$35, while tables are available from \$500 to \$1,500. Tickets at the door (if available) will be \$40. University Student Groups Play Key Role in **NATIONAL COMING OUT DAY** Observances Across State Next Week

Public opinion surveys and other studies indicate that people who know someone who's openly gay, lesbian or bisexual are much more likely to support the idea of equality for all regardless of sexual orientation. "Coming out," in fact, has come to be considered one of the most effective weapons gay and lesbian people can wield in an era in which hate crimes are on the rise and a backlash against homosexuals is being spearheaded by Radical Right groups across the country.

The National Coming Out Project is an ongoing, nonprofit educational effort by the Human Rights Campaign Fund to encourage gay people to be open and honest about themselves. Year-round activities culminate in National Coming Out Day on Oct. 11, a date that organizers say was chosen because it commemorates the 1987 March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights as well as the inaugural visit by the NAMES Project AIDS Memorial Quilt to the nation's capital. As in past years, Texans will be joining the rest of the country in observances over the next week, many of them coordinated by university gay student groups. Below is a partial listing of NCOD activities across Texas.

▼ In **Austin**, a rally will be held on the West Mall on the campus of the University of Texas next Wednesday, Oct. 11. Following introductions and announcements at 11:30 a.m., state Rep. Glen Maxey will address the crowd at noon. Local minister Sid Hall will speak on religion and homosexuality at 12:30 p.m. From 12:45-1:30 p.m., an open mike format will allow audience members to make comments to those assembled. Tables will be set up by Out Youth Austin, the Human Rights Campaign Fund and other organizations during the rally.

▼ At Texas A&M in **College Station** on Monday, Oct. 9, a panel of parents from P-FLAG Houston will speak. 7 p.m. at Friends Congregational Church, 28 18th St. in College Station. On Tuesday, Oct. 10, East Texas activist Wesley Beard will speak at 7 p.m. in Room 206 of the Memorial Student Center at Texas A&M. On Wednesday, Oct. 11, Frances Reid will screen and discuss her film *Straight from the Heart* at 7 p.m. in Room 206 at the MSC. On Thursday, Oct. 12, a special "rap group" featuring coming-out stories will be presented at 7 p.m. in Room 302 of Rudder Tower on the A&M campus. For more information, call (409)847-0321.

▼ In **Dallas** this evening, Oct. 6, Chastity

Bono, the daughter of actress Cher and U.S. Rep. Sonny Bono, will speak at 8 p.m. in the theatre of the Hughes-Trigg Student Center at Southern Methodist University. This Sunday, Oct. 8, thousands of gay men, lesbians and their friends and supporters are expected to participate in a "Family Outing" from 10 a.m.-8 p.m. at the State Fair of Texas. The day-long event will feature an appearance by Bono as well as a keynote speech by activist and HRCF spokesperson Candace Gingrich, half-sister of U.S. House Speaker Newt Gingrich (at 2 p.m. at the NCOD tent, adjacent to the Dallas Civic Garden Center in Fair Park).

NCOD organizers have also purchased space for a signature advertisement promoting National Coming Out Day to appear in *The Dallas Morning News* next Wednesday, Oct. 11.

A number of Dallas-area churches are also planning special services next week in support of nondiscrimination on the basis of sexual orientation.

The Question of Equality looks at the case of U.S. Navy Petty Officer Keith Meinhold, who was discharged (later reinstated) for declaring his homosexuality.

In conjunction with National Coming Out Day and National Lesbian and Gay History Month, this month public television stations around the country are airing **The Question of Equality**, a four-part series that looks at the rich and complex history of the gay and lesbian civil rights movement. Combining rare archival footage and first-person accounts, the series covers a time span from the 1969 Stonewall riots to the present day, when gay men and lesbians face a powerful backlash, the continuing threat of hate crimes directed against them and, of course, AIDS.

"Out Rage '69," the first installment in **The Question of Equality**, introduces the series by examining the social and historical environment that gave rise to the current movement for gay and lesbian civil rights in this country.

The second show, "Culture Wars," explores the widespread rise of homophobia and increased incidence of hate crimes in spite of gains made by gay men and lesbians in the 1970s and early '80s.

"Hollow Liberty" focuses on laws and policies that have systematically reduced gay and lesbian Americans to second-class citizenship status, such as the Pentagon's discriminatory policy.

"Generation Q," the fourth installment of **The Question of Equality**, looks at the future of the gay and lesbian movement — young people.

The Question of Equality is produced by Testing the Limits for the Independent Television Service, with funds provided by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, Channel 4 Television UK and foundations and individuals.

On Friday, Oct. 13, GLOBAL holds its second annual Triangle Ball, a "semi-formal celebration of coming out, being proud and having fun," from 9 p.m.–midnight in the Oberholtzer Hall Ballroom. 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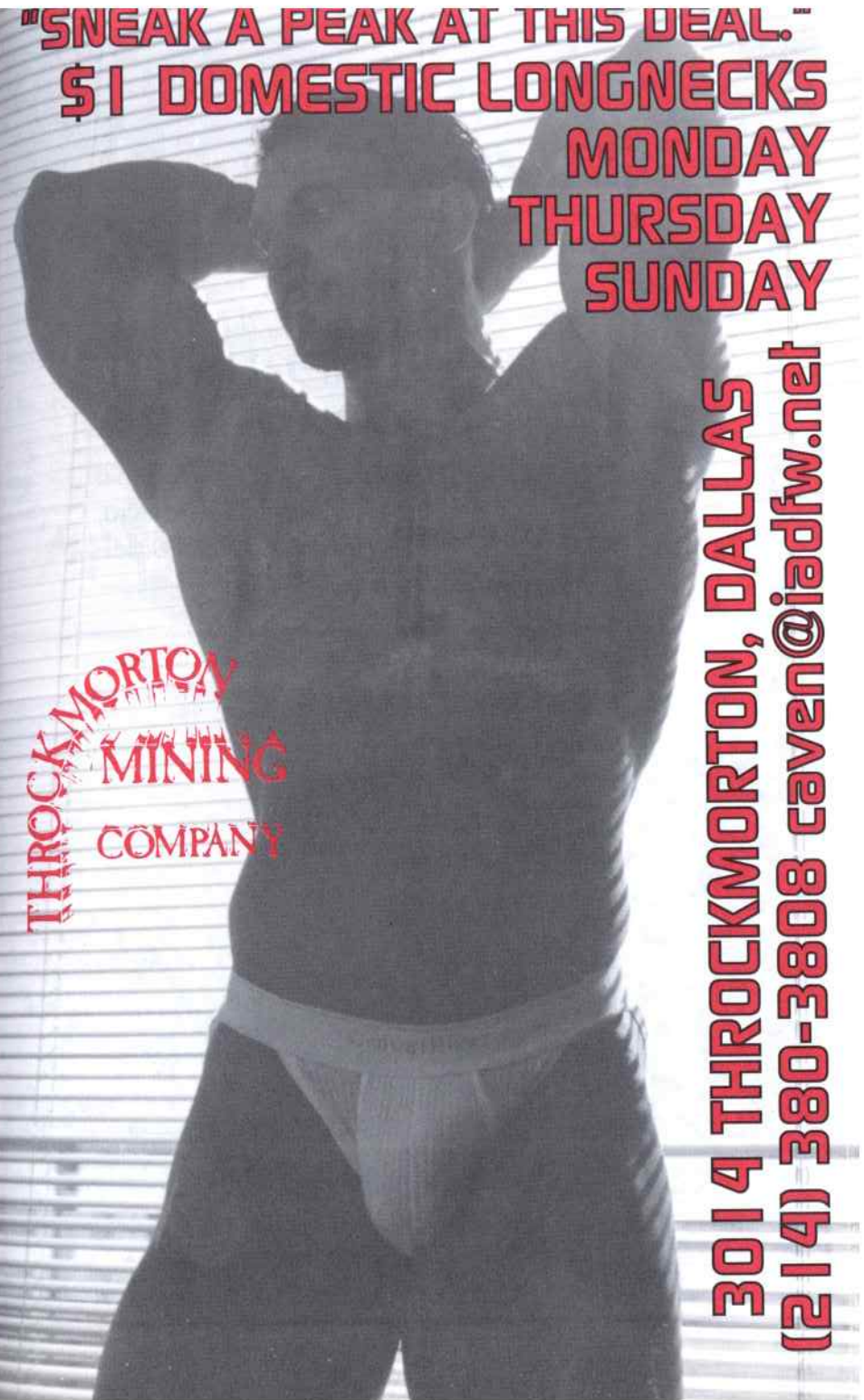
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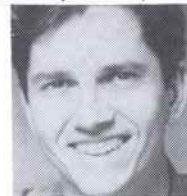
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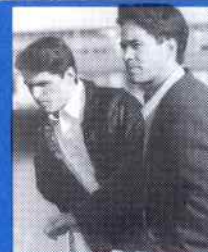
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Such is the case with **Toshi Kubota's** "Funk It Up," one of those brilliant House pieces that make you, like, want to dance with your eyes closed or something. Bouncy, flowy melody with mixes by David Morales and keyboard by the golden fingers of Satoshi Tomiie pull this track together nicely — from the forthcoming Columbia release *Sunshine, Moonlight*.



Another soulful romper is Logic Records' first true House track, "Shine," by **Erire**. This piece has a very jazzy feel to it, with almost an edgy undertone. Wonderful synth and percussion throughout the track, as well as mixes by Clubzone and Graeme Park make this item wantable.

Jazz seems to be the in thing lately, as evidenced by **Pepper Mashay's** "Something to Feel." This track took a couple of weeks and a few nagging calls to grow on me, but nevertheless I'm hooked — superb organ (not that kind!) work and fab mixes by Tom Moulton.

One of my favorites for several weeks that I haven't gotten around to telling you about is a clever piece on the Cheeky label entitled "Salva Mia" ("Save Me") by **Faithless**. Can we talk?! It all begins with an operatic intro to a Hi-House romp and from there sets you on fire with a Techno-inspired frenzy to work your gay ganglions and back around again! But then, it's produced and mixed by Rollo — what else *should* we expect?

The music industry suffered a horrible blow in January with the death of **David Cole** (of C&C Music Factory fame). In fact, many of us wondered what would go on with his partner of 13 years, Robert Clivillés. Well...MCA Records is proud to continue the legacy of

C&C with the release of the first single, "I Will Always Be Around," from their new album, *C&C Music Factory Presents Robi-Rob's Crew*. The track is nothing short of brilliant, 12 minutes of sheer musical pleasure. This will undoubtedly be one of the hottest tracks of 1995. Welcome back where you belong, Brother Clivillés.

Those **M People** have let us have it once



again with "Padlock," yet another sure-to-be #1 on the charts from their debut album, *Bizarre Fruit*. Check out the Sound Factory (Junior Vasquez) mix. Can Miss Heather sing, or what?

A while back, I told you about the new **Diana Ross** single, "Take Me Higher." If the domestic mixes didn't float your boat, give a listen to the import mixes by BT and Felix "Da House Cat" — they're hot! Ms. Ross will be at the Music Hall in Dallas' Fair Park Oct. 22 and at the Arena Theatre in Houston Oct. 27. Be there — her new show is the one!

Cut 'N' Move is back out with a flawless NRG/House hybrid, "I'm Alive." Cute, spacy intro to a slamming bass line with fabulous, anthem vocals — even a little Techno thrown in for good measure. Look out for Vinny Vero's Refreshing Breath Mint mix, available on EMI.

Harajuku has released a cover version of "Color of the Wind" (from *Pocahontas*) on ZYX (the cover label). Although I've been a big fan since "Phantom" a couple of years ago, I don't quite feel that "Colors" meets my expectations where Harajuku is concerned. I mean, it's kinda cute, but nothing spectacular. Maybe a remix is in order?

Finally, there's a really nice piece out by **Bruce Roberts** (whom I've never heard of). Anyway, there are several nice Housy mixes on the 12-inch by E-Smoove and Ronnie Ventura, but I'm really getting into the album version (first side, second cut). It has a very Pet Shop Boys-meets-Cicero feel to it. Very electronic, almost retro in nature. Now get

GAY CATHOLICS TO PROTEST CHURCH STANCE THIS SUNDAY

*Members, Supporters Encouraged
To Wear Rainbow Ribbons.*

TEXAS — Dignity/USA, the world's largest organization of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered Catholics and their supporters, has called on Catholics who disagree with official Church teaching on homosexuality to join in a visible protest this Sunday, Oct. 8. The group has designated the day, which coincides with a planned visit by Pope John Paul II to Baltimore, "Solidarity Sunday," and is calling on supporters to wear rainbow ribbons throughout the day.

In announcing the event, Dignity/USA President Marianne Duddy stated, "For too long, the Pope and bishops who endorse discrimination against gay people have controlled the Catholic message about homosexuality, when in fact their attitude is not at all representative of what most Catholics think. It's time that people understand that most Catholics are fair and decent, and believe that all people should be treated with respect."

Duddy pointed to numerous studies that indicate the majority of American Catholics support gay rights, including a 1992 Gallup poll that put such support at 78%.

In contrast, recent Vatican statements have referred to homosexuality as "intrinsically disordered" and are seen by many as tacitly approving of violence against gay people. Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, Director of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, wrote, "When civil legislation is introduced to protect [homosexual] behavior...neither the Church nor society at large should be surprised when...violent reactions increase."

The National Coordinator of Solidarity Sunday, Bruce Jarstfer, a retired military surgeon who lives in San Antonio, said, "The Radical Right has targeted our community for abuse, and to drive the fundraising for their 'ministries.' Hate crime against people perceived to be gay or lesbian increase with every sermon or speech based on gay hatred. It is time to call a halt to such verbal and physical violence."

Dignity/USA is predicting that as many as 250,000 Catholics will wear rainbow

ribbons to Mass on this Sunday, in the first of what they hope will become a national event. Solidarity Sunday is also planned to coincide with National Coming Out Day, which this year is being observed Oct. 11.

DALLAS ISD TRUSTEE MAY RESIGN AFTER RACIAL SLURS

*Activists Reject Peavy's Defense
Of 'Colorful' Language.*

DALLAS — The Jewish Community Relations Council, the Anti-Defamation League and the Dallas Gay and Lesbian Alliance [DGLA], among others, are all calling for his resignation and this week it is expected that Dallas Independent School Board Trustee Dan Peavy will, in fact, resign. Peavy allegedly made racial slurs against African-Americans, women and gays which included insults against his fellow school board members. The slurs are contained in privately recorded conversations that were recently made public.

Peavy has insisted that the tape in question, which was anonymously mailed to members of the school board, was spliced together to smear his reputation, although he admits to using "colorful" language on it, saying he comes from a different time.

That defense has not been accepted by most of those calling for his resignation. DGLA president Cece Cox said in a recently released statement, "Peavy's so-called apology is an insult to all those affected by those words. Trying to excuse his words by calling them 'colorful language' ignores the fact that those kinds of words are used to incite violence against people who are perceived as different — and that includes gay and lesbian students."

"We find his comments totally abhorrent. He's an equal-opportunity bigot."

Several school board members, County Commissioners and prominent Dallas minister the Rev. Zan Holmes have also called for his resignation, as has *The Dallas Morning News*, which said of the incident, "Mr. Peavy's tape-recorded remarks not only were loathsome to hear; they showed a crude and callous disregard of other school board trustees."

The school district has turned the tape in question over to the FBI for investigation.

This is not the first time Peavy has been at odds with the gay community in Dallas.

In July of last year, he opposed a seminar on gay and lesbian youth that was offered for counselors, nurses and psychologists, saying it would make it appear as though DISD were condoning homosexuality.

At press time, DGLA was scheduled to hold a protest outside DISD administrative offices last Tuesday to call for Peavy's resignation. They were to be joined by Dallas P-FLAG and Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Young Adults of Dallas.

Peavy is already under investigation by state and federal officials for allegations that he acted improperly in helping DISD select insurance providers, although he has denied any improprieties in that matter.

If Peavy does resign, the school board would call a special election on Jan. 20, 1995 to fill his seat until May 1997, when his term will expire.

AUSTIN PANEL LOOKS AT GAY POLITICAL CONCERNS

*Hardy-Garcia Cites Apathy,
Urges More Grassroots Work.*

AUSTIN — A panel discussion on political concerns of the gay, lesbian and bisexual community became the first in what will be a long series of steps as the Austin Lesbian/Gay Political Caucus prepares for the challenges of the elections of 1996.

A small crowd of about 50 interested citizens turned out for the community meeting on Sept. 27 at Metropolitan Community Church Austin. The event was co-sponsored by the Cornerstone, which is working to establish a community center.

Panelists for the discussion were Dianne Hardy-Garcia, director of the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas; state Rep. Glen Maxey; Allan Baker, chairman of ALGPC, and Brett McHargue, ALGPC Endorsement

Committee Chairman.

Hardy-Garcia emphasized one problem in stirring community interest so far before the '96 elections when she noted, "This isn't a packed room. How do we energize more people? How do we get more people involved? Those are very important questions we have to solve...."

The panel pointed out how important all elections can be next year, from the presidential level all the way down to city council and school boards. The panelists noted how the '94 legislative session almost passed a stronger hate crimes bill, the closest a heavily pro-gay issue has come to success in that body; it failed by two votes. They added that organizing and the power of individuals to lobby elected officials was one of the strongest weapons voters have.

An opinion survey is being circulated by the Caucus to identify the importance of various issues to the lesbian/gay/bi community, and also to help find more people willing to get involved in the process, as candidates or as workers.

"We don't get a true indication of where people are on our issues anymore," Maxey noted. "In the hate crimes vote, the Eagle Forum wouldn't let representatives walk (skip the vote); they had people at the doors saying, 'if you don't vote, we will record that as a vote against us (the Radical Right)'...I think our community should ask how people are going to step to the plate and help our objectives, not just if they're for or against us. We need to ask more open-ended questions."

Hardy-Garcia added, "We have to put aside what 'I' want and do what is logical, do things in step. The grassroots are extremely important; that's where everything begins. And we have to start organizing now. There's only two ways to pass laws: to buy them or to have constituent support. Contrary to popular belief, we don't have the bucks. So we have to do the nitty-gritty grassroots work."

McHargue emphasized that positions are still open on the endorsement committee to anyone wishing to become involved, as well as on other ALGPC standing committees. ALGPC and Cornerstone also have vacancies on their respective boards.

Volunteer nights are held from 7-8:15 p.m. every Thursday at the ALGPC/LGRL offices, 602 W. 7th St. In addition, the Caucus is gearing up a garage sale to raise funds, to take place next weekend, Oct. 14-15 at 2011 Goodrich Ave.; anyone

AUSTIN COMMISSION ISSUES REPORT ON GAY YOUTH

*Local Activists Hope Issues
Will Draw More Attention.*

AUSTIN — The Austin Human Rights Commission's Report on Lesbian, Gay and Bisexual Youth was released Sept. 27, chronicling the multitude of problems and challenges facing today's youngsters and making recommendations on how local government, schools and social services can help meet the needs of youth.

Lisa Rogers, director of Out Youth Austin, which offers a support group for gay youth, was among those greatly impressed with the AHRC's report.

"I think it's great; I think it could have wonderful consequences," she said. "The next thing is to keep their (officials') feet to the fire...until some of their recommendations are implemented. This report is a wonderful opportunity for us [to] carpe diem, to seize the moment...and frame the issue. We have to assume that whoever they are out there will have the best interest of the children at heart, and will work for the safety of all to implement the report's suggestions and recommendations."

The 29-page report identifies five main areas of concern to lesbian, gay and bisexual youth: alienation, isolation, abuse from others, abuse from self and support. It goes on to make specific recommendations to area schools, the City of Austin, Travis County, social and/or health service agencies and the media on dealing with gay youth issues and solving their problems.

The report was a result of testimony given at public hearings May 27 and June 11, 1994, plus public testimony given at an AISD board meeting held on Sept. 28 last year when the district adopted a sexual harassment policy which included sexual orientation.

One immediate effect of the report is that Rogers and Steve Seifert will be tutoring school counselors, beginning on the elementary level, on what the issues gay and questioning youths are dealing with and how to be supportive to them.

The memorial service will be held this afternoon (Friday, Oct. 6) at 3 p.m. at Cathedral of Hope Metropolitan Community Church in Dallas.

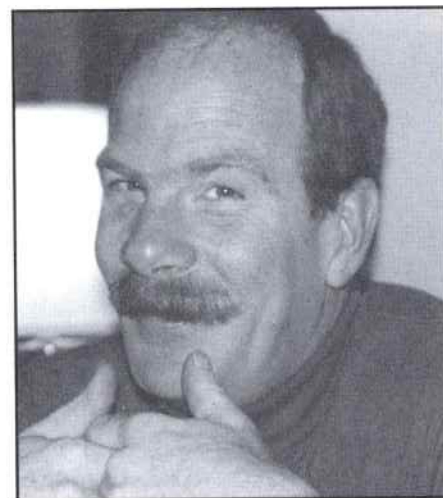
